

MINUTES OF THE SECOND QUARTERLY MEETING OF NORTH FLORIDA AREA
CONFERENCE OF ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS

April 4, 1993, Ocala, Fl.

General Assembly Meeting called to order by Chairman, Fred W.
at 9:00 a.m.-Serenity Prayer.

Howard S , Corresponding Secretary-Roll Call-Officers and

Recording Secretary, Kathy P , motion to approve minutes as
mailed, seconded, carried, no opposed.

Treasurers Report-Ken reported we did substantially better during
this quarter of 1993 than any quarter in 1992. Our total income
was \$6,536.39 and group contributions were \$5,261.91. Review of
Delegate expenses \$600.00 contribution for Delegate, April
Conference, reimbursed expenses listed for Tom's trip to Chicago
for medallion/logo ad hoc committee meeting. Our expenses were
higher this quarter for all new officers and committee chairs for
start-up expenses.

This quarter we paid our bulk mail permit and Kathy did try to
keep expenses down by mailing 3rd class until we received this
permit. Noted expense for Southeast Regional Trustee, Jackie
Martin at our last Assembly and we believe this money was well
spent, as Jackie did a great job of sharing with us that weekend.
The fire-proof filing cabinets for Archives and also replenishing
video tapes and resources for NFAA through our PI committee were
extra expenses. Ken also reported that he has spoken to Joan and
our taxes have been filed for 1992. Checking Account balance is
\$8,152.46 and prudent reserve of \$19,065.13. Ken asks that all
GSRs ask their group treasurers to be sure and put their group
name, group number D10# from New York, and district #s on the
checks so he may give the proper groups and districts credit when
their contributions come in.

Delegate's Report-All Committee Chairs received a copy of the
Conference Agenda for New York and Tom was placed on the ad hoc
committee for medallions/logos. Tom attended a committee meeting
in Chicago February 12-14, 1993. One delegate from each region
was in attendance plus the delegate chairman. These 9 people
reviewed the medallions and logos by using the Traditions and
Concepts to reach a consensus and make a recommendation. Tom
reported that God works in mysterious ways and even though he had
an opinion going into the meeting, by the end of that meeting
all nine of these people were in complete agreement. His

committee is scheduled to have one more meeting and then they will give their report at the April Conference and their committee will be dissolved. Eventually the Fellowship will decide this issue.

Also at the Conference in New York we will be electing a Southeast Regional Trustee. Our candidate is Jimmy G. We will also be electing a new Trustee at Large, our candidate is Dick F. Tom will report to the officer's meeting in Deland on the results of these nominations.

Tom held up his copy of the new 4-5-9. Tom became interested in the State of Michigan which began a contact program that is setup in conjunction with the 90 day pre-release program for inmates. Tom called Joe F., our Corrections Chairman and now Joe has a pilot program started here in Ocala. Also Joe has been in contact with South Florida Area Corrections.

New York is very excited about our Accessibilities workbook. Brian created this workbook last year. The book is being offered to the Delegates. Tom received an Easter card with a nice message from the Delegate in Quebec who is using this Accessibilities Workbook and is very grateful for it. We thank Brian for his fine work in carrying the message for Accessibilities.

Tom did submit request for Delegates approval before mailing lists are given out by New York, as requested by this Assembly, and it may not be on the agenda but further information is forthcoming. North Florida contributions to GSO were up but the contributions for the Fellowship are down for 1992. The price of literature has gone up just recently. Tom showed letterhead from South Florida Assembly and would like the same for NFAA. Tom will return on April 24th and since he is retired he will be more than glad to come to your group or area and report on the Conference. Tom's responsibility to the Assembly and the Fellowship is to report back on the conference and that is what he intends to do, so call when you need him.

Alternate Delegate Report-Dan E. -Delegates meeting-February 12, 1993, Atlanta, Dan attended for Tom who was attending medallion/logo committee meeting. Delegate meeting chaired by Jackie M. and reviewed AA as a whole.

1. 1993 contributions are down, project a 4% decline this year. Expenses are up, concern, not dire straights.
2. George D., our present office manager is doing a great job. M. has improved. Merit pay, consolidation of mail routine, as well as paring down expenses are being considered.
3. There is a little big book that appears to be Conference approved but it is not. A letter has been sent to the publisher. At this time, no response has been received from the publisher.
4. Additional Regional Forums are being discussed, perhaps one per year instead of every two years.

5. Jim E is being considered for the Chairman position, as Mike A will be rotating out.
6. Southeast Regional Trustee candidates were introduced. Jimmy G. from NFA. Dick P was introduced as candidate for Trustee at Large.

The open discussion topics:

1. Mailing lists—who should control them. Opposition was expressed, concerning handing out lists with an AA members full name and address.
2. Continuation of the discussion from December's Southeast Regional Forum "A.A.'s responsibility in dealing with the wet drunk:" Dan received a letter back from Mike Alexander, thanking Dan for bringing this subject back into focus for the fellowship so we can all ask ourselves what we are doing to carry this message to the wet drunk. We have a new challenge and as Dr. Bob said, "KEEP IT SIMPLE".

ACCESSIBILITIES—Dennis C /-Chair-30 in attendance.

Dennis introduced himself and thanked everyone for this opportunity to serve NFAA. Richie had a health problem and had to resign but will continue to help Dennis and the committee in any way he can. Susan signed for this meeting.

Discussion on budget for Accessibilities for 1994, \$400 special events and \$200 for signers for assemblies (Saturday Speaker Meetings). District 31 just beginning to take homebound meetings and hospital visitation meetings. They have a couple of signers in their district, also holding a Service Workshop. District 32—taking meetings into Independence Court for the Elderly(some Court ordered). Hernando County has an Audio Step Meeting and asked about ads in the newspapers for Accessible meetings. District 4 is having workshops on a monthly basis to get GSRs involved. The Chairman requested list of dates of the Workshops being held. Judy spoke about a non-reader Big Book meeting.

District 9—has deaf meetings with signers. They have called Deaf Center of Central Florida for paid signers. Audio Big Book signed \$42.00. Braille meeting schedules available and TDD machine, also rides for the handicapped. District 15—Susan has a sign language class, guidelines on signers. Suggestion on Workshops(each group sponsor a committee workshop). District 19—discussion about literacy problems, reaching the Spanish speaking population, the blind, the homebound, and young parents with children. Discussion on cable closed captioned ad space (free), this must be updated every two weeks. Babysitting meetings—very lively discussion, this is an accessibility function. Inventory sheet discussed.

ARCHIVES

Heidi F ,Chair/Penny B. Co-Chair-23 in attendance-
Workshop Theme "Interviewing Members for Archives". The purpose

of this committee is to collect items of historical interest. Gave out two handouts: Guidelines on setting up an Archives and suggested guidelines for interviewing members. Heidi stated that fireproof boxes were purchased and all current archives, except two boxes are now in the fireproof boxes. The tapes of previous interviews are currently being transcribed and are not in our possession. The interviews are at Fast-Chair, Marie B's house. The meeting then proceeded with viewing the handouts and the forms available in the Archives handbook. We also talked about preserving the minutes of the last two assemblies, as well as this quarter, to establish the cost of preservation. Then we plan to start processing all the items that need to be preserved. GSD is sending us the Archives Display to be used at our July assembly. We have just added a copy of the journal kept by Lois Wilson from their motorcycle journey to our collection. Also during this quarter we received the handbook written by our Accessibilites Committee and added it to our NFAA Archives.

CPC COMMITTEE-Brian S ,Chair/Steve M. Alt.Chair-Attendance-30. Thanks to Dave W., PI Chairman we had a slide presentation regarding the do's and don'ts of putting on a CPC presentation. Richard B. presented innovative flyer for CPC'ers. The Drug Free Statewide Prevention Conference in Haines City was briefly mentioned, which was headed by Joe and Jackie Carco. This was a combination of North Florida and South Florida CPC'ers at a large conference. There were over 1000 teenage drug abusers and alcoholics. The table-top display went very well.

Also Steve M the Area Alternate for CPC took care of the Amelia Island Plantation Family Health Care sponsored by the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine. They requested our pamphlets and Steve organized the A.A. meeting which he said went well. Bernice asked for feedback on the district level CPC and others commented on personal CPC experience.

There is a Florida conference on school health in Orlando May 10-12 and a big physicans convention in June. However this June convention and a number of others are contingent on the hand of AA and the increase we are asking for in our budget. Also the PI and CPC committees have been invited to Tallahassee to conduct a workshop, a date and location have not yet been decided.

CORRECTIONS-Joe F , Chair, Attendance 78. Joe explained briefly about the pilot program that has been started with Dan E.'s assistance at MCI for the 90 day prelease contacts. This entails active coordinators and of course, confidentiality. The prisons notify us and the inmate can fill out a form with his destination and a repoire can be established before his release. Kim stepped down as Alternate Chair as this position involves travel and a great deal of time plus hard work. Strong Corrections background is suggested.

Six key DCMS have been chosen for the Corrections Committee. Updated phone lists for corrections information on meetings now

should be mailed to: Joe F

Males needed to correspond with male inmates see Joe for details. 7,000 new inmate beds will be available in Florida, Governor Chiles requested 25,000, but this is a start. Corrections should be involved with Juveniles also, we need to start to carry the message to them at an early age.

Cans for pennies for prisons (collected \$250.00 in South Florida). We are starting bucks for books. Inmates will be hopefully sent to State Convention in Orlando Aug 4-8. We have this in our budget. North and South Florida Corrections will have a workshop in Ocala, date to be announced. Sunday, April 18, 1993, at the Lost & Found Club in Ocala, there will be a potluck dinner for Corrections, 2pm-5pm. Sunday, June 13, workshop for Corrections, 322 Penman Rd., Jacksonville Beach, call Sharon Ray (904)221-8476 for more information. The theme for the next assembly workshop will be "Inventory".

GRAPEVINE-Libby C , Chair, Alt. Chair-Charlotte B , Attendance 17. Libby asked each Grapevine Rep to take a picture of their Grapevine Display in their group to include the Rep. The Chairperson will make a display for the assemblies. Suggested that each Rep order the "free items" from New York-also suggested that he or she greet AAs in their group at the door with a Grapevine Subscription. Try to create interest in the Grapevine. Subscriptions keep going down.

Discussion followed on the advance information for the April Conference. The computerized list of Grapevine Reps was available for corrections. Need correct Rep for each district and his/her address. Point of interest-Brian Smith's article entitled "Hold the Phone" will appear in the July 1993 issue. I will order 50 copies for the July assembly. Anyone interested in writing articles for the Grapevine should mail directly to Grapevine, Box 1980, New York, NY 10163. At the January Assembly Grapevine Sales were \$192.00 and at this Assembly \$282.00, these are revolving funds to replenish our supply of material. We will have a supply of Service Manuals at the July Assembly. The new Grapevine Book "The Home Group" Heartbeat of A.A. is due out in May

INTERGROUP-Marlene S , Chair-Attendance-87. Intergroup Managers and Coordinators in attendance: Don B.-Central Florida, Donna G.-Volusia County, Ken M.-Ocala, Marlene-Brevard. The Intergroup Committee will participate in "AA takes its Inventory" and we will see how the Committee is doing. A form was passed out to those interested in topics for future workshops. Topic of this workshop was "Lack of Participation". Al who shared said they were having the same problems with volunteers for the offices and 12 step work, also funding to be able to be successful in serving the groups. We reach out in newsletters, but this is not always successful. Many felt that more would become involved in service work if their sponsors would educate them early in recovery. Service Workshops can be helpful. It

was suggested that we should try to carry the message as to what our Intergroups do on the local level, compared to GSO at that level.

Volusia County Intergroup Steering Committee and Officers are going to visit the groups this year and tell them that the office is there to serve their group and ask for support and suggestions. One district has copied job descriptions from the pamphlet "The AA Group", including Intergroup Rep and will distribute them to all the groups. Suggestion for Manager's corner and Rep's corner in the local newsletters.

Other suggestions: 1) Steering Committee Officers and Committee Chairs serve for two years. 2) Groups work on a roster system to handle Intergroup phones. 3) Breakfast meetings for Intergroup Reps. 4) Quarterly dinner for appreciation of volunteers. 5) Present volunteers on phones and in office go and tell others of the satisfaction in this 12 Step work. 6) Make brochures and By-laws available for new comers with accomplishments of Intergroup explained. 7) Educate people!

The new GSO price list is out with increases. Bernice from Dist. 5 reported that their Accessibilities Committee has made available an Audio Big Book for the Deaf, a Braille meeting list, and are presently up dating the list for the Office Manager.

PUBLIC INFORMATION-Dave W. , Chair, Attendance 60. Dave announced that he needed help for his PI Committee, contact him, if you can help. Vicki Dritsos of Tallahassee, Dist. 5, has volunteered to be on this committee. Dave read letter from Joanie M. at GSO, in regard to 43rd General Service Conference in April and other items. The 1993 Anonymity letter has been sent to 3,900 media contacts, these include radio, television, and newspapers. The letter requests first name only and no recognizable pictures of AA members.

The new literature catalog is in color-price increases on PI and committee materials. However for years the PI material was priced below printing costs and the 7th Tradition states we need to be self-supporting. Big Book is available in 24 languages. The Area PI Committee is considering ordering VHS video of the Big Book-American Sign Language. Conference PI Committee will discuss at the General Service Workshop: 1) Membership Survey 1992. 2) Anonymity Issues-Bill, Dr. Bob, Lois-posthumous photos and writings. 3) R06 deleted from order form-contained confusing mixed messages-R09 is better 4) Review PI Workbook.

Out of 32 Districts 11 have responded so far to the PI survey. Districts (5, 11, 13, 14, 17, 18, 25, 27, 28, 30, 31). This survey will be helpful in our future projects. Dave will compile report on survey results and present at a later time. We watched all the available Public Service announcements and everyone enjoyed the presentation. Dave read quote from Bill W. on Concept 11. Covered precise instructions in the PI workbook on how to approach stations to get our spots shown. All these spots refer

viewer to AA in the phone book. Dave is asking in the budget for approval for area to have spots that some districts can't afford.

Dave shared letter from Joanie M. in response to his request for help for 4th and 5th graders. Suggestions for "It Happened to Alice", "What happened to Joe", the video "Too Young". Discussion followed on dealing with elementary school groups. Good workshop, thanks for sharing, tapes available for internal use, "Markings of the Journey", "Your GSO Today", and "Circles of Love", other tapes are available for outside presentations. Contact Dave from your resource page if your district is holding a workshop and needs additional information.

TREATMENT FACILITIES COMMITTEE-Debbie W. , Chair/Neal B -Alt. Chair-Attendance-68. Announced that Growth Committee group conscience decided against a separate Bridge the Gap Committee. We asked the group for ideas and information to help establish a temporary contact list. This will also help coordinate our North Florida, South Florida, and Panhandle areas. We emphasized the need to begin these lists within each district. Some or most districts do not have an intergroup for organizational help. The Bridge the Gap concept was discussed and explained with great enthusiasm, as well as confusion, due to the fact that we have many new GSRs.

We read the 5 questions on the inventory and asked for group committee support to help improve our workshop and committee work. The questions: 1)How well our we doing our jobs? 2)How can we improve? 3) What are we not doing to the best of our ability? 4) How can we correct the above? 5) How can we improve communications to the groups, and from the groups to the area committee?

FINANCE COMMITTEE-Dick G. -Chair, Alt Chair-Ken R. - Attendance-15. Committee had our new members in attendance, good cross section. Dick presented overview of the Finance Committees purpose. Ken reviewed Treasurers report. At the July meeting we will have anticipated funds for 1994, we will mail to the DCMs the proposed budget so you can have two months with GSRs to look over for October vote. Operating by Robert's Rules-approve motions that come to the floor,two requests: \$200 for Corrections 90 Pre-release pilot project, \$1,75.00 to cover CPC Projects not allocated in the current budget. Assembly will need to vote on these two requests, our committee supports both of these requests. Carryover funds form 1992 \$2,256.00.

GROWTH COMMITTEE-Bob L. , Chair, Steve W. , Co-Chair 10 Committee members present,40 total participants. Bob V gave an outline of Bridge the Gap, the committee he was proposing. Joe from Corrections said they have their 12 step list covering Southern Alabama and all of Florida and it was working well. After discussion, Milt-District 1 made a motion not to recommend forming a new committee. Hal-Dist. 9 seconded the motion, the vote was 8 against and 2 for forming the committee.

In July a Growth Committee inventory will be taken, also we will discuss if the Intergroup Chairperson can have a vote at our area level.

SITE SELECTION COMMITTEE-Corrine F -Alternate Chairperson-in attendance 15. We are signing the contract with Steinbrenner's Ramada Inn for 1994. District 14 and 16 are hosting for October 93. District 17 and 19 are hosting for July 93. Special thanks to Districts 9,10,11,18, and 31 for hosting this assembly, they did a great job. We still need hosts for future assemblies. Committee members will be checking on new proposals for different sites. You can ask Corrine for any information you need to check on these sites, in regard to meeting rooms, prices, etc. We are still looking for proposals for 1995-1996. At this 2nd Qtr. Assembly we had 320 sign-in at our registration desk.

GSR Workshop-4-3-93-Attendance-119.

Many new GSRs attended this meeting. Corrine went over agenda for General Assembly in the morning. Discussion Structure & Guidelines, Service Manual, 5 questions on the AA Inventory. Howard S., Corresponding Secretary reviewed the rosters and importance of correct addresses. Also reminded GSRs to give these changes to their DCMs. Corrine explained the AA Directory. Then general discussion. What does a GSR do? Workshop questions? Be enthusiastic about Service.

Traditions Workshop-4-3-93-Attendance-127.

A reading on the Twelve Traditions from "Language of the Heart". Discussion about the principles of the Traditions and our strengthend unity. "Should a closed AA meeting change the format to accomodate a non A.A. visitor?" Discussion followed. We should support Conference Approved Literature in our groups. Good participation and a lot of group experience shared.

OLD BUSINESS

We had planned to vote on Structure and Guidelines today but because of 3 pages of ammendment considerations a motion was made yesterday at the DCM/Officers meeting to recommend suspending this vote until these considerations can be made. Fred requested that any additional changes be sent to Kathy F , Recording Secretary, by May 16th(deadline), so we can begin the process.

MOTION-"To suspend the Structure and Guidelines vote at this time" Seconded, No Opposed, 1 Minority Opinion from yesterday waived the right to express minority opinion.

MOTION-"To institute 90 day Pre-release Pilot Program-stationary, postage, phone calls, and travel to facilities to present the program."

Discussion-Dennis, "Each committee receives \$400 for special projects, can you clarify." Joe,"Our \$400 for special projects is used for inmates attending State Convention." This is a brand new pilot program.

The MOTION on the floor-"To institute 90 day Pre-release Pilot Program-stationary, postage, phone calls, and travel to

facilities to present the program." Seconded, carried, no opposed, no minority.

MOTION-"Recommendation from the Finance Committee to increase funding for CPC Committee by \$1,725.00".

Brian S , CPC Committee Chairman to the microphone to explain the request. A lengthy discussion followed.

Comments made from the floor: We need to be talking one on one to these professionals and small groups in our own areas first not just booths at Physicians Conferences. This idea is grandiose, too much solicitation rather than promotion. We should not have to keep asking New York to pay for the literature and the booths when we have the funds here at NFAA, lets use them. With all the rehabs closing we will be seeing more people coming to us through physicians, EAP programs, lawyers, and the clergy. We can do a lot of good work through CPC. If we expend all the literature and help one alcoholic then this literature is well worth it. What is the responsibility of the district, group, area, and GSO?

Procedural statement from Fred, "The Chair cannot recognize anyone who does not have a vote on this floor."
"Call the Question." 2/3 majority not attained so discussion continued. If we can get free literature then we should. CPC can do a good job, give them the money. Good idea to establish a network within our districts and areas and they can send a newsletter that is made for professionals.

MOTION-"To provide \$1,725 to C.F.C. to carry on work for NFAA". Motion made, seconded, carried, opposed-25. Minority Opinion-Dan E.-"I would just like to state that my District, District. 17, last year contributed over \$1,700 and was the largest contributor. I just wonder how they feel knowing we just gave one person all those funds to attend all these conferences and conventions."

Brian, CPC Chair-Related that a member told him to mention something about the Prudent Reserve that we have in our Treasury and it is supposed to be used for Committee Projects-if we don't use it the groups will rebel.

NEW BUSINESS

Area Inventory-All the Officers and Committee Chairs have the basic inventory sheets. These 5 questions can be expanded and enlarged upon. I have asked that these be returned to Dan E.- Alt. Delegate, no later than the October Assembly. Dan will compile the area inventory. Return district level inventories to Dan by July.

Fred-1994 Budget will go out after the July qtrly, the 2nd weekend in July. We will send out the budget to you and we will

vote on at the October 1993 assembly. We hope to do the same next year. In 1994 we will have the budget for 1995. Any new business? Tom, "I still have copies of my Committee work available." Howard found his missing list, thank you. Put name tags on the desk when you leave.

Libby Crique, Grapevine Chairman-error in my report-please just take picture of your Grapevine display and do not include yourself in the snapshot.

Dennis C new Accessibilites Chairman, please leave message if not home.

There is a workshop in St.Cloud on June 13 and Tom our Delegate will be giving his New York report at that workshop.

Dick G, once again remind everyone to register for the Florida State Convention August 4-8, 1993. Flyers on the tables out front, please take copies back to your groups. We need your support.

Thanks once again to the host districts, also June 13, Corrections Workshop in The Beaches Group, Jacksonville Beach. Close in the usual manner.

OFFICER'S/INTERIM MEETING
May 2, 1993
Victor E. Club, Deland, Fl.

Fred opened with Serenity Prayer. Howard called the roll. In attendance: Tom D , Dan E , Fred W , Ken R , Howard S , Kathy P , Dennis C , Joe F , Libby C , Bob L , Marlene S , David W .

Treasurer's Report-Income \$2,749.84, Operating expenses \$2,286.59. Ken explained line by line distribution of funds and mentioned \$50.00 under special projects which is the first expense of the CPC Committee for a registration fee for the Florida Foundation for School Health.

Delegate's Report-Tom said the Conference in New York was fabulous. The new Southeastern Regional Trustee is Gaye Gardner from Waycross, Georgia. The new Trustee is Larry Nelson from California. A site will be selected for the 1996 Regional Forum. We are one of the areas that will make a presentation next year.

Medallions and logos-The recommendation was that A.A.W.S. not get into the sale or licensing of this product. There will be no more lawsuits and George Dorsey will write a letter to all companies producing material with our logo and request that they cease doing so. Our issue of not giving names and addresses to anyone who asks will now stop. Tom was elected Alternate Chairman of the Report and Charter Committee. One action in the A.A. Service Manual. This action will be under Districts, there will be such a thing as linguistic districts (see S52). There was a request to change or delete paragraph in the Concepts. But it will not be done (we won't mess with Bill's writings).

The cities will now be highlighted in the directories. The cost of printing the last annual report was \$86.00. Tom handed out the early bird printing of the 4-5-9. The A.A. history book will be deferred for two years until a new group can look at it. They did not feel the book was up to A.A. standards at this time. An anonymity card will be produced this year.

There will not be a Spanish speaking Grapevine, however the Spanish article in the Grapevine will be continued. After 1994 no calendars or pocket calendars will be produced. Subscriptions are declining. Contributions from Conventions and Conferences can exceed the \$1,000 individual contribution. Good luck in separating the A.A. funds from non-A.A. funds.

No more pie charts in the F3 pamphlet. There will no longer be recommendations on percentage for groups to give. The cost for a delegate to attend the Conference was \$3,500. That was \$128.00 a room plus food. If our area can send

more than \$600 a year, it would be appreciated. Contributions were down in 1992, but they came in under budget. Class A Trustee will be limited to two terms, may be extended only one time if necessary. Tom gave report on changes in the New York office staff rotating out and this information will all be in the final report. Tom will also give his report at the assembly in July.

C.P.C. Report-May 10-12, at the Peabody, District 9 and 31 presentation for School officials, teachers, principals, and school nurses. District 31 contacted 12 different organizations with "What A.A. does and does not do".

Grapevine-Libby gave report on ordering 50 copies of 50th anniversary issue and 25 Service Manuals for our July assembly. Also 5 books, 'Language of the Heart'. Libby will be sending out postcards to try and contact all GVRs on the printout she received from Grapevine.

Treatment-Everything is fine.

Archives-No report.

Alternate Delegate requested that all officers and committee chairs do their inventories and send into him.

Growth Committee-Bob reported on LCM methods that are being used at present. Still working on the map. Growth will also be involved in Intergroup vote issues.

Site committee-Letter in regard to 1994 and discussion followed on rotating sites, however at this time there are no new recommendations.

Finance will present the 1994 Budget at the next assembly. Committee Chairs have submitted outlines. Suggestion has been made to include in minutes a comparison report of how we did in 1993. The proposed budget will be voted on in October. We should try in the first year of a budget to live within what we have projected.

The Officer's Forum will be begin at 9:30 pm at the next assembly, immediately following the speakers meeting which will be slated at 8:00 pm-9:00 pm.

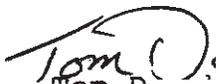
