January 14, 1996

Area Chair -Corrinne opened with the Serenity Prayer

Corresponding Secretary -Tom G took Roll (See next page), announced his new address, Information Page reflects the change on the Information page.

Recording Secretary -Correction to the previous (Oct '95) minutes. Page 9-CPC section, delete entire last sentence which starts with "Kate then". Page 17 , Growth section, top of page should read *7yes/2no*, also; Add *July 16-20* as the dates of the State Convention. Page 18, New Business Motion *passed* to have business meeting on Saturday night. Minutes passed with corrections.

Treasurers Report - Judy P See report attached. Completed computer purchase under budget. All three computers have extended warranty contracts. District 18 did not send \$4700.00 it was a type-o. Amount for each of the groups is correct. Total cash on hand, \$10,257.00, Prudent reserve \$21,010.76. The budget shows we budgeted deficient in actuality, exceeded expenses by \$4443.00. Judy explained contributions listed on the Treasurer's Report. Assembly Host expenses cost \$2000.00 less than we expected. Please make checks payable to **North Florida Area Assembly** not Judy Petersen. Judy did list the Spanish A.A. Group. If you find any errors in group contributions send in corrections. Report was approved.

Delegates Report-Dan E -Part of the Delegates' duty is to let us know what is going on in AA, which Dan does give the pertinent information.

International Convention lost half of a million dollars,. Committee discussed Reserve Fund in New York, 9 million dollars. Transferred some funds to AAWS. They reduce prudent reserve and were able to drop literature prices. Keep sending the contributions. Big Book in different languages. Each quarter new translations are being put out. In 30 years the largest population in AA maybe in Asia. 30 AA groups are now on the Internet. Conference Board and Charter Committee will write to groups that this subject will be discussed at the April conference. GSO has implemented an AA Web-site. Dan did not have the Internet address.

At the last Assembly a motion was passed to submit the bid for the 2005 International Convention. Dan and Diana H , South Florida Delegate worked together on this, Diana Hobbe will make the presentation in April. We will find out in July if the bid is accepted and a contender for further consideration.

Dr. Silkworth's contributions: Information on our illness, describing our illness, describing the Alcoholics dilemma, the allergy. Alcoholism was not recognized as a disease until 1956. Twelve step recovery is based on the Dr.s' opinion. He knew the problem, but, not the solution. He gave the concept of allergy and disease to Bill W. Bill knew of his problem. At a "Meeting after the ""Meeting"". Dr. Jung saw necessity for spiritual. change. In 1913, he separated with Freud. William James "Varieties of Religious Experiences". Accessibilities-Kenny T Theme- Why & How of Workshops
We opened with the Serenity Prayer followed by introduction of ourselves and group or District Representatives.

A brief orientation for newcomers was presented by Azubah W. who also serves as Alternate chair. She explained functions of special needs committees.

Some reports of what's happening in other districts with Accessibilities past and present were given.

We had such good participation from everyone on several special needs topics, our "Why & How of Workshops" and our upcoming workshop (multi-county) in March came toward the latter part of session-(which was good. We were real pleased with all the questions. The basics of the theme were covered however.

Cooperation with Professional Community -Joe C /40/(11 first-timers) Discussed what CPC is and what we do and how we do it. Discussed the new Condensed CPC

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Workbook....Catalogue #M41-1 for \$1.65 or M41 with pamphlets & guidelines for \$6.75 (plus discount) we discussed the various ways to find contacts for professional exhibits (Conventions)

We discussed the importance of active committees versus the people to do the works. We discussed the importance of knowing our literature. We discussed the Guide letters & mock presentations in our workbooks We will be looking for help for a convention in April in Kissimmee at the Hyatt Orlando Highway 192 and Interstate-4..

Corrections- There was a short memorial to Charlie R. Past chair Papa Joe started the meeting. Read short speech from Debbie P /Past Alt. Chair. Played tape for Charlie R. Introduced Roger J as new Chair. Roger gave short talk re: Charlie R. and re: About committee.

Theme: Why are we here.

Had Charlie T.(D12) read from the "AA comes of Age" Pg. 89, 88? How do we know this program works? Called on Ron J to answer. Ron J said he made a wish yesterday. He is a 3X loser- That he might be able to come here to say something profound. Nothing more profound than this program. The program took him from being nothing to a person today that is a part of society.

Roger short talk about why we are here. Here to serve. Serve people in prison. Not going to give up on the AA people. Even when DC says give them up. Personally thankful that someone was around wanting to do something for someone else and not expecting anything in return. DC is tough to work with. Doesn't matter who is chair of Committee. But without you people nothing would get done. Met with DC in 9/95, want a similar yearly meeting, next one is 4/20/96 in Orlando. It will be hosted by South Florida Area 15 Corrections Committee DC wants to meet with volunteers. Need people at this meeting

Grapevine Charlotte B - The meeting opened with the Serenity Prayer and 35 members were present.

The topic for discussion was "articles & letters submitted by people expressing their opinions & thoughts, good or bad about AA meetings.

One concern was, if the Grapevine could archive the circulation it would like when it was felt it did not stick close enough to the "meat & potatoes" of the program by following more closely with the "Big Book", Steps, etc.

Much input was presented. A lot of good comments about the value to the recovering alcoholic. Several shared of instances where a persons recovery was actually helped by the Grapevine "No opinion is out of line" -"it should generate controversy & discussion". "It

is a meeting when we can't get to a meeting". "It's our Magazine!" An important tool in promoting AA.

Florida is now listed at 6,238- this is excellent. But we have no way of knowing what just North Florida is generating.

Tomorrow I'm faxing to N.Y. a request be brought before the April Conference. It is: "If it could be made possible for statistics to be reflected by areas separately and solely?" The usual was expressed about the need for more GvR's Many Districts do not have GvRs 6 or 8 Districts do out of 31. We are working on this and it will change

Intergroup-Don B. - Theme: "Ultimate authority and being autonomous"

Six of eleven intergroups in the North Florida Area were represented, and representatives from two areas with Intergroups in the formative stages were present. Don advised that he was no longer administrator of Central Florida Intergroup in Orlando, but will continue as NFA Intergroup chairperson. Judy C. is the new Orlando Intergroup Office Administrator.

Discussion topics raised by those attending were: 1) Relations between Districts and Intergroups, 2.) AA telephones- full time volunteers vs. answering services, 3.) Carrying only AA produced materials vs. carrying other materials requested and 4.) What are fair wages for special workers.

There were strong differences of opinion expressed.

We need always remember our Traditions that each group and indeed each Intergroup, is autonomous and the ultimate authority is God as he expresses himself in your Intergroups' conscience.

Literature-Dennis C. -14 present, 1.) We talked about ways to encourage groups, Districts and intergroups to appoint literature chairpeople. 2.) A great deal of discussion about the sale AAWS literature by this committee. Followed by a motion to maintain the current Literature sale policy of the NFAA. Motion seconded and passed. 3.) A suggestion was made to set up the literature display in the room where the GSR orientation takes place. Also, to do a brief presentation to the GSR acquainting them with various pieces of literature.

Public Information-Fred H. chaired meeting with Jackie C., Alternate Chairperson. 44 people in attendance. The theme for the workshop was "Anonymity and PI work". The GSO video "hope" was shown the allow everyone to see "Public Information about AA in action To be effective in PI work, one must have an understanding of anonymity in AA. We must always be aware of the 11th Tradition.

Discussion followed about ways an methods to "Carry the message" and protect your anonymity. Anonymity is actually a practice of humility. Other discussion covered ways to get Public Service Announcements on TV and Radio. The Gainesville area would like

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to carry the AA message on the University of Florida campus. A PI workshop will be held in Jacksonville on 1-27-96.

Treatment Facilities-Chair Neal B. -Co-Chair Jeff H. 38 present. Jeff began the meeting covering questions concerning the Temporary Contact Program. He discussed solution to different problems in beginning a TCP.

I then discussed the need to go back to the basics and attempt to help each district with their concerns. Referring to the Temporary Contact Program workbooks and questionnaire mailed to each DCM, I received only seven replies. None expressed concern for creating (or lack of), I have discontinued any effort to create an Area workbook. Jeff and I will however help any interested.

I came the area with an agenda and goals. I realize that this is not my Area, it is OUR area. Not all districts want or need a temporary contact program. Some do and have done a great job (such as Jeff Harvell in Volusia County).

From the basics of :How do I get into a Treatment Center with the AA message, to the most advanced steps within a working Temporary Contact Program, we all need something Our committees purpose for existence is to help your district carry the message. We need to hear from you so PLEASE call or write with any concerns.....

Administrative Committees

Minutes of the Finance Committee Meeting
January 13, 1996

Dave announced several items had come up since the last October 1995 Assembly which needed to be discussed by the Committee.

First, the Committee discussed the new budget forms developed for use by Area Officers and Committee Chairs in preparing their proposed budgets for 1997. Dave passed out copies of the new "Budget Worksheet" form and the new "Workshops Worksheet" form. Dave reminded everyone that in the past, proposed budgets had come to the Finance Committee in a variety of formats, some handwritten, some typed, using different terminology to describe the various activities in which money was proposed to be spent. It was hoped the new forms would simplify everyone's job in preparing and reviewing budgets. Also, the Treasurer said she plans to use the new budget expense categories in her quarterly Treasurer's reports, so that we're using the same terminology in both the budget and the reports. After some discussion, the Committee approved the use of the forms as part of the budget process.

Second, the Committee discussed the reimbursement of mileage for Officers and Committee Chairs to attend the quarterly Interim Officers Meeting. This was an issue

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which had come before the Committee in January, 1995 and was approved but never made it onto the floor of the Assembly for a vote. The Committee reviewed the issue again, and recommended approval so that the item could come before the full Assembly on Sunday morning. The expected annual fiscal impact is about the same as the amount for reimbursement to attend Assemblies, or about \$1,400.

Third, the Committee initiated a review of the Area's policy on the Prudent Reserve. This discussion was precipitated by the Alt. Delegate's request at the October Assembly to transfer sufficient funds into the reserve to bring it up to an amount equivalent to nine months of the 1996 budget. The Committee wanted to understand the difference between the various accounts shown on the Treasurer's report each quarter. The Committee was also curious as to whether in the past the Assembly had actually adopted a particular percentage of operating expenses which would be maintained in the Reserve, and what the rationale was behind such a decision. It was agreed that the Treasurer could make some simple changes in the way the checking and savings accounts are reported that might clear up some of the confusion. After much discussion, the item was tabled; no action was taken on the transfer. Discussion will resume in April or July.

Growth-Steve W - We had 8 committee members present and 21 in attendance.

We voted to change Section 17 Paragraph 2 of the motion to read- "the DCM then petitions the Growth committee meeting. The meeting was short as no other issues were on the agenda.

Site-Kathy P : 12 present. 1st order of business discussed motion from William S Dist 23, Motion-"that the need of a signer for the hearing impaired be put on a request basis. The request would be the responsibility of the person(s) requiring this service to contact their DCM who would present the request to the Chairperson of North Florida Area at least two weeks prior to the Assembly.

Furthermore, in the event that duplication of the services be requested (two requests for different meetings) that occur at the same time. In this event the Chairperson of the Assembly would make a decision." 9 in favor. 1 abstention.

Second Discussion-Hotel Selection- Motion "To have Fred W and Tom G proceed with finalizing the bid received from the Ramada Beach Resort for 1997 and 1998." 9 in favor and 1 left the room.

Discussion followed on smoking in the hallways since the assembly voted the hallway non-smoking.

Area Chairperson

North Florida committee members, one and all. Officers, Committee Chairs/Alts, DCM's/Alts, and GSR's/Alts. I would like to utilize this; my sounding board section of the minutes to review, discuss and hopefully add some meaning to this years Theme for the NFACAA. "I Am Responsible". Originally penned by Al Steckman, an alcoholic who was also the second editor of the Grapevine, the declaration was the choice of theme for the 30th Anniversary in Toronto, Canada. Later in 1968 the ratio of Alcoholic/Non-Alcoholic trustees was changed to 2/3 majority Alcoholic thereby adding further responsibilities at all levels of our organization.. During this time in AA's history there was a great deal of doubt as to the Alcoholics ability to preserve and care for such a large and complex organization. (A quick look through some AA literature will confirm this) The declaration "*When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A. A. to be there, and for that I am responsible*" was indeed the keynote of the 1965 15th Annual International Convention.. In the minds of many this declaration conjures up only the image of shaking the hand of the newcomer and leading him to the coffee pot. Maybe even introducing some of the other group members. Perhaps offering temporary sponsorship, giving him a Big Book, maybe a newcomers kit. And it does mean all that. But there is so much more meaning to that declaration that it boggles the mind. *When Anyone*,(The loving arms of AA embrace alcoholics of any age, from the youngest to the oldest, persons who suffer; regardless of race, choice of Religion (if any!), sexual orientation, gender, or past history) *Anywhere*, (Service workers travel to jails, prisons, hospitals, nursing homes, homes of bedridden people, coalitions for the homeless, detox centers, to name a few. Others visit Doctors, Lawyers, Judges, Probation Officers, schools, garden clubs, etc.. The AA program at last report was in 141 countries worldwide, the Big Book published in 24 languages, and the growth and spreading trend seems to be continuing.) *reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA to be there* (How many forms does this reaching out take? I've been going to meetings for some time now, and rarely does someone walk through the door on their own and stick out a hand along

As might have been anticipated, there was no response to your District Inventory form from a majority of the 31 Districts in the North Florida Area. The following Districts submitted at least one form: 4, 5, 8, 11, 12, 14, 15, 18, 19, 23, 24, 25, 28 & 29. On a brighter note, Districts 4, 9, 11, 12 (good job), 15, 18 (very nice job), 19, 23, & 24 seemed to have taken part in the spirit of active participation. The explanations for not attending our area quarterlies run the gamut from lack of interest to the apparent belief that if the GSR's full expenses are not paid, by someone other than the GSR, then the current GSR will not be coming to our quarterlies to represent his/her group. This view appears to be held by some DCM's as well. Another theme that seemed to be present on quite a few forms was the misguided belief that the election of an Alternate GSR would somehow alleviate the GSR from their obligation to attend area quarterlies. A few GSR's feel the need to be entertained while a few others would like to have a "big AA meeting to discuss living problems". On a positive note, there were many new GSR's at our January, 1996 quarterly which is just great. I wish to thank all DCM's and GSR's who participated in this survey and especially the GSR from District 11 who wrote expressing thanks for the phone call from their DCM or someone reminding them of a pending quarterly. Postcards also work well when mailed two weeks in advance. In the words of the GSR, "a specific commitment and involvement other than to simply attend the local meetings might also be helpful!" It has also been pointed out to me that many GSR's were rotating out of office and since the October quarterly was not a voting quarterly many of them decided not to come to the quarterly.

Dan, as you can see from the mild response to your survey, we the Area officer's, along with the DCM's and GSR's who are committed to the General Service structure have an ongoing job of communication and modeling of our love of service for and to the fellowship.

with a heartfelt request for assistance. More likely they come from a treatment center in large groups that irritate some AA's, or are freshly out of jail or prison under a similar program. Some attendees are the direct result of a 12 step call.(Are you on the local 12 step call list?, is the information current?, are you too busy when the call finally does come?) Most of these newcomers have one thing in common, a defensive attitude, unwillingness to participate, and a great need to have a paper signed; so they can get this over with. We need to see through all this and allow the love and fellowship to draw as many as can be helped by that one extra kindness that we could perform, rather than scurry out the door as soon as the Amen is said.) ***And for that I am responsible.*** Is that all this means? Or does it include getting the newcomer involved in Service as soon as possible, letting them know of the joy of giving. Would it include attendance at Home group meetings on a regular basis? Business meetings, Area Assemblies, checking to see if the group is actively contributing (if able) to the service structure? Making sure the those elected for a service position are fulfilling the obligations of their jobs, or are they merely holding a title and inhibiting someone else's growth in service. After all these observations and I'm sure you can think of more, I wonder if the theme for 1996 should have been "Am I Responsible?" instead of "I am responsible" The future of AA for those to come is woven into the words of this declaration, and I pray that Area 14, the North Florida Area is a strong fiber in that cloak to comfort the suffering Alcoholic.

It's time again to begin the budget cycle that will result in a budget for the North Florida Area Assembly for 1997. Although it might seem like "here we go again," in fact we are still novices at creating budgets.

The books of the North Florida Area are presently being audited so the comparison of the 1995 budget and actual 1995 spending will be distributed to you at the April Assembly. Some information is now available which you can share with your group. Specifically, the expenses we approved in the 1995 budget exceeded the budgeted income by \$5890. The final result is that income exceeded expenses by \$4444. A number of things happened to cause this difference.

1. The Area regularly receives 7th tradition funds from AA conferences and meetings (e.g., FCYPAA) that take place in North Florida. Two large contributions were received in 1995.
2. Some of our cash on hand and all of our prudent reserve was invested in CD's and a savings account which resulted in a large increase in interest income.
3. Although literature sales income was much higher, the cost of the literature increased even more.
4. On the expense side of the ledger, the Delegate costs, including the International Convention, were well below budget. The cost of the Hospitality room at the International Convention was nominal.
5. We were able to stage the four assemblies and house all the officers and committee members for half the cost of the assemblies before we committed to a single location.
6. Duplication and supplies budgets for officers and committee chairs were well below budget, as was special projects spending.
7. Due to careful shopping and good timing, we purchased 3 new computers with extended warranties, 2 printers, and upgrading of our 3 old computers for the amount approved.

The budget totals for income and expenses since our first budget in 1992, and the end-of-year results for each year is shown below. Because your groups are the major source of income, the income budgeted from groups and actually received during this period is also shown. 267 of the 644 active groups contributed to the Area during 1995. I think we can all be gratified by this level of financial participation by the groups.

A conclusion we can draw from our budgeting experience is that Area funds are being spent with care. We have worked out advantageous arrangements for inexpensive duplicating, hotel and room charges, and corporate costs. We are now a 501c(3) organization and exempt from Florida sales tax. On the other hand, some officers and committee chairs restricted their spending voluntarily in order to be sure we don't overspend. It's important that we don't cut back on services you have requested and approved only to end up with a surplus for the year. Clearly, designing an accurate budget and managing actual spending to come out even is a tricky business. A crystal ball might help!

Meanwhile, budget requests will be submitted and explained to the Finance Committee at the Assembly in April. At the July Assembly, you will receive the proposed budget to take back to your groups for discussion. The budget voting will take place at the Assembly in October.

Please pass a few points on to your group treasurer. Check your group's contributions carefully in each quarterly report. Bring all errors to my attention. Also, we don't provide receipts for contributions but all checks are stamped with the NFAC deposit endorsement and account number. If you want a receipt, just enclose a stamped, addressed postcard and I'll return it to you. Your group's District # and group name are the two vital pieces of information to put on the check.

Thanks for your support! I look forward to working with you in 1996.
