

# North Florida Area Conference Assembly Minutes

## 3rd Quarter, July 14, 2013

*The General Service Conference Takes its Inventory - Our Solution in Action*

**Area Chair:** Vivian F., Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00am on Sunday, July 14th, 2013.

**Registrar:** Roll call was taken by Jeff P. Each District was called for attendance DCMs, Alternate DCMs, GSRs, Alternate GSRs, Panel 63, and Visitors.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of Concepts.

### **OFFICER REPORTS**

**Secretary:** Joyce C., Motions from the March Assembly were e-mailed to the Webmaster within 7 days after the Assembly and posted to the password protected area of the anorthflorida.org website. There were a total of 350 copies. Fifty were given to the Area Chair for the GSR packets and the remaining copies were inserted into envelopes and given to the Registrar and mailed out within 2 weeks after Assembly. The total duplication cost for this mailing was \$210.00 this breaks down to 62¢ per packet or 3¢ per page – PLUS mailing costs. I would like to thank all Service Coordinators, Administrative Committees, and Officers for their quick submission of reports.

I have been working on reformatting the NFAC Advisory Actions to hopefully make them more readable. Also, I have started working with the Growth Committee to update Structures and Guidelines in order to make those clearer and change outdated procedures. Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to serve. Are there any changes to the minutes which have not been made known to me? CHAIR ENTERTAINS A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES. Motion made to accept the minutes as amended, seconded and passed.

**Treasurer:** Annette D. It is my privilege to serve as your treasurer. I am honored by your trust and humbled by your generosity. If you will review the financial summary on the first page of the treasurer's report on white paper, you will see that total income and group contributions are above projection by \$2000 plus. Income is also comfortably higher than this time last year. Thanks to the thriftiness of your panel, expenses are \$1700 lower than projected. Prudent reserve is within guidelines. I am receiving only a few contributions mailed to incorrect address and am notifying the group contact. We are receiving contributions from several groups who are new or have not contributed in a while and this is very encouraging. Please remove all financial reports from tables when leaving. I'd like to thank the finance committee for their support in the work we did today. Thank you again for your generosity and for the opportunity to serve. CHAIR ENTERTAINS A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE TREASURER'S REPORT SUBJECT TO AUDIT. Motion made, seconded and passed unanimously.

**Delegate:** Marilyn B., Good Morning, everybody. It is my honor and privilege to introduce to you our experience, strength and hope in our Past Delegates: Panel 45, Dan. E.; Panel 47, Dick G.; Panel 51, Tom G.; Panel 53, Panel 55, Michael S.; Panel 61, Cecilia R. You heard a lot from me last night so my report is going to be short. Usually the July report is a review of Conference, but we all heard that last night. I want to thank you for all of who attended and your warmth and compliments. It is good to be back in sunny old Florida and back with you. I do have a couple of people to thank for last night as well, Jeff and Glenn, you probably didn't realize that we didn't know we'd have two screens – I only had one advancer so while I was I advancing the PowerPoint on one screen, Jeff had to synchronize hitting on the computer on the other and Glenn and he came down and got things set up and cleaned up. I know I am a challenge for Carlos because I walk all over the place and my back was to him. And, to him I do apologize

OK, where is the delegate going? In a few short days from now, I will be at your State Convention and I have an opportunity at the State Convention to do something no other delegate has been asked to do. Usually we are asked to do just a normal common workshop, but I've been asked to give the presentation that I gave to you last night. So, I am hopeful that possibly we will run into some folks who maybe don't know even what a conference is, what a delegate is, who the delegate is, never been to the assembly and possibly through the Convention ears we will be able to get some more participation. From there, I will be off to Columbia, South Carolina for the South East Regional Conference. I have been asked to do a tour of the Grapevine website in real time. **Alternate Chair:** Heather V-W., Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Alternate Chairperson for Panel 63. I would like to thank all those involved in making this Assembly a success. I would like to report our attendance this weekend is 38 DCMs; Alt. DCMs, 158 GSRs; Alt. GSRs, 18 Officers/Service Coordinators and Administrative Committee members and 71 Visitors for a total of 285 attendees in all. A Special thanks to District 23 for hosting the Friday night meeting, District 10 for hosting the Grapevine Room, District 27 for doing the Registration and District 9 for doing the 7th Tradition, Traditions Workshop and other assigned duties this weekend. I need to speak with the DCMs of those Districts interested in Hosting October's Assembly after the meeting today (District 18 & 10).

I would also like to thank Dick G. our former SE Regional Trustee & Panel 47 Past Delegate for the weekend who hosted our GSR Orientation and facilitated the Service Manuel Workshop. Thank you for your dedicated service to the NFAC. Our Past Delegate for the October Assembly will be Tom G. I would like to thank Jeff P. our Webmaster and Registrar for assisting to facilitate a very informative discussion on our fillable forms and all areas of the aanorthflorida.org website. **Registrar:** Jeff P., We were able to get the minutes out just 18 days after the last assembly. There were 285 copies sent by US Postal mail, and 591 sent via email. This morning we have 180 voting members and a substantial majority is 120 votes.

### **SPECIAL REPORTS**

**57<sup>th</sup> Florida State Convention Report:** Carl G., Registration Chair, Good Morning everyone. The convention starts in 10 days and things are getting really heated up right now and a lot of things happening. I sat out there yesterday working on the spreadsheet to do the name badges. We are doing some things a little bit different this time, we will have paper schedules. The schedule is on your smart phone in Guidebooks. All you have to do is pull up Guidebooks app. So if we have any last minute changes, you'll have them in real time. We have 1250 registrations 600 banquets and the website is still open. You just can't purchase merchandise there. Merchandise has been shut off. Registration, Banquets, Ice Cream Social are still available. So like all good alcoholics who wait until the last minute can still do that on the website. Yesterday was a really exciting day; we had more signups yesterday than we had in all the previous three assemblies all rolled together. See you in 10 days.

**NFAC Florida State Convention Oversight Committee:** Glenn W., Alt. delegate, Joyce C., Secretary. At the last Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee which I am a Director and Joyce C. is the other one of two representatives from the North Florida Area, the two motions that I gathered a sense of this assembly in March were considered. On the motion of providing funding a representative from either area for travel to the AA International Convention, the motion passed with substantial unanimity.

The other motion which would set a cap of \$25,000 on the accumulation of prudent reserve funds was amended by me to increase the cap to \$35,000 as a result of your sense of assembly and minority opinion in March. That motion also passed with substantial unanimity.

We discussed the status of both the upcoming 57th Florida State Convention to be held in 10 days in Jacksonville and the Orlando bid for the 59th /2015.

The Joint Advisory Committee will meet on July 27 at the Florida State Convention for the quarterly business meeting and to facilitate the site selection at 3:30 on Saturday.

### **SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS**

**Accessibilities** — Kay M., Renee G., Alt., conducted the meeting with 15 in attendance. The theme was "Do we need an Accessibilities Committee and how to start one", with suggested activities for a committee, interaction with other service committees, and a discussion of materials available for committee members and newcomers. Packets of literature useful in establishing a service committee were handed out. Special thanks to those in attendance. We also would like to thank District 15 for inviting us to participate in an Accessibilities workshop in Cocoa during the month of May. Both Kay and Renee are available for workshops; contact us thru our NFAC website.

**Archives** — Vicki E., We had 14 in attendance at our workshop. Steve R. Area 14 Archivist spoke on preserving our old Grapevines by removing the staples and cording the magazine in print. A short film from the 2011 National AA Archives Workshop was included showing how to remove tape safely from old documents. Steve also presented our Area 14 Archive collection a framed card with everyone's signature that was in attendance at District 28's first ever Founders Day Celebration that was held in June this year.

Cecelia R. past North Florida Archivist and Delegate also shared her experience about the surprising discovery of her late mother's archival possessions. She encouraged us to keep our eyes open when visiting

elderly relatives as many people have book shelves and other items from years past that just might be an archive collection waiting to be discovered.

Group histories are still being sought throughout Area 14. The group history forms can be downloaded from the website or picked up in the archive room during the assembly. Please come by and check to make sure your group history is documented within our records. The Area 14 minutes can be found within the password protected area of the Area 14 website. We have archived minutes dating back to January 1967. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

**Archivist** — Stephen R., Workshop: On basic archival procedures using the GSO pamphlet, “Archives Preservation Guidelines”. Guidelines are located on the GSO web site and on our North Florida Area Web site under documents..

On Saturday June 15<sup>th</sup> I had the privilege of speaking at the District 28 Nature Coast Intergroup Founders Day Breakfast on the early history off AA. (How it all started) I also received assistance from members in my home district as they presented a short skit called the “ARCHEOLOGIST” Gave the same presentation in District 13 and Hernando County. Intergroup Founders Day Picnic in Brooksville and on June 8<sup>th</sup> in Pasco County, District 15 Area 15 for their Founders Day. District 28 donated to the Area Archives with a large first ever Founders Day Breakfast card signed by everyone in attendance. Thank you to past Delegate Cecilia R. for giving us with a copy of the January 1992 minutes.

Thank You to Annette & Joyce for their work in redacting the rest of the past minutes of NFAC, for posting on the web site. All past minutes that we have been able to locate are now available in the password protected area of the web site under Archived minutes. If you open that section and there are no minutes for that particular assembly it means it is missing and we are looking for it. Thank you for allowing me to serve

**Cooperation with Professional Community** — Linda G., There were 45 people in attendance. Terri-Lynn reported on manning the AA booth for the National Association of School Nurses on July 27-28 where 76 school nurses asked about Al-Anon, and Al-Ateen. Linda reported on manning the AA booth for the National Association of Black Social Workers for 5 days. The most AA literature that was given away was: The GSO Catalog, and the National Intergroup Directory.

Melanie E of Central Florida Intergroup will be manning the booth for the FJJA 2013 Adolescent Conference for Counselors being held in Orlando. Linda is working with GSO and the JAX CPC coordinator to provide AA literature for refugees from Burma, Thailand, and Singapore. So far there are three pamphlets translated: This is AA, Ask the Newcomer, and 44 questions. Linda reviewed and held open discussions on the CPC Workbook and the AA Guidelines for CPC. Linda will deliver AA literature to Nassau County.

**Corrections** — Mike R., Kim L. Alt. & Note-taker. Meeting opened with Serenity prayer. We started with going through a list of pre-released inmates being released between July 30 and November. Passed all that information on. Then we discussed inmates looking for outside help. An inmate asked to start a meeting at Taylor Correctional Institution Annex, Perry, FL. Outside support needed at Apalachee Correction Institution, Sneads, FL also at Suwannee Correctional Institution in Live Oaks, FL. There will be a joint effort between Area 14 and Area 15 (So. FL) to put on a corrections workshop to be held at the Sahara Club in Sanford, September 29 from noon until 3pm. Flyers are posted on the aanorthflorida.org website. We then opened to the floor for discussion and questions & answers. Closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

**Grapevine/La Vina** — Richard C., We opened the workshop with the Serenity Prayer. We had 23 people in attendance. In the workshop we covered the many uses of the Grapevine/La Vina whether at the group or district level. That our meeting in print is a great tool for use with the PI, CPC, Treatment and Corrections. That when they use our meeting in print, they should consider using both the Grapevine/La Vina. We covered that there are a large number of items sold by Grapevine / La Vina, that can be used for display in the meeting places, along with a large amount of books and CD's. The books offer a lot of great meeting topics and can be used as gifts or door prizes at events. They were asked to find in the service manual, the process for reprinting art and articles from the Grapevine/La Vina. I would like to thank District 10 for a great job in the Grapevine/La Vina room with sales of \$371.00 and ticket sales of \$420.00, making it possible to give away 14 subscriptions. We closed the workshop with the Responsibility Statement. It is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Grapevine/La Vina Service Coordinator. I hope to see you all in Jacksonville at the 57th State Convention.

**Intergroup** — Ruth R., Our workshop opened at 1:30 and was attended by 33 members. The topic revolved around funding an Intergroup or Central Office. While the primary source of revenue for most Central Offices are 7th Tradition donations contributed by the groups served by the office, sometimes those contributions are not enough to cover all of the expenses involved in maintaining an office, such as rent, salaries, utilities, internet and inventory. Often this is due to a lack of awareness of all the services provided to groups in the service area. We discussed how many Intergroups combat this lack of awareness by having committees whose members visit all of the local groups to let them know what services are provided. Other Central Offices have Unity committees to act as a liaison between Groups and the office to encourage individual and group participation. In addition, many Intergroups pass out Birthday Contribution envelopes similar to the ones utilized by GSO or have Faithful Fiver Clubs, for members to support the office by pledging to donate \$5.00 each month. Most offices sell AAWS and Grapevine literature or materials for small profits. Others also sell what's affectionately known as "drunk junk" which tends to have a very high profit margin. When all of those efforts aren't enough to meet financial obligations, many Intergroups hold fund raisers. We went through a list of about 50 events found during a Google search of Central Office newsletters from around the country. These events range from banquets to pig roasts, golf tournaments to poker runs, raffles and auctions, and picnics to pancake breakfasts. **Literature** — Ken S., In Ken's absence workshop conducted by Chad H. Alt., We had about 40 in attendance. We opened with the Serenity Prayer and a brief agenda for the workshop. Went over the 6 conference agenda items that were from the literature committee. We covered the updates for all 6 from the Conference and answered questions from the floor.

The last half of the workshop was spent discussing the Panel 63 literature challenge. Participants gave updates and recommendations for how they are implementing the challenge in the home groups and districts. We also discussed some workshop ideas that literature chairs could put on in their districts. We finished going over the highlighted literature piece for the quarter "Box 459" what it is and how they can receive it. We closed with the Serenity prayer.

**Public Information** — Sheryl R., Thank you to Melanie, the Alternate PI Coordinator for taking minutes. The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer and closed with the Lord's Prayer; There were approximately 40 in attendance. we took Roll Call and then reviewed the Agenda Items. We reviewed and discussed "tear sheets" and their need and effectiveness.

I am always available to come to your District and help with Public Information. Thank you to The Weir Crazy Group for having me speak at their 9th Annual "Miracles in May" Celebration on May 8<sup>th</sup> and a special thank you to my special friends for attending. But especially, thank you for keeping me sober.

**Treatment** — Iain B., (Iain was not in attendance) Renee R. conducted the Treatment Workshop. There were 41 attendees in the treatment workshop. We discussed the traditions as applied to treatment settings. We learned traditions four and nine were not discussed in the Treatment Committee Workbook. There was a lively discussion how to apply the traditions to treatment settings. Then the workshop participants had an open dialogue to support one another in our work within other districts as it pertains to treatment settings. The area website was provided to all participants as was the Treatment Service Coordinator's email address and how to locate other Area servants contact information.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

**Finance Committee** — Lori P., Finance, Alt. Chair & Note-taker: Marcela W. I am privileged to serve as your Finance Committee Chair. Number in attendance was 20. Thank you to the groups for your contributions to the Area; and also to our trusted servants for your fiscal responsibility. It is your contribution which enables the Area to continue its work of saving lives. Contributions are up and expenses moderately down. This provides for an optimistic outlook that we as an Area are capable of tightening our belts and living within a balanced budget. The budget for 2013 was presented by the Treasurer and the Committee reviewed and accepted it as modified. Our recommended budget for 2014 will be published in the July minutes and voted on by you at the October Assembly. Please take time to review it when you receive your minutes. Feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

The Finance Committee also voted in favor of the re-allocation of budget monies under Cooperation with the Professional Community line items; moving \$200.00 from line item 7381 (CPC Exhibit Space and

Convention) to line item 7350 (CPC Literature) as per the CPC Service Coordinators' request. This a \$0.00 bottom line net effect on the existing budget. Thank you for the opportunity to serve. We will have two motions to present under new business.

**Growth Committee** — Glenn W., First I wish to Thank Mary M., DCM District 6 for accepting the Alt Growth Chair position and taking fantastic minutes. We are continuing efforts to define district boundaries in the Jacksonville and Daytona areas with the cooperation of all the effected DCMs.

We also began the task of refining language in the Structures and Guidelines. The Growth Committee has been tasked by our Chairperson to address ambiguities and inconsistencies within our Structures and Guidelines. With the help of our Area Secretary, Joyce C., we will work to clarify some language striving to ensure the original intent and spirit is maintained. With that thought in mind, we will also strive not to revise this document into some wordy novel. In this case a familiar slogan comes to mind - "Keep it Simple".

**Site and Agenda Committee** — Heather V-W., Kelly J. Alt., Renee R., and Parliamentarian assisted to facilitate the workshop. Kelly J took roll call there were 35 in attendance and eight of nine DCMs assigned to the committee present. After the attrition issue in January we as a Committee have worked very hard to monitor our pick up and ensure we do not incur additional expenses. The Addendum signed for July 2013 decreased our room block by 10 rooms overall; with 80% attrition our commitment to the Hotel for July was 152 total room nights. We currently have 162 total rooms this weekend and have met our commitment to the Hotel. We will not incur any meeting room rental or attrition fees. Special thank you to those involved in helping me think through our options and the Hotel working with our Group. We will make decisions Assembly to Assembly based on our trend, current and past pickup and how willing the Hotel is to work with us during those needed dates. October is a very busy month for the Hotel therefore please book early and often; we cannot guarantee the group rate after the cut-off date which is 30 days prior to October's Assembly. The links for the October, January, April and July Assemblies are currently on a northflorida.org website. A motion will come up under new business from the Site & Agenda Committee.

**Web Site Committee Report** — Rita C., I went to the Finance Committee to request a certain amount of money to hire a vendor webmaster. I requested the committee to review the website guidelines for changes and to email all their suggested changes to the website chairperson. I informed the committee of all the flyers and notification that were posted after the March assembly to present.

## ATTACHED: OTHER WORKSHOP REPORTS

**GSR Workshop Report** — Heather V-W., We opened the GSR Workshop with over 100 GSRs/Alt GSRs present and said the Serenity Prayer followed by all Orange and Green Badges being recognized. Then a reading of the Service Manual S25-S30 "The Group and its G.S.R." we concluded the reading with Group Information and introduced our Registrar and Webmaster to give a live demonstration of our [aanorthflorida.org](http://aanorthflorida.org) website. We fostered a question and answer session during the presentation and to evoke participation we gave GSRs who asked a question a chocolate and a volunteer gave a raffle ticket to foster lively discussion during the presentation. When the presentation concluded we raffled off a book purchased from the Grapevine room called "AA and the Home Group". We concluded the workshop with the Lord's Prayer.

DCM Workshop Report — Vivian F., The DCM Workshop had a joint meeting with Breda, the Delegate to Flemish Belgium via Skype. Breda joined the DCMs to discuss the service structure in Northern Belgium and some of the issues faced within the groups and solutions they have found. Several of the DCMs shared specific concerns they have in their Districts, with Breda and she gave feedback about her country. Ultimately, although everyone had the opportunity to learn about the service structure in Flemish Belgium and the World Service Meeting, it was noted that we all share the same issues and solutions in USA or Belgium.

**Parliamentarian Workshop Report** — Eric J., "Robert and His Pesky Rules" The workshop covered the areas of the conduct of the NFAC business meetings, Robert's Rules of Order, and interaction of the NFAC Structures & Guidelines with Roberts Rules. There were about 20 persons in attendance. The role and function of the NFAC Parliamentarian was explained which is to assist the Chair and voting members of the NFAC Assembly in the orderly, efficient and effective conduct of the business meetings, the interpretation and application of Roberts Rules and NFAC Structures & Guidelines as those issues arise during the business meetings.

The NFAC has adopted a set of "Structures and Guidelines" (the "S&G"). By section 4 of the S&G the NFAC adopted "Robert's Rules of Order" for its business meetings. Section 4 also adopts the "Summary of Conference Procedures" as Appendix A which modifies some of the applications of Robert's Rules. We reviewed from Appendix A the procedure and rules on the proper method of speaking from the floor to the Assembly. We next considered who may speak, make a motion or otherwise participate in the Area business meetings by a question, which was answered by one of the participants. The correct answer being that only a current voting member of the NFAC who was present and included on the roll call at the beginning of that morning's business meeting. Or their designated alternate if the primary service person is not present. See Section 9 of the S&G. It was additionally noted that: If you are NOT a current NFAC VOTING member, you do not have the right to make a motion, speak to a motion, vote on a motion or otherwise participate in the business of the Assembly. However, the Chair has the right to recognize a non-voting member to address a matter before the Assembly or to make a presentation to the Assembly.

The proper etiquette of how to address the Assembly was presented as follows: Approach the nearest floor microphone. WAIT until those ahead of you have finished. WAIT until the Chair recognizes you. GET CLOSE TO THE ACTUAL MICROPHONE. STATE YOUR NAME, your District, and your service position which qualifies you to address the Assembly. {NOTE: you have 2 minutes. Use those 120 seconds wisely.... The Assembly does not need to hear your entire AA history, when you got sober, your service resume, etc, UNLESS it directly pertains to the question at hand....}. STATE WHETHER you are in favor of the pending matter OR are against the pending matter. STATE your reasons briefly and clearly. IF your reasons have been covered by another speaker, please do not "ditto" or restate the same opinions again. REMEMBER. You have 2 minutes to speak. You may not address the same topic unless all others have spoken AND the Chair elects to recognize you again.

There are various reference books on Roberts Rules of Order, from full authorized and fully annotated versions with 716 pages with small print or Robert's Rules Complete Idiot's Guide with only 356 pages. The "rules" are referred to as "Roberts Rules" due to the fact that the original author was General Henry M. Robert, U. S. Army born in 1837, in first written in 1876. The current edition is the 11<sup>th</sup> Edition, revised by Henry M. Robert III, a grandson of General Robert, and some member of the Robert family as always been the principal author of all authorized versions. There are actually 63 numbered Rules, with various additional examples, charts, tables, and discussions. We did an exercise of a sample motion, an amendment, a vote and a minority opinion. I presented a chart of the various procedural motions, from the web site of [www.jimslaughter.com](http://www.jimslaughter.com).






