ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairperson: Annette D. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:02 a.m. on Sunday April 15, 2018.

Registrar: Stephen R. - Total votes from today's roll call 203; 2/3 - 135

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Lori P. – Thank you for the opportunity to serve and thank you all for your well wishes and support following January's Assembly. Surgery is over and all is well. A special thank you to those who quickly provided reports after January's Assembly and those who proof read the minutes for me. Motions were sent to the Web Chair and Webmaster for posting within 10 days of the Assembly. 230 envelopes were stuffed with January Minutes and delivered to the Registrar on February 6th for mailing via U.S. mail, the file for email delivery was also delivered at that time. The Registrar has since returned 14 envelopes from which we recycled the minutes for placement on tables today and envelopes for use with the next round of minutes. I have received no corrections to the January Minutes thus far are there any corrections at this time? Seeing none, the Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, and passed. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Treasurer: Terri-Lynn S. – Good morning - my name is Terri-Lynn, and I am grateful for the privilege of serving as your Panel 67 Treasurer in Area 14. Will the Host District please pass the baskets? Thank you.

1. As we review the financials for the 1st Quarter, let's keep in mind that a year ago, Al A. from District 24 openly asked the Finance Committee, “Why does the Area have so much money? It isn't right that the Area has so much money!” I could not answer the question then, but when District 24 invited me to have a Sharing Session to discuss the Area's money, I gladly agreed to lead the meeting. I am happy to share the essence of our sharing session, and I will be submitting the entire report given in yesterday's Finance Committee meeting to the Secretary so that it can be posted in the minutes¹. Reading from Structures and Guidelines, Section 18 NFAC PRUDENT RESERVE, #3. Any such overage shall be reported in the minutes from that Assembly, (an overage of \$26,379.00 was reported at the Jan Assembly) and distribution of the overage shall be decided on at the next NFAC Assembly by the NFAC Assembly body. (That's this assembly). Two motions were presented at the Finance Committee to try and disburse these funds. One motion failed and one motion was tabled. Everyone in the Finance Committee agreed that the disbursement of funds that are over the prudent reserve must be given intense scrutiny so that a policy can form that actually deals with disbursing funds that are over the prudent reserve. 2. Looking at the financials for the First Quarter on the Balance Sheet first page, we show \$70,781.17 in the Reserve Fund and \$28,126.68 in the Checking Account plus cash on hand. For a total of \$100,101.89. In accordance with the Treasurer's Manual, I will look into moving \$18,000.00 into one of our long term investments leaving the suggested \$10,000.00 in the checking account. On the next page our Income vs. Expenses – Actual vs Budget, we had a healthy quarter for contributions at \$16,045.56 which are itemized after page 4 in the following Group Contribution Summary. Turning to the last page, we see that we are over maximum prudent reserve by \$25,347.00 a decrease of \$1,032.00 from Dec 2017. Please remember that the financials are posted after each assembly in the password protected area along with the Group Contribution Summary if you need to check that your group has received the proper credit for its contribution. Chair entertained a motion to accept Treasurers' Report subject to audit, passed.

Delegate: Joyce C. – Good Morning everyone, my name is Joyce Caristi, Alcoholic, my home group is the Primary Purpose Group in Titusville FL and I am honored and privileged to be serving as your Delegate to the 68th General Service Conference. First, I wish to recognize and thank our Past Delegates for their service. These are the people you can go to for experience and guidance. So that all can see who you are, please stand and remain standing. Thank you all for your service. Pre-Conference Workshops started very quickly after receiving the Background material. Thanks to all the DCMs for joining together to have the workshops in their areas. We travelled nearly 2000 miles, and we were able to inform approximately 350 of our members throughout North Florida. I especially want to thank Annette, Area Chair who assisted me at all the workshops, and Marcela, Literature Service Coordinator who only missed one. Others participating were: Lori, Area Secretary; Mark, CPC, Deb, Grapevine, Marty, Treatment/Accessibilities, Richard, Alt. Chair who covered Report & Charter. Two past Delegates, Cecilia R. Panel 61 and Glenn, Panel 65 assisted at the Space Coast workshop. We also presented in Brooksville, Tallahassee, Citrus Springs, Jacksonville, Orlando, Daytona and Gainesville

Annette and I presented a workshop on the Home Group in Palm Coast, and I presented a Sponsorship workshop at Primary Purpose in Titusville. We just love getting out to you, please invite us anytime.

In the past few days, we received communications from GSO regarding the Manuscript Litigation. A timeline was given regarding the decision to initiate a lawsuit. The total cost of this now dismissed case to AA is \$452, 702. I did send these documents to the panel, including DCMs, Alt. DCMs, and past delegates. Highlights from AAWS: These were emailed to the usual suspects and are on our website (with a link under the Delegate’s Corner, a few interesting items worth mentioning:

1. The new aa.org website is coming soon, as is the YouTube channel. YouTube is now active for both AAWS and Grapevine. GSO has not formally launched the page, but you can view them in test, just go to YouTube and search for Alcoholics Anonymous World Services or AA Grapevine.
2. The Big Book in Navajo in the works since 2012 is finished. This is a spoken language. Audio will be available soon.
3. The Video PSA “I have hope” has had 796 million views between February and December 2017, ranking it 35th out of 1500 PSAs monitored over the year by an outside organization.
4. A basic AA app to include the Meeting Guide (developed by the NAATW), Big Book, Daily Reflections and Alert/Messaging capabilities be launched in conjunction with the new AA website.
5. \$2,162,827.83 being transferred to the General Service Board General Fund to cover the 2017 GSB Deficit.
6. A transfer of \$1,400,000 of excess cash to the G.S.B. Reserve Fund.
7. Daily Reflections Video Project: The project would provide renewable content in various formats that could be used on the website and app, for an audio book, or as content for the YouTube channel. The project will proceed at an estimated cost of \$174,835.

I will do my best at conference and I promise not to break AA.. Thank you again for honoring me with your trust.

Alternate Delegate’s Report: Heather V. W. – absent; (reported by Joyce C.) Kelly and I attended the Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee February 24, 2018 at the East Side Club in Orlando, Florida. We reviewed a bid proposal for 2020 Innisbrook Florida State Convention and will play a pivotal role in ensuring the proper bid goes forward for vote at the 2018 FSC. Our next Joint Advisory Committee meeting is May 5, 2018 at the East Side Club in Orlando, Florida. I attended the Southeast Delegates Get Together with our Delegate at the Westin Atlanta Perimeter North in Atlanta Georgia February 2 – 4, 2018. This was our second year and we were able to pass long experience from the year two Panel 67 Delegates to the Panel 68 Delegates. This sharing of information is vital to

NFAC Florida State Convention Oversight Committee: Heather V.W. JAC Treasurer, absent; Kelly J. Area 14 Representative to the FSC Joint Advisory Committee. Robert DCM District 10 Reporting: The Florida State Convention Oversight Committee meeting started with the Serenity Prayer. There were 19 in attendance. 3 of the 4 voting members present for a quorum. Doug J. Chair, Jim P. Co-Chair and Walter S. Treasurer for the 2020 FSC Bid Committee attended to present revised bid. The purpose is to provide oversight of the FSC when it occurs geographically within the North Florida Area. Heather and Kelly attended the JAC Meeting February 24, 2018 at the Eastside Club in Orlando, Florida where we reviewed the 2020 Innisbrook bid proposal; however, the bid has since been withdrawn. Archivist: Vivian F. - I am an alcoholic; my name is Vivian. In January, I was joined by Paige W., Growing Through the Grapevine and former District 11 Archivist, as we cleaned out part of the Repository in St. Cloud and began to assimilate a moving plan. February was a busy month: I set up the new storage unit for the Repository in Orlando, completed the purchase of the laptop and scanner, purchased shelves, table, chairs and stepstool for the new Repository and moved them in. The transfer of the Repository from St. Cloud to Orlando was made on March 17th and it only took a total of three hours, with more helpers! Now that the physical labor has been completed with the move, it is time to begin with modernizing our inventory. Did you say BARCODES???? In the next quarter the job of digitization will continue, itemization will begin, along with the deaccession of items in the Repository that do not FIT into our collection policy. Cooperation W/Professional Community: Mark A. - no report; agenda items discussed.

Corrections: Gayle E. – We began at 1:30 pm with the Serenity Prayer. 33 were in attendance. Quick introduction of myself as new service coordinator for Corrections and Robert Moses as Alternate. Robert presented the first Agenda item in corrections asking if the groups of those present felt a need for additional pamphlet to “It Sure Beats Sitting in a Cell” for inmates preparing for release after long term incarceration. Lively discussion for 15 minutes ended with a vote of 32 for and 0 against, one not voting. Second Agenda item addressed by Gayle, displaying and explaining the Kit and Workbook for Corrections. The question was, does your group feel a need for changes in this kit? A pleasant discussion produced a vote of 28 to 3. Only change voiced was to add background of pink can funding. The last 15 minutes were a good discussion of needs the inmates have voiced, including how to get a Corrections kit, information on halfway houses and transition housing. All materials in prison and jail authorities hand obviously needs updating. Reciprocal policies need to be checked into. Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Area 14 Corrections Service Coordinator.

Cooperation with Intergroup: Paula D. – Good morning everyone. I am an alcoholic and my name is Paula. It is a privilege to serve the North Florida Area 14 as the Intergroup Service Coordinator for Panel 67. Thank you to everyone who attended and participated in the Intergroup Workshop yesterday. We looked at information in the A.A. Service Manual on the basic operations and the functions of a Central or Intergroup Office. We focused on the role of the office manager and decisions are made for this role by integrating Steering Committees, Trustees, and the group’s Intergroup Representatives. We discussed the suggestions in the Service Manual on various topics: A.A. Inquiries, Meeting Lists and Other Literature —The Exchange of Information between Groups, Districts and other Intergroups and Central Offices. Local A.A. Events, A.A. It was worth mentioning that to avoid duplication of efforts and other difficulties, good communication between all parts of A.A. is paramount. We collected \$355, including sales tax, in the bookstore and \$603 in raffle tickets for a total collection of \$958. The money collected helps to maintain a sufficient and diverse inventory on hand. Last night, we had the pleasure of giving away 20 *Grapevine* subscriptions, congratulations to all of the winners and thanks to everyone for your support. Area 14 had a very successful Grapevine and La Viña workshop, DeLand this quarter and I will be heading to District 13 in September. Thank you to all who participated in the GVR/RLV workshop yesterday; it was a very successful and lively discussion. It truly amazes me to see everyone in this program pull together to help in extenuating circumstances, Thank you for allowing me to be of service and to step aside and be truly humbled by the amount of help one can receive if one just asks!

Literature: Marcela W. – no report; agenda items discussed.

Public Information: Clark M. – no report; agenda items discussed.

Treatment: Marty C. – Agenda items were covered. Area website links are working great. I was interviewed by Box 4-5-9 for an article which was published in the Winter 2017 issue. Upcoming July motions out of Treatment; 1.) to implement a new website that will house a National Bridging The Gap digital library that will be encrypted. There will be a link on the Area website. I will be working with the Finance and Website Committees on this. 2.) To have the GSO develop Yellow Page guidelines detailing Bridging The Gap for Treatment and Corrections. In July, we will begin to inventory facilities we have contacted and been in touch with to determine who is active, who is not.

There will be a Bridging the Gap workshop on Saturday, June 10th. at the JABA Club in Jacksonville from 1-3 pm. This will be hosted by District 30. It will include a skit and Peter C. and myself sharing and answering questions.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Finance Committee: Greg N. Alt. Chair and note taker – Paige B. Attendance: 27 Total (8 voting members). Meeting opened with the serenity prayer. Our Treasurer (Terri-Lynn S.) reviewed the sharing session she participated in at District 24 regarding the 7th tradition. We then passed a motion from our Delegate to increase line item 6171 (General Service Conference) by \$1000. The vote passed unanimously. Next, the Archives Workshop moved to increase line item 7260 (Archives – Workshops) by \$1200 and decrease line item 7265 (Archives – National Archives Workshop) by \$1200. Motion passed unanimously. We then looked at a motion from District 24 to fund their annual Founders Day in Palatka in the amount of \$500. After much discussion, the motion failed. 2 votes in favor, 5 opposed. We discussed the two GSC agenda items pertaining to Finance and gave our Delegate the tally sheet after the meeting. Finally, we discussed the Scholarship motion that was brought up at the January assembly. We had very little time left, and agreed that tabling that motion until the next assembly was the prudent course of action. Passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 4:16. We closed with the responsibility pledge.

Growth Committee: Heather V.-W. – absent; Lon L. Alt Growth Chair reporting. Meeting began with the Serenity Prayer and roll call of the seven districts assigned to Growth. 6 of the 7 DCMs or their Alternate(s) assigned to this committee were present. We had old business. We revisited the motion referred back to Growth Committee from the last area assembly. After making changes to the motion and history given with much discussion, the Growth Committee made a motion and passed by 5 of the 7 committee members for a majority and quorum. We revised the motion and voted on bringing the motion to the body for approval this morning. The motion will be sent to the body as a seconded motion and brought to the body for approval. There was also a motion made within the Growth Committee to re-surface the 2015 Ad Hoc Committee's digital file for review to see if we can use them in our current Structures & Guidelines. Discussion opened on having a safety net in place for emergency replacement procedures. Peter C. with District 4 stated that we need to look at this before the next assembly. We closed with the Responsibility Statement.

Site and Agenda: Richard C. – We had 4 of 9 DCM's present with a total of 14 in attendance. We covered Conference Agenda Items for Trustees and International Conventions / Regional Forums. We then moved on and looked at changes to Host District Responsibilities for changes to update them to what is being done currently. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Website: Steven N. – Welcome by Chair Steve Northsea. Serenity Prayer. Introduction of committee members. Introduction of visitors. Six of ten committee members were present; also nine visitors were in attendance. Website Report January 1, 2018 - March 1, 2018: During the past three months there were 29,819 visits to the website by 24,148 viewers who looked at an average of 1.45 pages per visit. 67.58% of the visitors used phone devices, 29.51% used desk- or laptops and 2.91% used tablets. After the home page the ten most visited pages were Spanish Steps, Traditions, etc.; Assembly Agenda; Meeting Info, Area Activities; Documents; Grapevine; Map; Delegates Corner; News and Rule 62. 87.2% of the visitors to our site were new with 1285% being returning visitors. 79.09% of the visitors came through a web search engine like Google or Yahoo, 18.68% came directly to the site, 1.66% came from referral from another site like a District website and less than .1% came through social media. It is interesting to note that the Spanish pages are still currently viewed more often than the English pages and there is a very active audience in Mexico of those Spanish pages particularly Steps, Traditions, and Serenity Prayer. Discussion was held about what to include and how to promote the web site usage workshop for July Assembly. The format will be live projection of website navigation, paper handout of instructions, and an encouragement of attendees to B.Y.O.B. (Bring Your Own Blackberry) meaning your mobile device (smart phones and tablets) for hands on work along with the live demonstration. Topics will include such things as how to navigate the site, how to use and submit fillable forms, how to access minutes, how to download agendas, how to find meetings, where is the delegates corner, how to find what District you belong to, Accessibility, etc. Suggestions for promoting the workshop included assembly

wide email, announcement at GSR meeting, announcement in Chair's Highlighter newsletter, etc. Some ideas for improving the website were suggested for future consideration by the committee. They included adding a categories button leading to category links and menus; adding tutorial videos on how to use the website; developing an "AANORTHFLORIDA.ORG for Dummies;" asking Assembly to add a five-minute segment to New GSR workshop on how to use website, access minutes, etc.; add a digital donation option to the website, and taking the website workshop to Districts. Steve explained he is available and willing to do the District visitations upon request. The meeting closed at 3:41 pm with the Lord's Prayer.

From Growth: Moved to have the Secretary update the November 1, 2014 edition of Structures and Guidelines per all motions passed from 2014 and 2017, except the October 2015 motion regarding Structures and Guidelines and replace with the current version of Structures and Guidelines. **Passed**

How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

- Voting is by show of hands unless the Conference decides otherwise.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration

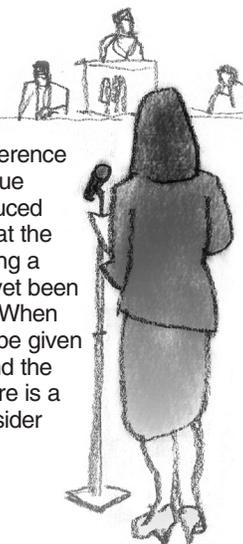
A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.

Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
