ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairperson: Lori P. Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 7:00 pm on Saturday October 8, 2022.

Registrar: Mary P. Total votes from today's roll call is 147; two-thirds is 97.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary – My name is Maureen, I am an alcoholic and your Panel 71 secretary. The July motions were posted to the website the week following the Assembly. On August 27th, I emailed the minutes to the Webmaster and Web Chair to post to the Password Protected area and to email to the body. After the minutes were emailed, our Treasurer Richard notified me that I had forgotten to include the 2023 budget in the minutes. I contacted the Webmaster immediately to let him know I'd be providing a revised version promptly. Thank you Richard for reviewing the minutes quickly and catching my mistake. The printed minutes were mailed to 11 addresses on September 9, 2022. The mailing of the minutes was delayed by a few days. I apologize for any inconvenience this caused our members. I provided additional copies of the July minutes in the Registration room today. Please see me at the break if you still need a copy. Today in old business, we will be voting on a tabled motion that I brought to the body in July to update a section of the Structures and Guidelines. Speaking of Structures & Guidelines, I placed a copy of the Structures & Guidelines revised May 2022 at each table for your district to reference today. The voting procedures for tomorrow's election are in sections 11 and 12. As a reminder, all motions passed and/or tabled today will be posted to the NFAC website in the Password Protected area within 10 days of today's business meeting, per Structures & Guidelines. I have been made aware of a mistake in the July minutes in the Delegate's report citing the attendance of the past delegates. Listed as being in attendance are Panel 53 Corliss G., Panel 57 Fred H., Panel 65 Glenn W., and Panel 69 Annette D. and they were not in attendance. Also that the past delegate Cecilia R.'s name is misspelled. I will be correcting the July minutes to correct that information and send to the Web chair for reposting to the website. Lastly, I am grateful to have been able to contribute to NFAC as your secretary. Thank you for the opportunity to serve Panel 71.

Motion to accept the minutes as amended. Passed.

Treasurer – Good Evening, I'm Richard C. and I am an alcoholic. My home group is the Came to Believe Group in District 19B. It is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Panel 71 Treasurer. Will the host district please pass the basket, in keeping with the 7th Tradition of only accepting contributions from A.A. members and entities? As the basket is passed, please be mindful of those around you who will still be listening to the reports being given. When sending contributions please include your group name, group number, district number and contact information. As you will see, the Area is still financially sound. We have brought in \$63,580.74 and had a total of \$59,972.97 in expenses giving a net total of \$6,614.15 of income above expenses. We had \$9,291.44 of Area income from E-Contributions at a cost of \$331.71 in fees. E-Contributions can be made by going on the Area website and clicking on the tab labeled [Make a Contribution](#) located on the left side of the home page. Our Prudent Reserve is currently \$15,759.00 below the 12-month maximum allowed. We have a combined amount of \$114,085.67 in the checking and savings accounts. There isn't any overage at this time but that can change as the result of expenses being lower than income and/or the change in the budget. Please disregard the Group Contribution sheets. I clicked on the wrong tab. This will be corrected for the minutes. I do apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. On August 25th it was found that the bank account signature cards were reverted back to Panel 69. There wasn't any clear reason for this to have happened. The problem was resolved on

September 9th thanks to the Area Chair organizing the Delegate, the Chair and myself being in a bank branch at the same time so the needed documents could be signed. To help in case this was to happen again, there's a paper and electronic copy of these documents. I can tell you that there wasn't any disruption in the ability to do the day-to-day bank business. Since our last Assembly I have had the pleasure of being part of two wonderful workshops. The first one was a tri-district event put on by Districts 12, 15 and 23 held in Satellite Beach on August 20th, and the second in Palm Coast, District 22 on September 17th. Thank you to all four districts for the wonderful events. If I can be of service to your group or district, please let me know, and it doesn't have to be on finance. Treasurer's report accepted, subject to audit.

And I did forget to say that my home group is the Upstart Women's Group in District 1 in Jacksonville. Thank you so much for allowing me to serve you. It's been such a pleasure and a privilege. And as a way of saying thank you, I'm going to keep this report short for a change! Ok, now we know it's an honest program so I need to change that to I'm going to keep it shorter than my other ones. But it won't be exactly short. So my apologies in advance. I'd like to start today by thanking all of our past delegates and by recognizing all those that are in attending this business meeting. Please hold your applause until they're all introduced. Panel 45 Dan E., Panel 51 Tom G., Panel 57 Fred H., Panel 59 Past Delegate and Past Southeast Regional Trustee, Chet P., Panel 61 Cecilia R., Panel 67 Joyce C., Panel 69 Annette D. We are incredibly fortunate to have dedicated servant leaders still joining us at our assemblies each quarter. They have a wealth of knowledge to share with us. Make sure you thank them next time you see them in the hallway. They don't have to be here. They're here because they love A.A. and they love Area 14. As I've said before, they're here for what's in their hearts, not just what's in their heads. So thank them for their love of service. Now on to business. Since the July assembly I've finished all of the conference report facts to each of the districts who wanted them. In addition, I attended service fairs in Satellite Beach and Gainesville. Both of those were very well attended and resulted in several service committees getting new volunteers, and that's what it's all about. We had fantastic results at both of them. On the 22nd, I'll be in Edgewater with Lori our Chair for Dogs with the Delegate and Chips with the Chair. It's going to be a cookout at the Rebos Club. We'd love to have everybody come join us. Then, on December I'll be at the Southeast Regional Forum in New Orleans where I'll have a workshop: "Inclusivity – How much is too much?" Those of you who were at lunch today with the Delegate were able to participate in a dry run for that event. If you have any thoughts in that regard, feel free to email me or give me a call. We have had some exciting news from GSO very recently. The offices finally opened up for visitors on October 5th. Visitors will be welcomed now Wednesday through Friday from 9am – 3pm. There have been changes to the building security protocols. Since we don't own that building, we now need to schedule our visits. In a pinch, that can be done upon your arrival with security at the Interchurch Center where our offices are housed. Groups of 10 or more must be scheduled in advance. If you want to setup a visit you could email GSOtours@aa.org or call them at 212-870-3430 and those numbers will be in the minutes. And now for the not-so-good news from New York; AAWS (Alcoholics Anonymous World Services), which is our publishing arm reports that we're still experiencing supply chain issues resulting in very low stock and in some cases backorders on quite a bit of our literature, including pocket versions of the Big Book, the large print Twelve and Twelve, As Bill Sees It, Came to Believe, Living Sober, Dr. Bob and the Good Old Timers and others. Most of these items will be back in stock before the holidays, with several being available by the end of October. Some won't be available until February/March 2023. These backorders will most likely continue due to industry-wide paper shortages and other supply chain issues that are currently happening. Please be patient during this time. And support your local central offices. Buy from them when they have stock because they need to put together orders. I did hear yesterday that we are low on the regular Big Book. Now the sad part for me. When I was elected your delegate, I thought 2 years seemed like a long time and now that it's almost over, it seems to have flown by. My life has been so enriched by this experience, both by getting to know so many of you and getting to learn so much from all of you. I am incredibly grateful for this experience. Thank you so much from the bottom of my

For fun and incredible fellowship, I attended the 65th Florida State Convention in Fort Lauderdale to attend the FSC JAC and participate in voting for the bid package for the upcoming Jacksonville Convention in 2024. Along with more than 2,500 of my closest friends we participated in workshops, listened to some amazing guest speakers, played together, laughed, and hugged and celebrated sobriety. We have recently received the final conference report electronically -168 pages of what our delegates heard, saw, and felt at the 72nd General Service Conference, bringing together the voices of the fellowship for decisions made of our collective informed group conscience, making history and ensuring our future. This is my final report to you as your alternate delegate. Words cannot express my gratitude for the confidence you have had in me as your trusted servant. Thank you all.

We'll also ask this for the elections tomorrow morning. Tonight Eric J., past parliamentarian Panel 63 will be serving as our Parliamentarian. Terri C. our parliamentarian for Panel 71 has moved out of state. We thank her for her dedicated service and will miss her as part of Area 14. For Elections tomorrow morning, please remember to be seated at your district table or on the perimeter of the room for visitors – we'll start at 9 am sharp. For those standing for a position, please keep your resume to under 3 minutes. Finally, I would like to thank the Panel members for your service to the success of Panel 71. It has been a treasured experience. Thank you for the opportunity to serve you.

Alternate Chairperson – Terri-Lynn S. The in-person attendance numbers are G.S.R.\Alt G.S.R.s: 122, D.C.M.\Alt D.C.M.s: 29, Service Coordinators, Officers, Past Delegates: 30. Totaling 181. Registrar – Good evening Area 14! Welcome to the new G.S.R.s, D.C.M.s, and visitors. My name is Mary and I'm an alcoholic. I am your Area 14 Registrar and grateful to be of service. Total votes from today's roll call were 147 of which two-thirds is 97 votes (15 votes on Zoom). In August I prepared the email list to provide to the Webmaster so that Area Minutes could be emailed. Our NFAC Webmaster uses the MailChimp for bulk email distribution, and the message containing the minutes is sent from webmaster@aanorthflorida.org. Unless I am notified in writing, all minutes will be mailed electronically. District group reports were emailed to D.C.M.s on September 8 for first review. Structures and Guidelines/Advisory Actions Ad Hoc – I am an alcoholic; my name is Vivian. This is the final report for the Ad Hoc on Advisory Actions and Structures and Guidelines. We have completed our task by taking an overview of the Advisory Actions and Structures and Guidelines as requested by the Area Chair. The committee has had to review advisory actions that were very ambiguous and have caused issues in later terms. Please take advantage of the motion station to get feedback that might save issues in the future. We asked the Area Chair to leave this committee viable until the October assembly in case we needed to address any issues prior to our final report. We received another item and this was passed to the Area Secretary. I would like to thank the following committee members for their tireless work on this committee: Lyndi J., Lina R., Chet P., and Maureen T. At this time, I would like to request the Area Chair to dissolve our ad hoc as we have completed her request.

Newsletter Ad Hoc – Good evening, my name is Max R. The Ad Hoc Newsletter Committee met at 2:30 pm, Saturday, October 8, 2022, in conjunction with the October Area 14 Assembly. All members were present. To recap its activity since the July assembly, the committee produced the digital edition of Spirit of Service, the area's newsletter, which was distributed to the subscription base in early September. An updated print version was prepared in late September and made available in the registration area at the October 2022 assembly. The committee is grateful to all who contributed to the content and production of both versions. At the Saturday meeting, the committee discussed the future of the *Spirit of Service* newsletter and reviewed the motion made and tabled at the July Assembly that NFAC create a permanent, non-administrative newsletter committee. That motion is expected to be brought to the floor for a vote at the October 8, 2022, Area Assembly business meeting. The committee also discussed general plans for developing content and producing the next edition of *Spirit of Service* to be published in early December 2022 in advance of the January 5-7, 2023 Area Assembly. It was agreed that in addition to its recurring features, the next edition would include coverage of the results of the election of Panel 73 officers accompanied by a feature article that includes words of wisdom and encouragement from Panel 71 officers and service position holders to their successors. If the motion to establish a permanent newsletter committee passes, the current committee members affirmed their commitment to work in whatever capacity needed or requested to make a smooth transition to the next committee chairperson and members. Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Hybrid Feasibility Ad Hoc – Kat, D.C.M., District 11, Chair for the Ad Hoc. We met five times on Zoom between July and September. We had seven committee members and several visitors each time, including our Past Delegate Joyce C. We successfully put together a recommendation for the October Assembly which was executed today, and also a recommendation for both the current panel chair as well as our incoming panel chair. I will read the recommendation now. **A majority of the Hybrid Assembly Ad Hoc Committee recommends the following for our Current panel Chair's consideration:**

To understand how everyone feels currently, we recommend the Area Chair take a "sense of the assembly" as was done previously in January of this year. This was offered as several different tiers in January. Some tiers to offer as options include:

1. Entire Assembly (all Workshops, Committees, Business Meeting);
2. Select Workshops, Committees and

Business Meeting; 3. Business Meeting and Saturday night meeting only, 4. Business Meeting only, 5. No hybrid; in person only.

Background: We believe this will help the incoming panel gain a sense of how the area feels overall, and where our view on hybrid is currently. Does a majority of the area strive to be completely hybrid in the future? The pandemic may be winding down, but it has opened our eyes as an area to the possibility that offering hybrid may help to serve our members who are immunocompromised, care for someone who is immunocompromised, or may not have the economic means to travel to an in-person assembly. We think offering this as a question asked as a "sense of assembly" versus a formal motion will help to avoid unneeded controversy during October's Saturday business meeting.

The second recommendation is to the incoming chair: A majority of the Hybrid Assembly Ad Hoc Committee recommends the following for our incoming panel Chair and Alt Chair's consideration:

A. For assemblies beginning in January 2023 at our new site Mission Inn, we recommend a baseline of hybrid coverage for the Saturday night meeting and Sunday Business meeting in the big room El Nuevo Mundo (50' x 100') for the next two years. B. We also recommend the purchase (or renting) of audio-visual equipment to ensure success of our incoming Technology Committee Chair, which would include the purchase or renting of at least two laptops with reasonable functionality, two durable webcams, sound mixer board, and connecting cables for all functionality. Background: We chose to have the Saturday Meeting and Sunday Business Meeting as our baseline because they reside in the same open conference room (El Nuevo Mundo, 50' x 100'), so the set up will not change. Because our current Technology Chair used her own personal equipment to ensure the functionality for the past year of hybrid assemblies, we think it prudent to invest in this equipment for not only hybrid, but the functionality of the assembly *in person* as well. As a matter of finance, we do have a budget to use towards this investment within the realm of line item 9480 under section 9400 Assembly Costs wherein we have \$10,000 allocated to use towards "Audio/Visual Services". With this broad definition, purchases can be made to ensure adequate A/V for the assembly, which would include hybrid set up for this one large room.

SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS

Accessibilities – Good evening! I am an alcoholic and my name is Melanie. It is an honor and a pleasure to serve as your Area 14 Accessibilities Service Coordinator. We began with discussing several virtual Accessibilities workshops coming up, such as "A New Pair of Goggles" October 16th at 2 p.m. It is Part 2 of A.A. in the Military. A member will wrap up his story of getting sober in the military. We also discussed the story solicitations from G.S.O. and their deadlines: Big Book stories for the 5th Edition, "A.A. for the Black and African-American Alcoholic" pamphlet and Big Book stories for the 4th Edition of the Spanish-language Big Book. Please email me at aaccess@aanorthflorida.org for information regarding the virtual workshops. We distributed pamphlets "Access to A.A. - Members share on overcoming barriers" (P-83), "Serving All Alcoholics" and the Accessibilities Checklist for Meetings and Groups (SMF-208), Guidelines, Updated Safety Card, Area 14 Accessibilities document that is on our website www.aanorthflorida.org, and other literature for Accessibilities. Our discussion included how to help everyone have equal access from our Fellowship, to the members we serve, and those members to come. This happens whether it be in recovery or service. We talked about solutions and ways to help. Thank you to the attendees today! Great questions with solutions and discussion expressing their sincere interest and concern.

Archives – Bob C. - The workshop was opened at 11:15 am with the Serenity Prayer. Bob C. described the role of Archives Service Coordinator for Area 14, also, the accomplishments of the past two years in Archives. Bob C. explained how to become an Archives Service Coordinator. Vivian F. Area 14 Archivist, explained the role of Archivists and explained how an Archivist is selected and/or elected. She also explained some tips on preserving and collecting materials for the archives and discussed how to develop a collection policy. Beth E. went to the National A.A. Archives Workshop (NAAAW) in Little Rock, AK. She described what was presented and the talks that went on at the workshop. She brought some presentations and MP3 files. Workshop closed at 12:20 pm. I want to thank Area 14 for allowing me to be the Archives Service

Coordinator. It has been my honor and pleasure to be of service.

Archivist – Vivian F. - Our archives made it through Hurricane Ian with no issues. There was some amazing flooding a few blocks away, but it did not make that stop to come near our repository. There is a box in Registration for any suggestions you would like to make on what we should do with our Grapevines that do not adapt to our collection policy. Please complete a form and put it in the box. Does your district plan to begin an archives or continue what you have already begun? Do you need research help on North Florida Area A.A.? Cooperation with Professional Community – Good evening. My name is Tom S. and I am an alcoholic. I am privileged to serve as your C.P.C. service coordinator. We had a new record high attendance this Assembly, with nineteen members participating in our C.P.C. workshop. We had 15 G.S.R.s, 1 Visitor, two D.C.M.s and 1 Committee Chairperson, representing a total of twelve districts! We recapped our C.P.C. efforts this year, which included two recent service fairs, and discussed two upcoming events: a service fair in Tallahassee and an Addiction Health Summit in Orlando, which is anticipated to be attended by more than 100 physicians involved in the prevention and treatment of alcohol and other drug addictions. This group of doctors are in the Florida chapter of the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM). We already had six A.A. members volunteer to staff this event prior to today's workshop. By the end of the C.P.C. committee meeting, we had six more members put their names in the hat! It appears that the Panel 71 C.P.C. committee, after getting off to a hesitant start in the beginning of 2021, will be closing out 2022's Professional outreach in spectacular fashion! Corrections – Nanette L. - Today we had 22 participants in the Corrections workshop. We broke into four groups of five to six people. Each group was given a written correction dilemma. Example: "There is a decrease in meetings taken to jails and institutions. How do you spark interest within your district and the area? What kinds of activities would you plan to create interest in A.A. corrections activity? Give a thorough description of what you would do and what tools you would use." Each group spent ten minutes collaborating on a solution to the corrections dilemma. A scribe for each group was chosen. Each group had an option of using a variety of literature and A.A. books to illustrate their answer to the designated problem. Each group took five minutes to share their responses to the set problem. There was good interaction, a lot of sharing, and smiling faces by the end of the workshop. Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Area 14 Corrections service coordinator!

Grapevine – Linda G. - We had 20 in attendance. We introduced ourselves. We talked about the book increase of \$2.49 starting June 1st; mentioned about free shipping November 1st to December 31st. We also talked about the resources page at aagrapevine.org; mentioned the podcast being a year old and where to find it and how funny those guys are. We talked about the Archivist having two sets of old magazines and can only have one and looking for suggestions on what to do with them. The box is in the registration room. Took a group conscience of the room about the Spanish literature that we have and the inventory has not moved in a very long time and it is getting a little beaten by traveling. So we are donating it to District 33 so maybe it gets used, with the thought of coming back at a later date with new books. Talked about the opportunity of being a Grapevine coordinator. Talked about needing Grapevine stories. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Intergroup – Hello, my name is Lyndi and I'm an alcoholic, and I am the Intergroup Service Coordinator. I want to thank Katharine B., G.S.R. from District 31, for taking notes and helping me navigate through the workshop. My alternate Intergroup Chair, Sam G. from District 1, is at home with a new baby girl who arrived 2 weeks ago. Today's Intergroup workshop was attended by approximately 20 people. We first reviewed the final draft of a Letter to Intergroup Offices on the importance of service in both Intergroups and General Service, as well as how the two vital entities overlap. Feedback was given, corrections have been made and I will send the letter to Intergroups of Area 14 to publish and post as they best see fit. I have a copy of the letter, with my report, to the Secretary to be included in the Area Minutes*. The remainder of our time was spent revisiting the January

Intergroup Workshop on Service Goals. We asked ourselves questions like, “Where did I get distracted from the primary purpose of my position?”; “Am I leaving my position better than when I accepted it?”; and “Did I do my best?” And in order to finish our commitments strong, we reminded ourselves of our spiritual values. Attendees shared the experience of the past two years as they reflected, and many shared honestly and vulnerably. For them, and for this experience of service, I am grateful. Thank you for letting me be of service.

Literature – Nina V. - The Literature workshop began promptly at 11:15am with 14 attendees. Our workshop focused on “The Gift of Desperation – Surrender and Hope”. We reviewed excerpts from Bill W. and Dr. Bob’s stories, “A Vision for You” in the big book of Alcoholics Anonymous, the A.A. Fact File, The God Word pamphlet and the three A.A. Absolutes Bill wrote about in the Grapevine in 1966, which were republished in 2019 in A.A.’s newest book “Our Great Responsibility”. Absolute #1: Absolute Sobriety; Absolute #2: Absolute Anonymity; Absolute #3 Absolute Membership. As Bill W. stated, “The guy’s a member [of A.A.] if he says so.” Attendees shared about their personal experience receiving the gift of desperation and how they have recaptured hope. The workshop concluded with Alternate Literature Service Coordinator, Talitha C. raffling off a brand-new service manual, which was awarded to a G.S.R. who contributed her experience and hope to the group share. Workshop closed with the declaration of responsibility. Thank you for allowing me to serve. I am not just saying that, I mean it sincerely. You have allowed me this great opportunity to learn and I am grateful.

Public Information – My name is Tim S. We had a workshop this morning. We started with the Serenity Prayer. Recap of the last two years. We reviewed the PowerPoints from the last two years. We discussed the P.I. and the new PSA’s. There are 2 new videos. Sobriety in A.A.: My Drinking Built a Wall (30-40 sec). Sobriety in A.A.: When Drinking is no Longer a Party (15 sec). Both can be found on the A.A. YouTube channel. We discussed radio/TV spots. We discussed Billboards. We discussed carrying the message into for-profit treatment centers. Discussed best practice guidelines for P.I.

Technology – Good evening, everyone, my name is Katie and I’m an Alcoholic. I have the privilege to serve as your Area Technology Committee Chair for Panel 71 and I want to thank you for the opportunity to serve in this newly created position. There were 7 attendees at our workshop today. We had a bit of divine intervention and I want to thank Maureen and Kat for their awesome teamwork today. Some of the topics we discussed included: passing on technology-related ideas for the next panel; Richard C from District 13 raised the issue of digital needs for Accessibilities regarding the Big Book and his plans to introduce a motion with specific details of the proposed requirements such as a flash drive with audio, video and scrolling highlighted text.; The TIAA Forum continues to be a wealth of knowledge for other groups, districts, and areas of A.A. The forum is for all things related to Technology in A.A. and not all technical gobbledygook. I encourage you to check out tiaa-forum.org; The area should consider retiring several NFAC laptops and expanding line item 9480 which currently says Audio Visual Services to Audio Visual Services and Equipment; Continued to discuss the value of hybrid for at least some of the assembly and the considerable cost savings if we were to purchase some inexpensive equipment. As a final matter, I’d like to emphasize my concern on the future viability of the aged Access database where the area stores our member records, and our Registrars use as their primary work tool. While the database has done a lot of heavy lifting over the years, there are underlying issues that I will not detail in this report. I recommend this body support the next panel Chair, Registrar and Technology Team to consider a more stable foundation for our record-keeping. I want to thank the Technology Committee members Bob, Alan and Kris as well as the onsite tech volunteers who worked on planning and executing the Area Tech needs this weekend.

Treatment– Carson – We had 10 people in attendance. We opened with the “we version” of the Serenity Prayer. We had a general discussion about treatment programs and how A.A. can carry the message. The focus was on young people and how we can offer a message to attract young people to the program. Many experiences were shared. There were various pieces of literature available that focused on young people. We broke into groups of two. Each group reviewed the literature they were given. After the review, each group shared important insights from the literature. It was noted that the average young alcoholic started drinking at 13 – 14 years old. For many

young people it is difficult for them to identify as alcoholic because of their age. Relating our experiences as young alcoholics can help the younger people. There were two districts that have young people's groups (YPGs). Finding treatment programs that address alcoholism/addiction in our youth are few and far between. Insurance rarely pays for treatment. It has been a privilege to serve as Treatment Coordinator for Panel 71.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance – Bob E. - The Area 14 Finance Committee met at 1:00 PM October 8, 2022. A quorum of members or alternates was present. The third quarter financial report was presented by the Treasurer, with the condition of Area finances reported as sound, and the Prudent Reserve within acceptable limits. It was noted that revenues were somewhat higher than originally expected. There was no old business. A total of five motions were presented, all requesting additional funds for travel and lodging activities. All five motions were approved for submission to the body for approval. There was discussion concerning the merger of the Technology committee and the Website committee. The Finance Committee declined to formally express an opinion on this matter because of a lack of information. Respectfully submitted.

Growth/Alternate Delegate Alternate Delegate and chair of the Administrative Growth committee - my name is Mary. The committee convened today with three of eight member D.C.M.s in attendance. No quorum. We began by discussing some additional consideration needed concerning a motion to change Structures & Guidelines brought to the floor at the July assembly. The decisions made regarding this will be presented to the members later tonight in old business. The floor was opened to new business and a question was posed to the committee regarding how the area is handling its virtual groups. How are we providing for participation of these members in general service at the area level, how are they registered within the area? Do they have their own district, similar to the linguistic district we have for Spanish speaking members? Several individuals spoke passionately about this, and it was noted that other areas are moving forward with considerations for representation of these virtual groups. The sense of the room today reflects it is time for us to do so as well. William E. district 22 has stepped up to coordinate a look at answering these questions. If you would like to assist with this effort please contact William at willeaa2214@gmail.com I know he will welcome your interest and assistance. I am very proud of the interest this committee has taken in this topic and others to help carry the message in our area. Being tasked earlier this year with looking at how we could bring better motions before the body and better understanding of those motions, a new motion submission form now appears on the website, both pdf and fillable. And the Motion Station has been so well received that it has already evolved to answering any variety of questions, like a human ask-it-basket! Special thanks to Vivian F. for her support and sharing her knowledge at this station for three assemblies now. I am hopeful that future panels will continue to make this a part of our assemblies. I appreciate everyone's desire to be of service and work towards the best possible future for Area 14 and all of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Site and Agenda/Alternate Chairperson – Terri-Lynn S. - We opened the meeting at 3:03pm in Oscar Wilde 4. Thank you for recording our sessions. A quorum was established with 6 out of the 8 members present. Thank you Bryant G. for your report on the ad hoc hybrid meeting. We reviewed the Hilton Daytona Beach response from our bid packet. Unfortunately, the prices are too high for us. We will be passing on all of the 2024-25 bid packet responses to the newly elected Alternate Chair. Thank you for letting me serve. I've loved every minute of it.

Website – Good Morning, my name is Kevin B. and I am an alcoholic. My sobriety date is October 13, 1995 and it is my honor and privilege to serve as your Panel 71 Web Committee Chair. Many thanks to all who participated in the Website Committee meeting for all of your efforts, hard work and accomplishments. It was truly a meeting of collaboration and service in action. The Website Committee meeting was called to order at 1:08 p.m., with six voting members present out of ten assigned, and substantial unanimity was established at four. The previous minutes were read and accepted by the Committee. Overviews of service sponsorship, the weekly Area service

workshops held on Wednesdays at 6 p.m., and to serve or not to serve on the next panel were presented. Discussion was held on the upcoming SERF, SSAASA, and the recent NAATW workshop. A big shoutout to all the D.C.M.s who make up your Panel 71 Website Committee for all of their hard work and their continued efforts through the end of this panel. We discussed and approved an amendment from last quarter that will be brought off the table later tonight. Moved that the Technology Service Committee be integrated into the Website Administrative Committee and the Website Committee be renamed to the Communications and Technology Committee [to continue as an Administrative Committee], changing Structures and Guidelines as follows:

- Communications and Technology
 - This committee will review and select the preferred candidate for the position of Webmaster, act to ensure continuity with technology used by Area 14, will consult with other Area Committee members in planning, selecting, obtaining, and the maintenance and use of technology.
 - The contract for the Webmaster’s Services will be executed by both the Communications and Technology Chairperson and the NFAC Chairperson.
- Ensure Advisory Actions and Structures and Guidelines per all motions that have passed are updated on the website.
- Communications and Technology Chairperson
 - Will be appointed by the NFAC Chairperson and attend Assemblies.
 - Responsible for setting up the meeting and coordinating information within the committee.
 - Ensure that the website (aanorthflorida.org) meet the recommendations of the Committee and/or the Assembly.
- Webmaster
 - Maintain the website and only add or remove data when directed by the Communications and Technology Committee and/or Assembly.
 - Responsible for the bulk emailing of the minutes 30 days before the next assembly.
- Hardware and Software:
 - Maintains records of technology equipment and software, including those assigned to Area Panel members, and oversees transfer of equipment at beginning of each panel. Provide an inventory of all equipment and software licenses to the Area 14 Finance Chair at the beginning of each panel.
 - Receives all requests for use of technology equipment for use at assembly and other Area 14 events. Provides AV and Virtual support as requested, and oversees AV support, providing equipment set-up and securing outside resources as deemed fiscally responsible.
- Virtual Needs:
 - The Area Chairperson will maintain “ownership” status of any Area 14 virtual accounts with Zoom or other providers. The Committee Chair, or their designee, will administer the accounts, assigning user levels, scheduling meetings, etc. A roster of members available to provide virtual

hosting and other support for virtual/hybrid events and other necessary administrative functions will be maintained.

- Evaluates Area 14 immediate and future needs for equipment, software licenses, for production or contractor outside help, including, securing and evaluating bids in order to make fiscally responsible purchases.
- Considers future technology, equipment and software needs including integration of other Area functions within the committee, such as website and/or communications.

Motion from the Newsletter Ad Hoc Committee: Majority voted against. 1 Minority Opinion. Motion Failed.

Moved that: North Florida Area 14 establish a Newsletter Service Committee, as described in the Area 14 Newsletter Service Committee's Composition, Scope, and Budget Guidelines.

- Composition
 - The committee includes a chairperson, a reasonable number of voting members, a trusted advisor experienced in and familiar with A.A. traditions and Area 14 procedures and protocols (e.g., a past delegate, past chair, website chair, etc.) and other non-voting volunteers as needed.
 - It is suggested that the chairperson have experience in written communications, editorial, and/or electronic publishing technology or demonstrate a willingness to learn.
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson will be appointed by the Area 14 Chairperson, as a voting member of Area 14. The remaining members will be selected by the Committee Chairperson and approved by the Area 14 Chairperson. The Area 14 Chairperson will serve as an ex-officio member.
- Scope
 - The committee will be a permanent, non-administrative committee.
 - The newsletter will provide a regular news and information communications link between the North Florida Area Conference service structure and D.C.M.s, G.S.R.s, service coordinators, and other interested individuals to help them participate more fully in Area activities and to assist voting members to make more fully informed decisions.
 - The committee will determine the frequency, timing, publishing format, and distribution method for the newsletter in accordance with Area 14 policies and standards relating to electronic communications.
 - The committee is responsible for determining the content of the newsletter and establishing a review process to ensure accuracy, appropriateness, and conformance with the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- Budget Guidelines
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson submits a budget request and is allocated a budget each January, as approved by the Finance Committee, and is responsible for committee expenditures.
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson is entitled to one night's paid lodging at each quarterly area assembly hotel and reimbursed for mileage and tolls to and from the assembly.

*A Collective Intergroup Letter to The Fellowship of Area 14

Dear A.A. Members Within Area 14,

In the next couple of months, service commitments are coming to an end and Groups, Districts and Intergroups will be having elections for a new round of trusted servants. For the past year and a half, those of us who have a mutual interest in both Intergroups and General Service, have been gathering at the Area Assemblies to discuss various roadblocks and means of collaboration and cooperation between these incredibly vital A.A. entities.

We ask you to keep these ideas and suggestions in mind when considering how you want to serve A.A.:

Intergroup (IG Rep) and General Service Representatives (GSR), do not only serve their groups but the Fellowship at large. Both of these group representatives are a link in Fellowship wide communication chains where information flows. While it is important that your group be informed of what each branch of A.A. is doing, it is more essential that your group's voice is carried back to that entity.

There are also more opportunities for service within Intergroups and General Service than simply carrying reports back and forth. Each facet of service has its own committees that work to carry the message of Alcoholics Anonymous to the still suffering alcoholic. Be prepared to surprise yourself when you find spiritual gifts you didn't know you had. This often happens in service when you say yes to something new. You may also learn what you are not good at, which is as equally important. It is prized information to know that you are a better secretary than a public speaker, or that you are better workshop organizer than a treasurer.

All entities that serve A.A. are interconnected and ever evolving. These entities that both serve the alcoholic, whether the alcoholic is suffering or not, need to be connected to each other. Often the services and committees are repeated at Intergroups and Districts. Liaisons that are willing to report between Intergroups and Districts are vital so that service groups know what the other is doing. This way efforts and energy can join and be shared rather than repeated and possibly wasted. These entities can utilize each other's services to reach more people.

You may occasionally find it necessary to be in the spotlight. You may find yourself being an educator and you will definitely have to be a cheerleader! This may involve explaining the purpose of a committee to encourage people to volunteer or sharing with your group how a Tradition has been implemented to come to a solution. Responsibility of sharing, educating and leading coming with the obligation of learning. But don't worry. You will meet people who have done this service for a long time. Service sponsors are real and they will present themselves to you just as Step Sponsors did when you were ready. All capable leaders follow the lead of someone else.

We hope that this letter does not intimidate or offend. We hope that it will stimulate interest and excitement. The Fourth Dimension that Bill W. talks about is out here and most of us found it when we began serving A.A. outside of our Home Groups. There is much satisfaction and gratitude in extending the hand of A.A. to the alcoholic before they walk into our rooms and that is the purpose of Intergroup and General Service. Then we can open the door for them and greet them when they arrive.

How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee or appropriate corporate board for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question

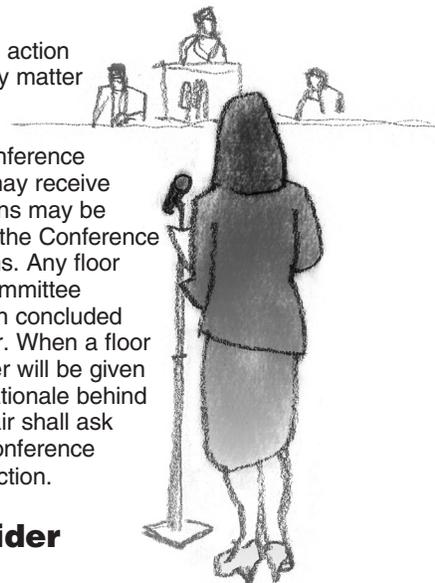
Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.



Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
