

**North Florida Area 14 Assembly Minutes**  
**3rd Quarter, July 24-25, 2010**  
**Theme “Enthusiasm and Gratitude in Action”**

**Area Chair:** Glenn W. called meeting to order at 9:05 AM. Serenity Prayer was said. The AA Anonymity Statement was read and the Short Form of the Twelve Concepts was read.

**Registrar:** Roll call was taken by Andy D. As each district was called for attendance of D.C.M., Alternate D.C.M., and number of G.S.R.’s and alternate G.S.R.’s present. All officers and service coordinators were present except Grapevine. 208 total voting members for assembly.

**Officer Reports:**

**Secretary:** Kelly J. Motions from April Assembly were emailed to webmaster 7 days after assembly and are under password protected area of our website. Mailed minutes were sent out in a timely fashion. Are there any corrections to the minutes? No changes to the minutes. All were in favor of approving the minutes from the April Assembly.

**Treasurer:** Laura M. Let’s start on the top of the Balance Sheet – combined cash on hand is \$72,805.10. If you go to the next page – Income & Expense report shows our budgeted amount for contributions for 2010 was \$48,000, that’s \$12,000 per quarter. Note that we had total contributions of \$25,244.52, estimated \$24,000 for second quarter which puts us \$1,244.52 ahead of estimated contributions. Thank you to all the groups who have supported the area and their generosity. If you look at page 3 of the Income & Expense report you’ll see Expenses budgeted for 2010 are \$65,972.00. Our actual 2010 Expenses are \$21,422.01. So we are well below budgeted expenses at this time. Thank you for allowing me to serve!

**Delegate:** Chet P. recognized the Past Area 14 Delegates seated in the audience: Dan E., Panel 45; Kathy P., Panel 49; Corliss G., Panel 53; Michael S., Panel 55; Fred H., Panel 57.

I attended the International Convention in San Antonio and participated in a panel on “The Traditions: The Spiritual Glue That Holds AA Together.” Over 53,000 attended. There are some extra copies of the commemorative book, “AA Comes of Age”, which are being inventoried and can be ordered from GSO. They are being sold by the box with a limit of one box per order.

Last weekend, I attended the South Florida Area Quarterly in Ft. Lauderdale and was very warmly received. I was asked to give a workshop on the 12 Concepts.

**AAWS report:** Contributions On Line is operational with credit cards being accepted and soon e-checks will be accepted. Go to [www.aa.org](http://www.aa.org) for information on how to create an account and utilize the new system.

**Grapevine Survey:** This is a very important event. The Grapevine is in crisis and they are trying to reach as many people as possible to see if there is anything that can be done about reversing the trend away from print publications. It will be a big job to coordinate the tabulating of the results in addition to getting the word out and getting the broadest response possible.

**AAWS Financials for 1st Quarter:**

Net sales were \$ 3,315,000; contributions were \$1,498,000; Total revenue was \$ 3,646,000.

Net income was \$626,000 compared with \$ 351,000 budgeted income and \$335,000 more than same quarter last year. Publications: Total distribution of all literature through May 31, 2010 was 740,813 units: 22.7% less than last year. AAWS Ad Hoc E-Technology Committee was established to advise in the development and delivery of electronic formats of AA literature and other means of electronic communication. This committee made two recommendations 1) Full support for GSO to begin developing e-publishing as a digital format that will enable electronic delivery of our literature. 2) Full support for GSO to move ahead with a questionnaire that requests feedback from the fellowship on preferences for digital devices and 3-delivery. Distribution of the questionnaire

began at the International Convention. Further distribution will be through the Conference structure, Forums and other AA related events.

**Conference Report:** The 60<sup>th</sup> General Service Conference was held April 18<sup>th</sup> through April 24<sup>th</sup> in Rye, New York. It was my privilege to attend as your Delegate from Area 14, North Florida.

The keynote address was given by Bill Clark, the rotating Class A Trustee. As part of his remarks, he said: "We are men and women, younger and older; we differ in ethnicity, in religious persuasion, in personality, in so many ways. Each of us is committed to widening the circle of recovery, in his town, in her state, in our U.S.A. and Canada, and even around the world. What brings us together is a commitment to do our best to 'keep our work arteries carrying life giving grace'. People cannot live out the covenant with the Fellowship by themselves and alone. We must move forward together, in unity, in we are to facilitate the fellowship flourishing." This set the tone for this year's Conference. The theme of Unity was set early in the Conference by an Archives presentation. They showed a picture of Bill and Lois in San Diego during a 1948 trip across the country. An excerpt from the talk he gave was played: "For we are coming to see, and ever so clearly, that unless we are bound together as one, there can be little recovery for those hundreds of thousands yet to turn to us." For those who may be new to general service, the General Service Conference was established in 1951 to take the place of the Founders in setting the policy and direction for Alcoholics Anonymous. Two-way communication is essential. Any member, group, District or Area can make a suggestion for A.A.'s future. It may become a Final Agenda Item for the Conference to consider. Last year North Florida proposed two agenda items. The both were included in the final agenda and were assigned to a Conference Committee:

1) A request that the Conference establish a policy for the use of full faces of actors portraying AA members in videos. This was referred to the Trustee's Committee on Public Information to establish such a policy recommendation and report back to next year's Conference. 2) A request that personal stories regarding the use of 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition funds be collected for use in Conference literature. This was passed. The second aspect of that two-way communication is for the Delegate to report back what happened at Conference so the members know where A.A. is headed.

I have given a report to the Orlando area Districts. Districts 13 and 14 have scheduled reports. I am available to meet with any other District that wants me to come. Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

**Alternate Delegate:** Cecilia R. The Florida State Hospitality Suite at the 75th International Convention was a great success. We were visited by members from over 59 countries, all 50 United States and 7 Providences of Canada. With an over all attendance of 53,000 we were visited by over 2000 people who signed the guest book and close to 2500 came over to have their picture taken with "Bill and Bob". Dates of sobriety ranged from 53 years to 2 weeks. 4000 buttons were given to our guests who consumed 55 Gallons of Coffee and 30 Gallons of Iced Tea and lots of candy. We were the only suite offering such. We would like to thank the 87 volunteers for the Florida Hospitality Suite and 11 for the Southeastern suite who stepped up from North & South Florida. There will be a lessons learned and all materials archived for the 2015 International in Atlanta. Thank you for the opportunity to be of service. I participated in the workshop "Let it begin with me" and did an archives presentation with the archives book we put together in North Florida. 3 of the archives books were going back to Belgium.

**Chairperson:** Glenn W. First I want to recognize all new G.S.R.'s and D.C.M.'s with orange badges. Also, I wanted to recognize all our visitors with green badges. I once wore a green badge here for a few years also.

Since the last time we met, I was invited and participated in Jacksonville's Service Fair.

I also attended the International Convention in San Antonio and helped out for awhile in the Florida hospitality room. While there, I also had the opportunity to speak on a panel, which was quite the experience for me.

As Chet has mentioned, we have a couple of Grapevine items that the North Florida membership has been asked to respond to. I will be creating an ad-hoc committee to assist with the compiling of the member's responses back to the Grapevine.

Yesterday, we had a Robert's Rules role play workshop facilitated by our Parliamentarian. I hope members found this helpful and will be able to apply those concepts in today's business meeting.

Lastly, about today's business meeting, a couple of items. I am aware the printed agenda for today does not indicate the past old business that still exists. On your table, you should find a correct agenda of old business motions to be discussed and voted today. Also, these motions have been available on our website in the member's section. As we do have a full plate of old business and a number of new business items that I am aware of, I wanted to ask our panel giving reports to please be brief.

Lastly, as far as the business is concerned, my job is to facilitate the motions, to keep things moving. But I also have a more spiritual responsibility, which is to contribute to an informed group conscience when it comes to these decisions we make. Let's be conscience and considerate about getting the work done that we are being funded to be here for. While our agenda states 9-12 we are finished when the work gets done. I will do my best to both keep things moving along and facilitate you all coming to informed group conscience decisions. Thank you for this opportunity to serve Alcoholics Anonymous.

**Alternate Chair:** Marilyn B. This weekend we had 308 members registered. The breakdown is as follows: 43 D.C.M.'s/Alt. D.C.M.'s; 55 Visitors; 174 G.S.R.'s/Alt.G.S.R.'s; and 36 Officers; Service Coordinators and Administrative Chairs. I want to thank Districts 9, 13, 17, & 25 for hosting, with special thanks to Nancy D. for taking on the job to host DCM. Great Job! I want to thank Fred H., for serving as the Past Delegate. Our next Assembly will be October 22, 23 & 24th and Districts 3, 14, 19, and 21 will be hosting. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

**Registrar:** Andy D. Thank you for allowing me to serve you as registrar for Panel 59. The result of our role today is that we have 208 voting members and I want to again welcome the 14 visitors here in attendance today at this business meeting. Since the April Assembly, we've processed more than 85 change forms and I want to thank you for taking the time to provide us this information. On May 24, 2010, we bulk mailed 552 hardcopy white envelopes containing the April assembly minutes. Also, in an effort to identify those USPS addresses that are no longer valid, we mailed 552 post cards of which we received 82 responses. Our database has now been updated to reflect this new information. Between now and the next assembly, I encourage you to email me any group changes you'd like to make. I gave PowerPoint on the AA early history and Dave brought the display and spoke on the history of North Florida. I was invited to District 7 by the Lake Sumter Intergroup on September 9. I will be attending the National Archives Workshop in Macon, GA. On September 23-26, 2010.

**Cooperation with the Professional Community(CPC):** Tom H. Coordinator, Alt. Kathy P. Attendance, 48. Discussed upcoming conferences: Kiwanis and A.A.R.P.. Discussed carrying the message to professionals and clergy with flyers and pamphlets. G.S.O. asked about showing showing videos at workshops and exhibit halls and if we think it would make a difference. Professionals can go to AA.org to see streamed line DVD's.

**Corrections:** Bob C. Coordinator, Alt. Jordan, Attendance 30. A.A. Comes of Age new in soft cover for corrections. Area 14/15 Corrections Workshop will be held September 12, at the Sahara Club in Sanford, FL. Cecilia R. will be the speaker and Area 14 will provide food. Discussed Corrections Workshop at International Convention and will be sending thank you notes to wardens of our facilities to show our appreciation for allowing access. Went over what a Corrections Service Coordinator does for the area. People interested will need to submit service resume to new chairperson elected in October. Discussed registering corrections groups with G.S.O.. Dan E. shared how the Florida Department of Corrections appreciates our service work and will continue to support our efforts.

**Grapevine:** Coordinator did not attend assembly. Grapevine room was not open. No raffle took place. No report given. No workshop took place.

**Intergroup:** Don H. Coordinator, Melanie E. Alt. Coordination, Attendance, 39.

This meeting focused on fielding questions about how each represented Intergroup conducts the business of being there on the front line of their local areas in carrying the message of AA to the still suffering alcoholic. The following items were discussed: The importance of maintaining a current website meeting listing for all visitors to your area (it was noted that each Office Mgr. utilizes different techniques to accomplish this task- each which work for them); the importance of accurate and timely website communications; the proper training of members manning our hot-line phones; how to insure our individual groups are still operating and open (one Intergroup has a "Unity Committee" which physically visits each group on a monthly basis, other Intergroups use a Steering Committee/Board Member to accomplish the same thing); Funding for Intergroup operations was a very topical item of discussion and here again each Office does this differently and effectively; how to work in harmony with/support Districts. Don asked the attendees their opinion of whether this panel format should be used in future Intergroup Workshops. The overwhelming answer was YES and main reason was the attendees seemed astounded by diversity of our Intergroups and their outstanding ability to adapt to needs and wants of their area.

**Literature:** Wendy S. We discussed what action needed to be taken if someone was interested in one of the service coordinators positions and the proposed 2011 budget for Literature. Discussed progress of the pamphlet "A.A. Along the Way." We reviewed the 2010 Conference Advisory Actions & additional considerations. A special thanks to Chet P. for stopping by and discussing various agenda items & answering some of the committee's questions.

A motion was brought to the floor regarding the Service Manual which was passed and will be brought the assembly later under new business. We ended the meeting with a quick game using both Conference approved literature & service materials.

**Public Information** Staci S.- Coordinator, Heidi L.-Alternate Coordinator, Attendance-25 In our workshop we spoke about "rotation" and how the Area needs people to take over the workshops and also stand for panel positions. We played a game on the background of P.I. We spoke about the Membership Survey and the usefulness of it in our committee. We also discussed what P.I. work was going on in our districts. I would really like to thank Heidi, my alternate and note taker for yesterday. Great job! I attended the Jacksonville Service Fair, wonderful food, wonderful fellowship, and great information.

**Treatment:** Vivian F. Coordinator, Randy W. Alternate Coordinator, Attendance 65.

We began with a good "Old Fashioned" Sharing Session. Everyone had the opportunity to share what they had been doing in their District. We had terrific feedback from many. We discussed our goal of sponsoring Grapevine subscriptions in each Treatment Facility in North Florida Area and found more groups had been achieving this in the last quarter. We also discussed the need to put Grapevine Subscriptions in nursing homes and enhancing our presence in this area also. Randy W., noted there were eight (8) calls this quarter for Bridging the Gap and four (4) of these were in one week. This led into a discussion on what Bridging the Gap is and suggested parameters for AA'ers participating in this area of Service. During the Assembly, Randy received a phone call from Connecticut and was able to set up the Bridge prior to leaving the Assembly Sunday morning. **Finance:** LeRoy L. Chairperson, Sandi B. Alternate Chairperson. Attendance, 11 out of 13 members present. The Treasurer gave her report, which the committee accepted. She reported that we have a \$72,800 and the budget is for \$65,900. She stated that expenses are running lower than budgeted. The expensive are running under \$60,000. We are over our cap. Six motions will be coming to floor under new business. The main one is the proposed 2011 budget. The proposed 2011 budget was review, amended and passed. The proposed budget will in your minutes and voted on at the October meeting. On a personal note I would like if everyone would read and study the long form of the Seventh Tradition.

**Growth:** Cecilia R. Chairperson, Rita C. Alternate Chairperson. The growth committee met with a quorum of D.C.M.'s attending. We discussed the request from Districts 16 and 14 to change their districts. All voted in favor and will be sent as a motion from growth to the floor at the business meeting. We request that a member(s) from District 33 attending the next growth committee meeting to discuss this.


