Standing Committees

Accessibilities - Kathy P [REDACTED] chaired in Azubah's absence. - 7 members in attendance. Discussion of Accessibilities. Are the New York guidelines correct? Is the North Florida pamphlet correct? Do we really consider babysitting an accessibility need? Discussion on our primary purpose. Should be consider listing "child friendly" meetings.

We also talked about wheelchair accessible meetings. Is this to get in the building, is the restroom accessible? Do we use the ADA guidelines. Some suggestions for using community transportation for transport to meetings.

We also talked about workshops to increase interest in accessibilities.

Archives - Scott L [REDACTED] - I would like to thank the Step Sisters group of District 8 for donation of the 2 Grapevines also Daytona Intergroup for the donation of the Guest Book from the first North Florida Area Assembly held in Daytona in June of 1966 and Joe H. for the history of how AA got started in the North Florida Area according to Gordon J [REDACTED].

We opened the meeting in the usual manner and I proceeded to tell the group what I had been doing and I talked about the Longtimers workshop I attended in March and the discussion I had with Bill P [REDACTED], the archivist from Hazelton who also used to work at GSO. Bill will be helping with the Richmond W [REDACTED] papers and compiling the history of the Daytona Area, talked also about the further restoration that I have been doing. On a more personal note I wish to pass on much thanks to Dick and the other delegates for their work on trying to get a Conference Delegates for Archives and also if there are any Districts or groups that would like to have the archives visit, please contact me at least 3 weeks in advance.

Cooperation with Professional Community - Janet L [REDACTED] 23 people present. We opened with the serenity prayer. Thanks to Jackie C [REDACTED] for the Nurses Convention. Bill H [REDACTED], CPC District #9 to handle American Physical Therapy Convention in June. Alternate CPC will be Don L [REDACTED], DCM District #19 and CPC Chair. We broke into 5 groups to discuss the 5 agenda CPC items.

- A. Acceptance of trustee's committee report with recommendation to take professional students to OPEN AA meetings.
- B. Acceptance of draft of new pamphlet "If you are a professional" as long as we add back referrals from courts and treatment facilities.
- C. Acceptance of new pamphlet "AA and Employee Assistance programs" with more current wording of supervisors, personnel, and human resources and singleness of purpose emphasis.
- D. Acceptance of addition of working with students of professional schools in CPC workbook. Suggestion for changing wording "taking" to be replaced with inviting and accompanying.

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E. Agreement that CPC should assist in taking the survey and help tailor the questions with PI and Corrections. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Corrections - J.R. B [REDACTED] 41 in attendance. Recommendations: Video behind bars; shown in groups to get enthusiasm of AA's to go in. Voted on, vote yes was majority. Workbook on detention centers for kids, review items in. Do not know what the proposed changes are.

Get your adults to go and talk to young adults, voted to let delegate know that workshop agrees to let delegate put something in "workbook" for young adults- majority test.

"Memo to an Inmate" " It sure beats sitting in a cell" adequate literature? Voted majority enough literature.

Letters from GSO to Wardens and Correctional Facilities workers (1) what we do; how we do it, (2) How we started, voted majority liked shorter version (1 page) how we started.

Grapevine - Bernie T [REDACTED] chaired in Sharon K [REDACTED] absence. 20 people present. Discuss suggestion for production of 2 new grapevine related softcover books in the year 2000. Meeting opened with the serenity prayer.

Discussion opened on proposed book "Dear Grapevine". Discussion centered around what this book could contribute to AA. Vote was taken 18 yea, 1 no minority opinion heard. Expressing redundancy of the printing.

Next discussion on proposed book "AA around the world:" all comments were positive vote was unanimous to print.

Question and discussion how can I improve and help Grapevine sales in my district to grow. It was stated that we have a spanish translation of the grapevine available.

Suggestion made for group conscience to make their group treasurer, also their grapevine group rep.

Sonja told a humorous story of 1 of her alcoholic oversea's adventures. God she was wild.

Question was asked if grapevine banners were still available. Answer arrived at seemed to be no.

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Tom "Trustee" said we have plenty of spanish translations of Language of the Heart which were recently made available at half price. He also stated grapevines was it own separate sub corporation.

Suggestion was made on the use that can be made by the grapevine in jails and prisons. Stated also that the boxes of 50 back issues of the grapevine can be purchased for GSO at a much lesser charge.

Suggestion made that someday we could possible have a page in the grapevine entitled "Trustee's Corner" specializing in tidbits of information from our Trustee's.

It was stated by Tom that grapevine is the independent voice of AA.

Suggestion was made that you could give a subscription of grapevine to your sponsee's when they have a 1 year birthday.

As a group we found enthusiasm to be the success of grapevine growth. If we as trusted servants emanate enthusiasm for grapevine newcomers and people who do not know of it will want it because it excites us as trusted servants. Enthusiasm is contagious.

Idea was suggested that it would make a great grapevine article for some delegates to write of their experiences on their 1st visit to Conference in New York.

Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer for those who wished.

Intergroup - Bobbie F [REDACTED] 40 in attendance. Original planned workshop was to demonstrate website and then discuss 10 frequently asked questions about AA websites - workshop material tabled until July assembly.

We were asked to discuss 2 issues for input to our Delegate.

1. To discontinue or change format of directories.
2. Whether to list an "On line Intergroup" along with other Intergroups on line. The conclusion to the first issue after considerable discussion was keep the directory but perhaps change it somewhat. Issue #2 was a little more complicated. On-line AA meetings are not recognized by GSO as groups. "On-Line Intergroup" wants to be listed an GSO's hyperlink - along with other Intergroups that have websites. If you have no groups how can there be an Intergroup? Our conclusion Yes-No-Maybe or better yet "let's wait a while". We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Literature - Debbie W [REDACTED] 11 districts represented. Workshop was attended by 16 persons. We broke into 4 groups to discuss agenda items. The outcome of the discussion was:

1. We reviewed the pamphlet that will accompany the video - it was excellent and was approved.
2. Stories in Big Book have to be in by June - no comment.

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3. AA group pamphlet should remain as it is - don't mess with it if it's not broken.
4. 12 Step call pamphlet - need one but this one needs a lot of help - doesn't get the job done.
5. In Living Sober - we agreed with changes with a few modifications. Officers Forum killed attendance. We adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Public Information - Scott K [REDACTED] - PI Conference Actions. Should we continue with the 98' membership survey? If so, should we discontinue the race question? After much debate a show of hands showed the majority to be in favor of taking the 98 survey as well as asking the race question. It was generally felt that simply asking these questions (age, sex, race) did not imply that membership hinged upon the answer. Therefore we are not breaking any traditions. That yes, the statistics gained were important and worth the effort. The survey results itself force us to ask ourselves "Who are we missing, do we tell newcomers to get a sponsor, or to get a home group. What can we do to better attract, blacks or American Indians, treatment center patients, etc. Many in attendance stated that the survey placard helped tremendously when doing presentations. As does the membership survey pamphlet. Delegate Dick also explained that results are released to professional groups who call and ask for statistics.

Average age, average length of sobriety. Our Trustee Tom M [REDACTED] explained that news agencies call GSO frequently for information, without the survey we would be unable to give accurate information. These news agency's will publish something, it may as well as be accurate and from the horses mouth.

Treatment Facilities - Jeff H [REDACTED] 19 GSO items. We opened with the Serenity Prayer. Discussed topics related to the 1998 GSO.

1. We talked about the need for a list of suggested goals for Treatment Facilities Committees. An overwhelming majority felt there is a need for a suggested list.
2. Treatment Facility activity reports (no chairpeople for Treatment are receiving them).
3. Discussed area Temporary Contact efforts. Districts are moving forward in establishing TCP's through their local Intergroup. Some districts are using the Twelve Step call list to get started. Suggestions are needed in trying to attract more female to get involved in this program. TCP leaflets are being used to establish contact programs and inform clients.
4. Read over results of 1997 request to TFC's for sharing on carrying the message in to psychiatric/mental health facilities or state hospitals.
5. Review treatment facilities workshop and handbook. Handbook is being used widely to help start and inform committees on carrying the message, and supply temporary contact information. Very good feedback on the handbook from those who are using this valuable tool. Closed meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

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Administrative Committees

Finance Committee - Bock [REDACTED] Called to order with 6 committee members and 3 visitors. A quorum requires 7 members. The treasurer gave his report. We discussed the preliminary report given by the committee investigating a North Florida Central Office. There is an expectation that a formal proposal may surface at the July assembly.

Discussed the Conference Finance Agenda item "Self Support" with the following advisory comments: it is the sense of the committee:

1. That NFCAA consider sending additional money (currently \$1,000) to support the delegate expenses at the conference.
2. That the Conference consider increasing the minimum amount for delegate expenses (currently \$800.00)
3. That the conference make a effort to determine why the % of groups contributing is declining.
4. That NFCAA not send unrestricted contributions to GSO.
5. That an effort be made to better communicate the need to send money to GSO.

Growth - Jim B [REDACTED] 8 members present. District #19, DCM, Donald L [REDACTED], petitioned the growth committee for multiple DCM's. All 34 groups in the district were contacted. 34 groups in favor 0 against. Committee voted 6-1 in favor of District #19 having multiple DCM's.

Discussion of issues before the conference committee of policy/admissions.

- a. Review dates of 2001 General Service, voted 6-1 to let the committee choose.
 - b. Consider rounding to the next whole number if a fraction is involved when calculating the number of votes to determine substantial unanimity on the conference floor. Voted 8-0 in favor.
 - c. Consider request to revise the timetable for the election of delegates from the West Central Region to allow for a more even distribution of new delegates on each panel. Voted 8-0 in favor.
 - d. Consider the need for a conference archives committee. There was much discussion on this topic plus input from Tom M. Trustee and member of the Trustee's Archives Committee, and Scott L [REDACTED], Area Archives Chair. Vote (4-3-1) to table this motion.
3. Motion was made to extend the term of the Archives Committee Chair from 2 to 4 years. Motion was tabled due to lack of time. It will be discussed at the next Growth Committee meeting in July.

Site - Tom G [REDACTED] Had a very productive meeting with 17 in attendance which included 9 members of the Site Committee. We took up the agenda items given us by the Delegate.

Items A-D pertained to the 1999 Conference theme, presentation/discussion topics and workshop topics. After careful scrutiny we decided the best ideas had been presented by the NFAC.

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We thought the GSO Conference Evaluation form to be well thought out and to cover all aspects that need to be covered.

We all agreed that the Policy/Admissions committee's suggestion that each Conference Committee inventory itself was very sound and would be of a beneficial nature for this conference and all in the future.

We talked about the fact that the SE Regional Forum is to be held at this hotel December 4-6 1998 and it will be our responsibility to provide people to man the registration table, give rides back and forth to the airport and to provide any other services necessary while our guests from GSO are here. We need volunteers see me or a member of the Site Committee.

Most of the hour was spend discussing a proposed permanent office for the NFA. Charlotte B [REDACTED] (Chair of the sub committee) which has been studying all the apexes of setting up an office gave a very comprehensive report on their findings to date. Some of the things that have to be looked at are size, cost, how to man the office and of primary concern location. The office would be used by the secretary to do the printing of the minutes, which would save the NFA over \$2,700.00 annually. It would also give us a permanent address so there would be no more problems with the post office and our tax exempt status. It could become a permanent mailing address for all groups to send contributions to the NFAC which would elevate the problem of contributions being mailed to different locations. The NFAC archives could also be stored at this location with the possibility of some of them being displayed there. A setup of "traveling archives" could be kept by the archivist if they wanted to.

It would also be a good location for the area to store any computers or equipment that the officers or committee chairs are not using. There have been tapes and other things that have gotten misplaced over the years. This location would prevent any more losses. Anything belonging to any committees could be kept there. The materials that the Grapevine Committee has is very extensive and could be kept there also.

The interim officers meeting could be held at this location which would save a few dollars that is now spent for rent.

The Secretary, Treasurer, and Archivist would be the people that would most greatly benefit from this office.

We feel that a permanent part-time employee for 12-15 hours per week would be advised.

We would recommend a minimum of 800 square feet to do the things discussed. If archives we laid out and displayed there more room would be needed.

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It would be our thought at this time that rent, insurance, electric, and phone would probably run about \$8,000.00 per year. This of course would have to be taken up by the finance committee. We talked about the fact that there is a large sum of money in our prudent reserve and this might be a good time to put some of it to a good use.

I asked all members of the Site Committee to try to find a storefront or small house located in a commercial zone that would have a minimum of 800 square feet (preferably larger) and trying to keep the cost of rent in the \$400.00 per month or less located in the central part of the NFAC to make it easily accessible by people from anyplace in the area. If anyone has any input or ideas please convey them to Charlotte (407) 951-1165. We are hoping to have a completed proposal to present to this group at the next assembly. Sense of assembly was in favor of a central office.

Site: It was asked if at the registration table a list of who is chairing the non-committee workshops (Traditions, Service Manual, GSR Workshop, GSR Orientation) could be posted? Tom will add to the host responsibilities.

Can an TV/VCR be set up to show the various video's offered by GSO during Saturday? Tom to check on this.

Now that the "Ask the Officer's Forum" has been included in the daytime schedule; there was concern that it may cause a conflict with the other workshops that are in the same time slot as it took away attendance from the other workshops.

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One workshop will be moved to the 2:45 slot so only two workshops will be going on at the same time as the Officers Forum.

Growth: Discussed the proposal on the central office. Growth is to consider whether the NFCAA is ready for this. Finance: can we afford it, Site: Feasibility of location and proposal.

Archivist term length as been brought up to change from 2 to 4 years.

Letter received to Growth on making the Alt Delegate Growth Chair. This will be discussed at committee meeting in July.

Grapevine: Sonja asked as Alt what kind of inventory was necessary for the assembly? There is a stockpile due to the price increase and she does not have the ability to transport all the inventory. It was felt that we should sell as much of the inventory over the Big Books/Service Manual./12 & 12 to make it more manageable. Focus should be on the Grapevine and Grapevine Reps.

CPC: Janet has set up American Physical Therapy conference, service seminar in Holly Hill.

Finance: Proposed budget for 1999. With finance taking over the inventory, this should be added to the Structure and Guidelines. Motion will be discussed at the next committee meeting to have this added to the growth responsibilities.

Intergroup: Corliss G [REDACTED] was introduced. There is a workbook of Intergroup material, this will be made available as soon as possible.

Public Information: Mike has completed inventory of video's, researched projector for use at the assembly. Juvenile justice meeting was held, saw film "Message to Teenagers", information was given out.

Question was asked about what reimbursement is given to people who are asked to help with workshops that are not members of the assembly. If you invite a non-member of the assembly, the assembly is responsible for the mileage and/or room for this individual. This comes out of the approved committee's budget. If not already in the current budget this can be brought before the finance committee at an assembly to be voted on for approval to be sent to the business meeting for a vote.

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Delegates Report

I thank God everyday for my sobriety and the members of the North Florida Area Assembly for the privilege of serving as your Delegate. The 48th General Service Conference was held April 20-24th in New York. The recommendations that passed by at least 2/3's majority and became advisory actions are enclosed in your minutes. Also enclosed are the agenda items that did not pass. The service and corrections videos were both approved for distribution as were four new Public Service Announcements.

In case you were wondering I did bring the following floor action: "That the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous, Inc. return the \$150,000 transportation subsidy received from the city of San Diego for the 1995 International Convention. "Want to know what happened? Be at the July Assembly.
