Area Chair: Vivian F. opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 7:00pm on Saturday, October 18, 2014.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Jeff P., Each District was called for attendance DCMs, Alternate DCMs, GSRs, Alternate GSRs, Panel 63 Officers, Service Coordinators, and Visitors.

Reading of Anonymity Statement and short form of Concepts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Joyce C. Motions from the January Assembly were e-mailed to the Webchair within 7 days after the Assembly and posted to the password protected area of our website. 325 copies of minutes were made. Fifty went to the Area Chair for the GSR packets and the remaining copies were inserted into envelopes, given to the Registrar for mailing. There were 27 pages. The total duplication cost for this mailing was \$263– PLUS mailing costs. I would like to thank all Service Coordinators, Administrative Committees, and Officers for their quick submission of reports for the entire 2 years of this panel.

Now, there was a glitch in the printing of the minutes. If you receive your minutes in the printed form by US Postal service, your minutes have part of page 7 missing. That being motions which were not passed. Also, p. 18 the part of the treasurer's report on group donations for District 21-33. These two pages are at the beginning and at the end of the inserted Treasurer's report. The only explanation I have is that on the wonderful new laptop I updated from Word 2003 to Word 2013, and Acrobat 9 to Acrobat 10, so I'm blaming the Microsoft Gremlins, and the fact that Microsoft & Adobe don't like to speak to each other.

In order to have complete transparency, there was a lot of discussion about how to fix this error. We considered doing a subsequent mailing, but after looking at the cost – of around \$300, came to the conclusion that since these pages have no motions to be considered by your group we would have copies of those pages available on your tables at assembly. I took final responsibility to decide the cost was beyond what was prudent to spend of your money considering no actionable items were involved.

However, I felt it necessary to be sure you have full information, so as I said copies of the page with the motions error are on each table, and copies of the affected district's contributions (Districts 21-33) will find that page on their table. Beyond that, this has concluded in finding a better way to insert the Treasurer's Report into the minutes so I can train the incoming secretary to keep this from happening again. The amended minutes were posted on the website August 14, 2014.

I attended the Florida State Convention in Fort Lauderdale as your representative to the Florida State Convention Joint Advisory Committee where the bid for 2016 was awarded to Area 15, South Florida and that convention will be held at Innisbrook, FL. I also attended the South East Regional Forum in San Juan Puerto Rico. And I participated in an Anonymity Workshop sponsored by District 15. Thank you all again for allowing me the opportunity to serve Alcoholics Anonymous. Are there are any other changes to the minutes?

CHAIR ENTERTAINED A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS AMENDED. MOTION MADE TO ACCEPT THE MINUTES AS AMENDED SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Treasurer: Annette D., My name is Annette D and I am privileged to serve as your treasurer. My home group is Early Birds in District 12. Will the host district please pass the baskets? Thank you for your continued generosity. If you will review the financial summary on the first page of the treasurer's report, you will see that total income and group contributions continue to be above projection. Group Contributions are \$ 4,882 more than projected to date. Expenses to date are \$3,269 less than income received and \$6,466 less than projected. We are currently \$5, 715 over prudent reserve. The 990 Tax return is filed, and the Finance Chair will ask for a vote on the 2015

budget later. After this assembly closes, the 2nd Quarter Sales Tax Return will be filed and the Grapevine inventory will be completed to adjust the inventory on books.

This is the last time I will stand before you as your treasurer. I want to thank you for my experience serving 6 years on the Finance Committee. I have been the one to benefit from this journey. I have experienced profound personal growth, and I have learned the history and functioning of NFAC. I developed a keen awareness for the spiritual value of the dollar in the basket and efforts to be fully self-supporting throughout AA. But most importantly, I have had the blessing of meeting and knowing so many of you. I look forward to the next opportunity to serve you that may await me. Please remove all financial reports from tables when leaving. Thank you again for your generosity and for the opportunity to serve.
CHAIR ENTERTAINED A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE TREASURER'S REPORT SUBJECT TO AUDIT. MOTION MADE, SECONDED AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Tonight is the last time I will have the privilege of addressing the NFAC as your sitting Delegate. Alternate Delegate's Report: Glenn W., since we last met, I have accompanied our Delegate at the 70th Southeastern Conference in Charleston, WV, The Southeast Regional Forum in Isla Verde, Puerto Rico and a Delegate's report for District 13. Also, while in San Antonio I got to witness Florida win the bid for the 2015 ICYPAA.

The Southeastern Conference which was joined with the West Virginia State Convention had a reasonable attendance and the service-oriented meetings also had reasonable attendance. However that can be attributed to no other meetings being scheduled at the same time.

The Southeast Regional Forum (SERF) in Puerto Rico has nearly a 50/50 split of locals from Puerto Rico and us AA's from the Continental US. The fact is that the current contribution rate of the members is not sustainable for our AAWS/GSO in the future. To meet their expenses for

59th Florida State Convention Report – Richard C., In the past few months I have attended the 58th Florida State Convention in Fort Lauderdale and registered over 250 people and had a great time promoting the 59th. The next weekend I was in Miami for the Area 15 Assembly. I only registered a few people but I did a lot of promoting all I hear about is the International Convention but I remind everyone we live in Florida and we need to support Florida. Many say they will be at both and I thank them for that. We had a committee meeting in Orlando, we had 19 people attend and about 10 other people from Kissimmee/St. Cloud have committed to work on the convention

committee. Last weekend I was in Hutchinson Island for the Area 15 Assembly. I registered 11 people. Everyone loves the new logo and brochure and I met many wonderful people. We actually have two meetings there; the first is a regular business meeting and the second is the site selection which we (the JAC) facilitates. SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS

Accessibilities — Kay M., Service Coordinator; Renee G., Alternate; Our Accessibilities workshop began with an AA guest speaker, Dan M., who teaches visually-impaired adults at the Daytona Beach facility of the Blind Services Division of the Florida State Department of Education. After his presentation he answered many questions about technological advances that can help us carry the message to alcoholics who are vision-challenged. The second half of our workshop was spent in reviewing suggested changes necessary to update the Area 14 Accessibilities pamphlet. Accessibilities activities since the last Conference included information requests from Area 42 and involvement on three Area 14 workshops. We wish to thank Districts 13, 14 and 22 for these opportunities. I, personally, would also like to thank the entire body of the Assembly for the privilege of serving as your Accessibilities Service Coordinator during these past two years. It is an experience I would not have missed for anything and I shall always have fond memories of my time here.

Archives — Vicki E., Archives Service Coordinator. Kevin G., Alt. Vic L. from the Orlando Intergroup gave a presentation on early AA and Clarence S. who moved to Orlando in his later life. During lunch Steve R. showed the recently released version of the movie Markings of the Journey in Salon E. I'd like to thank you for allowing me to serve these past two years as your Archives Service Coordinator. I look forward to seeing you again next year in Gainesville.

Archivist — Scott B., What an amazing past year we have had. I would like to personally thank everyone serving on this panel for their expertise and support. What a wonderful group of people. Unlike the rest of you though I will not be changing or leaving my position. The Archivist position is blessed to serve through two different panels. I'm grateful for my experience with Panel 63 and look forward to working with Panel 65. What an amazing opportunity and blessing this service position affords myself.

I just returned from the National AA Archives workshop and was inspired and enlightened by the wealth of knowledge, information and opportunity for the North Florida Area. Before the current GSO office was in NY it was originally at 17 Washington Street in Newark New Jersey known as Honor dealers. This was where Bill W & Ruth Hock typed up our First Edition Alcoholics Anonymous known today as our Big Book! Before this original office was torn down from lack of use and disrepair AA had already moved... Mitchell K. and Clarence S. decided to break in and find something to cherish. A small archival token they could keep. A trim board over a doorway and a wooden bookshelf were forcibly removed. Mitchell has held onto this bookshelf in his personal archives until Saturday night at the Oct 11, 2014 National Archives Workshop in King of Prussia Pennsylvania. He presented this original shelf to Michelle Mirza GSO Archivist.....to return this to its rightful home in our new office now in NY! This shelf has come full circle, from our first office into our fellowship and back to the new office to become archived and cherished by ALL of our fellowship to see and enjoy! All the stories this shelf could tell. I am so grateful for Alcoholics Anonymous, to have the ability to have been present in that room, that night.... for this amazing moment in our A.A. history! I also made the trip to Stepping Stones home of Bill & Lois Wilson. What a spiritual week of AA.

Items we have added to our archives, a selection of photos from the approximate 600 I took on this trip, including copies of the bookshelf. Sandy Beach Tampa Times newspaper obituary and funeral memorial info/program, San Antonio History book from International Convention and 2nd year Delegate book from Cecilia R. The summer 2014 GSO Markings, which contained a piece on the hugely successful 1st Florida Annual AA Archives Workshop. The 2nd of which has been temporarily postponed with the inability to garner support from both Areas. Also looking for help in filling in the blanks in our archived Structures and Guidelines. We have all the S & G's from the very original and all the changes up through the year 2002. Hopeful some past secretaries, DCMs and GSRs might have copies of any of these missing years. Thank you again for this amazing opportunity allowing me to serve as your North Florida Archivist.

CPC — Linda G., I read an email from Jim Malone, PI Coordinator at GSO about September being Recovery Month. The email focused on making sure that we were aware of our Traditions and affiliations. There was lots of talk. For suggestions, look at the CPC kit and workbook. If you are still unsure, check with your Delegate and CPC Service Coordinator. Remember all the great free literature we have available, it is great! We talked briefly about the PI/CPC news exchange and some people shared their experience, strength and hope. I would like to thank everyone for allowing me to serve. I have met a lot of wonderful people and made a lot of friends. Thank you all for helping me to help you.

Corrections — Mike R., Richard H. Alt., Yvonne – note taker. We had 32 members in attendance. Pre-release forms are starting to come in. I am coordinating people to take those released who requested it to their first meeting. GSO has put out a call for men to correspond with men. Of course, women are needed to correspond with women as well. Intergroup has a form available for this service which is free. We had a lively Question & Answer session. A member shared about being released a year or so ago. Having meetings behind the walls has made a difference in his life and he is now giving back. More volunteers are needed to hold meetings for the

incarcerated. The joint Area 14 & 15 workshop was a great success. Thanks to all who participated. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Grapevine/La Vina — Richard C., Alt. Ruben S. At the workshop we talked about the process and duties for becoming a service coordinator. We then discussed a possible motion for new business. That motion will be introduced under new business. My Alternate, Ruben S. and I would like to thank District 18 for hosting the Grapevine/LaVina this weekend. We had room sales of \$307.00 and ticket sales of \$372.00 allowing for 15 subscriptions available to be given away. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Intergroup — Ruth R., 55 in Attendance. Minutes taken by Evonne A., The workshop opened with a discussion about ways to let the member Groups know what services intergroup offices can provide for them and for anyone who reaches out for help. Ruth shared about the Northeast Florida Intergroup giving statistics at a banquet about calls taken, hours worked, phone army calls taken, how many Groups were served, how many meetings each week, how many books sold or given away to corrections and treatment. Others shared about putting similar statistics in monthly newsletters. Rich S from Volusia County shared about their Intergroup offering to fund workshops with food for their member Districts. Their IG reps and committee members would man tables at a “speed dating” type of workshop to let folks out in the District know what each of the committees do in an effort to enhance awareness about IG. Evonne shared about having monthly intergroup business meetings which serve not only to do business, but for information sharing.

We discussed what the AA Guidelines on Central Offices say that Intergroups functions should be and how they are a lifeline for all Alcoholics as well as anyone in the community who needs information on Alcoholics Anonymous.

We finished up with a discussion about Central Office websites. Everyone got a copy of the AA Guidelines for the Internet. That was followed by a great discussion of honoring the Traditions and maintaining websites in an age when almost everyone has gone digital. It was pointed out how so few of us have much knowledge of Website Technology and how sometimes, it’s only after a website is launched that we realize how little we know. The takeaway was that many of us are beginning to realize that we don’t even know how much we don’t know and that we need to look for guidance in these matters.

Thank you so much for allowing me to serve the Area as your Intergroup Service Coordinator the last 2 years. It has been an honor and a privilege. I am so grateful to have been given this opportunity. I can’t wait to see which one of you takes my place at this mike next year, so put your service resumes in tomorrow! Thank you!

Literature — Chad H., There were 40 in attendance. We opened the meeting with house cleaning items for the assembly. Reminded everyone to be at the voting assembly by 9am. Also to book their rooms for Gainesville. Discussed service resumes, what they are and how to work them. Updated on the motion for Daily Reflection II. Literature Challenge results – no winner, but definitely encouraged many people to read more literature. Discussed what is “Conference Approved Literature” and interactive ideas for workshops involving literature. Thanks for this service opportunity.

Public Information — Sheryl R., There were approximately 24 members in attendance. We heard from each District as to where they currently are with their P1 Committees, discussed concerns they have and what they wish to see the P1 Workshops focus on in the future. In September I participated in an amazing Service Fair in District 13; Thanks so much for having me and for all you do. I am available to come to your district and assist in any way. Treatment — Pam C., Alt. Coordinator, Note taker – Howard B. 30 in attendance. Theme: Bridging the Gap. I explained what Bridging the Gap does and the need for a contact list from around the state of people to take or meet people newly released from treatment to their first meeting. Since I won’t be standing for Area 14 chair I will help aid new chair/coordinator with compiling a list of names from each district as a point of contact for treatment. It has been a pleasure serving as Alternate Treatment Service Coordinator in the interim. We closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Finance Committee — Lori P., Chair, Alt. Marcela W., Number in attendance: 16. The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer. 8 Voting DCM's were in participation. Our Treasurer delivered the Financial Summary report to the Committee. Following up on old business the group crafted the motion which will be brought to the body tonight for approval of the 2015 budget. We also discussed retirement of the Secretary and Treasurers' old laptops for which we had funded replacements this year. It was decided to scrub and salvage these with consequent funds being returned to the Area 14 treasury.

We discussed the role and responsibilities of the Finance Chair along with taking some time to reflect on our inventory as a Committee. Other new business included discussing possible budgetary consideration for our Delegate and Alternate Delegate to attend SSAASA (Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly) in Huntington, WV in November of 2015. This was tabled pending receipt of additional information. It was also brought to the attention of the Committee that the Registrar's laptop is an older laptop and a possible candidate for replacement in the upcoming panel. This was also tabled and noted for consideration by Panel 65 Finance Committee.

In reflecting over the past two years I first want to thank this body for your continued support of the Area. Without you and your groups we would not be able to say that today we are carrying on business and carrying our own load through your contributions. We have operated at a balanced budget for the past 2 years greatly due to the work of our Treasurer, Annette, your DCM members of the Finance Committee and all its participants as well as the fiscal responsibility demonstrated by this panel. Thank you also for the personal opportunity to learn through doing as so many of us do in service work; and for the opportunity to get to know so many wonderful people outside of my home District; learning to work through our challenges in the spirit of our Steps, Traditions and Concepts. This journey has been fantastic, rewarding, educating and more — certainly an opportunity which I hope every person in this room can experience in this new life we call sobriety!

Growth Committee — Glenn W., We proceeded into our assigned task to inventory the Structure and Guidelines. We received much needed further clarification from the Ad-hoc committee on the intent of their recommendation that the Growth Committee oversees this process. We proceeded to do two things:

- 1) A sense of the committee was unanimous that the current Structures and Guidelines is worthy of this process to better improve the effectiveness of the Area Conference meetings.
- 2) Brainstormed on ideas of how to inventory the Structures and Guidelines - all of which will be compiled and passed on to the Panel 65 Growth Committee for their consideration.

Will the Host District's for January 2015 Assembly in Gainesville see me at the conclusion of October's Assembly weekend.

We reviewed and discussed the Site & Agenda Committee binder, items we will include and collected 2017 – 2018 proposals for the incoming Committee.

We discussed the January 2015 Paramount Plaza Reservations processes in place to ensure we maximize our room block and give those an opportunity to stay on-site. In the event the hotel sells out we have (3) overflow hotel room blocks at the Holiday Inn, Sleep Inn and Howard Johnson's at a rate under \$99.99 and within 5 miles of the Paramount Plaza Hotel.

We put a measure in place to ensure there are enough hotel reservations for the newly elected panel and committee members. Those reservation confirmation(s) numbers have been reserved under the Title of the position. See me after the elections to obtain your confirmation number, if you do not need a hotel room I will

release the room(s) back into our room block for other members to reserve. Thank you for the opportunity to serve!

Web Site Committee Report — Rita C., Chair. Meeting opened with the Serenity Prayer the minutes and motions were posted on the website in the required time limit. The Responsibility Statement, Serenity Prayer, and the Declaration Statement were all on separate pages on the website. A motion was made and passed the place them all on the same page. A Motion was made to place the power point presentation "Privacy on Facebook" on the website. There was quite a bit of discussion. Vote was taken and the motion was passed. A Motion was made and passed that Steve R will take over the webchair duties while the webchair is on vacation. Meeting ended with the Responsibility Statement. I stepped out of my comfort zone two years ago and put in my resume and requested to be the website chairperson. The first assembly I was very nervous and a wee bit scared. I got through it. I want to thank the chair for appointing me to this position. To every one sitting in this room, I am very grateful for your support and patience. I am going to miss being your web chair. 
