ORDER OF BUSINESS
July 10, 2016

Chairperson: Heather V-W. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00 am on Sunday, July 10, 2016.

Registrar: Richard C. - We have 187 in attendance today with 126 being 2/3.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Chair: Most of us have heard by now of the passing of our Treasurer, Kay M. I have named Marilyn B. to serve out her term as Interim Treasurer.

Secretary: Annette D. – My name is Annette and I am privileged to serve as your Secretary. My home group is Early Birds in District 12. New envelopes were ordered and the minutes were mailed to the Registrar within the two weeks after the assembly. Updated Officer and Service Coordinator service resumes were uploaded to the website and were available on the Registration table this weekend. If you didn't pick up one, there are plenty left up here. If you present a resume this morning, please give me a copy for the minutes, via email, if possible. I have received two minor typos corrections to the April Minutes – the date in the header of page one and an error in the Intergroup report – are there any other corrections? Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, seconded and passed.

Interim Treasurer: Marilyn B. - Good Morning I'm an alcoholic and my name is Marilyn B. I am privileged to serve as you Interim Treasurer. Before I begin with the Treasurer's Report I need to give you a little idea of what was going on over the last month. Many do not know that Annette D., our Panel 65 Secretary was Kay's Service Sponsor. As Kay's health began to fail and she realized she would need to step down, she contacted Annette who contacted our Area Chair. Annette drove to Port Orange and met with Kay and was able to get all of the Treasurer's files and the laptop. After our Chair appointed me to be your Interim Treasurer, Annette immediately sent me a backup of our files and worked with me making contribution deposits and helping with the preparation of the documents you have before you, as well as the proposed 2017 Budget that was presented to our Finance Committee yesterday. With Annette's help we were prepared to have everything needed for this Assembly. How blessed I am to have a sister in sobriety to work with. I would also like to publicly thank our Panel 47 Delegate and Past Southeast Regional Trustee from 2001-2005, Dick G., who will be filing our IRS 990 tax return. Folks, we are not in the boat alone. Let's now review our financials. Looking at the Balance Sheet, you can see if you combine our CD, Money Market, Cash on Hand, Inventory, and the cash in the Checking Account we currently have \$84,438.6 total assets. Our income for the 1st half of 2016 is on track with the projected budget, and our expenses are under budget projections. As you can see, we had income in excess of expenses of \$7,965.08 as of June 30th. Historically speaking expenses are usually higher in the 3rd quarter and this year our expenses will be higher in the 4th quarter for two reasons; the Southeast Regional Forum and the Officers get together after the elections. It is a pleasure to once again serve the NFAC. Thank you. Chair entertained a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, subject to audit. Motion made, seconded and passed.

Delegate: Glenn W. - First, I wish to recognize and thank our Past Delegates: Dan E. Panel 45, Dick G. Panel 47 and also past Southeast Regional Trustee, Tom G. Panel 51, Corliss G. Panel 53, Michael S. Panel 55, Fred H. Panel 57, Cecilia R. Panel 61, and Marilyn B. Panel 63. Since our last Assembly, I attended the 66th General Service Conference in New York and if you were here yesterday I gave my report-back to you all. I am still available to give the same presentation or a variation in your local District if you wish. Joyce and I will be heading over to Brooksville the beginning of August to present there. Other “AA as a whole” issues, I along with all other conference members, received correspondence from Russia appealing GSO’s decision regarding licensing of AA literature. This is an issue that has been ongoing for at least 3 years now and to try to simplify and summarize; a few years ago the Russian AA Service structure basically had a split between the legal-side (the Board) and the fellowship (the Groups and office servicing the Groups). Our AAWS policy is that we only provide a single license to reprint AA literature per country so when this happened our AAWS office was faced with the challenge of who gets the license. After numerous trips by members of our General Service Board and GSO to try to understand and assist Russia, the decision was to provide permission and license to the equivalent of the Russia GSO which services the Groups. The equivalent of the former Russia General Service Board is the party that is appealing the decision. This puts into perspective something I think many take for granted here that our service structure - even with the current challenges facing us - is fundamentally very solid. There is also an announcement for a search to fulfill the upcoming vacancy for a Class-A (non-alcoholic) Trustee. These are generally suggested through members of the fellowship. The resume submission deadline is July 31. We will also be electing a new Southeast Regional Trustee and a U.S. Trustee at Large at the next Conference. This process will actually begin with our next Assembly here where we will elect our nominees for those positions. Following the 66th General Service Conference Advisory Action to revise the pamphlet “Young People in A.A.”, a call for stories has been requested. Stories should be 500-800 words and can be submitted to literature@aa.org. I also wish to thank all of those whom, since the last Assembly, have offered their condolences following the loss of my brother. Each and every one is sincerely appreciated as this has been the most difficult year of my sobriety and life. I wish to leave on a positive note this morning. Eight years ago right here let’s just say “boy meets girl on AA Campus” - actually Assembly. It is my pleasure to announce that as of next week you will no longer have a bachelor Delegate as Marcela and I will be getting married in Mexico. Thank you for this privilege to serve you and AA as a whole. Yours in service, Glenn W.

I sincerely appreciate all those involved in assisting with this sensitive transition. The responsibilities of the Oversight Committee and of the Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee were explained. There was a brief discussion about the process these committees use to work together to make the best Florida State Convention whether it takes place in North or South Florida. We heard a report from the 60th Florida State Convention, in Innisbrook, August 3-7, 2016. You have already heard that report, so I won't go into detail here except to say that if you aren't already registered, this would be a good time to do so. Also, Ruth R., chair of the 61st Florida State Convention, Jacksonville updated us with her report, as did her treasurer Walter S. The committee was informed of the status of the implementing a professional to service the convention website so that the transfer from one convention to the next can happen seamlessly and without the difficulties which have been encountered in the past. We also discussed the Bid process. There is a bid packet on our website which answers a lot of questions about how to go about proposing a bid. Area Inventory Ad Hoc Committee: Clarke M. – The Ad Hoc Committee met and discussed recommendations to issues raised in the Area 14 Inventory Survey. We plan to finalize our recommendations at our next Committee meeting and pass those on to the next panel.

SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS

Accessibilities: September Grace W. – As hosts of the Friday night meeting, The Accessibilities group started with skit relating Accessibilities with Tradition Three. This was followed by an open discussion allowing each of us to gain a better understanding of those about us with accessibilities issues. On Saturday we spoke about individual A.A.s with physical, mental, emotional, learning disorders, and visual and hearing impairments. We spoke of looking for solutions to problems by our various district committees, i.e. literature on CD for illiterate, dyslexic or visually impaired A.A.s; also ASL DVDs for the hearing impaired. We also discussed who pays for ASL interpreter-the home group, district, intergroup; setting up AA meetings in schools for the hearing or visually impaired. Solutions may be found in GSO guidelines. Many of us parted with a greater understanding of how to carry the message to the alcoholic. September-Grace W., Panel 65 Area 14 Accessibilities Coordinator.

Archives: Kevin G. – My name is Kevin Jr. I am a grateful alcoholic with the honor and privilege to serve as your Archives Service Coordinator. We met with 45 members of the District Archives Committees yesterday morning. Rich D., DCM 17 and Wayne C, a District oldtimer who got sober in Ocala 37 years ago gave a great presentation on the history of AA in Marion County that started in 1946 with three meetings a week including one in a converted bar. The District now has over 140 meetings a week and Rich has done a super job obtaining the histories and location pictures for majority of the groups. We hope that District 17's presentation inspires other DCMs and GSRs to obtain their district and group histories and meeting location pictures by the next assembly for the Area 14 history book. We discussed plans for Scott to participate in the National Archives Workshop this September in San Francisco and provide a report at the next Assembly. We also discussed plans for the Annual Florida Archives workshop in coordination with Area 15 in the Fall of 2017.

Archivist: Scott B. – Good Morning Everyone, so grateful to be serving the North Florida Area as your Archivist. First I would like to thank everyone who is contributing to our efforts in preserving the story and history of the North Florida Area. There certainly seems to be a growing enthusiasm in these efforts. We can do together that which we cannot do alone. I'm going to go off script here; sorry to our translator for this inconvenience. The last Quarter was quite difficult for me. Directly following the April Assembly, I did not get a day off from work until the last Sunday of May. I spent June playing catchup with my family. And during that time I have had to deal directly with the disease within my family. My step son has been in jail, released to rehab/bridge the gap program and off to halfway house with a 4-year probation. Last month he relapsed, broke probation; and instead of turning himself in and starting over. He decided to tie one on and rat and run the roads; ending up with another arrest and the possibility of 30 years in prison. This has been very difficult for my wife and I. If it was not for the assistance of our fellowship, A.A. and Al-Anon, I know it would have been much worse. I feel as though I was unable to get anything Archives accomplished lately; but am grateful for everyone's support and assistance. Thank you! Super shout out for the District 17 DCM Rick D. who compiled and edited a wealth of group history, information and photos for the entire District from their humble

beginnings to today. Nearly 100 documents covering both current groups and ones that have closed with photos and labels. Prior to his efforts we had **only one** group for the entire District 17 file. We are grateful for the Archivist and Historian they now have. Thank you for serving our whole Area. Also Vivian F., Annette D., and Cecilia R. who have continued with time consuming effort scanning past correspondence, and passcode PDFs for proper redacting and access; along with the massive undertaking of digitizing our past Area 14 cassette audio tapes! Can't wait to hear some of those voices from our beginning. I am sure there are soon to be discovered treasures in them. Kevin G. dropped off boxes of material containing lots old correspondence and Jacksonville info from past Delegate Jimmy G., There were Box 459s and GSO info, including some past State convention, lots of these even have the original envelopes. Speaking about Russia, our Delegate Glen W. mentioned their current Dilemma in getting Alcoholics Anonymous books printed. Originally it took over 30 years to get the first Twelve and Twelve in that country that wasn't smuggled in. The first edition Russian Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions was not even printed until 1989!! Amazing length of time to get A.A. behind the Iron Curtain. Thank you for allowing me to serve such an amazing Area and fellowship. Yours in Service, Scott B., Archivist, Area 14 Panel 65.

Cooperation W/Professional Community: Marty C. - Good Morning Family, we opened our workshop with the Serenity Prayer. We had 42 A.A. members in attendance (this number is growing with each assembly). We went over the outcome of our CPC General Service Conference Agenda Items that Our Delegate covered later in the afternoon. We talked about working with the elderly community. There are Cooperation with the Elderly Community committees (CEC) popping up around the country as well as Sober Over Sixty (SOS) groups and Seniors in Sobriety (SIS) groups. The intention is to get seniors back involved with the fellowship and service structure. I plan to talk with our Accessibility Service Coordinator (September-Grace) about this further. We also talked about talking with nursing home staff about bringing meetings into their facilities. We have started a monthly conference call with the district CPC, PI, CPC/PI chairs in our area. Including the Chairs we are adding from this assembly, we have 19 districts represented. This has proven to be a GREAT tool!!! We've had 3 calls so far. It allows us to meet 16 times a year instead of 4. We are setting monthly goals and task, sharing experience-strength and hope, sharing ideas, brainstorming, if one district is having a problem, maybe another district has the solution already. The PI-CPC Exchange News Letter is now coming out of Area 14. Vivian F. is the new editor. In the latest issue are articles by Donna W and myself on Traditions and PI-CPC work and our new conference call. A big thank you to Vivian for taking this on. She even reached out to foreign counties. I will be attending the La Raza Conference in Orlando on July 23-26. It's a Hispanic networking conference that will have 1500-2000 in attendance. The GSO is funding the event and is covering the registration, literature, and table rental. Carlos and some other bilingual A.A. member will be coming with me as well as Dr. Larry and Carolyn. Donna W. and I will also be doing a CPC-PI Workshop in District 9 on August 27th. Our workshop consisted of 3 presentations: **1)** Andre R. from District 10 talked about starting a monthly meeting with CPC Chairs from Districts 9, 10, 11, and 18 (Orlando area). They set a goal of reaching out to 5 clergy members from each District. Andres also called me about getting funding from the GSO for the Annual Behavioral Health Conference. The registration is around \$1500. When I contacted Tracy at the CPC Desk at the GSO, she said that it would be Conference. that they would like to fund next year, but the budget for this year has already been passed by the General Service Board. She did contact the Conf. and will be putting them on the docket to be funded next year as well as providing a speaker for it. The amazing thing is that the 4 Districts decided to fund it themselves and will be going this year as well. **2)** Peter C. from District 4 talked about the Google Drive account that he set up for our District CPC/PI Committees. This idea came out of our June Conference call. We can store documents, presentations, workshop outlines, information to pass on to future CPC/PI Chairs in the cloud. It will be password protected. We are just in the starting stages of this and I will have more to report in October. **3)** Maggie R. from District 3 (Northeast Florida Intergroup CPC-PI Chair serving the 7 Districts of the Greater Jacksonville Area) talked about how she established and started her Committee. She started from scratch and now has a very active, up and running committee of 12 members. We closed with the Responsibility Statement. In loving service, Marty C.

Corrections: Bob C. – Good Morning. My name is Bob and I'm your Corrections Service Coordinator for Panel 65. We had a very good workshop yesterday. We had 32 in attendance and, as a side note, I've seen more and more new faces. That's good news. We discussed Grapevine and the joint workshop coming in September between Area 14 and 15. We are asking the East Side Club in Winter Park for the 25th. We are planning on a panel of former inmates to speak to our guests. We also discussed doing 5th steps with inmates and sponsor work with inmates. We talked about state institutions and what's going on with a big turnover in corrections officers and other offices. As you know, in October we are having elections, and we encourage anyone who wants to do service work in corrections to get their resume ready for the new chair. I had open discussion on how facility meetings are going and literature, and about applications and different regulations to get inside. We closed with the Responsibility Statement. Thank for allowing me to serve.

Cooperation with Intergroup: Linda G. - 35 people in attendance. Started with the outside issue: A pair of flip flops, swimmer, and a candle. The flip flops are because sometimes we seem to flip flop around trying to find the answer, then we find ourselves swimming around with this and that. And then all of a sudden the candle is when the light comes on. We then opened with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Thank you Vickie, my Alternate, for taking notes. We then opened the floor for people to share what was going on at their intergroups. A gentleman from Leesburg shared that they were going to a point of sale system that helps with inventory and less paper work on sales. Jacksonville also is going to the same system and is also looking to move their office, hopefully soon. Another gentleman shared their intergroup manager retired and is leaving the end of July. There was another gentleman who said their intergroup was in the red and having some issues. We had a guest, Vivian F., who was sharing about "Me+ Plus One". This is an awareness program. It came about when the General Service Board announced their money issues. It is an awareness program that helps show awareness of it costs money for the books, pamphlets, and translators. "Me+ Plus One" does not "ask or beg" for money, it just creates awareness of what is needed for us to be self-supporting. Some suggested that this be sent to the AAWS, and it was, and it was very well received. There were suggestions: faithful fivers, double nickel club - \$1000 putting a extra dollar in the basket for someone who cannot. A pamphlet was given to them on the 12 steps illustrated and they translated that into the three languages. But to translate the Big Book into Chin and Koun, we need a translator. We here do not think about that cost. We have translated a lot of books and it does cost a lot of money. So that is why the "Me+ Plus One", for awareness. Please feel free to talk to Vivian. There was a lot of wonderful feedback. Thank you Vivian for sharing with us. In loving service, Linda G.

Grapevine/La Vina: Paula D. - Good morning everyone. My name is Paula, and I am an alcoholic. My home group is the First Thought Wrong Group in District 28. It is truly a privilege to serve the North Florida Area 14 as the Grapevine/ La Viña Service Coordinator for Panel 65. Thank you District 4 for hosting the Grapevine/La Viña room yesterday and a big 'thank you' also to all who pitched in to help. We had book sales of \$171.25, including sales tax, and \$406.00 in raffle tickets for a total collection of \$577.25. Last night, we raffled off 1 La Viña and 13 Grapevine gift certificates. Thank you to all of the visitors to the Vine Bookstore and all who supported our activities yesterday. During the workshop yesterday, Vivian F., DCM of District 11, presented background information regarding Spiritual Parity of Grapevine and La Viña. The key focus of our workshop was on the distribution of the Carry the Message Certificates or Grapevine and La Viña gift certificates received as a contribution from ICYPAA (International Convention of Young People of Alcoholics Anonymous). We were all excited and filled with gratitude!!! As a result of the successful 2015 ICYPAA convention, ICYPAA contributed 124 Grapevine and 14 La Viña annual subscription gift certificates to the North Florida and 124 Grapevine and 14 La Viña subscription gift certificates to the South Florida Areas; totaling 248 Grapevine and 28 La Viña gift certificates to the Florida Areas. At our workshop, we had a valuable decision to make. The

decision surrounded on how to maximize the benefit of the ever so gracious gift, to carry the message for the sick and suffering alcoholic. The final decision was made to combine the 124 Grapevine and 14 La Viña, and distribute the total of 138 subscriptions equally among the 34 Districts. Each District will receive 4 gift certificates for an annual subscription of the Grapevine and some Districts will also receive La Viña as one of the four. I will be sending out notifications to each of the DCM's with instructions on how they can receive their subscriptions. I will need to hear back from the DCM's no later than **September 20th, 2016**. Any gift certificates that remain unclaimed by a District after September 20th will be held by the Grapevine Service Coordinator as a future contribution to the Corrections or Grapes for Mates. Thank you again for this opportunity to serve Area 14.

Literature: Lori P. – 25 in attendance. This report was prepared and delivered by Meriem M. We opened the meeting discussing the outcome of the Literature Committee Agenda items of the 66th General Service Conference. Resulting advisory actions were also discussed. As a follow-up to the last Area Assembly's Literature Workshop, it was agreed that participants would get feedback from their groups to gauge interest in the notion of developing an A.A. approved 4th step inventory workbook. An engaging conversation facilitated the emergence of varied points of view during the ensuing discussion. Others felt that such a conference-approved piece of literature could prove beneficial for some members of our fellowship and should be an available option for those who choose to use it. When a sense of the room was taken, of those who decided to participate, ten members were in favor and 10 were opposed to the idea. Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Public Information: Donna W. – “ report given by Barry T.” Good morning, everyone, I am an alcoholic with the privilege of serving as your North Florida Area 14 Public Information Committee Alternate Service Coordinator and my name is Barry T. I'm giving the Public Information committee report today on behalf of our workshop's Service Coordinator, Donna W. In her report at yesterday's Public Information workshop, attended by 31 A.A. members, Donna shared highlights from the 66th General Service Conference in regard to Public Information, including Conference Advisory Actions and Committee Considerations. Donna also conveyed a request from the Public Information desk at the General Service Office that local A.A. fellowships share with GSO how they address the ongoing challenge of safeguarding our vital principle of anonymity. Donna encouraged all workshop participants, whether they were Public Information service workers or GSRs, to review an inventory of questions surrounding anonymity provided by GSO and brainstorm with their committees or groups ways we all can help educate A.A. members on how anonymity safeguards our fellowship as a whole. Our goal will be to compile the results of these brainstorming sessions and share them with the Public Information desk. In a very informative workshop titled, "What we can accomplish when we launch a district Public Information committee," Jason J. from District 32 and Richard C. from District 12 shared the amazing progress they've been able to make simply by making the decision, and then following through with the footwork, of establishing a Public Information committee. As Jason so eloquently put it, when we stop asking, "How can I possibly get a committee up and running" and instead ask, "How can we work together to carry the A.A. message through public information service work," wonderful things begin to happen. Going forward, we will continue to partner with Marty C., Area 14 Cooperation with the Professional Community service coordinator, on monthly conference calls with members of district PI and CPC committees throughout Area 14 to share our experience, strength and hope and to brainstorm new ways to work together. We're very excited about the creation of our Google Docs site, an idea that bubbled up from one of these conference calls and is being spearheaded by Peter C. from District 4, to archive and share documents we all can access and use to help us in our work. Our hope is that this "archive in the cloud" will be functional by October. If anyone - DCM, GSR or interested member of the fellowship - is interested in learning how to launch and nurture a district PI/ CPC committee, or just needs encouragement to keep moving forward, please get in touch with either me or Donna and we would be happy to assist you. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Treatment: Carson F. – Total attendance 23, We discussed recent changes in format for AA meetings at an inpatient treatment program in District 17. New Administrator want no more than 3 – 5 Treatment volunteers to bring meeting to his facility. He is using a GSO approved meeting format. Previously the four (4) AA meetings were open to the public. Much lively discussion followed: How can they do that? Has anyone talked to the Administrator? How did this happen? I provided copies of the recently received “A Newsletter for Professionals.” We used that as a reference for how other treatment meetings are handled throughout the Area, the importance of 12 Step recovery being offered to people in treatment and suggestions for handling the current situation in District 17. It is our responsibility to meet individually with treatment center administrators. We can offer information on types of meetings and if meetings are open to the public or rather a treatment committee. Local CPC and Treatment chairs or well versed committee members can carry the message of what AA can offer to the facility. Finance Committee: Bill C. - Meeting opened with Serenity Prayer. 20 present 7 voting members. Whoever made the motion should have been here providing background information. Why didn’t it go to Grapevine? Website: William H. – Opened with Serenity Prayer, seven of nine DCM's in attendance. We had a discussion on a section of Website Guidelines. Moved to the Google Analytics Report which will be included in the minutes to the Secretary. Now Public Announcements - any group, district, holding an event or needing volunteers for events, submit them to the website so they can be posted. Ended with Responsibility Statement. Thank you for the privilege to serve. **Website Stats:** The site has an average of 2800 sessions per month with 2298 unique visitors a month. Each visitor views approximately 1.85 pages per session. The bounce rate is 70% with our goal being 60%. On an average the site is being accessed by desktop devices by 1871 users (67%), mobile devices 790 (29% } and tablets 108 (4%). Each month an average of 625 users (22%) redirect to the Spanish pages. The most visited Spanish pages, in order, were Steps, Traditions, Unity, Concepts, Assembly Agenda, Responsibility Statement. In English the most visited pages in order were Assembly Agenda, Meeting Information, Activities, Map, Responsibility, Unity, Documents, Rule 62 (Password Protected Area), Delegates Page, and Service Bodies. On the average 43% of the visits are direct access, 38% through Google search, 5% through aa.org, 3% through Bing search, 1% through Yahoo search. The other 10% of visits come through various AA sites in order - aalakesumter.com, neflaa.org, aadistrict28.org, aadaytona.org, northcentralftaa.org, dlintergroup.org, aadistrict14.org and aatampa-area.org. Summary of Conference Procedures

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on as informal a basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Each Committee considers carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are urged to resist the temptation to edit recommendations on the floor.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and are called on in order.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place *before* each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to, and should, express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.

- Premature actions (e.g., amending motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question) can divert attention from the subject at hand, thus confusing and/or delaying Conference business.
- Voting is by show of hands.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion (postponing discussion to a later time during the same Conference):

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Needs only a *simple majority* to pass.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate. A motion to call the question:

- Must be made in order at the microphone.
- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds vote*.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone.

- Only a *simple majority* is required.
- If the majority votes to reconsider, *full debate*, pro and con, is resumed. (Conference members are urged to limit discussion to *new* considerations of the question under debate.)
- No action may be reconsidered twice.

Floor Actions

Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions, and:

- Must be made without comment.
- Must be submitted in writing by the maker to the Conference secretary.
- Will come up for deliberation after all Committee reports have been heard.
- Require a *two-thirds majority*.

When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action. A motion to decline to hear a floor action:

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds majority*.
