ORDER OF BUSINESS

Sunday, January 10, 2016 at 9:00 AM

“Our Spiritual Way of Life: Steps, Traditions and Concepts”

Area Chair: Heather V-W. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00am on Sunday, January 10, 2016.

Registrar: Richard C. - Roll call was taken, each District was called for attendance: DCMs, Alternate DCMs, GSRs, Alternate GSRs, Panel 65 Officers, Service Coordinators, Administrative Chairs and Visitors.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Annette D. – Motions were placed on the website timely. Minutes were delivered to Registrar and mailed before the deadline of 30 days prior to this Assembly. I have four changes: 1) Correction to motion regarding Florida State Convention Oversight Committee composition 2) Incorrect date in a page heading, 3) Page missing from Group Contributions Report, and 4) possibly an error in another motion. We will listen to the tape to determine what was said. Amended minutes will be uploaded to website. Are there any other changes to the minutes not already reported? Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, seconded and passed.

Treasurer: Kay M. – Good morning - my name is Kay Musette and I am an alcoholic. Will the Host District please pass the baskets. Thank you. Before I start my report, I want to apologize to Districts 17 thru 23. There was an error in the last Group Contribution Summary when one page was duplicated and another page left out of the report. I am very sorry for this and, if you wish, I will email you the Group Contribution total for September 2015. However, I am confident that the figures in the December Summary are correct and that all groups are reported. As your Treasurer I am very pleased to present our Financial Statement for the year 2015. We are in a solid financial position, mainly because of expenses coming in much under Budget. Part of this is due to the fact that we always over-budget a bit. For instance, under Assembly Costs we budgeted a provision for an American Sign Language Interpreter and we had no deaf attendees asking for this help. Therefore, we did not spend anything on that expense. Over and above that, your Panel - the Officers, the Administrative Committee Chairs, and the Service Coordinators - have been judicious in their use of funding and have come in under Budget. Our total expenses are roughly 25% under Budget. This, coupled with a 5% increase in expected income, gave us a cash overage of \$9000 instead of the cash loss of \$9600 which was budgeted in 2014 by the previous Panel. On a closing note, I want to call your attention to the Special Contributions line in the Financial Summary. We had several contributions from Young People organizations. We recently received donations from the FCYPAA Advisory Council and the 57th ICYPAA Convention. We have also received a donation from the 352 FCYPAA Chapter here in Gainesville as well as contributions from various YP groups. These are detailed in the Group Contribution Summary, the last section of the Financial Statement. It is so heartening to see that the future of AA here in North Florida is well-represented by our Young People membership. Thank you. Chair entertained a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, subject to audit. Motion made, seconded and passed.

Delegate: Glenn W. – First, I wish to recognize and thank our Past Delegates: Dan E. Panel 45, Tom G. Panel 51, Corliss G. Panel 53, Michael S. Panel 55, and Cecilia R. Panel 61. Since my last report, I have wrapped up Delegate's reports in Gainesville, Jacksonville and District 18 Lake Mary / Winter Park. At the Winter Park workshop, we had a sharing session to talk about the Agenda item request from 2013 that was approved by the NFAC for a Volume 2 of the Daily Reflections. As you may recall, this “died in committee” or more accurately put, the Literature Trustees committee took no action and noted there is “not currently a widely expressed need”. We talked about ways to re-submit or foster up support / query other Area's for interest. I suggested the upcoming Southeast Regional Forum in Lake Mary in December 2016 is the perfect venue for such a discussion / sharing. To kick off the New Year, the fun has already started for me. I have received my 66th GSC communications kit from GSO office and have started the process of preparing for the

conference. In the next few weeks, I'll be reaching out and sending a welcome to the new Panel 66 Delegates recently assigned to the PI committee as well as the current Panel 65's. I will be flying to NY to attend the General Service Board weekend – which is really Thursday through Monday and then on Friday fly up to Atlanta for the SE Delegate's get-together. And then, 1 week later I'll receive our Valentine's gift from the Conference Coordinator – the 66th background material. DCMs I need your help. Please ensure your email address is updated with our Registrar as he will supply me those email addresses. We will send you the link to download the background information from our secured website. I have already received a few tentative dates for pre-conference workshops and we'll be communicating the next few weeks to firm those up. I look forward to seeing you in your neck of the woods to go over and make sense of all this information with the help of our Panel members. In other news, The AAWS Board has posted an opening for a Non-Trustee Director of the AAWS Board. Some of the qualities they are looking for are a Professional background in business, legal, publishing, IT. A minimum 7 years of sobriety. And most importantly the ability to attend all the regular meetings (8 a year) plus 1 week at the Conference. The announcement and application has been posted on our website. The application must be received by Feb 1, 2016. I have submitted both requests for Conference Agenda items that you approved at the last Assembly: the request for an increase in the number of World Service Reports printed, and an audio version of the Service Manual. I have received confirmation that both items have been forwarded to the Publishing Committee for further consideration. The remainder of my report are some highlights passed to me from the most recent General Service Board Weekend in November:

Cooperation with Professional Communities (CPC): The *Three Talks to Medical Societies* has been approved to be retired due to the content being outdated as a CPC piece. Corrections: A draft video of *It Sure Beats Sitting in a Cell* was shown and received favorable reviews. Finance: To try to summarize a lot of pages of numbers and percentages, overall, sales are considerably under budget as of 9/30/15 and it is estimated a loss of \$200,000 for the close of 2015 and an estimated loss of \$300,000 for 2016. Grapevine: I'm pleased to share that Grapevine is in the black by approximately \$ 200,000 due to more subscriptions than expected and less expenses than budgeted. In addition, LaVina's shortfall is also less than expected at -\$99,000. International Conventions: It is expected that the final numbers for Atlanta will be at roughly a \$219,000 loss. To put this into perspective, the challenges of estimating and budgeting an International can be summarized by looking at some previous convention numbers; In San Diego we had a \$600,000 loss, Minneapolis was nearly a \$1,000,000 gain, Toronto was a \$40,000 loss and San Antonio was a \$800,000 gain. After analysis, the main reason for the loss was the additional costs of additional transportation – buses. The additional registrants were booked in hotels further away from the convention center and therefore new additional bus routes were added to accommodate those. All the same, the board is taking this seriously and it will factor into the decision as to what firm will receive our business to manage the 2020 Convention in Detroit. Literature: Following up on the approved Conference items for *AA for the Woman*, *AA for the Gay/Lesbian Alcoholic*, and literature for the AA's with mental illness and those who sponsor them – they have received over 220 stories for consideration. Also, there was a request for a Conference agenda item for a plain language version of Alcoholics Anonymous. This was agreed to be forwarded to the Conference Committee. Public Information: Notable items is the approved P.S.A. "Doors" is performing well and was approved for the CNN Airport network to be shown at various large metropolitan airports during September 2015. Also the committee reviewed a Conference Agenda item request for a video aimed at educating the fellowship on anonymity online from our neighbors in S. Florida and that it will be discussed at the January Board meeting. Thank you for your time this morning in allowing me to share these items from your General Service Board and thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Alternate Delegate: Joyce C. - Glenn and I finished up post conference reports in District 14, 18 and in combined districts in Jacksonville. The Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee met in November at the Eastside Club in Orlando. We said goodbye to the representatives of the 58th Florida State Convention. Annette gave the final report of the 59th Convention and now takes over chairing the JAC. Also in November, I attended the Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly in Huntington, WVA. I was honored to be representing North Florida in a skit called "The General Service Structure with Live Examples – Life of a GSC Agenda Item" or simply "The Skit". This was a fun way to present this subject and important with the fact that many attending had never been to a service assembly before. One of the great things about this assembly is that each of the service positions have a "workshop" dedicated to their position. So it is a good time to get ideas, solutions and just networking with people doing the same job as you. I of course attended the Alternate Delegate roundtable. Some panels I attended included: Safeguarding our Traditions through the Evolution of Technology; Responsibility for AA – As Members, As Trusted Servants. These included lively discussions. Other

activities included panels featuring Traditions, Concepts, Trustee Panel, Sharing Session, Ask It Basket, and the Business Meeting on Sunday at which 3 areas stated an interest in hosting SSAASA, including South Florida. Stay tuned for more information about that. Thank you for the allowing me to serve.

Chairperson's Report: Heather V.-W. - Thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Area 14 Panel 65 Chairperson. I would like to welcome our new trusted servants. All new G.S.R.'s and D.C.M.'s with orange badges, please stand. Thank you for your continued commitment to service. I also want to recognize all our visitors with green badges, please stand. Thank you for your interest in Service and participation. I would like to thank Melanie E., Alt. Website Service Coordinator for facilitating the DCM Mini Workshop and Rick W., GSO Staff Member, for visiting NFAC and giving a wonderful presentation that was well attended and warmly received. I would also like to thank FCYPAA for volunteering this weekend to assist with our host overflow responsibilities. Yvonne N., former Grapevine/La Viña Service Coordinator moved to South Florida and will be missed. Please join me in welcoming Paula D. to her new position as Grapevine/La Viña Service Coordinator. Richard H., former Corrections Service Coordinator has expressed his need to step down from his position due to health issues. His Alternate, Bob C. will assume the Corrections Service Coordinator position. Please join me in welcoming Bob. Please be cognizant when placing flyers on the Registration table and use Traditions 6 and 7 as your guide. The flyers must be approved by the Alternate Chairperson before you place them on the Registration table, if you have questions contact Kelly. There are two senses of the Assembly that will come up under new business from FCYPAA regarding letters of support. It appears we are duplicating efforts. We have just taken a fearless and moral inventory in October and appointed an Ad Hoc Committee to make recommendations to the area on each issue therefore effective today I'm disbanding the Structures & Guidelines and Strategic IT Plan Ad Hoc Committees. I'd like to thank those appointed to this Committee for their hard work and dedication, your efforts and time are extremely valuable. I'm requesting those interested in these Committees to create a new scope for consideration or visit the Ad Hoc Inventory Committee in April. The meeting will be posted on the Agenda. Our next Assembly is April 8 – 10, 2016.

Alternate Chair: Kelly J. – The date for October 2016 Assembly (Voting Assembly) is September 30-October 2, 2016. Total hotel bill for January Assembly \$2178.66. (\$317 Audio Visual, \$750 Coffee, \$1111.50 Guest Rooms). Our attendance this weekend: GSR/Alts-159, DCMs/ALTs-42, Officers/Service Coordinators/Administrative Chairs/Past Delegate-34, Visitors-60 for a total of 295. Thank you Tom G. for being our Past Delegate this weekend. A special thanks for host district 17 for Registration, District 1 for Friday Night Meeting, Districts 13, 27, and 33 for hosting Grapevine/ La Viña Room, District 28 for Traditions, baskets for Saturday and Sunday and chairing Saturday Night meeting. Registrar: Richard C. - We have 181 in attendance today with 2/3rd's = 121. We mailed 225 October minutes at a cost of \$81.45. Of those mailed we had only 8 returned at a cost of \$18.16. SPECIAL REPORTS

60th Florida State Convention Report: – (Given by Jerry M., Co-Chair) Hello. My name is David G. and I serve as the chairperson for the 60th FL State Convention to be held Aug 3rd – 7th 2016 at Innisbrook Spa and Resort in Palm Harbor, FL. We have been very busy since our last meeting. Our Outreach committee has been working very hard at all kinds of events to spread the word and get people excited to preregister. Our mail chimp email account and secret Facebook page have been very effective for news, events and information. Our Deep Fried Turkey and Trivia was a success. We received 15 new registrations and over \$200.00 in donations. The Convention Committee stepped up and made it a real fun event. We are planning to have a Seafood Boil event in the early Spring so stay tuned! Due to everyone's hard work we passed the 500 registration mark for the beginning of 2016. Our numbers are as follows Registrations 527, Friday Banquet 74, Saturday Banquet 139 and our room block is 437. Accessibilities: September Grace W. – With an attendance of six, we discussed the reasons individuals were interested in Accessibilities, as well as handing out pamphlets that are part of the GSO Special Needs/Accessibilities Kit. We discussed: 1)Assessment of current meeting places in compliance with American Disabilities Act or setting up meeting rooms so that they may be easily navigated by all who attend, 2) With the hearing impaired, use of ASL interpreter, head phones synched with speaker / chairperson, setting up the room in a circle for everyone who can read lips, asking all to speak as clearly as possible, and 3) Working with others regarding spiritual understanding of those with a non-Abrahamic god. Then we talked about workshop for April Assembly. As always, thank you for letting me serve.

Archives: Kevin G. – (Report was given by Archivist, Scott B.) My name is Kevin Jr. I am a grateful alcoholic with the honor and privilege to serve as your Archives Committee Service Coordinator for Area 14 Panel 65. First I want to recognize John M, Mike L and Ken L, District 14 Archives, for their truly outstanding presentation on the numerous changes to the District boundary, early members and meeting locations. Second I want to recognize Steve R, who designed and manufactured the great buttons to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the start of AA in Florida in January 1941. During lunch yesterday 32 members watched the movie "Bill discusses the Traditions" where Bill provided his insight why we must follow our traditions if we want our fellowship to be here for the next 75 years. After the movie we convened the Archives Workshop meeting with 47 members. We reviewed our four goals: 1) Obtain group histories and meeting location pictures. 2) Recruit District history speakers, 3) Organize District and Group Archivists and 4) Show great AA movies during Assembly lunch. Our Area Archivist, Scott B, discussed the status of the Area digital archives and history book. The very first registered Group of Florida began 75 years ago in Jacksonville, Florida in 1941. We have been serving the alcoholics of this State for ¾'s of a century. You could say: "back in 1941 we stepped out of the shadows of Alcoholism and walked into the Sunlight of the Spirit". Now as a member of our Florida fellowship, I truly understand why we call this the "Sunshine State"! Annette D. & Vivian F. came out to the repository to glean some materials for the District 12 Archives Workshop, past Structures & Guidelines clarification and lost/ updated past minutes. Great work Ladies, thank you. Annette D. is also going to help in beginning the digitizing of all of the NFAC audio cassettes. I also attended the District 12 Workshop and discovered a Florida founding member (Junius Cotten) 1918 Naval Academy yearbook page. We were able to track down the original color document and reproduce a nice copy. This was on display with some other Florida A.A. history in Archives room. Would like to thank both Past Archivist Stephen R. and Past Akron Archivist Gail L. for their assistance and donation of a large amount of past Grapevines that resided in Dr. Bob's house. During a recent inventory of Dr. Bob archives there were many multiples, and through the current relationship & generosity that Florida Archives has with Dr. Bob's house it was recommended that the NFAC archives would be a good fit for some of their missing Grapevines. Cooperation W/Professional Community: Andres R. (Alternate Service Coordinator) - Good morning everyone! Thank you for allowing to me serve as your CPC Alternate Service Coordinator. Our workshop was called to order at 10:00 AM with the Serenity Prayer. There were approximately 24 people in attendance. We began our workshop with the usual introductions and courtesies. We made an announcement for an upcoming conference that GSO has asked us to attend in Orlando for "Student Affairs Professionals in Higher Education". It will take place Jan. 21-23. Also we discussed how next area assembly we will be covering conference agenda items which relate to CPC. Being that we are starting the new year, we decided the workshop would concentrate on "celebrating our successes". We had a panel that consisted of Richard C., District 20; Carolyn B., District 11 & myself. I led with my experience in trying to coordinate for this workshop and how I tried to get a judge to come talk to us, which was a failure, so I thought. I didn't realize until right before my workshop that I wasn't a failure. I was a success because I made my first steps. It was clear at that moment, God wanted something completely different and I was okay with that. Our other panelists, although new to the role, have made amazing progress! Their success was simply following what our literature and workshops from this past year have stated, "start with a committee". Corrections: Bob C. - Bob C. opened the meeting at 10:00 am with the Serenity Prayer. 25 people were in attendance. Rich H. announced that he was stepping down (health reasons) as Corrections Service Coordinator and Bob C. (Alt. Service Coordinator) will take over the duties of Corrections Service Coordinator. Bob announced he needs an alternate and asked for volunteers. Bob asked the group what he can do as Service Coordinator. He gave out his phone number

(904) 860-9356 and email cookpr11@att.net. He said that he is available for helping the area with prison officials to gain access, for workshops, and any other corrections related activities. A discussion took place about the various requirements for individuals to gain access to facilities in the county and state facilities. The group came up with an idea of developing a list of people who are willing to speak at institutions. The people on the list will have to have the normal background check and obtain a PIN. They will be put on a list and will have the ability to go to different institutions to speak. Dan E. is willing to help get the PINs. So far there are two volunteer speakers. Bob C. will pursue this idea and get it organized. More to follow as this develops. Bob C. explained to the group that there must be communication among the various Corrections service communities to be successful. The Area gets a lot of request for pre-release volunteers and for literature. In order to help the inmates that are in need, communication is critical. Closed the meeting at 11:00 AM with the Responsibility Statement.

Grapevine/La Viña: Paula D. - Good morning. My name is Paula and I am an alcoholic. It is a privilege to serve as the North Florida Area 14 Grapevine/ La Viña Service Coordinator for Panel 65. Thank you Districts 13, 27 & 33 for hosting the GV/La Viña room yesterday and a big 'thank you' also to all who pitched in to help. We had book sales of \$132.70 including sales tax and \$415.00 in raffle tickets for a total collection of \$547.70. Last night, we raffled off 11 Grapevine / La Viña subscriptions; 6 of those subscriptions were donated back to the Area "Grapes for Mates" Campaign. Thanks to all of the visitors to the Vine and all who supported our activities yesterday. The focus of Saturday's workshop was on how to carry the language of the heart within our districts and to learn the difference between AAWS literature and Grapevine/ La Viña literature. We made a display poster for a District's Grapevine Representative to take back to District 10, to demonstrate how easily it can be accomplished. We discussed how the display can be used. We had 16 members representing 12 districts in attendance. Thank you to Sandy H. from District 28 for passing out the quiz and assisting with the workshop. In the future, I have scheduled to facilitate a "Record Your Story Workshop in District 10" on January 30. Thank you again for this opportunity to serve Area 14.

Cooperation with Intergroup: Linda G. – (Report given by ALT – Vickie E.) We had 16 people in attendance at the Intergroup workshop today. The discussion focused on conducting intergroup inventories. The AA members present were asked whether this was something that might be of interest, or whether their local intergroup did this on a regular basis? It was brought to our attention that at least one of our local intergroups had recently completed an inventory. A report on how the intergroup set up the inventory and what they learned was given. One problem with conducting an accurate inventory seems to be that people don't return the inventory questions. This is an overall problem and not just a problem at the intergroup level. Some intergroups stated that they are mainly a 12 step call service, and they direct the calls appropriately to the members of the 12 step committee and service calls to the local DCMs. Not everyone felt that taking an intergroup inventory would work for them. Questions that were used by other intergroups in the past were brought up and at least one intergroup felt that it was a good idea to review the Traditions checklist put out by the Grapevine to help educate members about A.A. groups, meetings and the AA service entities available both in general service and intergroups. Discussion then turned off topic about how effective sponsorship is needed to help newcomers learn about A.A. Being out of time the meeting then ended. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Literature: Lori P. – Our agenda began with reviewing changes included in the 2016 Literature Catalog. The following Conference Approved literature offerings were added: Living Sober e-book is now in French, 2015-16 Service Manual is now available, Public Service Announcement "Doors" (DVP-06) is now available and "A Brief History of the Big Book" in English, French and Spanish (M-73) are included in the items added. In addition, the Literature Catalog for the Alcoholic with Special Needs is also available in audio on aa.org. Literature prices, discounts and shipping charges remain the same. The workshop was provided with a list of those Literature items which are available at no charge. In total there are 80 pieces including Service Materials, Guidelines, Flyers and Pamphlets. It was requested after October's Assembly that on the January agenda the Literature Workshop consider vetting a sample 4th Step workbook based solely on the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous which was provided by a fellowship member who prefers to remain anonymous. We used the workbook as a vehicle to discuss if the workshop participants supported the creation of a workbook of this type and if the feeling was that there was a need for this by the fellowship as a whole. There was some great discussion on this topic and as a result the sense of the room was that this idea should be carried back to groups to inquire of the interest in a workbook of this type. We will pick the discussion back up with the feedback from groups at April's Assembly. In wrapping up, we briefly discussed the Saturday Evening

Post Article titled “Making the Case for A.A.” which releases in the January 11th issue. This article is said to revisit the Jack Alexander Article of 1941 and how the original article would become a turning point in our organization’s history. On closing, thank you to everyone for participating in our workshop and the lively discussion, to Meriem M. for taking notes and to this body for allowing me to serve you.

Public Information: Donna W. – Good morning, everyone, I am an alcoholic and a member of District 32. My name is Barry T. and I am serving as your Area 14 Public Information Alternate Service Coordinator, standing in for our Service Coordinator, Donna W. Donna and I co-chaired a great workshop yesterday with 44 participants titled “Celebrating our Successes in Public Information Service Work.” Realizing how tough it is to grow and nurture a service group, we worked with Andres R, Cooperation with the Professional Community Alternate Service Coordinator, to present a matched set of workshops featuring examples that prove a little bit of faith and a lot of hard work can really pay off. I had the opportunity to make a presentation on my attempts, challenges and ultimate successes in carrying the A.A. message by setting up and stocking A.A. literature racks in public places, distributing A.A. public service announcements to the media, and sharing information about A.A. through the A.A. Membership Survey. Richard B. from District 14 shared his committee’s success in interesting DUI school professionals in a presentation, and Donna shared District 14’s ongoing efforts and successes in carrying the message to middle and high school students. Everyone agreed that it’s great to celebrate these moments of success, especially at the start of a new year. Special thanks to Andres for taking notes at the workshop and to Nanette L from District 1 for sign-in assistance. Activities pursued by our committee since the last assembly in October – which we consider additional successes to celebrate – included two presentations that are part of the “Donna and Marty roadshow,” launched in an effort to assist districts throughout the North Florida Area nurture and grow Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community committees; in other words, what to do after GSO sends you “the box”? Donna and Marty visited the Jacksonville area on November 14, serving Districts 1, 3, 4, 6, 24, 25 and 30. On December 5, Donna visited New Smyrna Beach, serving Districts 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 18, 19, 21, 22 and 32. More than two-dozen A.A. members attended the workshops, which included information on how to form PI/CPC committees, activities to pursue, and where to go for resources. We look forward to continuing these workshops until we’ve covered the entire North Florida area. We also look forward to joining with our Area 14 Cooperation with the Professional Community group in accommodating a request from the General Service Office to staff a booth at a conference of Student Affairs Professionals in Higher Education on January 21-23 in Orlando. This group reached out to GSO, and they in turn reached out to us as the local contact. Thankfully, we have boots on the ground ready, willing and able to answer the call and be of service. Reviewed past year for strengths, weaknesses and opportunities; Many Districts with treatment facilities; Importance of relationship with the staff at treatment providers; One point of contact so there are not many calls to the facility; Their house (the facility) their rules; Obtaining information on starting a treatment; Contacting outpatient treatment programs to offer speakers; How to handle money from the basket when different groups are responsible for taking the meeting; Much discussion about volunteers: use flyers, announce at District and local AA meetings. Most popular idea was on-on-one discussion about service; How do we handle the issue of cross addiction/dual addiction. Most everyone agreed it is important to carry the message of recovery. Great opportunity for sharing what works, what doesn't and the importance of meeting at treatment facilities. Respectively submitted, Carson F.

Two motions brought to the committee. 1) Move to amend the October 2016 motion that approved the 2016 budget as follows: Move to approve the 2016 budget as presented in the July 2015 minutes and corrected in the Finance Report. 2) Moved, Section 17, current paragraph be renumbered to 17.A, and 17.B added as follows:
Within 30 days prior to any event, trusted servants shall receive advance payment of authorized expenses for that event, in full, if requested. For expenses requiring payment prior to the event such as airline tickets, registration fees and hotel deposits, fund shall be advanced within 30 days prior to the anticipated payment due date. The request will be submitted on a reimbursement form – marked “Advance Request”. The payee will, within 15 days after the event date, provide to the Area Treasurer a reimbursement form, with receipts for all expenses except mileage. The receipt should include date,

place, purpose of expense and reflect proof of payment. It should include return of any overpayment that resulted from the advance. At the discretion of the Treasurer prior advances must be reconciled before a new advance may be issued. We then had a lively discussion concerning some potential funding issues peripheral to the Florida State Convention.

Growth Committee: Joyce C. – The meeting opened by Joyce C., Alt. Delegate, Growth Chair, 25 in attendance. Since DCMs were reassigned to Administrative Committees to bring each to an even number, introductions were made. With quite a few members attending who had not come to the growth meeting before, the Ad Hoc Committee members were introduced as well. Dan E., Past Delegate gave an explanation of the Ad Hoc Committee and their responsibilities to the Growth Committee. Work on Structures and Guidelines continues. The corrected document reflected in a motion passed last assembly has not been completed, so at this meeting it was felt that nothing could be accomplished until we had the finished document. Terri-Lynn, Parliamentarian, had a suggested motion on “voting procedures” regarding non-election assemblies tabled last assembly. The wording of the motion was restated and brought back with additional background. This was refined and brought back to Growth in January 2016. The meeting closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

Clicks reported last 30 days: Spanish info, Assembly Agenda, Meeting Info (Intergroup/Central Offices), Activities page, Map of Counties, Grapevine Quote of the Day, Rule 62 (Password Protected Area), Service Bodies, Fillable forms, Area News. Closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

AD HOC – Area 14 Inventory: Clark M. – I would like to thank those on the committee for their enthusiasm and participation yesterday. We had the opportunity to respond to the issues brought up during our Area 14 inventory. We have appointed sub-committees comprised of DCMs, GSRs and Officers to address each question’s issues and come to the April Assembly with our recommendations.

Summary of Conference Procedures

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on as informal a basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Each Committee considers carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are urged to resist the temptation to edit recommendations on the floor.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and are called on in order.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to, and should, express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.

- Premature actions (e.g., amending motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question) can divert attention from the subject at hand, thus confusing and/or delaying Conference business.
- Voting is by show of hands.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion (postponing discussion to a later time during the same Conference):

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Needs only a *simple majority* to pass.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate. A motion to call the question:

- Must be made in order at the microphone.
- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds vote*.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone.

- Only a *simple majority* is required.
- If the majority votes to reconsider, *full debate*, pro and con, is resumed. (Conference members are urged to limit discussion to *new* considerations of the question under debate.)
- No action may be reconsidered twice.

Floor Actions

Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions, and:

- Must be made without comment.
- Must be submitted in writing by the maker to the Conference secretary.
- Will come up for deliberation after all Committee reports have been heard.
- Require a *two-thirds majority*.

When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action. A motion to decline to hear a floor action:

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds majority*.
