1st Quarter, January 20, 2013

The General Service Conference Takes its Inventory - Our Solution in Action

Area Chair: Vivian F. opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Jeff P. Each District was called for attendance DCMs, Alternate DCMs, GSRs, Alternate GSRs, Panel 63, and Visitors.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Joyce C. – The past Secretary emailed October motions to the Web Master within 7 days after the assembly and they were posted to the password protected area of the website. The minutes were copied and inserted in envelopes and given to the registrar for mailing by 30 days prior to this assembly. Going forward, minutes will be mailed within 30 days following this assembly which gives you more time to pass along the information to your groups. All proposed motions must be in writing with four copies, a copy must be given to the delegate, the chair, the secretary and retain one copy for yourself. Extra copies of the minutes, proposed motion forms and report forms are on the table in front of me. Thank you for the opportunity to be of service.

Treasurer: Annette D. –We had a busy January – the Corporation Annual Report was filed, the 990 was filed, and the Delegate's Conference Fee was paid to New York.

You will see some changes in the financial reports that I hope will make them more user-friendly. We will be looking at the summary sheet on top of the detailed reports. It is in three sections. At the top, you will see we closed out the year 10,000 under budget, but you will see that we still spent more than we received this year. Contributions include a \$677 contribution from FCYPAA and \$2000 from the Florida State Convention.

We continue to experience a decline in contributions from groups. We matched last year in amount, but overall, we are still trending \$7,000 less than in the past few years. 41% of groups are currently contributing an average of \$38 per group.

Our cost of operations is approximately \$65 per group, so we have a \$27 shortfall. In the middle of the page, approaching the 2013 budget we are slightly above prudent reserve, but must spend cautiously to maintain a balanced bottom line.

At the bottom of the page, I have also included some historical records of income and expenses for your information. Reviewing the graph will give you an idea of how our group contributions and expenses have been the last few years. The usual financial statements are attached for detail.

I give you heartfelt thanks for your contributions. I know it can be sacrificial for your groups. I appreciate this, not only because it allows the area to help you in carrying the message, but because it reflects healthy AA groups that are participating fully in the self-support system and connected to AA as a whole. I also appreciate the efforts of our trusted servants to be frugal.

I am excited at the progress I see in the new address getting out to all of you; please continue to help me spread the word. If you have any questions, please see me, email me, or call me. I am happy to discuss our financial information with you. Thank you to the finance committee for their support. Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Delegate: Marilyn B., Privileged to be your VOICE. Recognition of Past Delegates: I am going to ask our past Delegates to stand when I call your name and that you please remain standing as you are able. Dan E. Panel 45, Kathy P. Panel 49, Tom G. Panel 51, Corliss G. Panel 53, Michael S. Panel 55, Fred H. Panel 57, Chet P. Panel 59, Cecilia R. Panel 61. Members of the NFAC fellowship these ladies and gentlemen represent hundreds of years of sobriety, experience, strength & hope and they are here to help us! You may be seated. I have asked our Past Delegates if they would be willing to act as mentors/helpers to our current S/C and Administrative Chairs when we are dealing w/ the Conference final agenda & background material. Their willingness to help was heartwarming!

Since I mentioned the final agenda I wanted to bring you up to date on a few items. You may recall last year we had 2 motions concerning PI. We had asked the Trustees Committee on PI to consider the publication of a PI pamphlet that would focus on PI service & also that references to Special Needs/Accessibilities be added to the new PSA. On the new pamphlet the committee agreed that locally developed literature can be a helpful tool to

the local communities, but chose not to move the suggestion forward. On adding references to special needs to the New PSA the committee said the following: "That while it is vital to communicate in PI efforts that recovery is available to all, local resources for alcoholics w/ special needs vary". The committee went on to add, "the committee discussed other approaches to communicate the availability of AA to alcoholics w/ special needs & noted this demographic, along w/ others, is included in the Comprehensive Media Plan."

This year the GSB, which usually meets the last weekend in January will not meet until the 1st weekend in February. Our GSC secretary has said they will try to have the final agenda & background material available by mid-February. So far the time schedule that was originally received is running about a week late. Be assured that we are planning on having the material to the panel & past delegates as soon as it arrives. I want to thank Jeff P. & Glenn W. for developing a dashboard, similar to the one provided to the Delegate by GSO. This will expedite the distribution of the background material & the final agenda and save the NFAC hundreds of dollars. If you are not comfortable with going to a link and downloading this information please get in touch with me and I will see that you get a hard-copy CD. Our conference theme is: "the GSC Takes Its Inventory-Our solutions in Action".

I have already had a request from Districts 12, 15, & 23 for a pre-conference W/S. If your geographical area would like to get on the schedule please see me at the break or after the Assembly. It would be greatly appreciated if multiple districts would combine to reach as many as possible & reduce the panels travel time & costs.

CHANGING SUBJECTS: After Sandy hit the east coast many of the fellowship contacted GSO in an effort to help those in the area. Our General Service has put out a piece on how our GSO responds to disasters. This piece is available in Both the English & Spanish on the aanorthflorida.org website under the Delegates corner. At the same location, the Delegates corner, you will find the Winter Box 459. While I'm on that subject I'd like to note that Districts or Groups can purchase the Box 459. If memory serves me you can buy 10 subscriptions for a cost of \$6.00 per year. It has lots of great information for the entire fellowship. Before leaving the Delegate's corner I want to thank Marcela W for translating the D.C. into Spanish! I'm intending on updating the "Delegate's Corner" frequently. When new information comes in I will be passing it on to you. So please check that section

One final note: the 2011 membership survey is available. A few quick stats; 8000 members were randomly surveyed. Average age is 49, has 10 years of sobriety, attends 2 ½ meeting per week, has a sponsor that they often got in the 1st 90 days and belongs to a home group, Men outnumber women 64% to 35%. While the occupations varied widely, the single largest groups of respondents were retired. 17%.

I'm excited & pleased to be working with you all for the next 2 years. From the bottom of my heart I truly believe that "we are in the life saving business" and that is our Area theme and that's why we are wearing name badges with life preservers on them. Somehow over the years sometimes the connection gets lost, but remember the words of Bernard Smith (in 1955) about what a conference is. We don't need a Conference for you or me... We got it! We're here because the hand of AA was there when we needed it. This conference exists for the alcoholic that is sleeping in a door way a few blocks away and the infant being born tonight in a nearby hospital. And that is why we are going to wear these life preservers to remind ourselves of our primary purpose and you and I are in the life saving business. Thank you for allowing me to serve as your voice.

Alternate Delegate's Report - Glenn W, Alt Delegate, Panel 63. Over the past two months our Delegate and I have been discussing ways to best deliver the upcoming General Service Conference material and facilitate workshops around the Districts to inform the Groups of the agenda items. Our interim webmaster Jeff and I partnered on devising a more efficient method of digital delivery of the Conference Background material when it becomes available. Emails will be sent to the Panel with instructions on how to receive / download the material when it becomes available hopefully in mid-late February.

I also joined our Delegate along with many other visitors from the North Florida Area in attending the Southeast Regional Service Forum which was held in Boca Raton in November. The facilitators from our General Service Office included our General Service Board Chairperson Ward E., General Service Office Manager, Phyllis H., Southeast Regional Trustee El N., and other Trustees, Directors, and GSO staff. Some key notes were that Ward alluded to the fact that the Board may be looking into a possible restructuring of the service corporations. Also, the GSO has implemented a new benefits program for it new hires that will significantly reduce some of the future benefit expenses.

There were multiple general sharing sessions which were well participated in by the members with a wide range of questions and comments. Also during one of the working sessions, we were introduced to the recently formed GSO Technology Team; a group of IT professionals from around the country who are currently providing guidance to the GSO in matters of technology improvements including the eBook apps, and new aa.org

website.

Chairperson: Vivian F., I would like to welcome our new trusted servants, GSRs and DCMs with Orange Badges, please stand. Thank you for your service.

I attended the Forum and it was an amazing gift to be in the presence of so many of us either involved or seeking involvement in service. There were four specific highlights for me; 1. Ward Ewing, Chairman of the General Service Board will also be rotating out and he said his good-bye, 3. The donation made to our General Service Office by the Southeast Regional Forum due to the skit put on in the 7th Tradition Workshop, facilitated by our own Past Delegate, Cecilia R. and 4. Learning about not being afraid of new technology, but making sure we hear everyone's concerns and as we move forward, to move slowly. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Alternate Chair: Heather VW. I am honored to serve as your Alternate Chairperson for Panel 63. I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to all of those who gave assistance and support during this Assembly.

I would like to report our attendance this weekend is 42 DCMs; Alt. DCMs, 178 GSRs/Alt. GSRs, 31 Officers/Service Coordinators/Administrative, and 95 Visitors or a total of 346 attendees in all.

After the presentation and some questions/answers, the committee voted unanimously to approve and move forward with this bid to the Joint Advisory Committee which will next meet on Feb 2, 2013.

SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS

Accessibilities — Good morning. My name is Kay M. and I am your Service Coordinator for Accessibilities. Our first workshop of Panel 63 was well-attended with 22 people present. We had a very informative discussion of what Accessibilities covers. We found that a number of those attending do not have a local Accessibilities Committee. Therefore, in addition to Conference items that will be discussed at the next workshop, we will have materials available to address the issue of how to establish an Accessibilities Committee. Archives - Vicki E.—16 members attended the meeting. Vic L. from the Central Florida Intergroup was kind enough to welcome us to our new home at the Lake Mary Marriott by bringing some of the Central Florida Intergroup archive display for our enjoyment. Vic also presented about the early years of AA in the Orlando and Central Florida area along with information about AA #40 Clarence Snyder and his wife Gracie who lived in Orlando. Baschia our Saturday night speaker with 51 years sobriety gave us written permission to tape her talk for our archives collection. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Archivist - Stephen R. — Work has continued on the past minutes of the North Florida Area assembly. I recently updated & completed the panel 61 minute binder. This was updated with one original and one copied set of each quarter minutes along with the final conference report books. These binders are kept in Archives storage. I am presently working on updating the hard copy binders from past years 2000, 2004 through 2010. I have found missing minutes and inconsistencies in these binders. I am going through each one to make sure they are updated and contain the correct information. All past minutes, have been scanned electronically. The years 1990 through 2012 have been uploaded to the password protected area of the web site. They have of course been scrubbed for last names, addresses to protect anonymity. I have also put the past minutes on disc and distributed that to the web chair.

There are some past missing Assembly minutes we are in need of locating. The list is as follows, 1992 first, third & Fourth quarters, 1991 fourth quarter, 1990 second quarter, 1989 first quarter, 1985 second quarter, 1979 first quarter, and 1978 second quarter.

Thank you to George C. from District 12 Archives, for providing us with past minutes from the third quarter 1994 along with various other copies of past Area minute's & Archive committee documents.

I have also just completed scanning and updating the District and groups History Book. This book has now been turned over to the Archives Service coordinator for display and research purposes. A disc with the updated histories contained in the book along with a complete Inventory of all items housed in storage as well as items in the rolling Archives display have been turned over to the finance chair.

We do encourage all Districts to pick up or download the group history form from the website and distribute to the GSRs and groups in your districts. We have many groups and districts with long rich histories and it is imperative that we get them documented before they are lost. No group could be too new or too old to fill out a history form. Finally, I just wanted to mention that in the latest edition of Markings, the Archives newsletter has an article on the National AA Archives Workshop held Oct. 4-7 2012 in Cocoa Beach where all attendance records were shattered. Pick up or download a copy from the GSO website. Also during National AA Archives Workshop, Akron A.A. Archivist, Jim B. presented the GSO Archives with one of the original Poverello Medal Certificates. As you may or may not know, this honor was bestowed to the Fellowship in 1949 by the College of Steubenville in Ohio. Sister Ignatia was asked by Bill W. to accept the award on behalf of A.A. The

original medal and certificate are held at the Cleveland Catholic Diocese Archives in Richfield, Ohio. However, copies of the certificate were sent to A.A. groups and offices around the country by the College at that time. Akron Archives knows of the whereabouts of only 4 out of the 2,500 copies sent in 1949, this award precedes the prestigious Lasker Award that A.A. received from the American Medical Association (A.M.A.) in 1951. During yesterday's Archives workshop I made available copies for those who wanted them for their own Archives. Cooperation with Professional Community — Linda G., Chair, Terri-Lynn S., Alt. Chair, Note taker, Iain B., Number of attendees: 40; 2 trusted servants and 1 note taker for a total of 43

Linda opened meeting, and Teri-Lynn informed meeting of 2013 Adolescent Conference in Florida Hotel & Conference Center, Orlando Feb 18-20 and requested help to make event a success.

From floor: Multi-faceted area of need in Communities, particularly judicial and youth courts. Judiciary has different expectations as to what A.A. is all about and important to spend time informing people what we do. Mention about court slips being signed off for simple attendance in meetings rather than working steps.

Questions were asked about how to obtain workbook, the group was informed that it is available from GSO and can also be downloaded from the aa.org website as can other pertinent information.

Other discussions included: (1) Using display leaflets in doctors offices, - brought plastic display carriers as they stand up better than cardboard. (2) How to deal with visitors who are not members of fellowship attending meetings, like nurses, social workers, etc. and explain etiquette to visitors. (3) Statement of the day: "Do – Dump or Delegate"

Question was asked about getting message into hospitals. General sharing on subject included: Try starting with social workers via their department supervisor. Try psychiatric unit if exist try head nurse to see if they would like an education program for patients. Taking speaker meetings into facilities. Health fairs and job fairs. Don't forget schools – especially middle schools for educating students. Linda reminded group that she is available for district workshops. Meeting closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

Corrections — Mike R., Service Coord., Kim L., Alt. Service Coord., 60 in Attendance, Note Taker: Paula M.

Corrections Workshop opened with the Serenity Pray. Kim L. volunteered to be Alt. Corrections Service Coordinator. Reviewed Correction Activity Update sent by GSO Correction Coordinator, M. Tracey O. Some things discussed: People want to get involved, but don't understand the process, Bridging the Gap, the difference between Federal, State and County institutions. Going to one doesn't get you in others. The different ways to correspond with Inmates: Through your district, Intergroup, but never from your home. I asked if anyone wanted to be Correspondence Coordinator and that is still open. Using the pink can in the home groups to get literature. GSO will send a Big Book but not primary purpose. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Grapevine — Richard C., We opened the workshop with the Serenity Pray. We had 34 people in attendance. There was a discussion on ways of informing others about the Grapevine and we could share it with our groups. We followed with the importance of a GVR along with the duties and responsibilities. We talked about how and why a GVR should registrar as a GVR. We followed up with a look at how to use the website aagrapevine.org. My Alt. Kris O. and I would like to thank District 10 for a great job in the Grapevine Room with sales of \$398.00 and Raffle Ticket sales of \$587.00 allowing for 20 subscriptions to be given away. Intergroup — Ruth R., Alt. Service Coordinator; Johnette K., Number of People present – 45, Notes Taken By Johnette, The Meeting opened with a moment of silence followed by the serenity prayer. We began with a 1949 quote by our founder Bill W. who stated, "The Intergroup associations are the best insurance we can have that our life lines to the hundreds of thousands yet to come will never break or tangle. Let us always be generous. Let us warmly support Intergroup."

This led to a review of the early history of Central groups and Intergroups, which had their origins in the Cleveland Central Committee, although the first office wasn't established in Chicago until after the Jack Alexander article in the Saturday Evening Post. A handout on our early history was passed out along with the current A.A. Intergroup Guidelines from G.S.O

We then had a lengthy discussion and sharing session about the various services Intergroups provide to our fellowship and the general public. We made an extensive list of these services and shared about how

Intergroup services may vary from one district or geographic area to another. The importance of cooperation between Intergroup, Groups, Districts and the Area was stressed, since Central Offices, while not part of the General Service Structure, should exist to aid in the “common purpose of carrying the AA message to the Alcoholic that still suffers”. (AA Guidelines: Central or Intergroup Offices).

The latitude that Intergroups have to perform other services related to recovery but not actually AA sanctioned was also discussed. These included the sale of non-Conference approved literature, as well as chips and medallions.

Our workshop ended with a short discussion of the funds required to keep the doors open; rent, phone, salaries, lights, meeting schedules, inventory, etc. It was agreed that next time we'd focus on sharing our creative and successful ideas for funding our offices, including both fundraisers and increasing Group awareness and contributions. Everyone was asked to email recaps of their previously successful events or ideas so that we can put together a handout for the next Area Assembly in March. The goal is to help each other keep the life lines that Central Offices offer unbroken and untangled so we can continue to reach out to the Alcoholic who still suffers.

Many thanks to all who attended and for the wonderful participation we had. Johnette and I are looking forward to seeing you in March. Thank you so much for letting me serve.

Literature – Ken S., The Workshop was opened at 11:15 AM with a Moment of Silence and followed by the Serenity Prayer. We had a full house and an action packed first workshop!

Copies of the GSO Guidelines for Literature Committees were distributed. Using those guidelines, we discussed the role/job(s) of Literature Committees and what we will be doing for the next two years for Area 14 Panel 63.

I asked if anyone in the room has ever read, viewed, and/or listened to every piece of A.A. General Service Conference Approved literature. Not a single hand went up, including mine. So, we created the ‘Literature Challenge’ for Area 14 Panel 63. The ‘Literature Challenge’ is to have everyone that attends Area 14 to read as much of A. A.’s literature as they possibly can in the next two years. A checklist will be created for everyone to use and keep track of how much literature they have read. At the end of the two years, the top three consumers will receive some sort of incentive for their efforts.

We then went around the room and everyone in attendance got an opportunity to state what piece of A.A. literature was most important to them in their early sobriety. There were some common pieces that a lot shared but there was also a diverse array of literature mentioned.

We then went over our ‘Piece of Literature for the Assembly.’ At each Area Assembly, we will feature a different piece of A. A.’s literature. For this Assembly it was ‘Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix.’ We briefly discussed the many different ways that we can financially support the A.A. Service Structure. We also distributed a second piece of literature...”Your A.A. General Service Office.’ Both of these will give everyone who attended the workshop a head start on the Literature Challenge!!

Lastly, we discussed what our role would be for the March Assembly. The only thing that we will be doing is going over the General Service Conference Agenda Items. I encouraged everyone to read the information on the literature items and come prepared to discuss them so that we may give our Delegate the best informed group conscience on the items that we can. The workshop was closed at 12:15 PM with the Responsibility Pledge.

Public Information — Sheryl R., Alt. Coordinator: Melanie E., Number in Attendance: 35+, Note Taker: Melanie E., The meeting came to order with the Serenity Prayer and called roll by Districts.

The purpose of Public Information was read, the definition from page S-21 in the Service Manual and the History and the purpose of Cooperation with the Professional Community from the A.A. Guidelines. We reviewed how to contact PI at GSO and handed out forms to register as a District PI Chair.

2007 Past Literature Service Coordinator, Steve R. gave the history of the “Along the Road with AA” pamphlet. It was originally a tri-fold pamphlet. The next Literature Service Coordinator, Wendy updated the pamphlet in 2010. The pamphlet then became a flyer (flier – whichever spelling is your preference). The last Literature Service Coordinator, Joyce C. contacted the D.O.T. and was told that the information was not allowed to be placed in Florida rest areas. It was discussed to place it on our website for informational purposes. All were in favor of bringing it to the Website Committee Meeting with the request.

Participants shared what is happening or not happening in their Districts. Some of the sharing included: “adopt a Doc” (placing info about AA in the Doctor’s offices), books placed in county Libraries, an “ad” in Central Office/Intergroup newsletters, tear-off Hot Line numbers on flyers placed on community bulletin boards, at Workforce, grocery stores, et cetera and placing the AAWS Poster for young people in schools. PSAs were mentioned and will be discussed more at another Assembly.

The meeting adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer. I want to thank Melanie for taking notes and all that attended for great discussion and suggestions. I have been asked to participate in the Central Florida Intergroup Service Fair on February 23.

Treatment — Iain B., Number in attendance 56, Note Taker, Carson F. (District 17). The meeting opened with the serenity prayer. Iain introduced himself and gave a brief summary of his service history. He went on to state that the purpose of the Treatment service position was to educate facilities on what AA is and what we do, and additionally provide a Bridging the Gap (BTG) program for residents being discharged from facilities and wishing to attend A.A. New GSRs and District Treatment / Bridging the Gap (BTG) Chairs were warmly welcomed. The literature was explained, with emphasis on the Treatment Workbook and the BTG templates, with examples of how to obtain them.

Sharing from the floor included "What works" and "What doesn't work." in treatment meetings. BTG at Area level, and connections to wider fellowship through Area contacts was discussed. Sharing on how to generate enthusiasm for service in treatment committees at group and district levels. 7th tradition - donating time to service. Differences between Treatment BTG and Corrections BTG discussed. Summary – Volunteers were needed to assist in Treatment Facility New meeting. The workshop closed with responsibility statement.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Finance Committee — Lori P., Service Coordinator, 9 of our 10 assigned DCMs were in attendance. Note Taker: Marcela W. Thank you for the opportunity to serve. We kicked off our meeting reading the responsibilities of our Committee from Structures and Guidelines. After a high level presentation on Budgeting and Fiscal Responsibility the floor was turned over to our Treasurer, Annette. Annette provided a recap of the 2012 ending financial position of the area. She also covered the budgeting process for the coming year; and the budget for 2013. There was a good deal of participation with questions around the process, our financial position and prudent reserve. Annette also discussed how our committee should expect to participate in the budgeting process in the coming year.

We will have 2 motions coming to the floor, one to modify Structures and Guidelines Section 17 to make the change that 1 night lodging (instead of 2) be paid for Grapevine and Archives Service Coordinators. The second to dispose of the laptop formerly used by the Registrar, purchased in 2003 as well as the Xerox scanner formerly used by Archives, both of which have been retired. At the time of the meeting we did not have an Alternate Chair but I am happy to report that 2 people have stepped forward to volunteer to take on this responsibility. I would like to thank Marcela W. for filling in and taking notes. We closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

Growth Committee — Glenn W., Alt. Delegate, We started the meeting with introductions of the eight Districts attending and assigned to Growth. Since the updating of Service Manual page numbers had already been performed for 2013, we reviewed the NFAC Structure & Guidelines description of the Growth Committee and discussed whether or not it is adequate in describing the duties and responsibilities of the Committee. We also discussed the lifecycle of a NFAC motion, whether it starts from the floor, a committee, and its impact on the Structures and Guidelines. As it stands, by definition, we are not necessarily the committee for Structure and Guideline changes but rather the committee for all other actions that don't fit in Finance, Site & Agenda, or Website at the discretion of the Area Chairperson respectively.

Finally, the on-going effort of defining the District boundaries in populated areas is continuing with both Jacksonville and Daytona areas defining in detail the results of their "District Conscience". At our next Assembly, detailed District-level maps will be available for all Area Districts to review and concurrence. The end result of this project is to not only have an accurate overview map that is in the back of the Structure & Guidelines, but to have individuals maps at the District scale that will show the detail about the border between Districts, which in some cases may be a highway or river. We can then provide this information on our website in an interactive format that will allow the user to zoom in to a street scale to see exact District boundaries in populated areas.

Site & Agenda Committee — Heather VW., Alt. Chair, 7 out of 9 voting members attending and 8 visitors, Kelly J. Reporting. The committee will be busy getting bid packets for hotels for 2015-2016. Goal is to present to Assembly in July 2013. Host District Responsibilities were discussed and updated. Great feedback from current host districts which will make us more relevant and consistent to Orlando Marriott.

Room Block commitment – We discussed setting realistic expectation with the hotel as renegotiations are

underway we will learn how exactly the Marriott Orlando can fill our needs. Attrition= 200 Rm nights – 50 cancellations x \$85 = 3K. Motion will come up under new business from the Site & Agenda Committee.

Web Site Committee Report — Rita C., Chairperson, A request from the NFAC treasurer to have a link on the home page to bring you directly to the addresses of the treasurer, the registrar, and hotel reservations. The concern was to make sure the addresses were to post office boxes not personal addresses. This request passed.

The next item of business was to clarify who the webmaster would be taking direction from. A change to Structure & Guidelines, section 5, Webmaster – to read “They shall maintain the Web Site and only add or remove data from the site when directed by the website chairperson or designee, as approved by the Website Administrative Committee and/or the NFAC Assembly. Committee agreed. A motion will be made at the business meeting.

It was voted to change password. The Webmaster brought to the attention of the committee that the password only needs to be changed every 12 months not 6 months. All committee members we in agreement with is proposal. Motion passed.

The archivist proposed that the flyer “On the Road with AA” be posted on the website. The flyer has all the intergroup telephone numbers in the state of Florida. Motion passed.

We are going to need a new webmaster. The requirements of a webmaster were passed out to committee members and everyone present. We ask all to send webmaster candidates’ names to the web chair. Discussed was a proposal for a paid webmaster. Web chair will get together with the treasurer to talk about this matter and bring back a report next assembly. The webmaster will research what other areas are doing on their websites and report back next assembly. We are also seeking a volunteer to translate certain sections of the website in Spanish. Thank you for allowing me to serve.


