The committee generated questions for discussion at International Convention in San Diego. Needs of the hearing impaired AA were discussed.

Corrections CHAIR: CHARLIE R 48

Look for newsletter from this committee, tentative date for premiere issue in May. Discussed orientation program in District 14. Related topics: Traditions concerning anonymity and affiliation. Visitor from Marion County Institution, Mr. Jeanette talked about cooperation with Corrections officials. Noted that the attitude of DOC is amiable at this time and much progress can be made.

Grapevine ALT. CHAIR: ERNIE B 16

Deliberated methods of encouraging use of Grapevine. Some suggestions were a) weekly raffle b) anonymous donor gives subscription on 1 year anniversary. c) give back issue with white chip. d) Sponsors give subscription to sponsees.

Intergroup CHAIR: DON B 52

Attendees from each district served by an Intergroup were asked to share how they work together toward our common objective of carrying our message. Methods vary between Districts and Intergroups, each being autonomous. Communication and cooperation is beneficial

Literature CHAIR: DENNIS C

Function of the Literature Committee is: To inform Groups, Districts and assembly members, through displays or other suitable methods, of all available conference approved literature, audio visual material and other special items. Topic for workshop in July will be; "Changing the "Big Book" or any other literature available from GSO

Public Information CHAIR: FRED H 43

Understanding anonymity is a prerequisite for an effective PI program. Ref: "Speaking at non-AA meetings" pamphlet (P-40). Leave AA literature at police stations, libraries, and schools. PSA's to local radio and TV stations. PI literature packages available from GSO at reduced prices.

Treatment Facilities CHAIR: NEAL B 46

Spoke about working with the Dept. of Corrections 105 treatment programs. Chairman attended a state sponsored workshop with civilian volunteers and was encouraged. A list of all programs associated with DOC will be provided at the July assembly. Report on the success of Volusia county districts temporary contact program.

Administrative Committees

Finance CHAIR: DAVID W. 17

Five items were passed through committee to be presented to the assembly. 1) Start-up funds for the Literature Committee \$250 for literature for display not sale, and \$50 for constructing a display case. 2) Purchase of laser printer for Corresponding Secretary, amount not to exceed \$500. 3) Postage and Telephone for Intergroup Committee in the amount of \$150. 4) Add \$650 to the Corrections Committee for special projects. 5) Add \$200 dollars to Conference Operations for printing of Accessibilities pamphlet to be distributed at International Convention. 1996 budget will be given to GSR's in July to take back to their groups.

Growth Committee CHAIR: STEVE W 27

A motion was made detailing how the District may handle growth, see attached for exact wording, and was passed 6-0. This marks the end of a 4 year deliberation within this committee on this issue. It was noted that if a DCM is absent, the alternate may vote in his place. If you have a matter to go before this committee contact chairman prior to July assembly.

Site Committee CHAIR: KATHY P 22

Voted to put Literature Committee in line with PI, Acc., and TFC. District 25 offered to host Jan 96 assembly, but need another district to participate. District 5 needs assistance from District 20 for July assembly. Concerns were expressed to set non-conflicting dates for April 96 assembly (in re: Black College Reunion weekend). Trying to complete bids by October 95 for 1997-98. Voted to bring motion to floor of assembly concerning addition of a smoking hospitality room. This is an effort to alleviate congestive condition in the hallway. January of 1996 will be districts 25&17.

Upcoming Assembly dates - July 14-16, 1995-October 13-15, 1995

Old Business- Motion from finance committee for \$265.00 for startup cost for Literature Committee. Seconded. One opposed Minority opinion Carried.

Motion to amend Area Guidelines per References 1 & 2 published in January minutes concerning reimbursement rate for mileage. Motion carried.

New Business

Motion to make North Fl Area archives available on a loan basis with security provisions. Seconded. Discussion. Motion to amend Main Motion specifying "Intergroups only" Seconded Discussion. Amendment did not carry. Motion to amend "with 30 day limit" Amendment failed for lack of second. Call the question. Passed 2/3. Vote on Main Motion. Motion failed.

From finance committee-Motion to purchase new laser printer for Corresponding Secretaries' computer system. Cost not to exceed \$500.00 No opposed. Carried.

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From finance committee-Motion to add \$150.00 for phone and postage to Intergroup Committee budget for 1995. 2 opposed No minority opinion.

From finance committee-Motion to increase special projects by \$650 for Corrections. Much discussion followed including request for more information. Call the question. 2/3 carried. Several opposed. Minority opinion ". At .10 a mile \$10 would go about 89 miles. For 600 dollars that's a lot of miles.

From finance committee-Motion to increase Conference operations budget for 1995 by \$200 to publish additional copies of the NFACAA Accessibilities pamphlet to distribute in San Diego. Motion to amend to \$483.00 Second, Discussion, Amendment fails. Call question. 2/3 carries. Vote on Main Motion. Main Motion fails.

From Site Committee-Motion to add a smoking hospitality room for the assembly. Discussion, Vote 66 for, 59 against.

A motion was made from the floor to have a signor at the business meeting. The Chair indicated that this matter must first go to the appropriate administrative committees.

GROWTH COMMITTEE
NORTH FLORIDA AREA CONFERENCE OF ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS, INC.

At the April 8, 1995 meeting of the Growth Committee, the following motion was passed and is therefore, submitted to the Assembly for approval:

1. When a district reaches thirty or more groups, it may split into two or more districts, each with a committee member to head it. Each DCM would have a vote at the Assembly.
2. When a district reaches twenty or more groups, it may elect Local Committee Members for each combination of ten groups. The LCM will function as an assistant to the DCM and will not have a vote at the Assembly.
3. When a district reaches thirty or more groups and chooses not to split, it may elect multiple DCMs (one for each fifteen groups). The multiple DCMs will perform all the duties of a DCM and have a vote at the Assembly.

If approved Section 17 of the Structure and Guidelines would be amended to read:

17. REDISTRICTING THE AREA

When a District has grown such that the DCM can no longer effectively serve all groups (thirty or more), the District may petition the Area Assembly to (pg. S52):

- A. Split into two or more Districts, each with a Committee Member to head it. Each DCM would have a vote at the Area Assembly.
 - B. Elect multiple DCMs (one for each fifteen groups). The multiple DCMs would perform all the duties of a DCM and have a vote at the Area Assembly.
1. The DCM must receive approval from the groups involved. A letter of authorization should be sent to the Area Chairperson by the DCM. It must always be remembered that principles must be placed before personalities.
 2. The DCM then petitions the DCMs of the Assembly in the DCM business meeting. If this is approved, the petition will be taken to the Assembly business meeting during the same quarter for a final vote.
 3. When a District reaches twenty or more groups it may elect Local Committee Members for each combination of ten groups. The LCM will function as an assistant to the DCM and will not have a vote at the Assembly.

The Delegate is allocated funds to *help defray* his/her expenses at the conference in New York as well as to report on the General Service Conference to Districts requesting such report.

This change submitted through Recording Secretary by Past Delagate Tom Dougherty. Current wording suggests that NFACAA "covers" all expenses where in fact we do not.

The Treasurer prepares a two-year proposed budget to be presented to the NFAA for approval.
