His name will be added to the slate of officers for disapproval, if any, at the 74th General Service Conference. The chair of the Grapevine Trustees Nominating and Governance Committee announced they had interviewed and selected a candidate for the role of non-trustee director. The chair also reported that since the release of the Grapevine app on September 1 there have been 17,000 downloads and 2,300 subscriptions. The Grapevine app currently sits at number 32 on the Apple top two hundred chart. The committee for International Conventions and Regional Forums recommended that Indianapolis Indiana be the site for the 2035 International Convention, which will be the 100th Anniversary of the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. Woohoo! There will be a global celebration of the historical event. As is true of all committees, Literature reviewed all previously supported projects, such as the translation of the fourth edition of the book Alcoholics Anonymous into Spanish, the progress of the English 5th edition book Alcoholics Anonymous and the plain and simple language version of the fourth edition English as well. All these projects will be discussed and reported on at the April Conference. And Public Information, the committee I am assigned to, discussed, along with its many other projects, the Membership Survey Pilot. Thank you to everyone who took the time to participate in the survey either on the Meeting Guide app or aa.org. I am very interested to hear the results of this pilot survey at the 74th General Service Conference and compare the results with the original survey results taken of random groups in the US/Canada service structure. The results of the current version of the survey can be found on the aa.org website now. A pamphlet to be released soon. This is just a very small sampling of the work done by our Trusted Servants for the third quarterly, I am excited and honored to be a guest at the upcoming January Board meeting. If you have any specific interest or questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to me and I will provide any and all available information to you. I myself have been busy with the duties of the Delegate Chair. We discussed ways to achieve our goals and what the responsibilities of each role could be. We also decided to meet the first Wednesday of each month at 6:30pm on zoom to join together as a committee to discuss the work we are doing to serve the Area. While prayerfully considering Concept 10, I will be drafting roles and responsibilities to present to our new corrections committee at April assembly for a group conscience vote. The agenda featured a deck of topics that included An Overview of PI; CPC; Guidelines for speaking in PI; CPC; Using Technology to support PI & CPC; Report on 2023 accomplishments; Priority Setting for 2024 (interactive exercise); and a Call to Action. The presentation highlighted a PI; CPC Area 14 accountability report on 2023 accomplishments in carrying the message. Accomplishments included three (3) virtual workshops and attendance at six (6) conferences and service fairs reaching a total of over 5,200 people in our communities. In order to do that, we counted 36 volunteers from Area 14 that staffed the events. One of the six conferences targeted School Guidance Counselors in K-12. We set priorities in July of 2023 and Area 14 listened! The workshop also emphasized making a priority setting to accomplish more action in 2024. We brought back the pink cloud “hard” hat to collect the most popular vote for our community focus for 2024. Temporary Contact/Bridging the Gap Request and Volunteer forms and "Where do I go from here?" Many attendees shared their experiences and questions were exchanged as we considered solutions. Thank you to all the attendees and our note-taker, Brenda G.! A virtual monthly Treatment Committee meeting is in the works. We closed with the Serenity Prayer. I could not do this without you. And especially I thank all of you for giving me such a Blessing in service.

Motion #1 - Growth

Motion to change Structure & Guidelines Section II. Voting eligibility and Privileges: Privileges change:

Any eligible voter who is not in their seat at their District table at 9:00 am for roll call at the start of assembly shall have their voting privileges suspended for assembly.

To: Any eligible voter who is not in their seat at their District table at 9:00 am for roll call or in the virtual waiting room by 8:45 am for roll call have their voting privileges suspended for that assembly.

Motion #2

Move that starting with the April 2024 Business meeting, that Area 14 provides a virtual meeting platform for login to the business meeting, including voting capability for those who are voting members of the assembly according to voting privileges as set forth in Structures and Guidelines.

Responsibility Statement.

How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- *Full* discussion of a recommendation should take place *before* each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee or appropriate corporate board for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question


Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.



Declining to Consider a Floor Action


