

North Florida Area 14 Assembly Minutes
1st Quarter, January 16-17, 2010
Theme “Enthusiasm and Gratitude in Action”

Area Chair: Glenn W. called meeting to order at 9:02 AM. Serenity Prayer was said. The AA Anonymity Statement was read and the Short Form of the Twelve Concepts was read.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Andy D. As each district was called for attendance of D.C.M., Alternate D.C.M., and number of G.S.R.’s and alternate G.S.R.’s present. All officers and service coordinators were present. 215 total voting members for assembly.

Officer Reports:

Secretary: Kelly J. The minutes were emailed in a timely fashion; mailed minutes were delayed with holiday mail. No changes to the minutes. All were in favor.

Treasurer: Laura M.

Thank you for the privilege of serving. Let’s start on the top of the Balance Sheet – combined cash on hand is \$65,493.88. If you go to the next page – Income & Expense report shows our budgeted amount for contributions for 2009 was \$48,000. Note that we had total contributions of \$43,314.66. This is \$4,685.34 below estimated contributions. If you look at page 3 of the Income & Expense Budget vs Actual report you’ll see Expenses budgeted for 2009 were \$64,600.00. Our actual 2009 Expenses were \$41,531.81. So we are \$23,068.19 below budgeted expenses for 2009. Now let’s look at the additional report I have created on your table called NFACAA Monthly Comparison of Cash Income 2008 & 2009 & Prudent Reserve Overage. The first section on this report is the comparison of 2008 & 2009 Contributions, 7th Tradition, GV Sales & GV Raffle at assemblies. I’ve had some of you ask me questions, how much do we collect at the 7th tradition at the area assemblies? Or can you tell me what our biggest contribution month is? This part of the report will show you the answers to those questions. Historically October is our largest contribution month. The next section is the Prudent Reserve Overage Report: Under Structures and Guidelines 16A: Prudent Reserve: An overage evaluation shall be made by the Treasurer at the end of each calendar year after all bills are paid. Any overage shall be reported to the Assembly at its first quarterly meeting. Any such overage shall be reported in the minutes from the first quarterly Assembly meeting, and distribution of the overage shall be decided on at the second quarterly Assembly by the Assembly body. Our total year end cash on hand total for our prudent reserve including checking, savings and CD accounts is \$65,493.88. Our Total Expenses Budgeted for 2010 is \$65,022.00. Keeping with a 12 month annual reserve – our current overage is \$471.88. There are three motions coming from finance today that may wipe out the overage – but come to the April Finance Committee Meeting for the update. At the Officers meeting, a motion was entertained by the Board of Directors to change the name of the Corporation to the North Florida Area Conference, Inc. Motion passed unanimously. Removing Alcoholics Anonymous from the corporate name was to protect the anonymity of our officers at the public level.

Delegate Panel 59: Chet P. recognized the Past Area 14 Delegates seated in the audience: Tom D., Panel 43; Dan E., Panel 45; Dick G., Panel 47; Corliss G., Panel 53; Michael S., Panel 55. Our guest for the weekend from the General Service Office (GSO) Mary D. sent greetings for the GSO Office and thanked everyone for their hospitality and warmth this weekend.

The 4th Quarterly Report of the General Service Board in November: net **literature sales** were \$10,891,100, 2.3 % more than budgeted and 14% more than the same period last year; gross profit was \$499,250 more than budgeted. Contributions were \$4,371,200 or 6.5 % less than budgeted and 6% less than the same period last year. In summary, for the first nine months total revenue was \$10,992,461 with total expenses of \$9,966,338 leaving an excess of \$1,026,123 compared to a budgeted excess of \$626,753 and last year’s loss of \$315,916.

Grapevine circulation is down compared to last year: average circulation for the first 9 months of this year is 103,300 compared to 105,984 for the same period last year. Gross profit is \$4,687 less than last year, but \$130,296 more than budgeted. La Vina had a \$36,780 loss which was \$40,839 less than budgeted and \$19,572 less than last year’s \$56,352 loss. Circulation of 9,570 is 430 less than budgeted and 450 less than last year.

The Reserve Fund has a balance of \$11,920,036, which represents about 9 months of operating expenses. After deducting accrued pension costs, the Reserve Fund balance is \$3,518,037.

The International Convention/Regional Forum Committee recommended that over the Convention weekend, unlimited access to an encrypted, anonymity-protected International broadcast of the opening Flag Ceremony be made available through G.S.O.'s website. This broadcast would end at midnight on July 5th.

AAWS Report

Publications: Total distribution of all books through September was 1,852,873 which is a 14.9 % increase from the same period last year. Total AA purchases was 74.4 %.

The construction project for new lighting and new ceiling is on time. There was a virus intrusion that affected computer operations during the fall. It is fixed and no loss to records or data resulted.

GSO Corrections Desk needs volunteers for the Corrections Correspondence Service, particularly Spanish-speaking males who live outside the Pacific Region. Also, submissions for the revision of the pamphlet, "**It Sure Beats Sitting In A Cell**" are being sought. Stories can be sent directly to the Corrections desk. Local Corrections committees are being asked to share experience with signing legally binding documents as part of the cooperation with corrections professions. Local solutions regarding how to observe facility regulations while staying within our Traditions can also be sent directly to the Corrections desk.

Last year's Conference passed an Advisory Action asking for input from the Fellowship on the use of literature profits to pay for services. I have distributed a short questionnaire that can be taken back to your groups that may assist in gathering that input. I request this be returned at the April Assembly so I can take it to the Conference. Cecilia and I will be attending the Delegate's Get Together in Atlanta next month. My past experience with this meeting is that its primary purpose is preparation for the General Service Conference, especially for new Delegates and Alternates. In addition there will be a vote on the proposed change to the regional voting process on regional business and the proposed format for the Southeast Regional Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (SERAASA). Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

Alternate Delegate: Cecilia R.

During this past quarter I went with Bob C. to The Florida State Prison at Raiford to verify that the new group there is indeed meeting the requirements of a group and should be registered. It is always a privilege to go "inside the walls" to carry and hear the message of Alcoholics Anonymous.

I will be attending the Delegates Get Together in Atlanta in February.

We were notified that the Florida State Hospitality Suite for the International Convention in July would be at the Grand Hyatt. There is a form to fill out if you are registered and would like to volunteer to be a greeter for a 2 hour slot. This form is posted on Area 15's web site and instructions are included on the form www.area15aa.org. A copy of the form will also be included in our minutes.

I will be conducting several workshops in this next quarter as well.

Chairperson: Glenn W. First I want to recognize all new G.S.R.s and D.C.M.s with orange badges. Also, I wanted to recognize all our visitors with green badges. Since the last time we met, I have continued to participate in some workshops for various Districts. We, all of the officers as well as the service coordinators are available to you for workshops.

I have requested that our panel make their reports concise and limit the podium time to 3 minutes. Sometimes, however, especially when our trusted servants have just returned from a National conference that your Groups graciously contributed funds towards they felt compelled to share with you a piece of that experience. For the most part, with the exception of our Delegate, we should be able to keep the reports brief and concise. As far as the business is concerned, my job is to facilitate the motions, to keep things moving. But I also have a more spiritual responsibility, which is to contribute to an informed group conscience when it comes to these decisions we make. Let's be conscience and considerate about getting the work done that we are being funded to be here for. As I believe I have demonstrated so far, I will keep a cadence going so that we come to informed group conscience decisions and not just raising our hand to get done.

In closing, I'm very aware that some of us may have some "outside issues" "kicking off" at 1 today but let's be careful about calling the question prematurely. I'll do my job the best I can to keep things moving along. Thank you for this opportunity to serve Alcoholics Anonymous.

Alternate Chair: Marilyn B. This weekend we had 319 members registered. The breakdown is as follows: 39 DCM's/Alt. DCM's, 56 Visitors, 182 GSR's/Alt.GSR's, and 42 Officers, Service Coordinators and Administrative Chairs. I want to thank Districts 1, 7, 15 and 32 for hosting, with a special thanks to Jim B for taking on the job to host DCM. Great Job! I want to thank Dick G. for serving as the Past Delegate of the Assembly. Our next Assembly will be April 9th 10th & 11th and Districts 11, 24, 30 and 31 will be hosting and our Past Delegate for the Assembly will be Dan E.. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Registrar: Andy D. Thank you for allowing me to serve you as registrar for Panel 59.

The result of our role today is that we have 215 voting members and I want to again welcome the 13 visitors here in attendance today at this business meeting. Since the October Assembly, we've processed more than 100 change forms and I want to thank you for taking the time to provide us this information. On December 12, 2009 we bulk mailed 580 hardcopy white envelopes containing the October assembly minutes. This mailing did get caught up in the Christmas mailing rush and took longer than usual to get delivered. Between now and the next assembly, I encourage you to email me any group changes you'd like to make. Also, my registrar snail mail street address is printed on the bottom of the change forms we've be using at the registration tables this weekend. \$536.50, GV Subscription Raffles sold \$448.00, Basket raffle \$155.00 and sales taxes collected \$37.55 total collected \$1177.05. Rob completed the 2009 GV Literature Inventory total was \$1,678.00 in literature.

Grapevine subscriptions dropped dramatically in the last quarter of 2009 and caused the Grapevine Inc to draw from their prudent reserve \$40,000.00. Please pass the word, Grapevine subscriptions need support.

District 27 is planning to start an Intergroup and are asking for assistance. North Florida Area offered assistance, as requested. Don gave the detailed history of the Guidelines, which were obtained from GSO. There are a total of 17 Guidelines, 3 which apply to Intergroup. Those are: A.A. discussion focused on “Central or Intergroup Offices”. A lengthy discussion of whether Intergroups should/should not sell Non-Conference Approved Literature ensued, with no consensus.

Administrative Reports:

The Treasurer gave her report. It was reviewed and accepted. The NFAC property inventory report was given. From the Area Alt. Delegate a requested that "the Area Alt. Chairperson be funded for 2 nights at each Assembly". A motion was made and then amended to include all Officers, Committee Chairs, Service Coordinators and Archives Coordinator. The Amendment passed and then the amended motion passed. This will be presented to the Assembly under new business. Corrections asked to have their budget for workshops be increased from \$250 to \$750. The Committee though this was too big a jump and voted to increase the workshop budget to \$500. The Committee voted to change the Correction literature budget to \$750 from \$1000 and to then increase the workshop budget to \$750. This gave Corrections the amount they ask for. These items will be bough to the floor under new business. Last we discussed our prudent reserve cap.

The new password will be sent to all D.C.M.'s email. We need current D.C.M.'s email addresses. Detailed minutes of our discussions of the new NFA Website Guidelines are being created.

From Finance Committee, Motion to increase budget item #7400 Corrections sub item #7460 Workshops from \$250.00 to \$500.00. Motion Passed with 2 opposed.

From Finance Committee, Motion to change budget item #7400 Corrections sub item #7450 Literature to \$750.00 from \$1,000 and increase sub item #7460 from \$500.00 to \$750.00. Motion Passed with 4 opposed.

From Marilyn B., Alternate Chair/Site and Agenda: Motion to purchase (4) four additional wireless headsets at the cost not to exceed \$150.00. Motion Passed with no opposed.

Chet P., Delegate, requested a Sense of the Assembly on two issues prior to taking the Area's position to the Delegates Get Together in February 2010: 1) a change of procedure for voting on Regional business, other than related to the Southeastern Conference, so that only the sitting Delegates and Regional Trustee have a vote and 2) that Area 14 support an experimental trial of the Southeast Regional A.A. Service Assembly (SERAASA). The Assembly voted to approve both issues.


