ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairperson: Lori P. Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer in English and Spanish. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:05 am on Sunday July 11, 2021.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Maureen T. My name is Maureen. The April motions were posted to the website the week following the April Assembly. The digital version of the minutes was posted to the Password Protected area of our website on May 4, 2021 and a PDF of the minutes were emailed to the body on May 11. The printed minutes were mailed to 200 addresses on Monday, May 14, 2021. For April, the total amount of requests for mailed minutes was well below the 200 addresses required to qualify for our non-profit bulk mail permit rate. We had to add 20 addresses to meet the minimum requirement. After the mailings went out, we had nine envelopes returned by USPS as undeliverable. The updated Advisory Actions containing passed motions from the April 2021 Assembly has been posted to the website. Thank you to Terri-Lynn S., our Alt. Chairperson for her Adobe skills and assistance to create a fillable NFAC proposed motion form on the Area website, in the Documents link. The new form is dated January 22, 2021. It contains a large text box for you to type a motion. It's a beautiful thing! I also updated the Service Coordinator/Admin Report form on the Area website. We are requesting that you fill out this form with a summary of the activity in your workshop and email it to the Secretary, the Delegate, the Area Chair and the Interpreter prior to the start of the Sunday business meeting. The report in your email should match the report you provide at the microphone during the Business meeting. I attended the Officer's Interim meeting on June 19, 2021 and provided the minutes to the Web Chair for uploading to the website on June 23, 2021. I have identified an omission in the September 2020 minutes of the Panel 71 election results. Therefore, I will be correcting the September 2020 minutes to include the election results:

Are there any corrections for the April minutes? Seeing none. I thank you for allowing me to serve.

Treasurer: Richard C. Good Morning, my name is Richard C. and I am alcoholic. My home group is the Step-Up Group in District 19B. It is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Panel 71 Treasurer. Will the Host District please pass the basket? In keeping with our Tradition of only accepting contributions from A.A. members and entities, it's helpful to include four things with your contribution: your group's number, group's name, district number and contact information. I would like to thank all of you for helping get the treasurer's P.O. Box address change out to everyone. This has helped lower the number of contributions being sent to the wrong address. We've had only one in the last month. The current state of the Area is financially sound. We have brought in \$22,788.07 income and have had \$19,306.68 in expenses, giving a net of \$3,481.39 above expenses. Our prudent reserve currently is \$11,617.00 below the 12-month maximum

allowed. We do have a combined \$102,638.25 in our checking and savings accounts. We have had \$3,448.33 of our contributions coming in by online contributions. This method of giving can be done on the Area website by clicking on the tab on the left side of the home page. The tab is labeled "Make a Contribution". Or you can send the contribution to: NFAC, P.O. Box 226, DeLeon Springs, FL. 32130. The 2022 Proposed Budget was turned over to the Finance Committee at the meeting yesterday. Delegate: Ruth R. Good Morning, my name is Ruth and I'm an alcoholic. My home group is the Upstart Women's Group in District 1. I am extremely grateful that you've given me the opportunity to serve as Area 14's Delegate to the General Service Conference. I am so excited to be attending Area 14's first hybrid assembly! Thank you to everyone who put in so much time and work to make this happen for us. It's been wonderful to see so many of you in person and on Zoom this weekend. I love that we've been able to utilize technology to allow everyone who wishes to attend to be present, whether in person or virtually. I'm very grateful so many of our groups are represented this weekend. Today I'd like to start by thanking all our past delegates and by recognizing those who are attending today's business meeting, whether in person or on Zoom. Please hold your applause till the end. Panel 45 Dan E, Panel 47 Past Delegate and Past South East Regional Trustee Dick G., Panel 51 Tom G., Panel 55 Michael S., Panel 61 Cecelia R., Panel 67 Joyce C., Panel 69 Annette D. We all owe a huge thank you to our past delegates for all of the service they've given in the past and continue to give today to Area 14. We are so fortunate to have them. This year many of our past delegates have been actively sharing their experience, strength and hope at the virtual weekly Area workshops including hosting all of them. In addition, a couple of our past delegates have been active on our Tech Committee, working extremely hard on our first hybrid Assembly. So, let's don't call them "has beens". Our past delegates are still very active in service to Area 14 and we're lucky that they are! After our April Assembly, I attended the General Service Conference, virtually, of course. We met from 10 am Saturday, April 17th to 2:15 am on Saturday, April 24th. It was a very full week, with mostly 12-hour days up till the final day. That Saturday we met for more than 16 hours. Of course, we had a lot of "bio-breaks", but the last couple of days, those were about the only breaks we had. We worked through lunch and dinner those days! Amazingly enough, out of 135 voting members, there were still 130 there at 2:15 am to vote on the last floor action. Throughout the week I witnessed a spirit of cooperation and camaraderie that I've never seen outside of A.A. Even during debate on some of the hotly contested issues, people remained respectful, calm, cordial, and level-headed. Having sat through many, many, business meetings over the years, I know that's not always the case! I was constantly struck by the immense love for our program and fellowship that permeated every meeting. During this year's Conference, an advisory action was passed to allow for the equitable distribution of agenda items, so that all committees have an equal workload. This will be tested for 3 years with reports back to the Conference each year. As many of you know, the Literature committee gets a much larger percentage of items than other committees. So much so that they are often not able to discuss all the items assigned to them, much less to take any action on them. As a result of this year's advisory action, the deadline for submitting prospective agenda items has been moved up to September 15th. Consequently, if you have a prospective agenda item and want the Area to vote on backing it, you will need to bring that to the floor in new business today, as our next assembly will occur after the September 15th cut off. You don't have to have a vote at the Area to submit, but if you want the Area's approval, it will have to be done today. Since the conference, I've done several face-to-face and virtual post-conference reports around the Area, with the last one being yesterday. If you couldn't attend any of them and wish to have information on any of this year's agenda items, please reach out to me and I'll make sure your questions are answered. If you didn't pick up a quick reference guide this weekend, I'd be happy to email it to

you. Many of you know that we have a new general manager at the General Service Office as of the end of May. His name is Bob W. He's been sober for 28 years and served at all levels in groups, his district and at his area. In 2013 he was elected to the General Service Board as Trustee At Large and served there for 4 years, representing the US/Canadian Service Structure as the international delegate to the 23rd and 24th World Service Meetings, as well as many other A.A. gatherings around the world. During his final year, he served as vice chair of the General Service Board. Professionally he enjoyed a 30-year career as principal and owner of an insurance agency. I'm sure we're in good hands! It has been a lively weekend and I appreciate everyone's patience, tolerance, love, and support of one another as our first on-site assembly of Panel 71 comes to an end. SERVICE COORDINATORS REPORTS

Accessibilities Alternate: Mistia D. I'm a grateful alcoholic. I'm also your alternate Accessibilities Service Coordinator. I'm from District 8, the Happy Hour Group. I'd like to thank you all for this opportunity to be of service. It has been a wonderful experience. 10 members attended, Maggie R. recording notes. Mistia D. began the meeting with a question: Can you imagine not to be able to attend an A.A. meeting? Characteristics that isolate us: physical make up, visibility, language, mobility, hearing problems. Facts: one in four people have visual

difficulties. There were 119 countries represented at the Atlanta 2015 Convention. How do we help on a home group level? Visually, by greatly enlarging the print of the group's usual readings; providing a basket of various strength reading glasses; referring to the A.A. publications written in Braille, mobility listing the level of accessibility of the meeting room, kitchen, and bathrooms in the local A.A. meeting schedule; using tape to define areas; a bucket of white paint to make abutments such as curbs, steps, and ramps more noticeable; clearing the handicapped parking spaces of encroaching and low-hanging plants; coordinating rides for non-driving members; coordinating with the local Intergroup or Central Office for requests for meetings to be taken to facilities nearby such as assisted living facilities; continuation of hybrid online-meetings. For hearing, saving front row space for hearing impaired members; speaker's microphones and listener's headsets; "talking" machines such as the Capture app and TTY; utilization of closed-caption capability in the Zoom app, cognitive translators, both ASL and foreign languages. There was a sharing session that followed with suggestions from the audience's experiences and questions. Our home groups had incorporated language into their group's formats specific to the needs of their meeting place and group consciences: improving the room's acoustics; asking all to push in their chairs at the end of the meeting; choosing to afford the continued hybrid meetings; make sure that the meeting lists have an accurate level of accessibility, especially for accuracy in the Meeting Guide app; the discussion of the feelings of early disability. People's experiences of anger and isolation and some solutions: primarily remember that this is a fellow alcoholic and asking "how can I help?", "may I bring you coffee?", holding doors. We closed at 10:50 with the Responsibility Statement.

Archives: Bob C. Good morning, my name is Bob C. I'm from District 4, Free to Be Group. We opened the meeting at 10:00 with 10 people present. Cecilia, Panel 61 Past Delegate and past Area Archivist brought some books to give away and gave a brief talk about the role of Archives. Beth gave us a brief description of some of the activities that Archives is going to do at the state convention being held here in Jacksonville. Area 14 Archives will bring the display to the state convention. Also, Beth talked about an Archives workshop with Area 14 & 15 being held in February (location TBD). A discussion took place regarding digitizing old cassette tapes, deciding what should be archived, and how to start an archives committee at the group or district level. We closed with the Responsibility Statement at 11:00 AM

I am encouraging everyone to forage through that mountain of paper you have at home in a box and see if there are some scraps, some used, some crinkled paper with information about Alcoholics Anonymous on it. Don't worry if you think it is too old, too dirty or too crinkled, bring it to me or I will come and get it. I will be glad to scan it and bring it back to you, with a copy of the scan. If your group or your District has Archives and needs help with scanning, let me know. Our Area has one that goes extremely fast, and I have one for special papers. With technology pushing so heavily we are losing our history as it is. Please only you can prevent losing our past!! Cooperation with Professional Community: Tom S. Good morning. My name is Tom S, and I am an alcoholic, and honored to serve as your CPC service coordinator. Our CPC committee reviewed our main purpose: to inform professionals and future professionals about A.A. We do this through establishing better communication between A.A.s and the professional communities. We took a 5-minute tour of www.aa.org's Home page, pointing out the various tools we can use with professionals, including the videos for professionals. Also, the "For Professionals" link takes

us to many flyers and pamphlets that we can use in our interactions with professional groups. I shared with our CPC committee a recent initiative undertaken by an A.A. member in Volusia county. She learned of a community health fair being put on in conjunction with Juneteenth. She secured a table at the fair, rounded up some A.A. volunteers, and spent the day with the attendees discussing A.A.-CPC and distributing A.A. literature. I suggested that our CPC chairs inquire about similar events in their communities during the year with a view towards replicating this type of outreach. I will offer assistance as and when needed. Our committee will participate in a health conference being put on by the Florida Behavioral Health Association next month in Orlando. We will staff the event with two volunteers at all times and host an open A.A. meeting on Thursday evening at the hotel. We have pamphlets and flyers for distribution. The attendees can also sign up for the free "About A.A." newsletter which GSO will email to them at no charge. Finally, we discussed a relatively new, international resource for CPC known as cpcnorthamerica@googlegroups.com This Google Group has more than 190 members from CPC districts across the US and Europe, sharing their experiences and techniques carrying the message to professionals. The CPC chairs were encouraged to sign up to this group email and learn what their peers are doing across the country.

Corrections: Nanette L. Good morning, my name is Nanette I am a recovering alcoholic. My homegroup is New Dawn, in District 20. I'm honored to serve. Before the workshop began paperwork was passed out and an interactive map set up. We began our workshop with a speaker, Craig E. He shared his experience strength and hope with all and shared that he was an inmate, and that A.A. was vital to his time in jail. Tim D. then shared the three main parts of our committee. Informing all that it begins with the Corrections Workbook: How & where do we begin? Who and where do we serve? Why do we need a Corrections committee? Tim also brought a speaker that is part of his H&I committee within Volusia county. They were able to share from real life experience how they are developing H&I in Volusia county. We have a corrections workshop that happens every Sunday night that is International. It's very inspiring for ideas. Please let us know if you'd like us to come to your District for ideas.

Grapevine: Vicki, the Alternate Grapevine rep. The meeting opened with a reading of the Serenity Prayer. We had 6 people in attendance. How to download resources from www.aagrapevine.org for the new Grapevine representatives present was discussed. People present were made aware that the motion passed to create a new Instagram page. Ideas on how to start your own Grapevine display for your group or district was also discussed. How the Grapevine touches various aspects of A.A., such as carrying the Grapevine magazine into the local jails and prisons through our corrections committees, various treatment centers, CPC and PI committees also use them to carry the message. District 30 announced that it was having a service fair in October and was looking forward to having good attendance. A graph from 1997 until present showing how the sales in the Grapevine room have gone up or down periodically was shown to those present. The question was presented to those present about their feelings on the continuation of selling Grapevine materials during the assembly. Everyone present agreed that they enjoy seeing our Grapevine literature displayed during assembly and the room allowed us to get a look at the new literature available for sale. It was a unanimous decision from those present that we should look into alternative forms of payment to help increase sales in the room during assembly.

Intergroup: Sam G. - Hello, my name is Sam G., I am an alcoholic and I am the Area 14 alternate Intergroup Service Coordinator. In the Intergroup sharing session, we had 17 attendees present as we explored and discussed a potential motion for Intergroups to be the supplier of Grapevines. This motion will likely be presented today by the Grapevine service coordinator. Additionally, the history of the Intergroup committee and the background of the Grapevine committee were also

discussed. An attendee described the purpose of the Intergroup office to include it being a business entity selling literature, housing the Archives, and connecting individuals to A.A. via the phone army services. Despite the group not having the entirety of the Grapevine service coordinator's motion, there was a discussion about Intergroups supplying Grapevine literature at the Intergroup office to facilitate an increase in funds for Grapevine. An attendee addressed concerns about Grapevine sales at Intergroup as the Grapevine could be interpreted as not conference approved literature by some groups. Further points made by attendees led to a discussion about finances to include dialogue about the increase in electronic Grapevine subscriptions and decline of print subscriptions during COVID. This point led to further discussion regarding A.A.'s primary purpose to carry the message to the alcoholic that still suffers and that financial contributions of Grapevine and the like are secondary to that purpose. This was one of the more resounding messages during the workshop. Overall, despite not having the motion verbiage, the sharing session summarized the importance of carrying the message to Alcoholics as the top priority, and that Intergroups and districts must remain as separate groups whereas the districts do not govern the Intergroup office and vice versa. The Intergroup service committee looks forward to presenting their original idea, how The Traditions and Concepts 10 through 12 apply to Intergroups, at the next sharing session at the October Area Assembly.

Literature: Nina V. Good morning my name is Nina, my home group is the Promises Group in District 13. The workshop began at 11:15 with 25 attendees. We covered the 1930's history of the Big Book, the Liberty and Saturday Evening Post articles, the pamphlet "Circles of Love and Service" regarding service structure and literature reps at each level of A.A. We covered changes - proposed changes to the preamble, the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous, the Twelve and Twelve and many pamphlets. Information was shared about the availability of literature on e-books, audio books, ASL and the summer special of \$1 off of purchasing meeting-in-a-pocket. We ended with discussion of how groups carried the message during this past year of pandemic. We ended with an inspiring letter from Bo V., chairperson for AWS. I thank you for this opportunity to learn and serve.

Public Information: Tim S. Today we had 20 in attendance, representing 10 districts. We talked "what is PI?". We talked about how to help in a small town, in a large town. We talked about PI guidelines: accuracy, anonymity, Tradition 11. We fielded various questions: How to get PI Information to a new CPC/PI person at district; Keeping a record of what you do for a pass down; How to get PI into schools and keeping groups informed. We also have a new alternate PI committee member, Lisa B. We had a new idea: in addition to pamphlets, have a QR code sign that takes your smartphone to the A.A. website. Respectfully, Tim S.

Treatment: Carson F. Good morning all. I appreciate the warm welcome I've received this weekend from old friends and some new people that I've met. I'm privileged to serve as the Treatment service coordinator for Area 14, Panel 71. Thank you for asking me Lori. In the workshop yesterday, we had 19 people in attendance. General discussion about what treatment programs/sober houses are allowing A.A. to bring meetings into facilities. What issues are you encountering? And the overlap of treatment in D.O.C. outsourced facilities. Questions whether those places fall under Corrections or Treatment. Problem obtaining literature because no one wants either one of us. How does Bridging the Gap interact with people being discharged from treatment/corrections. Bridging the Gap has a national database to connect A.A. with people being released from treatment or prison.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance: Bob E. My name is Bob E. and it is my privilege to serve as your Finance chair for Panel 71. My sobriety date is Nov. 1976, and my home group is the Other Side of the Bridge group in Palatka, Florida. The Area 14 Finance committee met in regular session on July 10, 2021 at 2:45PM. All ten members were present. The treasurer presented a brief summary of the current financial condition of Area 14, and it was described as sound. The treasurer then formally presented the 2022 budget to the committee along with an explanation of some of the methods used to construct the budget, and the budget was not analyzed in detail at this time. Each committee member was given the opportunity to express his or her views on the budget in general and the methods used to prepare it. All non-voting members were also given the opportunity to express their views at this time. It was moved, seconded, and approved to send the budget as presented to the body for consideration without a recommendation at this time. The committee expects to make a recommendation concerning adoption of the budget at the October 2021 Assembly. A request was received by the committee regarding the possible creation of an additional \$5,000 Prudent Reserve earmarked for use to pay penalties incurred because of a possible cancellation of a contract for a future assembly. After discussion of the request, the committee declined to act upon the request. There was an in-depth discussion concerning the issuance of computers and/or other technical equipment to trusted servants for their use in the performance of their assigned duties. The request for the opinions of committee members was made by the Area chairperson who was present at the meeting. It was the opinion of most members that it should be the general policy of Area 14 to furnish sufficient equipment to enable each person to perform their duties. Despite the large variations in performance as compared to budget, we believe that there is no combination of variations in expense or in revenue which would prevent Area 14 from meeting its financial obligations for the remainder of 2021. Questions and comments are welcomed. I would like to say thanks to all of you who took the time to come to our meeting and took an interest in financial matters. Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Growth: Mary A. Mary A. Alt-Delegate. I am an alcoholic. The Area 14 Growth committee entertained a full house of attendees that included five of its eight committee members. We updated the status of the project to produce narrative boundaries for the North Florida Districts and intend to continue this task as time allows during the remainder of this panel. Our Area chair had requested that the committee discuss the implementation of the advisory actions passed by the 71st General Service Conference regarding participation of online groups in the U.S./Canada General Service Structure. How do we give our virtual members a voice and a vote? The agenda items recognize and encourage the participation of our online group, listing those who ask to be listed within the group's preferred district and area, a default being the location of the group's primary contact. This supersedes the 1997 advisory action that designates online groups as "International Correspondence Groups". Additionally, the General Service Board will form a committee to explore future possibilities for the participation of these groups. Our Area 14 members are clearly in favor of supporting the participation of all our fellowship members and proposed a variety of ways we can assist and welcome these virtual groups. We heard from our registrar and our chair with information available to assist with this discussion. There was consideration for the possibility of remote G.S.R., a G.S.R. that does not reside within the geographical scope of Area 14, some discussion regarding the continuation of hybrid assemblies, what defines a group vs a meeting and what are the privileges and responsibilities of any group participating in the U.S./Canada service structure. In the end a sense of the actual and virtual members in attendance was polled and it was almost unanimously decided that the online groups that register with the General Service Office and after the standard 30-day waiting period that is standard for any group registration, a group

number will be issued. This would in effect provide for the participation of a virtual group in the same manner that it would provide a brick-and-mortar group. Area 14 welcomes and encourages the participation of all members of the fellowship of Alcoholic Anonymous live and virtual, reflecting our goal of never being exclusive and always being inclusive.

Site and Agenda: Terri-Lynn S. I am Terri-Lynn, alcoholic, D10, College Park Triangle, and it is a privilege to be your Site and Agenda Chair. At the Site and Agenda Administrative Committee meeting we had 14 members attend in person and eight members attend through Zoom for a total of 22 members. The Site and Agenda Administrative Committee is made up of D4 June C., D7B Kim D. absent, D8 Tim D., D8 Dennis I. alternate, D17 Ed S., D18B Jackie C., D24 Beth E., D28 Bob M. absent, D30 Bryant G., and me. A quorum is obtained at five voting members, and we had seven voting members present. I explained the process of taking our April Site and Agenda motion from the table which allows the motion to be discussed by the body. At this time, I will make a motion to amend it enumerating five new changes. The details of this motion will be discussed in old business. Thank you to Vivian, Archivist, for working with me on the five new changes to this motion. I asked the Site and Agenda Committee to attend the G.S.R. workshop to give examples on how and why to pick an administrative committee for a new motion. We reviewed the 2023-24 Mission Inn contract. Bob E., Finance Chair discussed the importance of budgeting the correct amount of money for Site and Agenda. His research showed that historically we are doing way more than what we are being reimbursed. The 2022 Budget is being presented today so we should set our sights on the 2023 Budget. To keep the same experience that the North Florida Area is accustomed to, we should possibly double our present budget figures, and Tim D. suggested that we might even triple them. In the G.S.R. Workshop, we had approximately 52 people in attendance with 22 first-time G.S.R.s and 0 visitors counted. I was unable to display my PowerPoint, but I manually walked through it conveying most of the material. I asked if people wanted me to email them the power point and I have 52 emails that I will send the power point to. If you did not get a chance to jot down your email on the yellow pad, please feel free to send your email address to altchairperson@aanorthflorida.org, subject "G.S.R. Workshop PPT". We discussed how to create a motion, the lifecycle of a motion, and how and why to pick an administrative committee for a new motion. Pete C. stated a motion "Come up with a plan/process that helps people obtain important Area information outside of technology". We used his motion as an example of how and why to pick an administrative committee for a new motion and found that it did not fit with any administrative committee. This means that the motion must come from the floor and if seconded, the chair could have the option to refer to committee for more research. We ended by talking about how to enter the password protected area and find the financials, minutes, and Advisory Action excel document. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Web Site: Marty C., Alternate - Good morning, Madam Chair; Madam Delegate, Panel 71, and fellow A.A.ers, my name is Marty C., and I am an alcoholic. My home group is the 11th Step Group in St. Augustine in District 6. It is a privilege to serve as your Alt-Chair of the Website committee. Kevin B. sends his regards and was unable to attend because of a business commitment. Many thanks to Elenor B. for being our note taker and to the district committee members that serve as your website committee. The Website committee meeting was called to order at 2:45 pm on July 10, 2021. We had six voting members present and unanimity was established at four. Committee members were assigned different parts of the Website pages and all but a few have been reviewed with suggestions for changes that would not necessitate a motion. The following have been changed: The A.A. Preamble has been updated on the website as per the results of the 2021 General Service Conference; Minutes from the Interim Officer's Meeting had been added to the password protected area of the website for June (and April in the Archived Minutes section of the Password Protected Area still needs to be added as of this time). Interim Officer's Meetings

are open to all and everyone is encouraged to attend; An "Area 14 Contracts" section has been added to the Password Protected Area of the website and includes all current contracts of the Area; Material from the 71st General Service Conference in English and Spanish, has been posted on the Delegate's Corner page and in the Password Protected Area of the website; Updates for old business. The Assembly agenda page is complete as well. A subcommittee consisting of three committee members will review other parts of the website because some suggestions have been put forth from other members of Panel 71. After a lengthy discussion, it was a unanimous vote of committee members to post Intergroup Flyers on the Area website. A motion to change the Website guidelines was written and will be put forth to the body for a vote. A flyer guideline check list was discussed and was e-mailed to all committee members for further consideration. A visitor suggested that the committee put forth a motion to change the long password for the password protected area and it was tabled until the chair could be consulted. The committee discussed the possibility of scrubbing workshops that are on A.A. related service topics to be posted on the Area Website; the discussion was tabled until the next Assembly. It is moved to modify Structures and Guidelines as follows: Remove Appendix D (computer use policy), and replace it with the following:

"It is the policy of Area 14 to provide certain items of equipment such as computers, printers, translation equipment, and audio-visual equipment for the use of officers, committee chairs, and trusted servants in the conduct of Area 14 business. All data stored on this equipment becomes the intellectual property of Area 14. The Finance Chair will endeavor to maintain a record of the equipment and to whom it is assigned as directed by the Area Chair when equipment is transferred from one person to another, normally when new officers assume their positions. As a matter of convenience, equipment may be used for occasional personal use; however, extensive personal use of equipment which is subject to wear and tear is discouraged. Software updates and equipment maintenance, when required, should be coordinated with the person or persons designated by the Area Chair."

Motion to bring the motion off the table. Seconded. Passed.

Motion restated for vote. No second required. Background read. Discussion. Called the Question, Seconded. (Motion Failed. 72 for, 56 against. Minority Opinion 4. No reconsideration requested.)

From Site and Agenda Committee (Tabled; to be included in the April minutes)

Modify Structures and Guidelines, Section 9 Administrative Committees-Site and Agenda in its entirety with the following:

Site and Agenda

This Committee is an Administrative Committee comprised of several D.C.M.s selected by the Chairperson. The Committee votes on which business to bring to the Sunday meeting. The Committee is responsible for overseeing the logistics of each Assembly and, whenever possible, uses their experience to develop written procedures and guidelines for future Assembly hosts. The Committee solicits, obtains, and reviews bids from hotels/motels willing to provide facilities for Assemblies.

- Assembly

- Responsible for overseeing the logistics of each Assembly
- Develops written procedures and guidelines for future Assembly hosts
- Arranges for a Spanish Translator and/or ASL for the Assembly weekend
- Coordinate and conduct the G.S.R. afternoon Workshop on Saturday.
- Develops the Saturday agenda with the Area Chair to meet the needs of the Panel and the Assembly attendees
- Host Hotel
 - Works with the hotel to set up and sign the Banquet Event Orders
 - Manages the A/V needs for Workshops, Panel Members, and the Sunday Business Meeting
 - Acts as the liaison between the A.A. Fellowship and the host hotel
 - Settles the Assembly bill with the Area Treasurer
- Hotel Bidding
 - Hotel bids need to be finalized and submitted to the Site and Agenda Committee by the first Quarter Assembly which ends on April 1.
 - The Site and Agenda Chair negotiates the hotel bids once submitted
 - It is suggested that the Site and Agenda Chair present the Committee's recommendation at the 2nd Quarter Assembly held in April.

Moved that: North Florida Area 14 establish a Technology Service Committee, as described in the Area 14 Technology Service Committee's Composition, Scope and Procedure.

COMPOSITION

1. There are not more than seven voting members of this committee and non-voting volunteers as needed. These should consist of the Chair, and five (5) additional members. It is suggested that all members of the Committee have demonstrated knowledge and experience in service and technology areas that are of benefit to the tasks at hand, or demonstrate a willingness to learn.
2. The Chair will be appointed by the Area Chairperson, as a voting member of Area 14. The remaining members will be selected by the Committee Chairperson and approved by the Area 14 Chairperson. The Area 14 Chairperson will be an ex-officio member of the Committee.

SCOPE

The Committee will be a permanent, non-administrative committee. The Committee will act to ensure continuity with technology used by Area 14 and will consult with other Area Committee members in planning, selecting, obtaining, maintenance and use of technology.

HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE

1. Maintain records of technology equipment and software, including those assigned to Area Panel members. and overseeing transfer of equipment at beginning of each panel. Also, provide an inventory of all equipment and software licenses to the Area 14 Finance Chair at the beginning of each panel.
2. Receiving all requests for use of technology equipment for use at assembly and other Area 14 events. Providing AV and Virtual support as requested, including overseeing AV support, providing equipment set-up and securing outside resources as deemed fiscally responsible.

VIRTUAL NEEDS

1. The Area Chairperson will maintain “ownership” status of any Area 14 virtual accounts with Zoom or other providers. The Committee Chair, or their designee, will administer the accounts, assigning user levels, scheduling meetings, etc. A roster of members available to provide virtual hosting and other support for virtual/hybrid events and other necessary administrative functions will be maintained.

SHORT- AND LONG-TERM PLANNING

1. The Committee will be responsible for evaluating Area 14 immediate and future needs for equipment, software licenses, for production or contractor outside help. Including, securing and evaluating bids in order to make fiscally responsible purchases.
2. Long term planning should include consideration of future technology, equipment and software needs including integration of other Area functions within the committee, such as website and/or communications.

PROCEDURE

1. Meeting at each assembly and as needed for planning and administrative tasks.
2. Maintaining correspondence with the Area Chairperson and other appropriate members, maintaining transparency by providing reports of decisions made and work performed.

FUNDING

1. The Committee will determine any financial needs and submit requests to the Finance Committee for consideration.

POSITION: ARCHIVIST

SERVICE HISTORY INFORMATION:

- I got sober in the Orlando area in 1986. The group my sponsor, her sponsor and her sponsor's sponsor and I attended was undergoing some changes and we formed a new group. You know the new group as Back to Basics.
- I stayed away from General Service for many years. My husband and I have migrated north, and we both became GSRs for the first time 4-years ago. I have been involved in groups and Intergroups, just not General Service. One G_____ was enough!
- I have been a GSR and am currently the DCM of District 24.
- I served Area 14 as Archives Service Coordinator. My immediate reaction when asked to serve was not that! I don't like musty, dusty papercuts! But when the hand (fickle finger of fate) reaches out...I said yes.
- Attended the 2019 National AA Archives Workshop. The folks attending, were caretakers of treasures. I learned a lot that applied to being an Archivist. Upon returning, I reached out to others in the Archives community. And have been learning what the districts and Intergroups are doing.
- I participated in the 2020 Florida Archives Workshop. And am involved in planning the 2022 version.
- I am part of the 64th Florida State Convention Archives Room team.
- And drumroll please, the week before everything crashed to a halt, I put on Tea at the Gatehouse! An encore performance has been requested!!!!

WHY I WISH TO SERVE IN THIS CAPACITY:

- As many of you know, I grew up personally and professional in AA. I was a Certified Professional Secretary, now Certified Administrative Professional (CAP). For 15 years, I worked with Dick G. (Southeast Regional Trustee). In that position I watched AA at all levels in action.
- The Archivist's duties span a breadth of disciplines. The community divides into Collectors, Historians and Preservationists. All of these are important. As a CAP, I have skills and training not just in word processing and computer programs but cataloging files, maintaining legal documents and extensive research skills.

Good Afternoon – I am an alcoholic and my name is Vivian F. My Home Group is the Ponderosa Group in Orlando. We meet Thursdays at 8pm. It has been through the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous I have had the privilege to be of service in many areas. I am standing for the position of Archivist.

Per the NFAC Structure and Guidelines, the Archivist should be knowledgeable of the NFAC history, have experience with historical records, familiar with our primary purpose, protecting anonymity and a member of Alcoholics Anonymous. I meet all these qualifications with my involvement at the Area in my previous positions at the end of this resume and a fascination of our North Florida Area past. I became involved in helping scan our old minutes into a digital format and now reading those same minutes over and over again. I continue to spend time on research for people with questions about our past. I have organized the repository and digital files for easy access and I have also completed online programs for preservation handling of delicate records and I am a member in good standing of Alcoholics Anonymous.

I have the ability, time and willingness to continue to serve Area 14, as your Archivist. How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

- Voting is by show of hands unless the Conference decides otherwise.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration

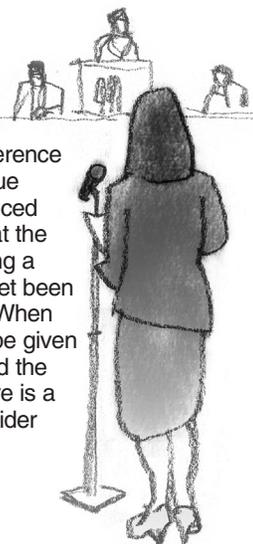
A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.

Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
