Chairperson: Heather V-W. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 6:30 PM on Saturday October 1, 2016.

Registrar: Richard C. - We have 168 voting members in attendance tonight with 2/3's being 112.

**OFFICER REPORTS**

**Secretary: Annette D.** – My name is Annette D. and my home group is Early Birds in District 12. It is my privilege to serve as your Secretary. Minutes were mailed to Registrar two weeks after assembly. We will hold this quarter's minutes long enough to have an address for the new Treasurer and Registrar. We will need your help to pass this information to your groups. I have 4 corrections to the minutes: 1) typo in Treasurer's name, 2) typos in 1 resume, 3) may have left one resume out and 4) Meriem M. wrote and read the Literature Report at the microphone. Are there any other corrections? Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, seconded and passed.

**Interim Treasurer: Marilyn B.** - Before I begin with the reports I want to give you some updated information. Given the early assembly this quarter I want you to know that the financials went to press on Sept. 20th. If you or your group sent a contribution this past week it will be reflected in the next report. I want to thank Annette D. for her assistance in timely making our contribution bank deposits. To keep this transition as simple as possible we decided to continue to use the same post office box that was set up at the beginning of Panel 65. Every Monday those checks are forwarded to us from a friend of Kay's, Helen A., so that there isn't further delay in cashing the contribution checks Annette D. has been handling that for the NFAC. Also our 2015 990EZ tax return was completed, thanks to Dick G., a few weeks after our last Assembly. It was signed and electronically submitted to the IRS. Now if you will turn your attention to the financial reports on the table. Looking at the Balance Sheet you can see we have cash in our checking, money market and CD accts that total \$ 86,884.85. Income is on schedule with the budget, expense have been less than planned which has resulted in a positive bottom line of \$ 10,817.23. I want to thank you for your continued support of the NFAC and for your understanding & cooperation during this transition period.

**Delegate: Glenn W.** - First, I wish to recognize and thank our Past Delegates: Dan E. Panel 45, Dick G. Panel 47 and also past Southeast Regional Trustee, Tom G. Panel 51, Corliss G. Panel 53, Michael S. Panel 55, Fred H. Panel 57, Chet P. Panel 59 and current Southeast Regional Trustee, and Marilyn B. Panel 63. Since our last Assembly, I gave Delegate's reports in District's 13 and 5. I will be in District 33 in October, and will be setting up one more in District 22 in late November. My last appearance as your Delegate will be at the Southeast Regional Forum, Dec 2-4 at the Lake Mary Marriott. If you haven't planned for it yet, I encourage you register for the Forum at aa.org. There is no cost to register or attend as this is a service provided by your General Service Office (GSO). You are on your own for lodging however and I do hope to see you there. I come with gifts this weekend – your final Conference Reports are here and please take one for your group and DCMs please take some back to you other groups. You are all “shareholders” in this wonderful organization and fellowship which is A.A. These books are your shareholders report on the well-being of your fellowship. Many questions that I have received in the past can be answered within this report.

Matters of finance, membership, staff, and organization, in addition to some fantastic presentations by members of the General Service Conference are all included. Please help yourself as I do not want to take any back home with me. In news from the GSO: Applications are now being sought for a G.S.O. staff member. G.S.O. staff are members of Alcoholics Anonymous who rotate through the various assignments such as Corrections, Public Information, C.P.C., Conference, International, etc. They also correspond with A.A.s on all aspects of recovery and service. Additionally, they represent the General Service Office at A.A. functions throughout the U.S. and Canada and provide the primary staff support for the General Service Board and the annual General Service Conference. GSO is welcoming applications up to *November 15, 2016*. The Trustees' Literature Committee is seeking current sharing from young people in A.A. Please encourage young members in your area to write their personal stories for possible inclusion in the revised pamphlet "Young People and A.A." Stories should reflect "In a general way what we used to be like, what happened, and what we are like now." Manuscripts should be 500-800 words, double spaced, in 12-point typeface. The words "Young People and A.A." should appear on the top of the first page of the manuscript. The author's complete name, address and email/telephone information should be included with the submission. Submissions can be emailed to: Literature@aa.org with "Young People and A.A." inserted in the subject line of the message. The deadline for all submissions is *December 30, 2016*. The mid-year financials (unaudited) are looking somewhat more optimistic than previously budgeted. While contributions (to-date) are slightly under budget, literature sales are slightly above. Add to that expenses are considerably under budget and we are currently in the black as opposed to the projected deficit for this year so far. But please do not take this news as we're fine now and go back to contributing just a dollar – we still have 6 months left in this year and many projects and services may not have been funded yet. Did you know the Big Book is currently available in 69 translations? The most recent translation is Rarotongan (Cook Islands); there are 15 translations pending including Navajo, Haitian Creole, Lao, and Thai. In terms of success in Alcoholics Anonymous, I guess at a fundamental level this was a successful panel for me - I didn't drink one day at a time! In all seriousness, through good times and rough times these past two years I do sincerely feel that I am rotating out having done the best job I could. This success was only possible through the help and cooperation of the rest of the panel here, all the members that have attended and participated, and especially our Alternate Delegate Joyce C. **Alternate Delegate's Report: Joyce C.** - Alt Delegate, Area 14, Panel 65. I attended the 60th Florida State Convention at Innisbrook. As Alternate Delegate, I serve on the Joint Advisory Committee which meets twice during conventions. First, at 9 A.M. JAC business meeting, then later in the day, the site selection meeting. Everyone attending the convention has a vote at this meeting. There was only one bidder, so winning the bid unopposed was Ft. Lauderdale for the 2018 62nd Florida State Convention. Registration opened at this convention for the 61st Florida State Convention taking place in North Florida in Jacksonville. Please register to support them. I also attended the District 13 business meeting and Delegate's Report, District 15, 3 legacies workshop, and the Area 14 and Area 15 combined Corrections Workshop. There was a panel of former inmates, which was very interesting. If you are thinking about bidding on the 63rd Florida state Convention, in 2019, the bid package must be presented to the Oversight Committee by the January Assembly. **61st Florida State Convention Report: Ruth R.** - Greetings from your 61<sup>st</sup> Florida State Convention Host Committee! It's been a very busy two months since the 60<sup>th</sup> FSC. Registration opened on August 3rd. We brought 300 limited edition t-shirts to give away with registrations, expecting to have half of them left over for the Assembly this weekend. You can imagine how happy we were when we gave out the last one on Sunday morning—and we were still registering folks! We registered 326 people at Innisbrook. We are beyond grateful to all of the convention attendees for the support they gave us. It was truly a fantastic way to kick off our registrations. The former Area Archivist, Steve R., briefed preparations with Area 15 for the Third Annual Florida AA Archives Workshop in Winter Park next February. The workshop will have some great speakers with a \$15 registration fee to cover the cost. I have flyers that you can take to share with your groups. Will the District 28 DCM, Steve M, please stand. Steve, District Archivist Denis S. and Old Timers Dick M. and Gus B. provided a really super presentation on the history of AA in Citrus County. We discussed a motion to the Finance Committee to cover the additional cost incurred by the Area Archivist to participate in the National AA Archives Workshop. It has been a really great ride and I will be forever grateful for allowing me to serve and learn so much about our rich AA history in Northeast Florida the last two years.

**Archivist: Scott B.** – I am Scott B. grateful to be serving as your North Florida Area Archivist. First I would like to thank all the caring members of our fellowship for your prayers and thoughts concerning my step son, this disease and my families trouble. No way to get through something like this without A.A. and your support. Shout out to goes to Glenn M. from Barefoot Bay Group in District 12 for his work on converting our huge mass of audio cassettes. He has started with the Area minutes. I have gotten the originals so we can begin to have access to these audio files. These have not been stored in any order & some cassettes do not even have labels.; so this has been a huge undertaking in digitizing not only for conversion but also filing & addressing for search ability. At the July Assembly we also received some braille A.A. books & pamphlets from September G. Accessibilities Service Coordinator including a copy of braille 12 X 12, (This book complete is two volumes each about an inch & a half thick), braille "Daily Reflections" Volume 1 (this complete is a 3 volume set), and a copy of the North Florida Area Accessibilities pamphlet. Jim B. donated a huge amount of group history files obtained through the diligent work of Volusia County Intergroup Archives. It included over 60 Groups within 5 different Districts!! Jim also included both the paper and digitized copy of all these group history files, A sponsee by the name of Rick C. donated the medallions & information of his sponsor Owen D. affectionately known as "Duke", who had 55years and 10 months of sobriety when he passed in 2005. What a story! I was blessed to get to meet Zach S. who brought all this information for the North Florida Archives, including a great photo of Duke speaking next to a copy of "Language of the Heart". Thanks also to everyone else who has been hand delivering their home group histories for our archives. These are now in two LARGE volumes!! And from the amount of group information from Volusia County; we will certainly have to split this into 3 volumes soon. So grateful I was able to participate in the 20th National Archives workshop held Sept 8<sup>th</sup> -11<sup>th</sup> in Concorde CA. right outside of San Francisco. I even managed a

special tour of San Francisco the day prior; through one of the members who was in the play performed on Saturday night. Ralph C. showed me some cool meeting houses, local Intergroup office & bookstore, couple of antique used bookstores, Golden Gate Bridge even the interesting Haight Ashbury district and stopped for dinner at the world renowned Mel's drive inn Diner! Finally dropping me at the hotel. What a day to kick it off! There was a wealth of great presenters and topics covered. Too many to catch them all; but I did get the complete recording of this 4-day event. 3 hour hands on workshop on preservation, Women of the Big book, Young people in A.A., dubious sources and myths in AA History, digital archives, cataloging and organization, archive ethics and copyright, history of La Viña, writing and collecting group history along with taking oral histories. There was also a workshop on writing an area history book, with a copy of their 3<sup>rd</sup> edition History! So in depth and comprehensive! And this is the first time we picked up the complete event on a digital thumb drive with MP3 files!! Anyone wanting a copy (of the complete 4-day workshop) please bring a thumb drive or laptop to me and I will be glad to pass it on. There was also a wealth of participation from our General Service Office, trustees, delegates and even a relative of A.A. # 3 Bill D. Area 14 also might have made a first & lasting impression at the 20<sup>th</sup> National event. With this year being our 75th Anniversary of the first registered group in the State of Florida, I made the effort to set up a display covering this milestone in the archive display room. But with all the workshops available at this event I did not want to spend a lot of time in the display room. So I created a digital movie presentation that ran on a small digital picture frame that accompanied the physical display items & photos. **Corrections: Bob C.** - Opened the workshop with the Serenity Prayer. 20 people attended. A discussion took place about the 14/15 Area Corrections Workshop that was held on September 18 at the Eastside Club in Orlando. Two speakers (Robbie and Dave) shared their experience, strength, and hope concerning A.A. meetings in correction facilities. The workshop went well. 1) It was announced that Joe M. needs help taking meetings into the Lake County Corrections facilities. His phone is (407) 620-7953. 2) A discussion took place concerning needing volunteers for Corrections Facilities in District 16. Most volunteers are coming from Jacksonville and Gainesville. Some of the Prison Groups are registered but are not being represented at

the Area level due to no DCM in District 16. The question was posed on how can this problem be resolved so the groups can be represented. 3) A discussion took place on the duties of the Corrections Service Coordinator. Some of those duties are: Being accessible, clean up – no biker colors; follow the dress code of the facility, remember that our primary purpose is to help the suffering alcoholic and make sure that prison officials understand that is our only agenda. 4) Bob C. explained the procedure to be selected as a service coordinator as submitting a service resume to the newly elected Chairperson. 5) A discussion took place about sponsoring inmates. Department of Corrections policy is no contact with inmates' other the meeting. It was suggested if you are taking meetings that you do not sponsor the inmates. 6) An extensive discussion took place about nonconference approved literature being taken into prisons. It was suggested that when one takes an AA meeting to a facility that they are representing AA and taking nonconference approve material may not be appropriate. This would include any material published by another entity that may use passages out of the Big Book. Closed with the Responsibility Statement.

**Cooperation with Intergroup: Linda G.** - North Florida intergroups shared that they are seeing a decline in literature sales. The young people in A.A. seem to like using electronic devices rather than carrying hard copy books, which may be part of the problem. We need to find ways to improve our communications between the intergroup and their districts. The districts cooperation with the local intergroup will help get the message to the groups. Sharing continued on ways for the intergroups to get out of the red. Dinners, dances, etc... One of our intergroups put together a committee called "Back in Black" to help come up with ideas for fundraisers and it worked as they are now "back in black". The General Service Board's Strategic Plan that was approved in February was discussed in our meeting. The PSA's also help to reach people looking for help with their drinking problem, and many times it starts with the call to our local intergroup. Thank you for allowing me to serve. During the workshop today, we wrapped up loose ends so a smooth transition can be made going into Panel 67 in 2017. We passed out Grapevine literature packets which included information on how the upcoming Group and District Grapevine / La Viña chairs can register with A.A. Grapevine to receive continuous updates from Grapevine. We also photographed a display to represent the North Florida Area 14 Grapevine / La Viña on the AA Grapevine.org website. This photograph will then be located on <http://www.aagrapevine.org/display-gallery>. The new Grapevine book "Our Twelve Traditions: AA Members Share Their Own Experience" was introduced. Regarding the 138 Grapevine / La Viña Gift Certificates contributed by ICCYPA - there are 30 Grapevine and 7 La Viña Gift Certificates that were unclaimed by 9 Districts. The cut-off date was September 20th. During this Assembly another attempt to contact the DCM's was made. It was decided in the Grapevine workshop, these remaining Gift Certificates will now be donated to Area 14 corrections as discussed at the July 2016 workshop. The final item discussed was the "Grow Your Grapevine" Sweepstakes being sponsored by AA Grapevine. The sweepstakes will be going on until February 28, 2017. The Area with the greatest number of cards submitted will be featured in a magazine section and online during 2017. Five winners will receive a selection of Grapevine books and other items. Participants can enter online, complete a card on your table or add your name and email address to the list on your table and I will be happy to submit them for you. Thank you for this wonderful opportunity to serve the North Florida Area 14, it has been a true privilege.

**Literature: Lori P.** – 37 in attendance. The Literature Workshop opened with a discussion on the call for stories based on the 2016 General Service Conference recommendation that the pamphlet "Young People and A.A." be revised to better reflect the experiences of young A.A. members for possible inclusion in this

revised pamphlet. Meriem M. provided us with information on how to submit a story. In her presentation, Meriem discussed that stories should reflect in a general way “what we use to be like, what happened, and what we are like now”. Submissions should be between 500-800 words, include the author’s contact information, and to be sent to General Service Office, P.O. Box 459, Grand Central Station, New York, NY or submitted by email to literature @aa.org. Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Respectfully submitted, Lori P.

**Public Information: Donna W.** – Good evening, everyone, I am an alcoholic with the privilege of serving as your North Florida Area 14 Public Information Committee service coordinator; my name is Donna W. We were fortunate to have as our guest at this morning’s workshop Greg N., DCM from District 14, who spoke from his professional perspective as a high school teacher and coach. Greg delivered a powerful and heartfelt message about the prevalence of alcohol use and abuse at his school, underscoring the need for a sustained effort from Public Information service workers to coordinate presentations with local school districts. A vibrant discussion followed with sharing from district Public Information committee members who reported their steady progress on a host of projects. Since the July area assembly, Area 14 Cooperation with the Professional Community Committee service coordinator Marty C. and I made a presentation to an eager group of Orlando-area A.A. members interested in learning how to launch PI/CPC committees. With this presentation, we were able to honor the commitment we made at the start of our rotation to offer workshops to every district in the North Florida area; thank you to the DCMs who helped us schedule those workshops in strategic locations to better maximize our travel time. Marty C. and I also made progress in our efforts to establish an online repository for resources that will help A.A. members engaged in Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community service work. With assistance from Peter C from District 4, we hope to have this “one-stop shop” online resource for archiving and sharing PI/CPC experience throughout our area available by the end of our rotation in December. On the subject of rotation, while the completion of my term as PI service coordinator is bittersweet, I’m thrilled to be able to look back over the past two years and see amazing progress in the North Florida area. At the July 2015 assembly, I regretfully reported that only eight of our 32 districts appeared to have even the slightest evidence of PI/CPC activity, and that most of that activity was of the one-man or one-woman band variety. Just 15 months later, more than half of our districts have established full-fledged PI/CPC committees and a half-dozen more are on their way to building committees. It’s been an honor to witness this level of commitment on the part of North Florida A.A.s, and I will remain forever grateful for the opportunity you gave me to serve.

**Treatment: Carson F.** - 8 people attended the workshop. General discussion about private treatment facilities vs government funded and limitations of government funded. Interacting with treatment administrators; getting and keeping volunteers, sponsors encouraging and supporting service were other discussions. Some discussion overlapped into corrections, importance of carrying the message. Thank you for allowing me to serve. Carson F., Treatment Service Coordinator.

The group conscience was to get more bids in a spreadsheet format for the January 14th Site and Agenda Committee meeting. Our Committee will be active getting bids until the end of the year.

**Website: William F.** – Opened with Serenity Prayer, seven of nine DCM's in attendance. William mentioned our Webmaster Alex M. translates everything into Spanish. Steve N. District 28 DCM, reported the google analytics. Each month averages about 4500 sessions by 3750 unique visitors. Each visit sees an average of 1.7 pages. The pages most viewed after the Start Page are all the Spanish pages (56%), Assembly Agenda, Meeting Information, Activities, Password Protected Area, Map, Grapevine News, Structures and guidelines, Group Change Forms and Service Bodies. # Summary of Conference Procedures

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on as informal a basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

## Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

## Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Each Committee considers carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are urged to resist the temptation to edit recommendations on the floor.

## Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

## Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

## General Rules of Debate and Voting

*(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)*

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and are called on in order.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place *before* each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to, and should, express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.

- Premature actions (e.g., amending motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question) can divert attention from the subject at hand, thus confusing and/or delaying Conference business.
- Voting is by show of hands.

## Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion (postponing discussion to a later time during the same Conference):

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Needs only a *simple majority* to pass.

## Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate. A motion to call the question:

- Must be made in order at the microphone.
- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds vote*.

## Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone.

- Only a *simple majority* is required.
- If the majority votes to reconsider, *full debate*, pro and con, is resumed. (Conference members are urged to limit discussion to *new* considerations of the question under debate.)
- No action may be reconsidered twice.

## Floor Actions

Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions, and:

- Must be made without comment.
- Must be submitted in writing by the maker to the Conference secretary.
- Will come up for deliberation after all Committee reports have been heard.
- Require a *two-thirds majority*.

When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action. A motion to decline to hear a floor action:

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds majority*.


