**OFFICER REPORTS**

**Secretary: Lori P.** – Motions from the July Assembly were emailed to the Web Master for posting on the NFAC site on 7/13/17. 232 printed copies in stuffed envelopes were delivered to the Registrar for mailing on August 9th. The email file copy of the minutes was delivered as well. Advisory Actions have been updated and are currently posted under the password protected area of our website along with Minutes. The Service Coordinator printer was again made available for our trusted servants to use for printing of Workshop Reports and business of the Area. A correction to the January 2017 Minutes was brought to my attention this past week. In a motion coming from Finance the supporting detail account number distribution information was inadvertently missed in the Minutes. I will make the correction to January's Minutes and the corrected Minutes will be posted on the website. No additional corrections were brought. Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, seconded and passed.

**Treasurer: Terri-Lynn S.** – Good morning - my name is Terri-Lynn, and I am grateful for the privilege of serving as your Panel 67 Treasurer here in Area 14. Will the Host District please pass the baskets. Thank you for your attention in using the correct address for contributions. I am now receiving the expected amount of contributions at Panel 67’s P.O. Box address. An address reminder is on the registration table if you need a copy. I’d like to thank the Officers and Service Coordinators who promptly responded to taking inventory of all equipment and software in their possession for 2017. The last inventory was conducted in 2013. We now have a current inventory of all items. I have also been working on updating the NFAC Treasurer’s Manual. I have added 12 pages to the manual, and I have asked Paige, Alt. Finance Chair and Michael, Past Delegate/ NFAC Treasurer to review the updated document for ease of use and accuracy. Each position should pass on as much information as they can to help the next person be successful in that position.

Yesterday, in the Finance Committee meeting: we entertained a motion to approve the 2018 Budget. Paige will discuss all the details in her Finance Committee report.

Let’s now review our financial documents for the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter. Looking at the Balance Sheet please note that we have \$24,525.43 in our General Fund. Turning the page, you will find the Income and Expenses Budget vs Actual which contain the three 2017 Budget line item increases from the July Assembly (Delegate, Archives, and Treatment). This page is available in the password protected area in the minutes. After page 4 is the Contribution’s Summary totaling \$45,466.31. Finally, on the last page is the Prudent Reserve and

Financial Summary. Are there any questions? Motion to accept Treasurer's Report subject to audit was received with second. Passed.

We would like to thank Ruth and her committee for an amazing state convention back in July. You made our whole team feel warm and welcomed. You helped us set up our Registration table in a high traffic area which really paid off. We ended up with approximately 450 Registrations which certainly exceeded all of our expectations. We had 21 attendees at our workshop; representing 13 Districts, 12 of which participants were Intergroup Representatives, Chairs or Office Managers of Central Offices. At yesterday’s workshop titled, “Intergroup Takes Its Own Inventory”, participants were broken into groups to discuss and share their experiences on key points from the A.A. Guidelines for Central or Intergroup Offices, followed by an open discussion and Questions and Answers period amongst all attendees. Handouts included: 1. A.A. Guidelines, 2. How Does Intergroup Work with Special Needs to Facilitate the Alcoholic, 3. Questionnaire for Future Topics and Participation in Area 14 Intergroup Workshops. **Grapevine/La Vina: Deb B.** – Good morning. My name is Deb B. and I am an alcoholic. I’m giving a huge shout out to District 15 for an outstanding job hosting the Grapevine and La Viña Bookstore and Raffle. They dressed in purple shirts, gave beads if you bought a raffle ticket, and they even decorated the fichus tree!!! We collected \$112, including sales tax, in the bookstore \$28 for a paid Grapevine Subscription, and \$543 in raffle tickets, and they even made a cash sale for a print subscription, which is a first for this year! They collected a total of \$683 and the money collected helps to maintain a sufficient and diverse inventory on hand. Last night, we had the pleasure of giving away 18 *Grapevine* subscriptions – a new record, congratulations to all of the winners and thanks to everyone for your support. I had the privilege of presenting a workshop on Grapevine and La Viña history to District 28 last weekend. We had a decent turn out, in spite of the hurricane rearranging schedules and we ate the best donuts! Thank you to all who participated in the GVR/RLV workshop. It was a small crowd because we were scheduled at the same time as the big book auction discussion. However, it was a very lively crowd and District 19 invited me to do a workshop soon! We talked about how to become the best GVR and we incorporated a discussion of the [aagrapevine.org](http://aagrapevine.org) website. Currently we are seeing an uptick in the amount of materials that you would like to purchase in the bookstore. **Literature: Marcela W.** - We reviewed the Literature Catalog and the process of how literature is edited, designed and published by AAWS. Then we turned our focus to a discussion, which started last assembly, to an expressed need to publish literature on: “Agnostics and Atheists members in AA”. Specifically, the pamphlet “The God Word”, which is published by the UK General Service Office. This pamphlet is not available for purchase in the USA. As well as important deadlines. After discussion we took a sense of the room and by substantial unanimity, attendees agreed on the need to have such literature available. I want to thank my alternate, Daryl S. for taking notes and conducting the Workshop in July. We ended with a literature give away; there were 47 in attendance. Please join us in January for updates. **Public Information: Clark M.** – 30 in attendance. The workshop started with a brief review of topics covered in the past three Assemblies. This was helpful as we had a number of first time attendees. We had joint PI/CPC workshops this past quarter in Tallahassee and New Smyrna Beach. Richard S. from District 5 and Lisa B. from District 20 discussed what was involved in putting on the workshops, which was helpful to the other attendees who are considering hosting PI/CPC workshops next year. Past Delegate Glenn W. shared

his experience serving on the PI committee at the General Service Conference. He brought us up to speed on the status of PI and social media. He also shared his thoughts on the mission of PI, that perhaps it could include internal sharing of information in addition to just being utilized for external dissemination of information. We concluded with a presentation by Christopher G., PI coordinator from the Jacksonville area. Christopher created a power point presentation for use at PI/CPC events. The power point incorporates information directly from GSO and puts it into a very easy to follow overview of PI and CPC for the public to view. He has used this at several events and would like to share it with anyone that would like a copy. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

**Treatment: Marty C.** - Hello family. We had 22 A.A.s in attendance. We had a very enthusiastic workshop and discussion. We talked about our conference calls which continue to take place the first Sunday of each month. We discussed a request from the GSO for experience, strength and hope on Bridging the Gap with members of the Armed Services. They requested letters from Veterans who had a Bridge built for them and/or letter from BTG Volunteers who provided Bridges for Veterans. We have committed the first year of Panel 67 to locating all the Inpatient and Outpatient Treatment Facilities, Halfway Houses and Detox Centers in Area 14, getting the BTG Forms (fillable format) on our Area 14 Website and now approaching and getting out to these facilities to make personal contact. In our workshop yesterday we presented four possible scenarios we may come across while contacting Treatment Facilities. There was great participation and many questions answered. Out Alt. Area 14 Treatment Service Coordinator, Peter C. and I have worked closely this past year and covered a lot of ground. Peter and I plan on getting together in the next few weeks and put a plan together for our second year of Panel 67. We will be focusing on contacting and getting BTG Programs established in Treatment Facilities Area wide. I attended the National Bridging the Gap Workshop weekend in Minneapolis in August. There were A.A.s from all over the U.S. and Canada. The keynote speakers were great!!! We heard from Patrick C. – GSO Staff – Treatment Desk. Al Updike – Hazelden Outpatient Manager and Judge Kelly Meyer – Hennepin (Minneapolis) County Dist. Court/DUI Court. They were very passionate about BTG and extremely informative. I was overwhelmed with the technology!!! There is an encrypted digital library on the bthww.org website for the entire U.S. and Canada that I was given the User ID and Password to. So if someone in treatment out of state and coming to Area 14 upon discharge, I can send that info to the appropriate Area. I had an unexpected surprise and was asked to present our experience of getting our fillable forms on our website. It was well received and discussed and there were many questions. About two weeks after I got home, I received a call from the GSO and was interviewed for an article in Box 459 on BTG that will be in the next issue. I'm looking forward to service the districts, groups and members of the NFAC another year. In loving service, Marty C.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

**Finance Committee: Greg N.** – Reporting: Paige B., Alternate Chair. The Alternate Finance Chair opened the Finance Committee meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. There were fourteen in attendance including, the Alternate Finance Chair, the Area 14 Treasurer, seven members of the Finance Committee and five visitors. A total of nine voting members were present creating a quorum. A motion to reallocate funds within the 2017 Budget was presented. The motion was passed unanimously. A motion to correct a line item error in the 2018 Budget was presented. The motion was passed unanimously. A motion to increase the 2017 Archives Budget by \$180.00 was submitted and after much discussion was approved unanimously. A motion to increase the 2018 Archives Budget to cover additional expenses was made and seconded for discussion. After a significant amount of discussion, the Alternate Chair suggested it was the responsibility of the Archives Service Coordinator to reevaluate anticipated expenses with the support of the Alternate Archives Service Coordinator and submit a request to amend the Archives Budget in January 2018. A motion to end the Seventh Tradition Collection at the Sunday business meeting at quarterly

assemblies was presented and seconded for discussion. After much discussion the motion was voted on and failed to pass. A motion to offer a Saturday buffet luncheon at no cost to members attending the quarterly assemblies was presented and seconded for discussion. Following discussion and a general consensus, the Chair recommended the motion be either referred to the Site and Agenda Committee or submitted to the body in the form of a floor action. A motion to approve the 2018 Budget, as published in the July 2017 minutes, will be presented to the body at the Sunday business meeting. A motion to approve the creation of line item 6740, Drop Box Subscription, in the amount of \$100.00 in the 2018 Budget will be presented to the body at the Sunday Business meeting.

**Growth Committee: Heather V.-W.** – Reporting: Lon L., Alternate Chair

Meeting began with roll-call of the seven Districts assigned to Growth. 6 of the 7 DCMs or their Alternate(s) assigned to this committee were present which established a quorum along with 16 interested members. The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer followed by a moment of silence for one of our trusted servants Gavin M. DCM District 25, his presence will be sorely missed. With an eye always on the future of the NFAC, this Committee monitors and helps manage growth to keep the NFAC as inclusive as possible. The Growth Committee's current Map project was tabled to address the motion assigned to Growth regarding the revised edition of Structures and Guidelines. Growth reviewed the Housekeeping and Advisory Action changes for the Structures and Guidelines. Growth did not complete but only assigned DCMs to the Growth Administrative Committee agreed to work together through e-mails, phone calls and possible meetings over the next 3 months and to have the revised Structures and Guidelines document completed by the January Assembly. Growth voted on a motion to be brought to the floor at Sunday morning business meeting.

We then looked at the responsibilities of the Host Districts. We closed with looking at the process for changing how the Agenda is done. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

**Website: Steven N.** – Rick D. Reporting. Meeting started at 2:45PM and ended 4:15PM. Five out of eight Committee DCM's were present and seventeen visitors. DCM's present were David H. District 7B, Evan S. District 12, Pati C., District 14, Richard F. District 22, Diane S. District 24. We opened looking at the NFAC Website for the past quarter beginning July and ending October 20, 2017. During the past three months there were 27,093 visits by 21,778 users who looked at 1.45 page views per visit. The top ten viewed pages were Spanish Steps, Traditions and Responsibility Statement. Activities, Assembly Agenda, English Welcome, Meeting Information, Documents, Rule 62, Delegates Corner, News and Services 68% were on mobile phones, 29.7% on desktop and 3.5% on tablets. We read and discussed the NFAC Website Guidelines. We noted a few things to look over and change or implement. They were, putting some place on the home page for a new person to navigate the site easier (AA Preamble, links for meetings in their area), (If you need help call). Password Protected area under Area Inventories add October 2017. Under General Service Office, note from Phyllis on contributions General Service Office, Past Delegate reports. Should we change to a more mobile website? Should revision dates be placed on Website Guidelines? How long before Archiving? Question about putting Past Delegate information under Password Protected Area. Does the Website Committee pick the Web Master or only the Website Chairperson? (The Chair appoints the Website Committee and the Website Committee appoints the Webmaster (Under Composition: The Website Committee: one appointed Web Chair, one appointed Past Delegate, one appointed Public Information Service Coordinator and three appointed DCM's). # How the Conference Operates

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on an informal basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

## Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

## Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the “Committee system.” This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Members are encouraged to trust the process. Each Committee has considered carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are asked to refrain from spontaneously amending the work of the Committee; there are no “friendly” amendments under Robert’s Rules.

## Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase “two-thirds majority” is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

## Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving “minority opinions” for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

## General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and address their comments to the chair.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.

- Our experience is that premature actions such as amending motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question can divert attention from the subject at hand, confusing and/or delaying Conference business.
- Voting is by show of hands unless the Conference decides otherwise.

## Motions Made During Conference

When making a motion, come to the microphone and address the chair. There are various types of motions we use to help reach an informed group conscience. The specific rules governing each are on the next page.

## Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion postpones discussion to a later time during the same Conference.

## Motion to Recommit

The motion to recommit returns a motion or proposal to the respective trustees’ committee for further consideration. A motion to recommit must be seconded, is debatable and can be amended.

## Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate.

## Reconsideration


A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone. If the majority votes to reconsider, full debate, pro and cons, is resumed.

## Floor Actions

Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions. When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action.

## Declining to Consider a Floor Action

A motion to decline to consider a floor action is made without comment.
