### **ORDER OF BUSINESS**

**Chairperson: Nicole D.-** Opened the meeting with a moment of silence and the Serenity Prayer in English and Spanish. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:01 am on Sunday, April 9, 2023.

Housekeeping procedures were reviewed.

**Registrar: Kevin G.:** Total votes from today’s roll call is 165; two-thirds is 110.

Reading of the Anonymity Statement by Noel and the short form of the 12 Concepts by Linda .

### **OFFICER REPORTS**

**Secretary:** - Good morning. My name is Nanette, and I am an alcoholic. I am also your Panel 73 Area Secretary. It is an honor and privilege to serve you, Alcoholics Anonymous, and the area. I am very grateful to be able to serve the North Florida Assembly. The January 2023 motions were uploaded by our Web Master to our NFAC website on January 20, 2023. The digital version of the minutes was uploaded to the website on March 8, 2023. The minutes were emailed to the body on March 9, 2023.

The printed minutes were mailed to seven USPS addresses. Please let me know if you have not received your minutes or have questions about the January minutes. This weekend, fifty printed copies of our January Assembly minutes were available at the registration desk. I also purchased a new Dell computer and Epson printer under the allotted budget. Corrections to the January 2023 minutes include the modification of page numbers. Corrections also include: the voting total for the final minutes for the January assembly must be changed from 164 to 166, with a two-thirds majority totaling 111. This also includes corrections to the January 2023 minutes for the modification of page numbers. For the Archivist report, a sobriety date must be corrected to 1992. Also, the instructions for the Zoom attendees at the January business meeting should have been added to the report. Referring to our Southeast Regional, the words Southeast should not be hyphenated. The second motion concerning contributions and funding for officers was printed twice in the minutes. This must be deleted in one place, so it is only published once. This finalizes the corrections for the First Quarter Assembly. Thank you again for allowing me to serve. Are there any other changes to the January 2023 minutes? Seeing none. **Motion to accept the minutes. Passed.**

**Treasurer-** Hello, my name is Bryant, and I serve as your NFAC Treasurer Panel 73. You will see that there are no Financial Reports on the table for this Quarter. This is a direct result of mistakes that I made when inputting the numbers for the first quarter. I was trying to enter the numbers in a manner that isn’t supported by the QuickBooks program. This resulted in the reports not presenting accurately. I do apologize for the mistake. My intent is to have the QuickBooks data corrected and ready to be printed to the Minutes when the Secretary uploads the Minutes for this Assembly. This will ensure that on July 2<sup>nd</sup>, Financials will be available for the Assembly. I can share that there is \$10,000 in our checking account; we have an \$85,000 CD, of which we accrued \$2.73 in the first quarter. Groups have contributed nearly \$21,000 in funds. Our taxes have been filed for the year 2022. Our Officers have been updated on Sunbiz with the 2023 Annual Report finished. Please note that the P.O. Box changed at the beginning of the year. Please make all contributions payable to: NFAC PO Box 6301, Jacksonville, FL 32205 The previous P.O. Box will be shut down at the end of the month. I have available the current P.O. Box address on a sheet to help facilitate proper delivery. I ask that when sending contributions, the group name is clearly written with district and group number, if possible. **Delegate-** Mary A.- Good morning Area 14! I have lots to report this morning but before I begin, I must share the sadness that our area and all the fellowship has experienced. I heard feedback, discussion, and questions at every workshop and since then I have received numerous emailed communications from the groups informing me of their group conscience and as you know yesterday, we gathered here, and I collected more of your voices to carry with me to the 73<sup>rd</sup> General Service Conference. I will be leaving this week to attend. Several districts have already asked me to return for Post Conference workshops and I am happy to do so. A few more dates are available. And of course, I will present a Post Conference report back to everyone at the July assembly. I have met numerous times with all the delegates, my committee members serving together on the Public Information committee and three meetings with the Trustees and Delegates specifically. Some of you may be aware of an issue of concern that has transpired with the members of our Board of Trustees. At the January meeting the General Service Board asked for and received the resignation of the Board Chairperson, Linda Chezem Class A Trustee. Shortly thereafter, a Class B Trustee, Josh E., also resigned. Included in the April Delegate's Corner is posted the Official letter from the General Service Board regarding this. Since then, entirely too much rumor, conjecture and innuendo has ensued. Social media has become a platform for a great deal of unfortunate incorrect information, divisive behavior, and a lot of he said she said. The information surrounding these events has been openly discussed by the Trustees and the Delegates in more than 7 hours of meetings via zoom over the last six weeks. A second document from the General Service Board has been uploaded this weekend to the website, [aanorthflorida.org](http://aanorthflorida.org). This is a reporting of 12 frequently asked questions from our discussions and the documented answers from the members of the Board. The Conference will include continued discussion of this topic and as you might imagine the Trustees Committee members have an increased workload. The Trustee themselves and the Nominating Committee have been working towards replacement of the Board Chair. Since January Jimmy D. Class B trustee and alternate chair has served as the Interim Chair. Leadership is in place and rest assured that business as usual has continued at the General Service Office while management and staff prepare for the arrival of the 93 Delegates from the US/Canada service structure. Words cannot adequately express the honor and responsibility I feel having been elected by this area to represent us at the 73 General Service Conference. I am committed to carrying our voice so that we are a part of what shapes the future of this fellowship that we each owe so very much, our very lives in many cases. In a world of anger and disunity let the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous stand as a beacon of light in this darkness. Let us all remember where we came from and how we got here. Let our united focus be on our Primary Purpose and how best to carry the message of recovery to the still suffering alcoholic. We do this with love for the fellowship, the program and each other. Setting aside personal differences and coming together, guided by a Power Greater than Ourselves as a united Group Conscience, Together in Service.

Past Trustees provided a sharing session and Alt. Delegates met and decided to follow up with a monthly zoom call to discuss happenings in our Areas as a way to share ideas and learn from each other. This was followed by a business meeting on Sunday morning. I'd like to thank Area 14 for supporting my participation at this event. I came away with a new level of understanding and ideas which I'd be happy to share with anyone who is interested.

Also in February, I attended the Joint Advisory Committee meeting along with our Area Representative Chet P. in Orlando. Planning for the 66th Florida State Convention at Saddlebrook is well under way. We also heard a report from the 67th Florida State Convention which will be hosted in Jacksonville in 2024. It should be noted that no bids were brought forward from either Area 14 or Area 15 for the 2025 Florida State Convention. Our Delegate has included me in many of the Pre-Conference Workshops and it is always a pleasure to hear your feedback and questions. **Cooperation with the Professional Community**- Harry D. - I am privileged to serve as your Panel 73 Cooperation with the Professional Community Service Coordinator. In our session on the 15<sup>th</sup>, we had a total of 23 people representing 16 districts, including Tom S, the previous panel’s CPC Service Coordinator, who has been an invaluable resource to me in taking on this position! I reached out to Districts 11 and 25 specifically with ideas to focus on their communities. And we also recognized District 19 for the work that they have done, without any help from me - yet! on committing to and staffing their upcoming Health Fair in May. This is the type of thing we absolutely need to do more of. And I am willing with the budget, any pamphlets and collateral that is needed, and my time to support any outreach that the various Districts bring to me. And finally, speaking of Collaboration, Talitha Callaway (the Service Coordinator for Public Information) and I are talking monthly and have come up with some ideas where we feel that by joining forces, we can truly be  $1 + 1 = 3$ . The first of these ideas being regular virtual sessions to talk about what we can do together and bring CPC/PI Chairpersons from each District together to brainstorm ideas.

**Corrections**-Nicole F.- Good morning, I'm Nicole and I am an alcoholic. My sobriety date is May 4, 2015, and my home group is the Back Porch International. It is an honor and privilege to serve as your Corrections Service Coordinator for the North Florida Area. Yesterday at 10 am we met for our second quarterly corrections workshop for Panel 73. There were thirty-three attendees present. We reviewed the current agenda items of the Conference Committee on Corrections. We took a sense of the room to determine where our groups stand on adding content on “Inside” sponsorship to existing A.A. pamphlets and the current revision of the Corrections Kit and Workbook (including the newly added piece on “Inside” sponsorship). We also discussed the service piece “Safety and A.A.: Our Common Welfare” and its history of revisions. Our discussion was honest, loving, and open-minded. Our delegate was able to gain a sense of the room to take with her to Conference next week. We discussed a joint corrections workshop that we will be having with Area 15 in the Fall. Save the date for October 14 in Hobe Sound. Details to follow. We had some time at the end of our meeting to take a pulse on the room to determine what workshop we would like to have in July. It was unanimously obvious that bridging the gap is a topic of interest, so that is what we are looking forward to coming together to talk about in the summer. Thank you for allowing me to serve [by helping you] help alcoholics who are incarcerated.

**Grapevine/La Vina**- Donald M. There were twenty-eight people in attendance for the Workshop. We went over the 4 Agenda Items that the Grapevine committee has for the General Service Conference: Review the Grapevine Workbook. The updated version of the workbook is divided into 5 sections which makes it more streamlined and easier to navigate. Review the Grapevine and La Vina Instagram Accounts. Grapevine average growth is about 2.5% per month and La Vina is about 4% per month. Review suggestions for Grapevine Book Title for 2024 Review request to give the Alternate Delegates read only access to the Dashboard. The cost would be \$3254 for the ninety-three additional licenses. Took a sense of the assembly for the fourth item. Twenty-eight in favor. None opposed.

**Intergroup**-Debra V. - My name is Debra V. alcoholic. My sobriety date is 9/10/1988. My home group is the Fiesta Group in District 1, Jacksonville, FL. I'm honored to serve as the Area 14 Intergroup Service Coordinator. The workshop went well. There were 43 in attendance. There were IGRs, GSRs, DCMs and interested Conference attendees present. Handouts included The Traditions Checklist, The Twelve Traditions Illustrated, The Long Version of the Twelve Traditions, Problems Other Than Alcohol, A Member's Eye View of Alcoholics Anonymous, and Structure of the Conference. The majority of the time we discussed the handout “A.A. Guidelines Central or Intergroup Offices”. I've never seen a more enthusiastic gathering of trusted servants committed to help each other and their home groups have an informed group conscience. Hope to see you at the Intergroup workshop next assembly. God is good and AA works.

**Literature**-Carson F.- We opened with the Serenity Prayer. Lively discussion on agenda items we covered. We reviewed and discussed literature agenda items. O. Recommendation was to use the video vs revising “Too Young.” The consensus was “no study guides” CPC...50/50 retire “Member's Eye View of AA”. Corrections: Suggested

You helped me to remember, the equipment doesn't carry the message, we do, keep it simple. Thank you! The workshop opened with First Things First, a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Then, Laura T. served as our Scribe, Jenny C. passed out index cards, and Tom S., with great wisdom, gave an easier and softer solution to handing out pens. Also, a member expressed interest in answering the call to serve as the Alternate Public Service Coordinator. Thank you to all who attended! # How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

## Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

## Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

## Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

## Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

## General Rules of Debate and Voting

*(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)*

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- *Full* discussion of a recommendation should take place *before* each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

## Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

## Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

## Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee or appropriate corporate board for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

## Calling the Question


Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

## Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

## Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.



## Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
