ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairperson: Lori P. Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer in English and Spanish. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00 am on Sunday July 10, 2022.

Registrar: Mary P. Total votes from today's roll call is 141; two-thirds is 93.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of the 12 Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary – My name is Maureen, I am an alcoholic and your Panel 71 Secretary. The April motions were posted to the website the week following the Assembly. On May 11, I emailed the minutes to the Web Chair to post to the Password Protected area and to email to the body. The printed minutes were mailed to six addresses on May 18. I provided additional copies of the January minutes in the Registration room yesterday. If you still need a copy, please see me at the break today. I provided an updated version of the Structures and Guidelines, dated May 2022 to the web chair for posting to the website. Please be sure you're referring to the most current version of the Structures & Guidelines, dated May 2022. Today in new business, I will be bringing a motion to the floor to update a section of the Structures and Guidelines. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Secretary report accepted as read.

Treasurer – Good morning, I'm Richard C. and I am an alcoholic. My home group is the Came to Believe Group in District 19B. It is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Panel 71 Treasurer. Will the host district please pass the basket, in keeping with the 7th Tradition of only accepting contributions from A.A. members and entities? As the basket is passed, please be mindful that those around you will still be listening to the reports being given. When sending contributions please include your group name, group number, district number and contact information. As you will see, the Area is still financially sound. We have brought in \$41,907.06 and had a total of \$41,204.97 in expenses, giving a net total of \$706.31 of income above expenses. We had \$7,071.84 of Area income from E-Contributions at a cost of \$258.15 in fees. E-Contributions can be made by going on the Area website and clicking on the tab labeled [Make a Contribution](#) located on the left side of the home page. Our Prudent Reserve is currently \$15,761.00 below the 12-month maximum allowed. We have a combined amount of \$110,767.47 in the checking and savings account. There isn't any overage at this time, but that can change as the results of expenses being lower than income and/or a change in the budget. There has been a change in how the Prudent Reserve is calculated. The checking account has been removed from the calculation. In Structures and Guidelines under Treasures duty, bullet five states "Maintain a savings account for the prudent reserve". Then under Prudent Reserve bullet one it states "including cash on hand". There isn't any mention of the checking account being part of the prudent reserve. The Federal Tax was signed and filed on 4/29/2022 at a cost of \$350.00 which came in \$50.00 below the budgeted amount. I filed the State Sales Tax on 5/17/2022 at the cost of \$23.40. If I can be of service to your group or district, please let me know and it doesn't have to be on finance. If you have any questions or concerns, I can be contacted at treasurer@aanorthflorida.org. Treasurer's report accepted, subject to audit.

Delegate – Good morning, my name is Ruth and I'm an alcoholic. My home group is the Upstart Women's Group in District 1 in Jacksonville. I have the privilege and absolute joy to serve Area 14 as your delegate to the General

Service Conference for Panel 71. Thank you so much for trusting me to carry your voice and your vote to the Conference. Please don't forget that this is an opportunity that's available to all of us in General Service. So don't hesitate to go to the mic when that time comes. You know, in just six short months, one of you will be up here giving your first Delegate's report. I, for one, can't wait to hear it! I'd like to start today by thanking all our past delegates and by recognizing those who are attending today's business meeting. Please hold your applause till they've all been introduced. Panel 45—Dan E.; Panel 47—Past Delegate and Past Southeast Regional Trustee—Dick G.; Panel 51—Tom G.; Panel 55—Michael S.; Panel 59—Past Delegate and Past Southeast Regional Trustee—Chet P.; Panel 61—Cecilia R.; and Panel 67 - Joyce C. Let's give them all a big round of applause. We are so lucky to have these servant leaders still joining us at our assemblies each quarter. They have a wealth of experience and knowledge to share with us. Make sure you thank them next time you see them in the hallway or a workshop. You know, they don't have to be here. They're here because they love A.A. In other words, they're here for what's in their hearts—not just for what's in their heads. I hope that when I'm a has-been, like them, that I'm even a tenth as good as they are. As many of you know, since I last saw you in April, I attended the General Service Conference. This year we attended face-to-face for the first time since 2019. This year it was in Brooklyn, New York. It was eight days packed with meetings, board reports, committee meetings, sharing sessions, fellowship, and the final three days, committee reports, discussion, debate, voting, and, unfortunately, Covid. We started the week with a couple of cases, ended the week with 25 cases, and in the week that followed, another 25 attendees tested positive, for a total of 50 cases. Considering that there were no prior protocols set up, they pivoted quickly and arranged for additional tables, masks, test kits, an audio link for those quarantined and a volunteer meal delivery service to those stuck in their rooms. Everyone pulled together in a spirit of cooperation. Luckily, the delegates maintained their two-thirds majority, since Covid spread equally between delegates, trustees, directors and staff members and in the end, our Higher Power was heard through the collective conscience of the US and Canada. Kathi F., the Pacific Regional Trustee who was rotating out, gave the keynote address Sunday night. She noted "We are here to have vigorous, loving, and informed discussions on matters affecting A.A. today. We are here to ask questions and make suggestions. We are here to roll up our sleeves, be fully present and do our best; to think deeply, to debate in loving discussions. It is important for all of us to take a good hard look at challenges and opportunities that are affecting A.A. today, of which there are many, and to carry those discussions back to those we serve." I took her words to heart and have done my best to get to as many sections of the Area that would invite me to present. My car has an additional 4,000 miles on it, 1,700 of which were done post-conference. And I'm not done yet. I'll continue going where I'm invited and have several events planned in the next couple of months. Zoom is also an option, for any district that prefers virtual reports. Hopefully, all of you have had the opportunity, as well as the inclination, to attend one of my post-conference report-back sessions. If anyone wasn't able to attend one, I'll have my final presentation posted on our website on the Delegate's page. Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions. As I looked around the conference center that week, I saw people of all ages with varying years of service. There were delegates in their 20s and delegates in their 70s. Some delegates had as little as 6 years of service, while others had decades. One delegate on my committee was 32, with 19 years of sobriety. Some Areas have their delegates come back and serve as Area Chair once their Panel rotates out. Other past delegates return to chair standing committees at their Areas, while others just serve as trusted advisors as we do here in Area 14. Some Areas allow their past delegates to have a voice as a non-voting member. Some have a voice and a vote. Others have neither. In other words, the Areas all do things differently. So there's no one right way to do anything. I've heard it said that members should work their way down their Area panel, serving in many positions prior to standing for delegate. But some of the best shares I heard at Conference were from folks who didn't serve for a multitude of years at their Area. Our Service Manual suggests that a delegate have 5 or 6 years of continuous sobriety as well as several years at the local or Area level as a G.S.R. or committee member. They should have a firm grasp of the Traditions and Concepts as well as having the time needed to serve among some other recommendations. But the qualifications for other offices aren't anywhere near as stringent. So, when they ask for folks to approach the mic to announce their intention to stand for an office, just take a deep breath, say a prayer, and trust your Higher Power. I strongly encourage you to stand for an office. Even if you don't get elected this time, there will be many other opportunities in your future. Plus, you could always turn in your service resume to whoever is elected Chair in October so you

can get a Service Coordinator role. I will be eternally grateful that you gave me this opportunity. I learned so much and made so many lifelong friends. I was able to sandwich a trip to Stepping Stones, Bill and Lois's home, and a tour of the General Service Office on either side of the Conference. It all combined to be an experience beyond my wildest dreams, with the Conference being the highlight. I truly feel like I've been rocketed into the fourth dimension. Thank you!

Alternate Delegate – Hello everyone, I am glad to see everyone here and I am glad the hotel has good a/c, it's hot outside! My name is Mary, and I am an alcoholic. I serve as your Area 14 Alt-Delegate and I am grateful I get to do so. I was able to meet with the JAC (FSC Joint Advisory Committee) in May. We met virtually due to the possibility of bad weather from the first tropical storm of the season. I serve as treasurer and convention details will follow in the oversight report. I was also able to attend our Delegates Post Conference report given in Longwood a few weeks ago. Although we get information about the conference many ways, it's hearing the actual experience from the delegate that tells the spirit of the conference best. I continue to attend and assist whenever asked with the Wednesday night Area 14 service meeting. And am glad to help whenever asked to by our area chair to help with panels and workshops. Please reach out for any opportunity there may be for me to be of service to any of you at the district or group event. I am grateful to get to serve Area 14 and all Alcoholics Anonymous.

Chairperson – I would like to welcome our new trusted servants, G.S.R.s and D.C.M.s with orange badges. Please stand. Thank you for your service. I would also like to welcome all our visitors with green badges. Please stand. Thank you for your participation this weekend. To those participating in the Area survey in April, you may have noticed some changes which have been implemented resulting from your comments. Please make sure to complete the July survey. The surveys help to identify those items for which your panel can be of additional assistance. Resulting from a request from the body and discussion in Growth, I have decided to create an Ad Hoc Committee to investigate the feasibility of continuing to hold our Area Assemblies as a hybrid meeting. This Committee shall include a representative from each of the Administrative Committees and 3 additional voting members of the assembly. I will be looking for volunteers from our voting members. For those intending to stand for an elected office in October, we will invite you to come to the mic and present your resume at the conclusion of today's business. Resumes will also be included in July's minutes. Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Alternate Chairperson – At the registration table, 87 G.S.R.s/Alt G.S.R.s, 24 D.C.M.s/Alt D.C.M.s, 28 Officers/Service Coordinators/Past Delegates, and 41 visitors registered for a total of 180 people. In Zoom, 24 G.S.R.s/D.C.M.s attended on Friday and Saturday and 28 GSRs, 5 D.C.M.s, 2 Past Delegates and 10 visitors attended Sunday's Business Meeting as reported by the Technology Chair. That makes 204 people that participated in person and 69 in Zoom for the July 2022 assembly. Thank you to the following host districts for showing up with much enthusiasm: District 10, for chairing the Friday night meeting, District 23, 14, and 8 for Registration, District 12 for Grapevine, District 22 for chairing the Concepts 7,8,9 Workshop, and District 6 for chairing the Saturday night meeting and working the Sunday Business meeting. Thank you, Joyce C, for being our past delegate. Thanks to District 31 for volunteering to handle Grapevine, District 22 for volunteering for one half of the Registration duties, and to Tom Guest who will be our Past Delegate during the October assembly. That means we still need volunteer Districts for the Friday night meeting, Concepts (10,11,12) Workshop, the other half of Registration duties, and the Saturday Business Meeting. Also, we will need several non-voting volunteers to help with the voting procedure on Sunday. Please read Section 12 Voting procedures to see if you would be willing to help. Thank you for letting me serve.

Registrar – Good morning Area 14! Welcome to the new G.S.R.s, D.C.M.s, and visitors. My name is Mary and I'm an alcoholic. I am your Area 14 registrar and grateful to be of service. Total votes from today's roll call are 141 of which two-thirds is 93 votes (24 votes on Zoom). In May I prepared the email list to provide to the Webmaster so that Area minutes could be emailed. Our NFAC Webmaster uses the MailChimp for bulk email

distribution, and the message containing the minutes is sent from webmaster@aanorthflorida.org. If you did not receive minutes, it is possible that your email address is incorrect in our database, or the message ended up in your spam folder. Unless I am notified in writing, all minutes will be mailed electronically. District group reports were emailed to D.C.M.s on June 26 for review. All updates received as of this report have been completed, and D.C.M.s received new reports this morning at the Area 14 Business meeting. If you have not updated your information with me, please complete a change form today. I have forms with me that you may pick up at the break and drop it off with me before you leave. Keeping the NFAC database current by eliminating out-of-date information is an ongoing process, and I appreciate everyone's help in making it happen. I am fortunate to have the support of numerous Area registrars from North America in monthly registrar sharing sessions sponsored by Area 15, as well as A.A. SPECIAL REPORTS

65th Florida State Convention - The 65th Florida State Convention "Oceans of Devotion" will be August 3-7, 2022 at the Harbor Beach Marriott Resort and Spa on Fort Lauderdale Beach. We have over 1,500 paid registrations as of this morning. We hope to see you there in August. Online registration is available at www.65.floridastateconvention.com. We have lots of wonderful speakers, exciting workshops and fun entertainment planned. The hotel rooms at the host hotel are sold out. We have a waitlist and three contracted overflow hotels along with five more hotels within a mile from the Harbor Beach Marriott. For more information about the waitlist see one of our volunteers at the table right outside the ballroom and they can assist you. Our banquets are sold out. We have the parking lots secured and four 15-passenger vans set up for shuttles for those not staying at the hotel to park off site. We are putting all the finishing touches on everything to be ready for you all. We did find out that as of mid-July they are starting construction, but after some negotiation, they are going to put the construction on hold during the five days of our convention. The only thing will be that the main entrance will be moved to the convention entrance area, and the spa will be closed during that time for renovations. They postponed the work on the pool area until after we leave. As per our refund policy, posted on our website, since we are now putting out a lot of funds, no refunds will be available after July 3rd. So if you are unable to go please find someone to transfer your purchases over to. We hope you will join us in Fort Lauderdale in August. Thank you for your attention. 66th Florida State Convention – My name is Robin and I'm an alcoholic, my homegroup is Nightly Newcomers, my sobriety date is June 25, 1993. As I'm sure most have heard, Saddlebrook Resort has been purchased by a 5-star resort company. The guidance committee met and drew up an addendum to be added to the contract signed October 28, 2021. The addendum was rejected by the General Manager and sales team. On March 26, the guidance committee met with the new General Manager of Saddlebrook. He was very upfront and informative. The new company, HEI Hotels, has begun phase one which consists of replacing old chairs, umbrellas at the pool, painting, and an overall "facelift" to the property. Phase one should be completed by the end of 2022. There is no start date for phase two yet. They have several designers that are bidding for the job which will run in the millions of dollars, so he had no dates for the beginning of this phase. They have taken out Dempsey Steak Restaurant, which was one of the items we had put in the addendum, hence the reason why they would not sign the addendum. After much discussion, we agreed that the most important thing is that there be no construction happening during our convention and if there are major changes that they provide adequate substitutions as outlined in our contract. We received an email from the sales manager of HEI Hotels agreeing to the updated addendum. Now that that is over, on to some exciting things happening with our convention. We are super excited to be hosting the 66th Florida State Convention at the world-renowned golf and tennis resort Saddlebrook Resort and Spa. It has everything you will need to have a relaxing extended weekend vacation. Rooms are conveniently located around the main building and banquet hall with only a max of five-to-seven-minute walk to everything. There are standard rooms,

one-bedroom suites and two-bedroom suites; all suites come with a full kitchen. There are AV rooms available. Shelby is ready to assist with any room needs you have. There are two pools available, one adult only and a 500,000-gallon free-form pool by the main building. Bicycle rentals and fishing poles are available at the Swim Shop, a 7,000 sq ft European Spa, a kids club, pool games, arcades and we could even set up a dive-in movie. Cooperation with Professional Community – Good morning. My name is Tom S. and I am an alcoholic. I am privileged to serve as your C.P.C. service coordinator. We had a record high attendance this Assembly, with sixteen members participating in our C.P.C. workshop. The group was comprised of eight G.S.R.s, four visitors, two D.C.M.s and two committee chairpersons, representing a total of seven districts. Volusia County was the most active district, with five members present. We have an opportunity to carry the C.P.C. message to the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) via their State chapter, FSAM. They will hold their Annual Conference on October 27-30 in Orlando. I am awaiting more info from their Executive Administrator. We already have one member from today's workshop who put her name in the hat for staffing the event! Three members spoke about their recent C.P.C. outreach efforts at our workshop. David M. (G.S.R. for D1 Central Group) told us how he arranged to meet with a probation supervisor in Jacksonville. They have more than 5,000 probationers, supervised by just 100 probation officers. There is a huge opportunity here for the CPC message to be delivered to these officers, providing them another rehabilitation tool for their alcohol-dependent clientele. Harry D. from D7 met recently with the Lake County Probation Department and has a similar opportunity to carry our message to another group of Probation officers. Cheri H., former D19 chairperson related her past and present efforts to rally like-minded A.A. members to service. She shared some tips about building a successful P.I./C.P.C. committee. Perhaps the most compelling statement presented was "Committee

chair positions would do better if they had an “Assistant” (not an Alternate) with specific duties, so they could [seamlessly] rotate into the Chair. Think “Assistant” instead of “Alternate” for service positions because “Alternate” is often thought of as only being needed to show up when the primary position holder would be unable to attend.” Respectfully submitted, Tom S.

Corrections – The North Florida Area 14 corrections workshop met Saturday at 10:00 am during the July Assembly to share ideas concerning three different districts and how they bring the A.A. message into our local jails and institutions. Our first presenters were Bob and Karen from Districts 8 and 20, who shared an excellent presentation about their A.A. journey in and out of the prison system. Our second presenters were Katie and her mother, Sheila. They, too, had a great message about bringing the program behind the walls. We ended our hour with David M. from the Jacksonville area, sharing his success story with a sign-up QR code, bringing A.A. into the 21st century and their local Bridging the Gap program. Thank you to our presenters for sharing their time and talent. We then rounded out our hour with questions and answers from our workshop participants.

Grapevine – My name is Linda, I am an alcoholic. I have the honor and privilege as serving as your Grapevine Service Coordinator. There were 13 in attendance. Thank you. Opened with the Serenity Prayer. Welcomed everyone, then talked about the paper shortage and books being printed and how the Grapevine is an online magazine. We talked about the new books *Prayer & Meditation*, and *Fun in Sobriety*. Talked about how there were three printings of *Prayer & Meditation*, just when we thought books were not selling, I brought some info that I printed one copy each of the news and let them know there were more in the Grapevine room, so come visit us there. Talked about Grapevine news, groups getting involved, podcast, Instagram, YouTube, sobriety calculator and more. Had suggestions about literature. Talked about the position of the Grapevine and the fun it has been. Answered questions. Thank you District 12 for a good job of selling \$456.00 for books and raffle. Closed with the Serenity Prayer.

Intergroup – Hello my name is Lyndi and I’m an alcoholic. I am the Area Intergroup Service Coordinator. At our Saturday workshop, approximately 25 attendees assisted me to create a service document that can be used by all Intergroups in the Area. The document notes the conversations we have had in the Intergroup workshops for the past year and half and we brainstormed specific ideas and suggestions to the fellowship to keep in mind when considering a service position in General Service and/or Intergroups. I have a list of interested people as well as the Intergroups of Area 14 who I will send the document to for further editing and will then share it with Intergroups to use as they see fit. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Literature – Nina V. The literature committee workshop began at 11:15 with the serenity prayer. The inspiration and focus of the workshop was A.A.’s new book, *Our Great Responsibility* (published 2019). We discussed the birth of the group conscience, our upside-down service structure that puts the groups in charge, how 24 hours of sobriety qualifies one for A.A. service, how the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous was written by members with only 2 months to 3 years sobriety, how Bill W. wrote the 2nd tradition in 1945 and how that tradition was really put to the test 10 years later when the General Service Conference was established and Bill resigned in 1955, how the A.A. group conscience worked and continues to work for us. About half of the 23 workshop attendees shared about issues or conflicts their groups had experienced and how the group conscience resolved them. Before the workshop closed with the responsibility statement, Ed pulled from his hat the name of the winner of a new (2021-2023) service manual. Thanks for giving me this great opportunity to serve and to learn.

Public Information – Tim S. 13 in attendance. Embrace Change. What is P.I.? Getting info out to the public on a broad scale. This month’s press release: LGBTQ+ share their stories. publicinfo@aa.org. Examples of district sponsored billboards park benches were shown. How do traditions and P.I. work together? We’re individually anonymous at the public level, however A.A. shouldn’t be invisible! 2 new PSAs available on YouTube, aa.org: Sobriety in A.A. - My drinking built a wall and Sobriety in A.A.- When drinking is no longer a party. We need

to reach our audience at their social level. Can we contact cable companies? Looking into it. Service fairs are a great way to get info out utilizing billboards. Public health fairs are a good source to get the word out. Pass out reliable meeting schedules that are up to date in time, place, accessibility. We don't speak for A.A. We pass out up to date info. We keep our opinions to ourselves. Our goal is to help people find A.A. who just don't know. Keep new ideas coming to share! Online P.I. group :878 0311 3474 password 411. 9:00 pacific 12 noon eastern.

Technology – Hi everyone, my name is Katie and I'm an alcoholic. I have the pleasure and honor of serving as your Technology Committee Chair. We had 16 people at our workshop on Saturday. We opened with the Serenity Prayer and introductions. We compiled a list of topics that members would like to cover during the meeting which included: Zoom count Sunday Business Meeting – Q. How is it done? A. Past Delegate provides count to Registrar at the completion of Roll Call; Discussed current hardware and possible retirement of some existing equipment and the selection process for new equipment; Consider using electronic voting equipment during Business Meetings; Members of our body are requesting access to more than the Business Meeting via hybrid. Accessibilities issue and inclusive vs exclusive; Discussed the availability of larger screens for the July Sunday Business meeting. We also invited the Registrar to talk about data stewardship and maintaining records at district, Area and GSO. The past year, current Registrars in north America have been having a sharing session on the challenges and options for better management of records. It was very informative and our chair, Lori, recommended that there be a Registrar workshop at a future Assembly. Thank you, Mary P., as well as everyone who attended for the information and thought-provoking workshop.

Treatment– Carson F. 21 people in attendance, We opened with the Serenity Prayer. A share session on “yeas” and “neighs.” There were great experiences about treatment meetings and experiences as a treatment client. We then looked at the current Treatment Service Manual. It is available to download from GSO. We then presented two skits on how to present A.A. to treatment programs. The first skit was how not to present A.A. to administration. The second skit was a more informative interaction with the Administrator. Both skits were well done. We laughed a lot. The last 10 minutes, David M. gave brief synopsis of BTG in the Duval County Area. We closed with the Responsibility Statement.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS

A motion will be coming to the floor from this committee today to make some changes to how we address our service coordinators and the intent of the workshops. Look

for this in new business. Another motion was presented regarding providing a fully hybrid assembly. Though the committee no longer had a quorum, a sense of the room was taken and the motion was supported. This information has been passed along to our area chair for her further consideration. Site and Agenda/Alternate Chairperson – Terri-Lynn S. At the Registration table, 87 G.S.R.s/Alt G.S.R.s, 24 D.C.M.s/Alt D.C.M.s, 28 Officers/Service Coordinators/Past Delegates, and 41 Visitors registered for a total of 180 people. In Zoom, 24 G.S.R.s/D.C.M.s attended on Friday and Saturday and 28 G.S.R.s, 5 D.C.M.s, 2 Past Delegates and 10 Visitors attended Sunday's Business Meeting as reported by the Technology Chair. That makes 204 people that participated in person and 69 in Zoom for the July 2022 assembly. Motion from Finance

It is moved that the reimbursement amount for travel on behalf of Area 14 be increased from the current \$.40 per mile to \$.50 per mile.

Motion passed unanimously.

Motion from Finance – (Tabled to be printed in the July minutes).

It is moved that the 2023 budget presented by the Treasurer be published in the minutes for discussion and voting at the next regular Assembly, with the recommendation from the Finance Committee that it be adopted.

Motion from Growth – (Tabled to be printed in the July minutes).

Moved to change Structures and Guidelines "Service Coordinators and Other Positions" to "Committee Chairs and Other Positions."

Background Material:

The specific area of service are Accessibilities, Archives, Cooperation with the Professional Community, Corrections, Grapevine/La Vina, Intergroup, Literature, Public Information and Treatment. These committees will utilize the following Composition and Duties.

Composition of each committee:

1. The committee chair is appointed by the Area Chairperson as adopted by our current Structures and Guidelines.
2. It is suggested that the committee chair have at least two (2) years of sobriety.
3. The committee the committee.
4. The voting members will be those members of Alcoholics Anonymous in Area 14, North Florida in attendance at the committee meeting each assembly.

Duties for each committee:

1. Is a permanent, non-administrative, service committee.
2. Keep total attendance and meeting minutes. Retain and turn over to the Archivist at the end of each panel.
3. Give a report of the basics of their meeting at the NFAC Business Meeting.
4. Keep a written inventory of any equipment or NFAC items in their custody. This written inventory will be submitted to the Finance Chair no later than the second (2nd) quarter NFAC Assembly.
5. Create, conduct, and facilitate a workshop at each assembly.

Historical and Additional Background:

1. The change from committee to service coordinator began in 2003 as the Corrections Committee wanted to send a representative to the Bridging the Gap Conference in Chicago. Discussion prevailed and questions arose on whom specifically would be sent and whether Corrections has a committee members. Minority Opinion felt that it set a bad precedent to approve funds to an unnamed representative.
2. The Area Chair in 2003 charged the Growth Committee with the task of clarifying the existence and make-up of a Standing Committee.
3. Growth Committee took on the issue of what constitutes a committee.
4. July 2005 the Growth Committee submitted the motion to eliminate the word “committee” when it described an Area Committee, other than Administrative Committee, and replace it with the phrase ‘Service Coordinator’.
5. Since 2005 these, once committees, have become Service Coordinator “workshops” consisting primarily of presenting similar topic in a variety of similar ways.
6. The committee attendees lost a sense of vested interest and attendance, and participation has fallen off.
7. The work done previously in committee in order to carry the message has become more and more talking heads or panels.
8. Items created for carrying the message during the time of committees that attendees had a vested interest include pamphlets, aiding committees in specific places such as corrections and treatment across the area. In other words, ideas and collaboration amongst the committee members resulted in useful results that actually carried the message to the alcoholic that still suffers, in accordance with our Primary Purpose.

Motion from the Website Committee - (Tabled to be printed in the July minutes).

Moved that the Technology Service Committee be integrated into the Website Administrative Committee and the Website Committee be renamed to the Communications and Technology Committee, changing Structures and Guidelines as follows:

- Communications and Technology
 - This committee will review and select the preferred candidate for the position of Webmaster, act to ensure continuity with technology used by Area 14, will consult with other Area Committee members in planning, selecting, obtaining, and the maintenance and use of technology.
 - The contract for the Webmaster’s Services will be executed by both the Communications and Technology Chairperson and the NFAC Chairperson.
- Ensure Advisory Actions and Structures and Guidelines per all motions that have passed are updated on the website.
- Communications and Technology Chairperson
 - Will be appointed by the NFAC Chairperson and attend Assemblies.
 - Responsible for setting up the meeting and coordinating information within the committee.
 - Ensure that the website (aanorthflorida.org) meet the recommendations of the Committee and/or the Assembly.
- Webmaster
 - Maintain the website and only add or remove data when directed by the Communications and Technology Committee and/or Assembly.
 - Responsible for the bulk emailing of the minutes 30 days before the next assembly.
- Hardware and Software:

- Maintains records of technology equipment and software, including those assigned to Area Panel members, and oversees transfer of equipment at beginning of each panel. Provide an inventory of all equipment and software licenses to the Area 14 Finance Chair at the beginning of each panel.
- Receives all requests for use of technology equipment for use at assembly and other Area 14 events. Provides AV and Virtual support as requested, and oversees AV support, providing equipment set-up and securing outside resources as deemed fiscally responsible.
- Virtual Needs:
 - The Area Chairperson will maintain “ownership” status of any Area 14 virtual accounts with Zoom or other providers. The Committee Chair, or their designee, will administer the accounts, assigning user levels, scheduling meetings, etc. A roster of members available to provide virtual hosting and other support for virtual/hybrid events and other necessary administrative functions will be maintained.
 - Evaluates Area 14 immediate and future needs for equipment, software licenses, for production or contractor outside help, including, securing and evaluating bids in order to make fiscally responsible purchases.
 - Considers future technology, equipment and software needs including integration of other Area functions within the committee, such as website and/or communications.

Background:

- Administrative Committees are assigned committee members versus only volunteers for service committees;
- This would maximize the use of our limited resources including human capital;
- This provides for more efficiency where these two committees overlap.

Motion from the Newsletter Ad Hoc Committee - (Seconded, Tabled to be printed in the July minutes).

Moved that: North Florida Area 14 establish a Newsletter Service Committee, as described in the Area 14 Newsletter Service Committee’s Composition, Scope, and Budget Guidelines.

- Composition
 - The committee includes a chairperson, a reasonable number of voting members, a trusted advisor experienced in and familiar with AA traditions and Area 14 procedures and protocols (e.g., a past delegate, past chair, website chair, etc.) and other non-voting volunteers as needed.
 - It is suggested that the chairperson have experience in written communications, editorial, and/or electronic publishing technology or demonstrate a willingness to learn.
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson will be appointed by the Area 14 Chairperson, as a voting member of Area 14. The remaining members will be selected by the Committee Chairperson and approved by the Area 14 Chairperson. The Area 14 Chairperson will serve as an ex-officio member.
- Scope
 - The committee will be a permanent, non-administrative committee.
 - The newsletter will provide a regular news and information communications link between the North Florida Area Conference service structure and DCMs, GSRs, service coordinators, and other interested individuals to help them participate more fully in Area activities and to assist voting members to make more fully informed decisions.

- The committee will determine the frequency, timing, publishing format, and distribution method for the newsletter in accordance with Area 14 policies and standards relating to electronic communications.
- The committee is responsible for determining the content of the newsletter and establishing a review process to ensure accuracy, appropriateness, and conformance with the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- Budget Guidelines
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson submits a budget request and is allocated a budget each January, as approved by the Finance Committee, and is responsible for committee expenditures.
 - The Newsletter Committee Chairperson is entitled to one night's paid lodging at each quarterly area assembly hotel and reimbursed for mileage and tolls to and from the assembly.

Additional Background

- The Area 14 Ad Hoc Newsletter Committee was formed by the Panel 71 Area Chairperson following the third quarter 2021 area assembly.
- The current committee currently consists of four voting members, a non-voting trusted advisor (past delegate), and the Area Chairperson as an ex-officio member.
- The Committee has published three issues of the newsletter, Spirit of Service, in advance of each area assembly held in calendar year 2022.
- Distribution has been by email in PDF format to Panel 71 members, area DCMS, and others who have either opted in to receive Area 14 emails or requested to be on the newsletter distribution list (about 100 email address) and in a print version distributed at the corresponding area assembly.
- Expenses incurred by the committee during its first year have been for the print edition, averaging around \$100 per assembly. The current Area budget has a \$500 line item for newsletter expenses.
- Area 14 DCMs are encouraged to distribute the newsletter to their district GSRs, service coordinators, and other interested members, which elevates total distribution considerably.
- The ad hoc committee recently conducted an email survey of panel members and DCMS regarding the future of the newsletter. Nine out of ten respondents had read one or more issues; three-quarters found the content useful; two-thirds agreed the area should continue to publish the newsletter beyond Panel 71.

Delegate: Mary A.

My name is Mary and I am an alcoholic. Today I serve as your Area 14 Alternate Delegate Panel 71. My service journey started like so many of us at the homegroup. But at 11 months sober my sponsor brought me to an area assembly and I fell in love with general service. I began as a group GSR, then onto District as CPC-PI Chair, Alt DCM and DCM. For the District I have hosted workshops and spoken at schools, health fairs and The Al Anon State Convention. I lead a project to place a billboard for Alcoholics Anonymous on Brevard Highways and started a Gratitude Breakfast that has become an annual event. For the 59th Florida State Convention I became the registration chair.

How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no "friendly" amendments under Robert's Rules.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.
- Our experience is that premature actions such as amend-

ing motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.

Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees' committee or appropriate corporate board for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

Calling the Question

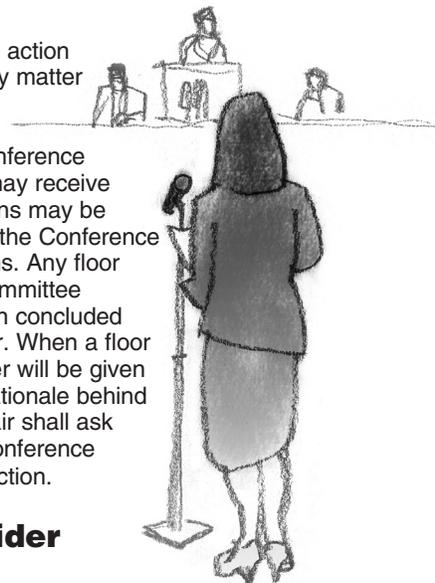
Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

Floor Actions

It is possible for a Conference action to come from the floor, but any matter which falls within the scope of a Conference committee ought first go through that Conference committee, so that the topic may receive due consideration. Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. Any floor action regarding a piece of committee business that has not yet been concluded will be considered out of order. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.



Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.

Summary of Conference Procedures

Remember:

- Motions must be made in order at the microphone.
- Address motions to the chair.
