ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairperson: Ruth R. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00 am on Sunday April 7, 2019.

Registrar: Carl G. - Total votes from today's roll call, - 234; 2/3 – 156.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Terri-Lynn S. – My name is Terri-Lynn S; my home group is the College Park Triangle group in District 10. It is my privilege to serve as your Secretary. I have placed motion forms in packs of five on the table in front of me. Please, help yourself. I prepared 175 envelopes with the Registrar's Bulk Postage stamp and stuffed the envelopes with the January minutes. On Feb 23rd, Carl and I met at our designated, 1-hour drive, rendezvous location so I could hand off the 175 stuffed envelopes that he would label and mail before the March 6th deadline. I was notified about the following corrections to the minutes: 1) Add "Motion to accept the minutes as amended. Moved and seconded. Motion passed" to the Secretary's report and 2) add "Motion to accept the Treasurer's report subject to audit. Moved and seconded. Motion passed." to the Treasurer's report. No other corrections were received to the Minutes for January; are there any other corrections at this time? Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Motion to accept the minutes as amended; seconded and passed.

Treasurer: Deb B. – Good Morning, my name is Deb B. and it is my honor and privilege to serve as your Panel 69, Area 14 Treasurer. Will the Host District please pass the baskets? Thank you for your continued generosity. Please note, the new Treasurer's address: NFAC, PO Box 10094, Jacksonville, FL 32247. Would someone please communicate the new address to: Sandpiper Group in Cocoa Beach; Ocean Reflections in Cocoa Beach; and Nocatee Promises in Ponte Vedra? Please include group number/district number with your contributions. Would someone associated with the following groups/treasurers please see me on the break: Laurie C. in Brooksville; Michael M. in Summerfield; Wake Up Call in Longwood; and Tracy or Craig E. in South Daytona. Referring to the Combined Financial Report on the table, please note the following corrections. On the report entitled Group Contribution Summary: on page one, the first contribution labeled (Anonymous) should total \$80.00; on page five, the total at the bottom of the page should read \$16,414.82, which matches Line Item 4110 on page one of the Actual vs. Budget Report. On the last page, the Special Contributions (Non-Group) of \$2,214 was entered erroneously and should read zero in both the "Actual" column and the "Over/ (Under)" column. Total Income should read \$17,811 in the "Actual" column and \$49,589 in the "Over/(Under)" column. Net Income should read - \$8,206 in the "Actual" column and \$27,984 in the "Over/(Under)" column. Corrections have already been made in QuickBooks and the corrected numbers will be reflected in the minutes. We are financially stable. We have spent more than we received in contributions this quarter, which is due to several annual fees being paid up front. We are currently \$15,598 over our Minimum Prudent Reserve (\$77,692) and \$10,300 under our Maximum Prudent Reserve (\$103,590) so we now have accomplished what the body asked us to do in getting below our Maximum Prudent Reserve. We still have the same amount of money in the bank. The Annual Corporate documents are filed, work on the 990 Federal Tax Return has begun, and the budget requests for 2020 will be assembled into a budget proposal

for you to approve at our October Assembly. In addition, budget training was held during the Officer's Meeting at 9 a.m., 6 April 2019 and if anyone would like to participate in a similar training please let me know. Please remove all financial statements from the tables when leaving. Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Motion to accept the Treasurer's report as amended and subject to audit; seconded and passed.

Delegate: Annette D. – My name is Annette D. and I am an Alcoholic. My home group is New Pineda Group in District 12. I am honored to serve as your Delegate to the General Service Conference for Panel 69. I want to recognize and thank our Past Delegates for their service. These are the people you can go to for experience and guidance. So that all can see who you are, please stand and remain standing. Please hold your applause until all are standing: Panel 45— Dan E., Panel 51 – Tom G., Panel 55—Michael S., Panel 57 – Fred H., Panel 65 – Glenn W.; and Panel 67 – Joyce C. Thank you all for your service. In February, I attended the Delegates' Get-together in Atlanta, along with several of our Past Delegates, and the Alternate Delegate. This event is a weekend gathering of past delegates and past trustees with the new Delegates and Alternates in the Southeast Region. The purpose is to prepare us for the General Service Conference. I met my Southeast buddy – Rick from Georgia. And I also now have my buddy from Conference, who lives in Nebraska! The background material for Conference agenda items was received on schedule 2/15/2019. Thanks to our Past Delegate Glenn W for his assistance in distributing it electronically to all of you. We completed 7 pre-conference workshops, traveling 1700 miles and talking with 350 members. A big thanks to everyone who gave up their time on some beautiful weekend days to present, to attend and learn. Thanks you for all of your input yesterday. Area 14 always excels in preparing their Delegate for Conference. After this weekend, I will return home to begin study and preparation – and most importantly, planning my wardrobe! The General Service Board met January 28th. We are now seeing preliminary information regarding the International Convention in Detroit in 2020. Expect to see registration start in September of this year, and remember to consider the dates 7/2-5/2020, when planning local events for next year. The 2019 General Service Office Budget was approved, reflecting an anticipated profit of \$501,000. Four Appointed Committee Members were approved for various committees for one year appointments. Contributions are down .29% from 2017. Online contributions continue to rise. This is a great cost savings. Grapevine Subscriptions are down 3000 over 2017, resulting in a 164,000 loss of revenue for Grapevine. La Vina continues to operate at a cost of services of 148,000, 22,000 more than 2017. The Grapevine / La Vina 2019 budgets, reflecting a combined loss of 300,000 was also approved. The Grapevine Daily Quote Book will be translated to Spanish and French. My calendar is available and ready to schedule your post-conference workshops. It would be helpful if they are combined with other districts in the area. If you request a workshop, I will pencil it in, and confirm when I get a flyer for the event. Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Alternate Delegate's Report: Richard C. – Since our last Assembly Annette D. our Area 14 Delegate and I have attended the Delegate's Get – Together in Atlanta, Georgia where we heard the Area Highlights and participated in a Sharing Session with Alt. Delegates and Delegates. This was a very informative weekend. On February 23rd, I attended the Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee meeting in Orlando with Lon L. Area 14 FSC Representative. If you have any questions about this meeting please contact me. I participated with our Delegate, Panel 69 members, some DCM's and members of the fellowship in seven Pre-Conference workshops throughout the month of March. We traveled to Longwood, Brooksville, Ocala, Gainesville, Jacksonville, Merritt Island and Daytona Beach representing over 30 Districts. The workshops were highly informative and it was a sincere pleasure meeting the DCM's, GSR's and the other members of the fellowship who attended. Working ever so close with our Delegate, I am informed and if called upon I'm ready to fulfill my duty to serve in the absence of our Delegate. My final thank you is to all of you who attended our Delegate Annette's pre-conference agenda meetings in order to be well informed and to voice your Group's conscience on the items she'll be voting on at the General Service Conference. All of you who attended your District workshops, the workshops held by our Service Coordinators here yesterday, and the 4:30 meeting yesterday had the enormously important task of carrying your Group's voice and vote to Annette so she can carry it on to the Conference for us. Thank you so much for caring enough about the future of AA to be here this weekend representing your Groups. I was fortunate enough to have been able to participate in the one held in Jacksonville and was grateful to have been included on that panel. Speaking of carrying your Groups' voice and votes, our work here isn't done yet. Today there will be motions that come to the floor for you to vote on. For many of these motions, you will have to use your best judgement as to how your Group would have you vote. As a trusted servant, it is your responsibility to listen to the discussions on each motion in order to make a qualified decision when it's time to vote. So be sure to pay attention, instead of chatting with your friends or using your phone to text, email or shop online. We are here for such important business. Alternate Chair: Lori P. – Thank you everyone for your patience and cooperation this weekend as we cohabit the conference center space with other groups. We should be back to our usual use of the space in July and the remaining assemblies we have at this venue. Thank you also to the flexibility of your Service Coordinators in sharing spaces with counterparts and coffee over the weekend. Also, thank you for booking your room early and taking advantage of the overflow hotel when rooms were unavailable in our site hotel due to the several groups on site in April. Remember that for next assembly the reservation block date closes 30 days in advance of July's assembly which is June 11th. In January, the NFAC booked room nights was 190. As a result, we received 4 Comp rooms for a credit of \$ 476.00. Our master account bill was \$6,243.00. The AV cost for January was \$ 575.00. Thank you for your support at last assembly to increase our budget for the remainder of 2019 because of the sharp increase in cost of AV in moving from Gainesville to our current location in St. Augustine. Our attendance for this weekend breaks down like this: GSR's and Alt GSR's: 214, DCM's and Alt DCM's: 40, Officers and Service Coordinators/Administrative Chairs and Past Delegates: 39, and Visitors: 69 for a total of 362 members in attendance. Thank you to Glenn W. as our Past Delegate of the weekend. We appreciate your continued service to our Area. Thank you to Districts for hosting this weekend: District 18 - Registration, District 23 – Friday Night Meeting, District 30- Grapevine and District 32 – your host for the weekend. You may have noticed by now, a little difference with our translation equipment. Our Area invested in new translation technology equipment. The new equipment is similar to that used by many non-profit organization and is portable, rechargeable (no more cost for batteries) and transmits via a UHF signal which assures clear resolution of sound to the receiver. Our Area DCMs nominated 4 individuals 3 of whom chose to use the Area 14 Scholarship funds a total cost of approximately \$400. Area 14 scholarships fund rooms for GSR recipients so that they are able to be here with us for workshops and this morning at the business meeting. DCMs please remember if you have a GSR in need of scholarship funding for July, reach

out to me with their nomination. I'll also be sending out an email again shortly after April's assembly to make nominations for July. Please help us to recycle your name badges by leaving them on your district's table at the conclusion of today's meeting. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Registrar: Carl G. – The January 2019 Area 14 minutes were mailed out on February 25th. There were no returns at a cost of \$113.08. A total of 594 minutes were emailed to the North Florida Area body on February 19th. As of February 28th, 242 emails were opened and 66 clicked. There was a successful delivery of 594 emails. If you were expecting minutes to be delivered via email or snail mail and did not receive them, it is possible that your email or address information is incorrect. Please contact me as soon as possible to update your information. District group reports are on the tables and updated through Friday April 5th. Once I have entered all the changes from this weekend, I will email all the DCM'S the current district reports. Also, about 10 days prior to the next assembly I will send out the current District reports. A bid proposal was given to the Oversight Committee for the 65th Florida State Convention. The committee denied the proposed bid because it didn't meet the Advisory Action time frame. This means we will possibly not have a State Convention in 2021. Thank you for allowing me to serve

Ad Hoc Committee: Vivian F. - Purpose of today's meeting was to: 1. Formalize a name for the committee. 2. Discuss areas of focus: 1. Realize the need we have = correct documentation 2. Current procedures =

Current practices. 3. Improve Format & Flow. The committee looked at specific examples from the Advisory Actions that need to be corrected, updated or challenged. A procedure was established for cross-referencing the Advisory Actions to their motions in the NFAC minutes and the committee initiated an action item for each member. The NFAC minutes have an integral part in this process. Committee Chair will send copies of all the minutes to the members. Each committee member will take a portion of the Advisory Actions to go through. Then we will have a conference call in six weeks to discuss where we are in the process. We requested information from other areas on how to accomplish this same type of work. There was about a 30% response from the delegates and this information will be passed to the committee. The last item of the meeting was to decide upon a name for the committee. After several suggestions the committee decided on I.F.F. Crew: Improve Format & Flow Crew! Accessibilities: Meriem Mc. – The workshop was attended by 10 members. We discussed the agenda items and took a sense of the room regarding each. The outcome was as follows: Item A: Consider revising the pamphlet “Bridging the Gap” to include related corrections activities. 8 YES, 1 NO, 1 ABSTENTION, Item B: Consider adding a story from an A.A. member who is deaf to the pamphlet “Access to A.A.: Members Share on Overcoming Barriers.’ 10 YES (Unanimous), Item C: Consider updating the pamphlet “A.A. for the Older Alcoholic—Never too Late.” 10 YES (Unanimous), Item D: Discuss the concept of posting anonymity-protected interviews on aa.org with military professionals about their experience in A.A. 10 YES (Unanimous). In honor of Autism Awareness month, I presented tips on making A.A meetings more accessible to persons living with Autism/Asperger and read a short story written by a gentleman living with Autism and his experience as a member of Alcoholics Anonymous over the last few years. Please refer to pamphlet F-73/CCS-2 to get linked with an inmate. I also shared event information about the Bridging the Gap Workshop, September 6-8, 2019 in Sacramento, CA. More information is available at www.btgww.org. In the remaining few minutes, we heard information from Bob C. about existing digital technology known as JPAY, which is being used by inmates in Florida State Correctional Facilities. Bob is trying to get more information for possibly adding A.A. eBooks to the tablet-like devices. I was grateful to be able to serve this weekend in Clark's absence. Thank you for this opportunity.

The Finance chair opened the Finance Committee meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. There were 23 in attendance including the Area 14 Delegate, the Area 14 Treasurer, the Finance Chair and eight members of the Finance Committee. The total of eight voting members present established a quorum. The Treasurer gave a report which included a review of the 1st quarter financials, a discussion of the Prudent Reserve and an overview of a budgeting workshop that took place earlier in the day. There was no old business. Under new business: Conference Agenda Items were briefly reviewed. There were several items mentioned for future consideration by the Committee; mileage reimbursement, electronic contributions and payments, and online accounts and business spending cards. Seven motions were presented for consideration. They are as follows: 1. Create Treasurer’s line item, 6720, Postage in the 2019 budget. 2. Move \$118.00 from Treasurer’s line item 6750, PO Box Annual Rent, to fund line item 6720, Postage in the 2019 Budget. 3. Move \$10.00 from

Registrar's line item 6650, PO Box Annual Rent, to line item 6640 Postage Permit in the 2019 Budget. 4. Move to fund the Area 14 Treasurer up to \$1,000.00 to attend the Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (SSAASA). 5. Move to fund the Area 14 Secretary up to \$1,000.00 to attend the Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (SSAASA). 6. Move to fund the Area 14 Registrar up to 1,000.000 to attend the Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (SSAASA). 7. Increase Literature's line item 7750, Literature by \$300.00 from \$200.00 to \$500.00

Growth Committee: Richard C. – Conference Agenda Items Only.

Site and Agenda: Lori P. – The site and agenda committee met with 8 of our 10 voting DCMs in attendance. There were a total of 34 in attendance. First up we discussed a housekeeping item to Structures and Guidelines for which we will be bringing a motion under new business. For many years the Alternate Chair has delivered a report during our business meeting. According to Structures and Guidelines the Alternate Chair is not currently listed as part of the order of business. This motion will bring procedure in-line with practice which has been in place for many years. During March, committee members were busy visiting and evaluating potential sites responding to our request for bid to host our 2021-2022 NFAC assemblies. Each member was provided with bid information which included room rates, conference room cost, coffee, AV and any other costs such as parking, resort fees, etc. This was a living document as we continued to evaluate each property and negotiate with the respective sales team. Out of 25 individual properties and 7 Visitor and Conventions Bureaus (Satellite Beach to Jacksonville in the northeast, to Tallahassee to my home District in Hernando County in the southwest) contacted with our request to bid document, those who responded with a bid and were evaluated based on meeting our criteria were: Mission Inn Resort (Howey in the Hills), Hilton Inns in Gainesville and Melbourne, The Lexington in Jacksonville, Lake Yale Baptist Conference Center and our existing site the Renaissance World Golf Village. Others responding either did not have adequate space or could not facilitate our dates. During our meeting we evaluated the responses to bid requests in conjunction with suitability of the venue as a host site. Members who visited the venues provided a brief summary on each to the group. We took a sense of the room based on location, cost per room, and suitability for our group overall. Our voting DCMs then voted and we are pleased to be bringing forward a motion today with the recommendation for 2021-2022. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Website: Vicki E. – There were 14 people in attendance. 5 out of 8 DCM's were present. We went over the website guidelines, content and possibilities were discussed. Discussion about uploading a document for the DCM's to submit for the scholarship was discussed. It was pointed out that the document would have to come from site and agenda, and this could be discussed further when more information was obtained from that committee. Questions arose about who was supposed to receive the new password as it was sent out with the minutes. How to add verbiage to the website guidelines was also discussed in our committee. The meeting ended with the responsibility statement.

NEW BUSINESS:

How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

- Voting is by show of hands unless the Conference decides otherwise.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration


A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.

Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
