Area Chair: Heather V-W. - Opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Let the record show that the Assembly was brought to order at 9:00am on Sunday, October 11, 2015.

Registrar: Richard C. - Roll call was taken, each District was called for attendance DCMs, Alternate DCMs, GSRs, Alternate GSRs, Panel 65 Officers, Service Coordinators, Administrative Chairs and Visitors.

OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Annette D. – Motions were placed on the website timely. Minutes were delivered to Registrar mailed before the deadline of 30 days prior to this Assembly. I have only one change. Melanie E. Chaired the Website meeting due William F.’s absence. Are there any other changes to the minutes not already reported? Thank you for the opportunity to serve. Chair entertained a motion to accept the minutes, motion made, seconded and passed.

Treasurer: Kay M. - Good morning. My name is Kay and I am privileged to serve as your Treasurer. Financial Statements are on your tables. They show that we are in a very healthy position. We have \$7000 over our Prudent Reserve. Contributions are 3% over budget. I had a surprise last week when I deposited the checks sent in by your Groups. Usually the biggest single weekly deposit we have is early in January because that’s when we get contributions from those Groups who make one contribution a year. The deposit made now was bigger than that big one in January. Thank you, your Groups, and your Districts for your generosity. But it’s not just the money coming in that is putting us over our Prudent Reserve. Expenses are almost 18% *under* what was projected –and those expenses include your decision for 100% funding when we set the Delegate to New York earlier this year. The Panel members – the ones who put on workshops, who go to conferences and Conventions, those who make these Assemblies’ run smoothly, and see that you get your Minutes – these trusted servants are being prudent and careful with expenses incurred. The 990 tax return has been filed. This is the last Assembly of 2015 and later we will be voting on the Budget for next year. The semi-annual Sales Tax return will be filed and the Grapevine inventory will be completed to adjust the inventory in the books. Please remove all financial papers from the tables when leaving. Thank you again for your generosity; it is a privilege to serve.

Delegate: Glenn W. – Absent. Report given by Joyce C. Good Morning, my name is Joyce C. I have been acting Delegate this weekend and I’d like to thank you for not being too tough on me! I would like to begin this morning by welcoming back our Past Delegates at the back table here: Dan E., Panel 45; Tom G., Panel 51; Corliss G., Panel 53; Michael S., Panel 55; Marilyn B., Panel 63 and our guest Graham G. Area 15, Panel 65. This is Glenn’s report. I am sorry to have missed you all this weekend and hope your experience here was fruitful. As you know by now our Final Conference Reports are finally here and hope you take these back to your Groups along with the explanation that this is truly your annual report on how well your organization is doing for you. In the news from A.A. beyond the Area, as of the beginning of October, Greg T. is now the General Manager of GSO succeeding Phyllis H. whom has retired. The staff positions at GSO have also recently rotated and I’m sure the staff is currently getting settled into their new responsibilities and a new boss. Also from A.A.W.S., for the first 6 months of this year, contributions and book sales are below anticipated budget and while actual expenses have also been running lower, they are still below budget. This reminded me that as I celebrated my 30th A.A. Anniversary in August, I forgot to take the 2 minutes to go online at aa.org and contribute my \$30 towards the “birthday plan”. On a personal note, upon returning from our July Assembly I received word that my younger brother was hospitalized with a brain tumor and terminal cancer. While this prognoses has emotionally devastated me, you all, my A.A. family and this program has taught me what to do. In addition to numerous flights to Baltimore to support my family through surgery, the beginning of treatments, and more, I have had to re-arrange my schedule. Some of the out-of-state functions such as the Southeast Regional Conference and the upcoming SASSA I

have asked Joyce to please represent on my behalf. This frees up time to serve you all locally, which I very much welcome and look forward to. Currently, I am scheduled for Conference Reports here in Gainesville in 2 weeks, In Orlando in November, and tentatively working out dates in Jacksonville and Tallahassee. Corrections Service Coordinator for facilitating the DCM Mini Workshop and James C. with FCYPA.A. for providing volunteers for various assigned duties this weekend. I would like to sincerely thank our Area 15 Host Graham G. Delegate and Shirley P. Chairperson for conducting our Inventory. We are truly grateful to the both for assisting us with our inventory and welcome a chance to return the favor! Please remember to copy our Spanish Translator on reports and motions before they are said at the microphone. Area 14 North Florida Area Conference has taken our inventory this October, thank you to all of you who have participated. Our Parliamentarian continued to expand the inventory with your feedback from the meeting which will be posted in the October minutes. I currently serve as your program Chair for the 60th Florida State Convention, which will be held 8/3-7/2016 at the Innisbrook Resort in the Tampa Bay Area. First, thank you all for your hospitality this weekend. You made me feel real comfortable. Thank you to the people who registered. Your Committee has been working hard to bring you a special Convention to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Florida State Convention. We have an awesome line-up of speakers from all across the country. We have quite a few special workshops including “Women Behind the Men in A.A.”, “Fourth Step Inventory”, “Emotional Sobriety” and a GSO speaker on A.A. and General Service. We also have big events happening every night. We’ll have a professional comedian, the play “Charlie and the Newcomer”, a 60’s themed dance and late night D.J. dancing. There will be golf, a 5K walk/run, volleyball, tennis, yoga and morning and evening meditation. Please check out our website at 60flstateConvention.com. 59th Florida State Convention Report: - Annette D. – My name is Annette and I am an alcoholic. It has been my privilege to serve as Chair of the 59th Florida State Convention held in Orlando in August. I had the opportunity to watch a miracle happen. We had attained our room block pretty easily. When I became Chair in May, we had \$5,000 in the bank. On Wednesday when the Convention started, we had just paid the hotel \$22,000, had \$1,700 in the bank and would owe another \$22,000 on Sunday. From Wednesday to Saturday night – we took in over \$26,000. We had over 600 walk-ins. On Wednesday, we 939 registrations and on Saturday night we announced 1589 at the banquet. We sold 900 banquets, we had been budgeted for 1,000. The 59th Florida State Convention was a success, both spiritually and financially. Our bills will be paid. And after distributions to the Joint Advisory Committee and sales tax, we expect to have a small disbursement to pass on. Thank you, if you announced the Convention, registered, served as a greeter, were any part of our experience, I send you our heartfelt thanks. For me personally, I am grateful to have been given such a wonderful opportunity to give back to A.A.. Thank you for the privilege to serve.

NFAC Florida State Convention Oversight Committee: Joyce C. – There were 25 plus members in attendance. The meeting was opened by Joyce C., Chair. Thanks to Alt. Chair, Melanie E. for taking notes. A brief explanation was given regarding the purpose and responsibilities of the oversight committee for any new attendees. Also, the structure and composition of the Joint Advisory Committee was explained as being composed of both North & South Florida Alt. Delegates, Appointed Area Representatives, past, current and next Florida State Convention Chairs and Treasurers. Annette D., Chair of the 59th Florida State Convention, Orlando reported that her involvement, which began in May, was a success! I’ll let her fill you in on the rest with her report. Ruth R. gave an update on the status of the 61st Florida State Convention in Jacksonville which was awarded the bid for 2017. She introduced her Treasurer Walter and Co-Chair Evonne. I’m sure there will be lots of opportunities for service when the Convention comes back to North Florida. Annette brought a recommendation to our committee for discussion. After great participation, lots of history and experience shared, the next step was to take the recommendation to the Growth Committee. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to serve.

SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORTS

Accessibilities: September Grace W. – Eleven people in attendance. Opened on time with the Serenity Prayer. Discussion about Service Manual audio. Many people have used audio books currently available from GSO to learn to read the Big Book and the Twelve and Twelve. There is a need for an audio version of our Service Manual, there exists the same reasons for an audio book of the Service Manual as there is for the Big Book and the Twelve and Twelve. Unanimous vote for the motion to produce an audio version of the Service Manual. Topic brought up about producing a Group inventory list to consider if the meeting places are accessible to wheelchair using members. Also discussion about other issues on psychiatric problems other than alcoholism. Thanks to Eric B., Alt Service Coordinator for taking minutes. And a special welcome to our newest Access. Chair, Amanda for D-28.

Archives: Kevin G. – My name is Kevin Jr. I am a grateful alcoholic who has the honor and privilege to serve as your Archives Service Coordinator for Area 14 Panel 65. First I want to recognize Bill B, District 14, for his great job as our Archives Co- Service Coordinator. **1)** During lunch yesterday 23 members the fellowship joined us for a very inspiring movie: “Bill’s Own Story” where Bill W. himself told his story and how Alcoholics Anonymous was formed with his wife Lois. Everyone knows his story from the Big Book but for those of us who have never seen or heard him this was a great opportunity to hear the story from the man himself. After the movie we opened our meeting with the serenity prayer and introductions. **2)** We discussed the beginning of A.A. in Florida in January 1941 when two drunks met and three of their friends met at a boarding house in Jacksonville. Junius C. was a Navy Commander at NAS Jacksonville and alcoholic, who had just gotten sober in California and returned to active duty after retiring early because of his alcoholism. Tom S. was a Jacksonville salesman and alcoholic who was referred to Junius by the Station Doctor at the urging of Junius’ wife who knew that Junius needed to work with another alcoholic in order to stay sober. Tom S. went on to be the first Delegate from the State of Florida to the General Service Conference in 1952. **3)** We discussed purchasing 75th Anniversary pins to mark this great event in our A.A. history for distribution to members of the fellowship at our January Assembly. **4)** We discussed the importance of signing up early for this great workshop spiritually sponsored by our Area and Area 15 at the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Winter Park, Florida. Copies of the flyer are on every table. We will have great speakers, including Gail L., the former Akron Archivist who will focus on building strong District and Intergroup Archive Committees. We urge everyone to send your registration fee of \$15 to Karla Kruger this month so we can properly fund the room rental, food and refreshments for this great workshop. Any excess funds will be divided in two and donated to Area 14 and 15. **5)** Scott gave a fantastic pictorial presentation of his trip to the National Archives Workshop in Independence, Ohio and tour of many historical locations in Akron, Ohio, the birthplace of A.A. Steve R., our former Area 14 Archivist, also discussed his experience moderating and presenting an A.A. traditions session at the workshop. **6)** In January, our main speaker will be from District 14 on the History of A.A. in Gainesville. In April Ben W., who was to be our speaker this weekend but was in the hospital, will share his experience being one of the first members to bring A.A. to the State Prison in Starke in the early 1960s. **7)** We discussed the four Group histories and room pictures provided by District 27 who will email their Group photos to the Grapevine to include in future editions. **8)** Scott B. discussed his plan to digitize the Area 14 Archives inventory so it is accessible to the membership on our website. We ended our meeting with a commitment to register EARLY for the upcoming Florida Archives Workshop at Winter Haven followed by the serenity prayer. This concludes my report. Thank you all for the opportunity to serve.

Archivist: Scott B. – I am so grateful to be serving the North Florida Area as your Archivist. First I would like to personally thank: Archives Service Coordinator Kevin G., Grapevine Coordinator Yvonne N., District 31 DCM Tom M., Past Delegates Cecilia R. & Dick G. for contributing to the North Florida Area Archives. From the amount and type of materials coming in it looks as though our fellowship has been getting enthusiastic about our Archives in general. If you wish to peruse these items in detail I will attach the complete list with this report as it is too long to express now. We have been quite busy since July with Archive website, 2015 Fl. State Convention and the National Archives Workshop in Ohio. We had hoped that we would be able to have something physical we could show concerning the creation of North Florida Area Archive website. Due to technical problems, personnel moving and ongoing digitization we are continuing to move forward, still hopeful we can present something the following year. If anyone of our fellowship out there is interested in this project, please contact me. We certainly look forward to your participation and impact. The North Florida Area was asked to set up Archives for the State Convention, and this was a huge success! We had a room complete with 4 complete Archive displays; Area 14 travelling road show, Central Florida Intergroup, District 31 and some of my personal collection. All told we had a little bit of everything from Temperance, prohibition, Oxford

Group, Clarence Snyder, early Akron A.A. and local Florida history! This was a huge success, with even a couple of members sitting down in the display room to do local Florida research. We also had an Archive Theatre room where we showed A.A. history films, including Clarence Snyder's last film recorded in Leesburg in 1983 accompanied by Clarence's Big Book & Twelve and Twelve in the display room. So grateful to have had the opportunity to interact with so many of our fellowship; some of whom had never been exposed to A.A.'s history & Archives. I found this to be inspirational & humbling. What an amazing opportunity to be able to attend the 19th Annual National A.A. Archives Workshop in Independence Ohio. I was moved, humbled and awed by the vast knowledge & experience at this event. We had a wealth of knowledge concerning the history & preservation of A.A. in its birthplace there in Akron, along with an all day Archivist tour of Akron A.A., consisting of Akron Intergroup, St. Thomas Hospital & Sister Ignatia, Dr. Bob's home & gravesite. In addition, we visited the Seiberling gatehouse, Stan Hywet gardens and Tudor House estate. We also brought back for North Florida Archives a complete CD set of National A.A. Archives Workshops, loads of photos from tours (over 300), 50 years A.A.'s Cleveland Central bulletin (containing a searchable file), Akron DVD tour that includes an interview with Sue Windows, Dr. Bob's adopted daughter from 26 years ago, and a Collective Vision of "Archives in A.A." from the recent International Convention. Cooperation with Intergroup: Linda G. – We started the meeting with the serenity prayer. We discussed the seminar that I attended for Intergroup in Ft. Lauderdale. The Seminar was wonderful and I learned a lot. Thank you for allowing me to go. There were great ideas about putting Big Books in High Schools and colleges in their libraries. There were ideas on events instead of saying (raffles). They ranged from tickets to give away a 60" TV, gas cards, restaurants, Starbucks, baskets, movie cards, pasta feast, chili-cook off, tax-free day at Intergroup. We learned a great slogan: Q=Quit, T-Taking, I=It, P=Personally. St. Louis does not have any committees. They pass everything over to the committees at their Area to handle. Some guests were: **1)** Chet P. – A.A.W.S. – Chair & Southeast Trustee; **2)** Greg T. A.A. – Publishing Director; **3)** Andrea B. A.A.W.S. – Order Entry Manager; and **4)** Racy J. – A.A.W.S. – GSO Staff Intergroup / Central Office Liaison. They mentioned that the General Service Office is going through renovations right now and they will not be done until November. So be patient and they are not doing tours right now. They did an Ask-A-Basket. Here are a few of the questions: **1)** When will the Big Book be printed in Somalia? When they find a translator. **2)** What kind of things affect A.A. as a whole. Not sure, but if a newcomer comes in the room – Are you representing A.A.? **3)** Are we getting Directories? They are not sending them out. You need to call to get them. Melanie and Carl shared their experience there. We talked about making your Intergroup a 501(c)3, how to lower prices to pay for operating expenses, and learned there are two ways to enter a room: "Here I am" and "There you are". Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Cooperation W/Professional Community: Marty C. – Our workshop yesterday was well attended and received. We had 25 A.A.s in attendance. The workshop was interactive and consisted of 4 parts. First, we started off with a true or false quiz for an icebreaker. Second, we presented information from the CPC Workbook and Service Manual on the importance of the Traditions when doing CPC Service Work. We focused on Traditions 1, 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, & 12. Third, we split into 2 Groups and discussed 2 questions dealing with specific scenarios involving the traditions in CPC Service Work. Lastly, we came back together and had a sharing period on the questions we discussed. Several A.A.s in attendance had their questions answered, received some good information to take back and share with their Districts and Groups and came away learning something new. Donna W. (PI Service Coordinator) and I will be blanketing Area 14 with a CPC/PI Workshop. We will be covering both the CPC and PI Workbooks. The intention of the workshops is to help the Districts of Area 14 start and/or improve CPC/PI in their Districts. We are in the process of developing a skit to aide us in these workshops with the help of our Alt. Service Coordinators Lucia D. and Andres R. The first workshop will be hosted by the Northeast Florida Intergroup in Jacksonville on Saturday November 14th from noon-4PM. There will be a potluck lunch served. It will include Districts 1, 3, 4, 6, 24, 25 and 30. The second workshop will be hosted by District 20 in New Smyrna Beach December 5th from noon-4PM. The Lunch will be served there as well. Districts 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 18, 19, 21, 22 and 32 have been invited. We are in the beginning stages of planning a third in District 7 for the spring. Bring your fellow home Group members, bring your sponsees. Everyone is welcomed!!! I was very moved yesterday at our Area Inventory by Carlos and the DCM from District 33. Donna and I both spoke with Carlos and invitations will be extended to District 33 members throughout Area 14 to be a part of and participate in all of these workshops. Since our last Assembly in July, I attended the County Judges of Florida Conference at the JW Marriott in Orlando. I'm sad to say that we were not that well received. Out of 200 judges in attendance, we only had about 30 visit our table. Next year's event is in Jacksonville at the Sawgrass Marriott. The registration for this event is \$500 that we split with Area 15. I spoke with my predecessor, Linda G., and she said she attended when it was held in Jacksonville a couple of years ago and that she was very well received. With that said, I'll leave it up to this body whether to give it one shot next year or not. I will not be attending the January Assembly. I will be recovering from hip replacement surgery. In my place, the Alt. CPC Service

Coordinator, Andres R. will be in attendance. I will be working closely with him leading up to the Assembly and will be in contact with him via cell phone and email during the Assembly. In loving service, Marty C.

Corrections: Richard H. – Report given by Bob C. Opened the meeting at 10:05 A.M. There were 20 people in attendance. First would like to give thanks to District 1 and District 12 for donating money to get literature to inmates in FSP main unit. The theme of this Assembly's workshop is communication. Rich H. has been trying to get in touch with all of the corrections committees and DCMs so when something needs to be done or news that needs to get out is communicated throughout the Area. This primarily is needed to arrange for inmates being released so they can be met and taken to a meeting. One suggestion was to get in touch with Areas' Intergroups might be a better way to communicate with the Correction Committees. Bob C. asked the attendees to go back to their Districts and Groups corrections people and ask them to get in touch with the Corrections Service Coordinator. A discussion took place about a list being developed of the State prisons and County prison point of contacts. The point of discussion took place about getting requirements of County jails to bring meetings into their facility. Closed the meeting at 11:00 A.M.

Grapevine/La Vina: Yvonne N. – Good morning. My name is Yvonne and I am an alcoholic. Thank you for allowing me to serve as the North Florida Area 14 Grapevine/La Vina Service Coordinator for Panel 65. Thank you District 11 for hosting the Grapevine/La Vina room yesterday and a big "thank you" also to all who pitched in to help. We had book sales of \$317.80 including sales tax and \$366 in raffle tickets for a total collection of \$683.80. Last night we gave away 15 Subscriptions, 5 CDs of the Archive Movie, the book "Forming True Partnerships", and 3 Grapevines. Thanks to all of the visitors to the Grapevine room and all who supported our activities. The focus of Saturday's workshop was how Grapevine and Corrections work together to carry the message to fellow alcoholics behind the walls. We had 18 members representing 10 Districts in attendance. Thank you to Richard H., our Corrections Service Coordinator, who spoke about the needs of corrections, for stressing the importance of each of us personally having corrections commitments and explaining how Grapevine resources are an important tool to use to carry the message because in-person meetings are not frequent enough or always available when someone really needs the help. We talked about different and creative ways to use Grapevine/La Vina resources to carry the message. At the Area level, we will start with a "Grapes-for-Mates" plastic bin at the bookstore for members to donate new or used Grapevine/La Vina literature to go to Corrections. We also recorded several members sharing their experience, strength and hope with corrections stories that will be submitted to the Grapevine Audio Project. Since the last Assembly, I processed two gift subscriptions for two inmates, facilitated a service workshop with District 22 and attended the Corrections Workshop in Sanford. I will have an information table at the District 19 workshop on Anonymity, have accepted an invitation by District 33 a presentar en el Group o hispano, and wil l be facilitating a "Record You Story" workshop for District 10 in January. Thank you again for this opportunity to serve.

Literature: Lori P. – 32 in attendance, Meriem took notes. Opening our Literature Workshop, we discussed the call for sharing for new and revised A.A. Conference-Approved literature being requested by the Trustees' Literature Committee. Sharing from the membership should include experience from members with mental health issues and those who sponsor such members. Submittals should be between 500-800 words and submitted to literature@aa.org no later than October 15, 2015. A call for stories has also been requested for the pamphlets "A.A. for Women" and "A.A. for the Gay and Lesbian Alcoholic". Similarly, these should be 500-800 words and submitted to literature@aa.org. During the working portion of our workshop, we broke into 4 Groups. Each Group focused on a pamphlet and brainstormed on how the pamphlets could be used as a basis for a Literature Workshop. The 4 pamphlets were: "A.A. for Women", "Many Paths to Spirituality", "Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix" and "A message to Teenagers". Following, each Group's spokesperson shared the Group's ideas with the workshop Group. A summary of these ideas will also be sent to workshop participants by email. Our hope is that this exercise will serve to provide ideas for District Literature Workshops. Wrapping up, we ran out of time before having the opportunity to experiment with the "Build a Board" literature Board made by our Alternate Literature Service Coordinator so we will bring this back in January. Thank you to everyone participating in the workshop and thank you for the opportunity to serve.

Public Information: Donna W. – Good morning, everyone, I am an alcoholic and a member of the Free to Be Group here in District 14. My name is Donna W. and I have the privilege of serving as your Area 14 Public Information Service Coordinator. Once again, Area 14 Cooperation with the Professional Community service coordinator Marty C. and I collaborated to present complimentary workshops, with this Assembly's topic

aimed at exploring how A.A. Traditions guide us in Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community service work. In our Public Information workshop, which attracted 38 participants, we looked primarily at Traditions Six, Eight, Eleven and Twelve. Following my presentation, one of two break-out Groups discussed how our principle of non-affiliation can be employed when we speak at non-A.A. events such as health fairs, while the other discussed possible actions we can take in the event of an anonymity break by a member of the media. A lively discussion ensued when the two Groups shared their findings with each other. Full transcripts of the presentation were made available and electronic versions will be emailed to workshop participants so they can share the information with their home Group or Public Information committee members. Special thanks to David A. from District 14 for taking notes and to Nanette L. from District 1 for sign-in assistance. As Marty mentioned in his report, we're moving forward on our plans to bring Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community workshops directly to Districts in the North Florida Area, despite receiving responses from our offer to do so from only 14 of the Area's 32 DCMs. We know from the comments we hear at Area Assemblies that the need for these workshops exists, and that the need is great. One of our workshop participants yesterday shared with me that he's recently come into possession of "the box" – a collection of A.A. literature meant for use in Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community work that's been passed around to a number of members of his District, each of whom has returned it to the DCM because he or she has been unsuccessful in launching a PI/CPC committee. I challenged this individual to stop the cycle of "passing the box" by establishing a committee and learning how to use that literature to carry the A.A. message to Professionals and the general public. My pledge to him was that the Area PI/CPC Service Coordinators will be there to assist him, a pledge I extend to anyone interested in either launching or nurturing PI/CPC service work in their Districts. Marty mentioned this in his report, but I would like to repeat it: We're bringing our experience, strength and hope, which we've begun referring to as our road show, to the Jacksonville Area Saturday, November 14, to serve Districts 1, 3, 4, 6, 24, 25 and 30. We will be visiting the New Smyrna Beach Area Saturday, December 5, to serve Districts 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 18, 19, 21, 22 and 32. Our goal is to continue scheduling workshops throughout the North Florida Area in the coming months, and we deeply appreciate the cooperation of the DCMs who are working with us to make this possible. Finally, I would like to offer gratitude to Heather and the members of the ad hoc committee who are working on the Area 14 inventory. I look forward to reading the full report and plan to incorporate as many suggestions as possible into my continued efforts to serve as your Area 14 Public Information Service Coordinator. Thank you for allowing me this opportunity.

Treatment: Carson F. – 37 people attended. Opened with request for questions, concerns, issues. There being none we broke up into four small Groups. Each Group was provided with a variety of Treatment related A.A. pamphlets: 1) A.A. and the Woman; 2) Is A.A. for Me; 3) A.A. and Other Medications; 4) Young People in A.A.; 5) Problems Other Than Alcohol; and 6) several others. After each Group discussed what they had read, they shared with the other Groups what was learned from the literature. There was a lively and interesting discussion about inclusion rather than exclusion. Treatment programs, of necessity, treat alcoholics and addicts. How can the treatment committee best help all clients with recovery? The consensus was that we can offer experience, strength and hope to all substance abusers. Another point of discussion was medication and the alcoholic. Much sharing indicated that we are not medical people and should never advise anyone, especially in a treatment program, to not take their medication. Several people shared their experience with medications and solutions for the medication issue. This was an informative workshop on the A.A. approved literature for the Treatment Workshop. Respectfully submitted, Greg Norman, Alternate Finance Chair.

Growth Committee: Joyce C. – 34 in attendance. The meeting opened by Joyce C., Alt. Delegate, Growth Chair. Thanks to Lori P. for taking notes. As usual, we had a full plate at the growth committee meeting. We began as usual with the assigned task of an inventory of Structures and Guidelines. One assigned DCM took the proactive research to document all changes to Structures and Guidelines since they were voted on in October of 1993. After discussion, the Group voted to have this version of the Structures and Guidelines replace the current version on the website. This will be coming to the floor as a motion. Maps were distributed to Jacksonville and Daytona Districts for their approval. At this point, I am only missing 3 signatures. I will contact those DCMs and hope to see this project to completion at the next Assembly. A recommendation was brought forth changing the composition of the Florida State Convention Oversight Committee. After good lively discussion, the assigned DCMs voted to bring the motion to the body. This will be coming as a motion under new business. Dan E. was available to offer historical background. A recommendation came to us from Terry Lynn, Parliamentarian on “voting procedures” regarding non-election assemblies. This would be a change to Structures and Guidelines. The committee requested that the motion wording be refined and brought back to Growth in January 2016. The meeting closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

Site and Agenda: Kelly J. – Seven out of 9 DCMs were present with a total attendance of 14. Upcoming NFAC for 2016: January 8-10; April 8-10; July 8-10; September 30-October 2. Assembly was changed from March to April per our Delegate. In April, we will not have access to Bivens Lake South and North will use over flow parking across the street on Saturday Night and Sunday Morning. Next Assembly we have overflow hotel since hotel was sold out on Saturday Night and Sunday Morning. Will send bid packets to all members of committee. Discussed bids for 2019-2020 and how to improve hotel for future assemblies. Discussed adding host committee for greeters. Many outside the box ideas for future assemblies were discussed. Website dates will be changed. This week for April and October Assembly.

Website: William H. – Opened with Serenity Prayer. 14 attendees (5 of 7 voting members). Discussion included: Is the site working? What pages are visited most? Are we reaching new people? Is there a balance of attraction for new and old members? Continue to keep track of Google Analytics each month. Need to streamline the landing page. Send the example from Steve to webmaster. Group topics by pictures (Area Information/meeting, password protected Area, agenda / hotel information for assemblies, etc.) Balance old and new styles for easier use. Replace Area Map with updated map and District numbers. William read the Guidelines from website for the NFAC Area 14. Closed with the Responsibility Statement.

Summary of Conference Procedures

Generally speaking, the General Service Conference follows *Robert's Rules of Order*, and proceeds on as informal a basis as possible consistent with the rights of all concerned. It is important to remember that the purpose of rules of order is to make it easier for the Conference to conduct its business; rules exist to allow the Conference to do what it needs to do to carry out the will of the Fellowship by reaching an informed group conscience. Over the years the Conference has adopted some exceptions to *Robert's Rules*, which help it to proceed more closely in accord with the spirit of A.A. Tradition.

Conference Quorum

A Conference quorum — two-thirds of all registered members — is required to conduct Conference business.

Committee System

To the extent possible, important matters to come before the Conference will be handled via the "Committee system." This assures that a large number of questions can be dealt with during Conference week. Each Committee considers carefully the items before it and presents its recommendations to the Conference as a whole for acceptance or rejection. Recommendations of Conference committees are automatically motions that have been made and seconded. Members are urged to resist the temptation to edit recommendations on the floor.

Substantial Unanimity

All matters of policy (Conference Advisory Actions) require substantial unanimity, that is, a *two-thirds majority*. Any actions, including amendments, that affect an Advisory Action, or motions that might result in such an action, also require a *two-thirds majority*. Because the number of members present in the hall during the week of Conference varies from time to time, the phrase "two-thirds majority" is taken to mean two-thirds vote of the Conference members voting, as long as the total vote constitutes a Conference quorum.

Minority Opinion

After each vote on a matter of policy, the side which did not prevail will always be given an opportunity to speak to their position. If the motion passes with two-thirds vote, the minority may speak. If the motion receives a majority vote, but fails to pass for lack of a two-thirds vote, the majority may speak.

Remember that saving "minority opinions" for after the vote, when there is no rebuttal, is a time-waster, for it can force the Conference body to reconsider a question that might well have been decided the first time around if it had been thoroughly examined from all sides.

General Rules of Debate and Voting

(Agreed to at the beginning of each Conference)

- People who wish to speak line up at the microphones and are called on in order.
- Each person may speak for two (2) minutes.
- No one may speak for a second time on a topic until all who wish to have spoken for the first time.
- Full discussion of a recommendation should take place before each vote.
- Everyone is entitled to, and should, express his or her opinion. However, if your perspective has already been stated by someone else, it is not necessary to go to the mike and say it again.

- Premature actions (e.g., amending motions early in the discussion or hastily calling the question) can divert attention from the subject at hand, thus confusing and/or delaying Conference business.
- Voting is by show of hands.

Tabling a Motion

Tabling a motion (postponing discussion to a later time during the same Conference):

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Needs only a *simple majority* to pass.

Calling the Question

Calling the question brings debate to a halt while Conference members decide whether to proceed directly to a vote (the question) or go on with the debate. A motion to call the question:

- Must be made in order at the microphone.
- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second.
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds vote*.

Reconsideration

A motion to reconsider a vote may be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side, but it can be seconded by anyone.

- Only a *simple majority* is required.
- If the majority votes to reconsider, *full debate*, pro and con, is resumed. (Conference members are urged to limit discussion to *new* considerations of the question under debate.)
- No action may be reconsidered twice.

Floor Actions

Floor actions may be introduced at any time during the Conference except at the Sharing Sessions, and:

- Must be made without comment.
- Must be submitted in writing by the maker to the Conference secretary.
- Will come up for deliberation after all Committee reports have been heard.
- Require a *two-thirds majority*.

When a floor action is to be heard, its maker will be given two (2) minutes to state the rationale behind the action, after which the chair shall ask if there is a motion that the Conference decline to consider the floor action. A motion to decline to hear a floor action:

- Must be made without comment.
- Requires a second
- Is not debatable.
- Requires a *two-thirds majority*.
