

North Florida Area Conference Assembly Minutes
3rd Quarter, July 13-15, 2012
Theme “Anonymity: Our Spiritual Responsibility in the Digital Age”

Area Chair: Kelly J. called the meeting to order.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Vivian F. Each District was called for attendance D.C.M., Alternate D.C.M., G.S.R.’s Alternate G.S.R.’s, Panel 61, and Visitors.

The AA Anonymity Statement was read and the short form of the Twelve Concepts was read.

Officer Reports -

Secretary: Motions from the April Assembly were e-mailed to the Webmaster 10 days after the Assembly and posted to the password protected area of the anorthflorida.org website. There were a total of 400 copies double-sided, and stapled. Fifty were given to the Area Chair for the GSR packets and the remaining copies were inserted into envelopes and given to the Registrar to be mailed out 30 days prior to this Assembly. The total duplication cost for this mailing was \$344. The Literature Flyer was missing the second page and the Alternate Chair report had the Officers and Service Coordinators numbers reversed. I would like to thank Central Orlando Group for asking me to assist in the facilitation of the Twelve Traditions workshop. Motion to accept the minutes as amended passed with none opposed.

Treasurer: Connie D. Financial Reports – Current assets include a reserve fund balance of \$42,736.15, which is 62% of budget – 75% prudent reserve. Prudent reserve recommended is 9 months. Checking account balance is \$7,196.10. Contributions are \$20,258.69 for the first half of the year. Income \$20,816.22 and annualized budget \$27,100, we are under income \$6,284. Expenses are \$25,267.11 and annualized budget \$34,358 we are over budget \$9,091. Net loss actual \$4,450.89. 2013 Budget has been prepared and passed to finance committee for recommendation. Annette will report in the Finance Committee Report. Thank you for the privilege of serving. There were two contributions Connie will review with groups. Budget and expenses were discussed briefly. Motion to accept the treasures report all in favor with none opposed.

Delegate: Cecilia R. Where have I been since we last met? I along with our Registrar, Literature Chair, Alt Literature Chair, and Finance Chair were guests of Area 1 Northwest Florida/Alabama for their April pre conference assembly. The weekend was informative with sharing of how our areas prepare for the upcoming Conferences I was the Speaker for Saturday Night and I focused mostly on service and recovery in my talk. Some of the differences is their assembly is taped by a professional taper, they have displays inside of their big meeting room from Corrections, Literature, Young Peoples and Archives. Their Delegate, Alternate Delegate, Secretary, Registrar and Chair were fully engaged in all activities for the weekend. I hope this starts a tradition of all Areas that include the state of Florida to visit each other’s respective areas in the future. I did receive a Thank You from Dennis J. Area 1 Delegate for his visit to us in March. Ten days after returning from Alabama, I left on the auto train for the 62nd General Service Conference, held in Rye, New York. The Policy/Admissions Committee met for the first time at 7:45am Sunday morning to start the business of admitting visitors or substitutions to the Conference, then pick up Registration packages, Roll Call and board reports, lunch, 3 hour Policy/Admissions meeting, dinner, presentations and then back to the room. This basically was the entire week schedule. I did thank the Corrections Committee Chair Debbie A. when she presented their report for including the North Florida Area suggestion to add stories about Young incarcerated people in the new “Sure Beats Sitting in a Cell” pamphlet. I also thanked the General Service Manager Phyllis H., Archivist Michelle M and Trustee Chair George M. for their support of the National Alcoholics Anonymous Archives Workshop, which will be held in the North Florida Area this year. I sent all results and how I voted, a newsletter developed by our Alternate Delegate, as well as information from GSO to the Webchair two weeks post conference. We have completed 5 post conference workshops with the Service Coordinators and have two more scheduled. We are trying something new this year for a post conference report to meet the

needs of the I-10/I-75/Jacksonville corridor. I have rented a conference room at a hotel near the I-10/I-75 interchange, and have invited all the Districts from east to west, north and south to attend a post conference report. If you were unable to attend a previous workshop and would like to attend, please come up. The flyer will be posted on the website shortly with time and directions. We are receiving a favorable response to the area hosting this workshop and hope to be able to reach those who cannot drive the distance to here from the western end of our area. 700 Conference reports will be here within the month and they will be made available to the DCM's to get to their GSR's.

There was an advisory action from Conference which I sent to all DCM's with their GSO contributions for last quarter asking for them to discuss if the 11th Tradition short form or long form meets the needs of fellowship. We discussed this last night and I will send the area sharing to our SE Regional Trustee.

A highlight from the Conference was to be interviewed by a member of the India General Service office, who was at conference as an observer. His short name is Lucky, his long name I still can't pronounce. He sat in on a Policy/Admissions committee meeting and afterwards wanted to know about the responsibilities of being the Chair and how I prepared for conference and to chair this committee. He sent out a history of AA in India which I gave to our Archivist and sent out a progress report on AA in India. Of over 3 billion people, only 2% are members of this fellowship. Social stigma, class status and women's place in society all make it hard for groups to flourish and grow. My guest at Conference works for an international company and had attended meetings in Mumbai (Bombay), so we were able to hear first hand from an American perspective of what meetings in India were like. Just this week we received a report from the Southeast Regional Trustee regarding India and a report from Lucky on his experiences attending the conference. I wanted to thank the Service Coordinators and their proxy's, Finance Chair, Alt Finance Chair, Alternate Delegate and Registrar for the awesome job they have done doing both the pre and post conference workshops this year. Your knowledge of the procedures and work involved with conference is evident. You have helped your Delegate and your area to be better informed and knowledgeable about our fellowship and the challenges it is facing and will face in the future. There was a letter from GSO for vacancies for a Class B Regional Trustee Southeast and a Trustee At Large. Each area is suggested to submit a candidate. We will do so at the voting assembly in October before we have Panel 63 elections. The qualifications are in Chapter 9 of the Service Manual. If you wish to submit your service resume for Trustee to the Area, please contact me for the form.

I sent a letter to all DCM's and officers regarding two proposed pamphlets for their review and discussion at this assembly. One is the proposed Public Information pamphlet which was presented by the Public Information Service Coordinator at our March Assembly and the other are proposed changes submitted by a member of this body to the Circles of Love and Service pamphlet. It was recommended by the Literature Conference Committee to review this pamphlet for possible changes in the future. We will hear from the Literature and Public Information service coordinators on this in their report.

For those who did not receive a contribution envelope at last night's conference report, there are some up here for you to take back to your groups.

At Conference during the financial presentation, it was suggested from the microphone, that the change had to start with the basket, and what were WE as Delegates going to do about it when we returned home.

After coming home and talking to our Alternate Delegate I decided that it had to start with me and I registered on-line with GSO for on-line contributions and gave \$7.00. This amount is based on what the average cost per member GSO estimates it costs to provide services to that member. Then I thought, my group does not have enough monies to fill their prudent reserve and cannot on a yearly basis help to defray the cost of services to the group which is \$136.00. So I put another \$7.00 in a GSO contribution envelope and put my group number on it and sent it in. I then asked myself what I was doing to help my District and Area to defray to cost of services. So I put another \$7.00 in a GSO contribution envelope and wrote District or Area on it and gave it to my District and Area Treasurer. Then I through where do I get my meeting lists and literature, do I not need to also be self supporting as well with the Intergroup I use? So I put another \$7.00 in an envelope and gave it in to my local Intergroup. So for the price of a half of a tank of gas, I have

been able to be self supporting to the areas that support my service and provide those vital lifelines to the still sick and suffering alcoholic. I also decided to give my sponsor's/sponsee's for their anniversaries a \$7.00 gift contribution to GSO in their name. These may seem like small gestures, however if every one of the approximate 2.5 million members of this fellowship did just the individual contribution, we would be self supporting, not to mention what it would do for the Districts, Areas, and Intergroups.

Everyone has been given an envelope with the Self Support Card on it. If you would like to put your \$7.00 dollars or a check in the envelope, either mark it as individual, group, district, area or gift, I will ensure that an online contribution will be made with recognition to whatever you indicate, or anonymous if you prefer. There are also blank order forms for GSO so you can order the GSO Contribution envelope, GSO Birthday envelop and green card, these are all FREE to you, just put the amount of each that you want sent to you, your address and fax or mail it to GSO. If you fill them out here I will get them to GSO as well. We will have these items available at each assembly for you as well.

Alternate Delegate: Marilyn B. Have you ever had a short period of time in your life that was filled with both joys & challenges? Since we last were together that is what I experienced. I have traveled to Maitland & Tavares for post Conference Reports, Kissimmee for the JAC Board Meeting & the Correction Workshop facilitated by our Correction Sub-Committee, on to District 17 for their great Service Fair and I also had a wonderful opportunity to participate in a 7th Tradition Workshop in my home District, District 28. The 7th Tradition Workshop trailed the basket dollars from the group throughout the service structure and I had the privilege to be the MC & address the dollars sent to our General Service Office. It was doubly nice to have Connie D. there to address the dollars sent to the North Florida Area and triply nice to have Steve & Sheryl R. comes to support the Workshop.

These were the joys! Here were my challenges. I slid off my roof while fixing a leak into a Ligustrum tree, was bitten by a newly adopted cat that caused a soft tissue trauma to my left hand and was stung by a swarm of wasp that had taken up residency in my patio umbrella. You may be asking yourself, what does this have to do with AA?

For those in this room who thought once you got sober life would cease to deal you challenging days, I am here to attest that is not the case. I have had to learn to "live life on life's turn" without the need to drink, thanks to your help and God's Grace.

Oh, I did have one other event that was near and dear to my heart. Two weeks ago yesterday I had the privilege of hosting a party honoring my parent's 65th wedding anniversary. Life is truly worth living now that I am sober! Thanks for allowing me serve.

Alternate Chair: Ken S. Good Morning Everyone! Thank you so much for the opportunity to serve you as your Alternate Chair. What an amazing and fun weekend this has been! Thanks to all of you for all your continued dedicated hard work and feedback on how we can continue to improve what we do to make the Assemblies a pleasurable experience for everyone.

I would like to announce that our attendance this weekend is 26 DCMs/Alt. DCMs, 139 GSRs/Alt. GSRs, 27 Officers/Service Coordinators/Administrative, and 29 Visitors for a total of 221 attendees in all. Thanks to everyone who came out this weekend and for making it another successful NFAC!

This gave our GSR's at least two group meetings to share the information from April assembly and get feedback from their groups. Our Districts have new reports, from our new working database. We visited Area 1 in Alabama and during this visit I met with their Registrar. He very graciously gave our Area a copy of the database they use. Not only great hosts, but the gift of the database has made "Registrar World" very, very happy! With the raw form and the dedicated help of our Finance Chair, Annette D, this database was adapted to our needs and is up and running. The reports, this weekend, came from this database. Please note that it is not perfect, so I need your feedback on corrections to help the process prior to our October Voting Assembly. The outside issue for October will be voting, of course. Special Reports -

56th Florida State Convention: The 56th Florida State Convention to be held August 1 – 5, 2012 at Innisbrook, Golf and Spa Resort 36750 U.S. Highway 19 North in Palm Harbor, Florida, near Tampa, no report given at this time.

NFAC Florida State Convention Oversight Committee: Yesterday we had planned on representation from 55th, 56th & 57th FSC. Pam O., 55th Treasurer, was unable to attend because of illness but did send her report. The following is the final numbers for the 2011, Orlando Convention: The 55th FSC had 1963 paid participants, plus they gave out 232 scholarships for a total attendance of 2185. The Convention distributed \$22,424.76 to various AA, Alanon, & other entities. They also contributed \$3,500.00 to FSC Prudent Reserve.

The 56th in Innisbrook is ready to greet us all next month. The 57th FSC team was there to give us a report on their budget, credit card account & their website. We had an opportunity to hear from Dan C. 57th Treasurer, Carl G. 57th, Registration Chair, and Jeff P. 57th Webmaster. Be sure to see Tom M. and his team at the upcoming convention to pre-register for 2013. They will need your support to aide in cash flow over the months to come.

The last meeting of the Florida State Convention Joint Advisor made one significant change. The Joint Advisor Committee voted to have the Alternate Delegates from Area 14 & 15 handle the monies, both checking & Prudent Reserve, for the Florida State Convention Board of Directors. The new signature cards have been signed and all the financial records have been set up in QuickBooks.

Service Coordinator Reports -

Accessibilities: The workshop was facilitated by Cecilia R, in the absence of Mike L. The Conference agenda items were reviewed. We then reviewed the workbook and the roles of the District and Area. Possibly the area Accessibilities service coordinator could help with the districts helping to identify what meetings are ADA accessible and how to identify them in meetings lists. We discussed about asking GSO to add the ADA symbols to the Special Needs Guidelines.

Archives: James B. 27 members attended the meeting. We started the workshop with Bill W. speaking at the General Service Conference in 1960. A DVD movie displayed the text of Bill's speech combined with the audio. Teresa S., Archivist District 9, presented a pamphlet she made on the History of the Home Group. I'd like to thank District 19 and District 32 for inviting me to their founder's day events.

Area Archivist: Steve R. On April 17th the NFAC Archives were relocated to 2465 Anderson Snow Road, in Spring Hill Florida 24609. This is a 10x10 climate controlled storage facility. The monthly charge is \$96.00. We received a 10% discount for prepaying six months in advance. The reason for this move was to enable myself the Archivist better access to the collection. There

are two keys to the storage facility. I as the Archivist have one and the Area Chair was given the other key. At yesterday's Archive workshop I passed out the updated North Florida Area Archives Collection Policy. This was discussed at the April Workshop with a first draft. Suggested changes have been made based on feedback given from attendees at the workshop. Work has continued on scanning the past minutes of the North Florida Area assembly. Jeff our Webmaster now has all the minutes from the 2000's uploaded to the password protected area of the web-site. Once the remaining years minutes have been scrubbed for last names and addresses, those minutes will be available on the web-site as well. The Library of Congress named Alcoholics Anonymous Big Book to its list of 88 Books that Shaped America – books that have “influenced the nation...shaped American's view of their worked and the world's views of America. The Big Book will be on display along with the remaining books on the list as part of a specials exhibition in Washington, D.C., from June 25th through September 29th. This was reported by Phyllis Halliday General Manager GSO US/Canada. I would like to thank District 19 (Orange City), District 31 (Kissimmee), and District 13 (Hernando County) for allowing me to present at their Founders Day Celebrations. I will be at this year's Florida State Convention on Saturday, August 4th doing a History of Florida workshop with Jim B. our Archives Coordinator, Jimmy (The Hat) L. and Karla K. from Area 15 Archives. The workshop will be at 12:00 noon in Edinburgh 7, 8, and 9.

The National AA Archives Workshop is scheduled for October 4-7 in Cocoa Beach at the International Palms Resort and Conference Center 1300 North Atlantic Avenue, Cocoa Beach Florida 32931. There is an article in the new summer edition of Markings about this event. The program highlights, Michelle M. GSO Archivist, all day hands on conservation and preservation workshop, history of Florida presentation, history of Richmond Walker and the 24 hour book, archive displays from Districts, Areas and Intergroups will be on display, Gail L. former Akron Archivist will introduce a private showing on Friday evening of the new Bill W. documentary! Featuring the films writer and producer, and Tommie D. close friend of Bill and Lois will be featured keynote speaker on Saturday night. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

CPC: Marcella gave report for Mary P. We had 16 in attendance. We reviewed definitions of “Cooperation with Professional Community” Committees and types of professionals.

CPC Districts needs assessment: Talks to law enforcement and judicial system officials, using pamphlets, questions about cooperation's with the clergy.

Several people shared their experience about their experience about various situations related with professionals in the Alcoholism, judicial and education fields. (gave the Conference Report on Agenda Items) We had pamphlets and several handouts as well as the CPC Workbook kit on display.

Corrections: Robert C. gave report. 23 in attendance. Opened with Serenity Prayer passed around contact information list since the last Assembly.

1. Assembled a meeting in Wakulla Work Camp Annex, in the process of registering with General Service Office.

2. A second meeting for the Graceville Work Camp is forming.

Went over all four of the Corrections Agenda Items and results.

The remainder of the workshop was used for discussing the following topics:

1. New Guidelines for appropriate foot wear to wear to Correctional Facilities. Closed toed shoes (safety a main concern).

2. Use of the pink can for raising money and where the money goes (used for Literature)

3. Bringing books into Correctional facility.

a. Every Jail is different (usually small amounts at a time).

Thanks to Dan E. Past Delegate for helping clarify issues in the system. Closed meeting with Lord's Prayer at 2:15am.

Grapevine: Sheryl R. gave report. 25 in attendance. We reviewed the 2012 Conference Agenda Items. Conference Agenda Item A: Consider proposal for A.A. Grapevine's Audio Strategy.

Recommended: A.A. Grapevine, Inc. move forward with an audio strategy to have members call in and record their story on 3rd party recording technology. The stories will be subject to the same

editorial process as print stories. The Audio endeavor will, at a minimum, breakeven financially. The Traditions, with the option to discontinue any and all contracts at any time. The committee requests that a status and financial report will be submitted to the 2013 Conference Committee on the Grapevine as background. Passed I voted Yes 88 for 24 against, call the question to end debate passed. English only, stories 7-10 minutes.

Consider "Sunset" proposal for Grapevine items. Recommended: that A.A. Grapevine Inc. carry out the "Sunset" proposal for Grapevine items. The "Sunset: proposal is a plan to phase out older or slow-moving Grapevine items and archive them digitally or make them available in another format. Passed I voted Yes. Overwhelming majority.

Additional Committee Consideration: Consider list of suggested Grapevine book topics for 2013 and later. Attitude of Gratitude, Voices of Long Term Sobriety II, Women's Stories in AA, GLBT in AA, Relationships in Sobriety, Having Fun in Sobriety, Daily Grapevine, Mid Sobriety Crisis, The Best of La Vina II, AA Inside the Walls. These are all working titles and subject to change as the books are developed.

Consider incorporating the service responsibilities and duties of the service position "Grapevine representative" into the Service responsibilities and duties of the "General Service Representative." The Committee took no action.

The committee requested that the AA Grapevine Board incorporate into all appropriate literature the 1962 Advisory Action that "retiring delegates become Grapevine Representative (GVRs) in their areas, with the objective of a GVR in each group." The committee requested that all groups that do not have a GVR or RLV consider incorporating these duties of the GSR.

The committee requested that the AA Grapevine Board look into the feasibility of producing on book in ASL format.

The Committee requested that the AA Grapevine Board provide a report to the 2013 Conference Committee on the Grapevine as background, on the cost of reformatting Grapevine magazine from its current design to black/white interior, non-glossy, minimal photos and increase the font size. Review Grapevine workbook.

The committee agreed with the proposal to update, proofread, and digitize the Grapevine Workbook. The revised workbook will be available on the Grapevine website for downloading. The workbook will no longer be printed, just downloaded. The cost estimate is \$5,000.00.

General Service Board Motion to the 62nd General Service Conference. The General Service Conference supports the General Service Boards development of a plan to restructure the current A.A. World Services, Inc. and A.A. Grapevine, Inc. corporate and governance structures. The plan may among other things, address the separate corporate existence of both entities, as well as issues of governance and operations. The plan will be designed to increase unity, better reach and connect the General Service Office and the Grapevine to the broader Fellowship while addressing financial stability. The plan will be submitted to the 63rd General Service Conference for approval prior to implementation. Passed. I voted for it. They are simply putting a plan together which will look at this and see if it is feasible. We are already using shared resources; this will not affect the editorial board or independence of the Grapevine articles.

The Grapevine Workshop then reviewed Bill's written reasons for keeping the two corporations separate which can be found in the Grapevine Workbook.

The Grapevine published a new book called "Young and Sober"; it is available on aagrapevine.org and we will have it for sale at the October Assembly.

Grapevine Challenge Update – Paula and I have received great correspondence from many Districts; the Challenge runs until October so there is plenty of time to get that First Edition Big Book into your archives! As of today, the District in the lead is District 27.

Literature: Joyce C. 21 in attendance. Literature updates since last Assembly were as follows: Ebooks (From Highlights from A.A.W.S.)

Over the past few months, a team of tech professionals has done an in-depth technical review of the eReader project. Their initial efforts focused on the issues that were being reported to G.S.O. with the Apple iPhone version and the fixes that are needed for an iPhone update. The Android reader continues to be on hold pending further examination by the board on the short and long term effects of expanding our development, delivery and support of G.S.O. e-books.

Daily Reflections by e-delivery

The committee received a verbal report on the viability of using e-delivery of the day’s excerpt from Daily Reflections. Options are still being explored as part of the overall web-site redesign. Literature post conference agenda items & additional committee consideration – AA and Armed Services revised pamphlet – now available.

Broke into small groups to review suggestions for revisions: Circles of Love & Service (proposed by Annette D.), and PI (proposed by Johnette K.) pamphlets. Thanks for the hard work!

Revisions Suggestions to the proposed pamphlets – from Literature Workshop 7-14-2012
PI Pamphlet

1. Check grammar and punctuation. (4)
2. “A.A. is Anonymous, No Invisible.” – Sounds like an ad tag line, almost like a new anonymity policy. It also appears under the AA’s Public Information Policy headline, implying its part of official policy.
3. Under “The Public Can Include:” Make capitalization consistent, i.e. – if Students is capitalized, then The Media should be as well. (3)
4. What is PI? Information could be arranged
5. “Anonymity” statement at bottom of shaded area isn’t favorable
6. No Comments overall – everyone in that small group likes the layout and feels it explains the “job” really well.

Circles of Love & Service

1. Needs color (2)
2. Look at capitalization
3. Check spelling and punctuation
4. Visually, the circles create a bull’s eye which is off-putting
5. C.O.’s vs Intergroup – Spell out C.O.’s
6. Flow of written information must move orderly
7. Illustration of AA Structure is more favorable than the bull’s eye
8. Original pamphlet explains more clearly how things go from group level to GSO and then how it filters back from GSO to DCM to GSR to Groups. The new pamphlet does not explain how it goes back to the group. Perhaps add more numbering explaining that part of the filter process.
9. Keep the visual appearance to attract interest. (the colors, put the triangle in the middle. Triangle is good because it coincides with the service manual
10. Three typos in bottom paragraph (COS), Central officers should be central offices, twelfth step call, s should be “calls”
11. Add number six to show the information process in reserve, perhaps adding arrows on the outside of the triangle

12. Intro from middle back or swap with inside right hand panel or swap outside left panel with middle one\
13. Middle panel – “and group jobs – have one (?) State primary purpose, don’t rewrite or make more complex
14. No abbreviation – i.e. C.O. keep to intergroup not C.O.
15. Third panel inside 2nd paragraph – “It does not participate in the group conscience as a whole.”...add A.A. before group conscience.
16. Third panel inside last paragraph Delegates serve for a two year term is repeated – delete one.
