OFFICER REPORTS

Secretary: Terri-Lynn S. – My name is Terri-Lynn S., and I am an alcoholic; my home group is the College Park Triangle group in District 10. It is my privilege to serve as your Secretary. I have updated Structures and Guidelines and the Advisory Actions with all motions passed up to the January 2020 Assembly. On January 13, 2020, I sent the January Motions to Alex, Webmaster, and he posted them to the website on the same day which is within 10 days of the January Assembly. On February 1, 2020, District 10 and Central Florida Intergroup hosted the “Service Manual Book Study” workshop. I helped by asking 6 speakers to present and by providing the PowerPoint for the workshop. The workshop was a success and the PowerPoint has been posted on the Area Website under “Area and A.A. news”, “Area 14 Officer Reports”, “Secretary”. On February 20, 2020, I emailed the Website and Printer-Copy versions of the minutes from the January Assembly to Alex and he posted the Website version the same day. On February 21, 2020, I mailed 235 envelopes containing the Printer-Copy version of the minutes to Carl for labeling and bulk mailing. As a member of the I.F.F. Crew, I was able to update/finalize the new Advisory Action excel sheet, create the matching PDF, create 6 short training videos, and 2 surveys. All of these documents have been posted to the password protected area under I.F.F. Project, I.F.F. Training Videos and I.F.F. Surveys. If you visit these documents, please fill out the surveys and send all feedback to nfac.adhoc@gmail.com. I also updated the Secretary’s Handbook with the following details: 1) how to add new passed motions to the Advisory Actions excel sheet and 2) how to create the matching PDF. The I.F.F. Crew continues to meet through GoTo Meeting to discuss and suggest further improvements, formats, and flows to the North Florida Area Conference documents. I hope everyone stays safe and COVID-19 free! I am hoping and praying that we will have an Assembly in July.

Treasurer: Deb B. – Good Morning, my name is Deb B., I’m an alcoholic. My home group is the Wesconnett Group in Jacksonville and it is my honor and privilege to serve as your Panel 69, Area 14 Treasurer. In keeping with our tradition of only accepting contributions from AA members and AA entities, it is important to include four things with your contribution: your group’s name; group’s number; district number; and your contact information. For some reason, I seem to be getting even more checks without any identifying information enclosed. However, most of you are doing this correctly, so thank you. We are still receiving contributions at the P.O. Box, albeit not quite as often during this pandemic. If your Group/District is unable to contribute at this time, please have procedures in place once we return to meeting in person to restart contributions to all AA service entities as soon as possible. GSO even put out a letter regarding the criticality of Seventh Tradition contribution at this time as their services have not stopped. Additionally, some of our entities may need to dip into their prudent reserves in order to get through this season and if there is any way I or your Finance Chair can help with guidance in these matters, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. It is important to note that our prudent reserves are meant for just this kind of scenario and that while we may dip into them that there will be time to build them back up in the future. I will bring more of the awesome finance related material such as the History of Self Support, Treasurer packets, and some really cool pamphlets for the flyer table next Assembly. If there is anything specific or a special quantity you would like from GSO, please reach out to me via email: treasurer@aanorthflorida.org. Thank you Thomas K. for inviting the Delegate and me to District 28 to partake in a valuable and informative workshop entitled “Where does your dollar go?” We talked about all the various levels in which your “dollar in the basket” helps to carry

the message. I would love to talk to your Districts too and I would be willing to do it virtually since most everyone in AA is now trained on some kind of online platform. Due to current circumstances, we had to postpone a workshop in District 13 and potentially a sharing session in District 24. The Area Committee does have a current subscription to GOTO Meeting which we could use to make workshops happen virtually. Now for the financial report, please refer to the financial papers at the end of this update. I moved \$17,000 from our Money Market Savings Account (MMA) to our checking account in anticipation of sending over \$8,000 to the General Service Board to cover the costs of our Delegate going to the General Service Conference and over \$6,000 to pay for our April Assembly. Since neither one of these has happened as of yet, you can see that we still have over \$25,000 in our checking account (line item 1050). A check for \$1,800 was sent to the General Service Board, but I am awaiting cost approximation if and when we have a virtual General Service Conference in 2020 in order to send the remainder of our cost share. Please turn to the last page. In the center box, you will see that our prudent reserve of \$89,713 is below our maximum prudent reserve. In the parentheses at the bottom left of that box, you can see that this amount is also above our minimum prudent reserve. Therefore, the fiscal state of the NFAC, Inc. is healthy. Finally, please refer to the top section; in the first column you can see that our total expenses (\$21,096) exceeded our total income (\$18,491) by more than \$2,500. This means that as soon as it is possible, it is a great time to invite your groups to fully participate in their general-service contributions so that we are able to continue to carry the message and provide the current level of services to our groups. Again, if the Finance Chair or I can assist you in disseminating this message to help increase contributions, please ask. Additionally, the final numbers for 2019 have been turned over to Dick G. for filing of our Corporate Tax Return, which is currently due in September of this year. Thank you for allowing me to serve, I look forward to seeing you in July. Until then I wish you peace and wellness.

Delegate: Annette D. – I hope this finds each of you doing well, whatever your individual struggles in our current situation might be. Check frequently at aa.org for updated information from the General Service Office regarding how our groups are keeping in touch. I trust that you are all staying safe and taking advantage of all the on-line meetings. It is giving me a great opportunity to visit around the Area without leaving home. I encourage everyone to work within the guidelines of our traditions and consider everyone's personal safety, as well as what is best for A.A. as a whole. As you gather in your zoom and other meetings, please remember to consider 7th tradition contributions. Your Intergroup, District, Area and the General Service Office will continue to have expenses, and your group will need funds when it's time to start F2F meetings again. If you have not seen the communication from the General Service Office regarding this, please contact me or your DCM. If you were registered for the International Convention in Detroit, which has been cancelled, you should be receiving notice of cancellation and refund of your registration fee. The International Desk has also cancelled your hotel room if it was reserved through the housing bureau. The General Service Conference will take place via virtual methods the week of 5/18-25. We were able to complete 4 pre-conferences, and cancelled Jacksonville. There were two online sessions with a total attendance of about 100. I have received feedback through email and the online survey. I can still accept your feedback until May 10th if you have not had an opportunity to provide your input or the input from your group. I have cancelled all Post Conference Workshop and we will re-visit this down the road. Since I saw you last, I attended the Delegate's Get Together in Atlanta with our Alternate Delegate and several of our past delegates. I had the opportunity to review the updated version of the "GSO and Grapevine" video that we are used to seeing in our GSR Orientation. I found it to be refreshing and informative – and 8 minutes shorter. I expect that it will be available shortly after Conference, if it's approved there. I look forward to a grand premier for all of you at an upcoming assembly! I am safely tucked in at home for the duration, as I hope you are also. I have found time to begin a quilt for my first great-grandchild, a girl, due in August. I miss all of you and look forward to the potential of our being together in July. Your Area Officers were all involved in this decision, but since the state of FL wasn't yet on "safe at home" orders, it involved negotiating with the hotel to let us out of the contract. By utilizing Lori's contacts at the hotel and negotiating by email and phone over several days, we were released from the contract with no financial penalties. Corrections: Clark M. – Greetings to my brothers and sisters involved in Corrections. It is a real shame that we could not meet for our April Assembly. I pray that everyone is staying well through this pandemic. We had a few interesting topics that were planned for our workshop. As you may recall, a conference agenda item in 2019 was to consider alternative ways to refer to those members who are incarcerated. The literature presently refers to these members as inmates and similar terms. An A.A. group in BC had requested that we consider changing the labels as they are considered offensive; however, no action was taken at GSC last year. I recently received the following request, which we were going to discuss at our workshop: "The Trustees' Committee on Corrections is requesting that the staff on the corrections desk ask for shared experience from A.A. members involved in corrections services on language alternatives to the terms currently used in Corrections literature to refer to incarcerated individuals (e.g., "inmate"). Please send your shared experience to the Corrections desk at corrections@aa.org by May 1, 2020." As requested, please submit your experience with this concern to the Corrections desk. Any change in nomenclature will require revisions to A.A. literature. At our workshop last year it was determined that no one had experienced a situation in which an incarcerated A.A member had mentioned the current language to be discriminatory or offensive. Evidently the Trustees Committee has decided that the issue should be revisited at this time. We were also going to get a status report from Bob C. on use of the JPAY tablet in prisons for A.A. literature. Another topic that we brushed on at the January Assembly was the role of "Bridging the Gap" in Corrections. We had a lively discussion going and we're going to continue that at this past Assembly. Please do some research on it and develop your opinions of that role. We will discuss this, the reference to "inmate" and JPAY in July. See you in a few months! Intergroup: Tia M. – The Intergroup Workshop was scheduled to be a 12th Step Call Workshop. We will pursue the topic when Area Assembly is held again.

Literature: Mary A. It is with privilege and gratitude that I serve as Area 14, Pane 69, Literature Service Coordinator and heartfelt disappointment that we had to cancel our April Assembly due to the virus COVID-19. There was so much excitement for so many agenda items for our members to consider and then advise our Delegate for the General Service Conference. And it is with amazement and appreciation that I acknowledge all the efforts that have been made by so many to continue to connect, inform, discuss and gather the responses of our groups and our members. A two hour workshop was planned to cover the Conference Agenda Items for Literature, there were 22 in all, at the April assembly. Though not planning to discuss all items, all information was made available to all members through their District DCMs or by contacting the Delegate directly, all 1000 plus pages of background material. I was grateful to have participated in several pre-conference workshops around the state and the Delegate held a couple more I could not attend. Sadly a few were cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic but we rallied and presented two on line workshops though Zoom that were well attended. During the first hour of the workshop the agenda was to cover items I, J, K, P, T and U. Item I1., discussed the review underway of the pamphlet "The Twelve Traditions Illustrated" and a consideration for not retiring the original pamphlet. Items J1 and J2 dealt with the policies for modifying literature and presenting literature in video format. Item K was a request for a common solution regarding a plain text version of the Big Book and an accompanying workbook. Item P1 and P2 were revisions to the language of the *Twelve and Twelve* regarding the phrase "opposite sex" from page 66 and the phrase "lustful enough to rape" from page 117. Item T asked for consideration to remove from the pamphlet "Questions and Answers on Sponsorship" the suggestion for newcomers that sponsors and sponsees be of the same sex and add to the text an expansion of the topic of service sponsorship and retitling the pamphlet to reflect this. Finally, item U would present the GSR Preamble for consideration and addition to the pamphlet "GSR: Your Groups Link to A.A. as a whole". In the second hour discussion and feedback would be heard for items N, O, R, Q, L and M. Items N and O respectively asked for consideration for forward movement to develop a fourth edition Spanish Big Book and updating the pamphlet "A.A. For Black and African American Alcoholics". Item R, made a request to bring into continuity the language of the pamphlet "The A.A. Group" and the blue card regarding open meetings. Item Q added a subtitle to the booklet "Living Sober", leaving items L and M regarding the book *Alcoholics Anonymous*. Item L suggested the addition of the pamphlet "The A.A. Group" at the next printing of the fourth edition and that changes be made to make the text read gender neutral and more reflective of today's society with specific interest to the chapters "To the Wives" and "The Family Afterwards". Item M addressed the timeliness of beginning the project to prepare a fifth edition of the book "Alcoholics Anonymous", specifically, consideration for the addition of updated stories and an inclusion in the forward to address an explanation of the gender terms used in the first 164 pages of the text. It is certain that lively and educated opinion would be shared by all with hopes to produce the best possible informed group conscious for the Delegate to carry to New York that will now be held virtually making history for the first time.
