

**Minutes of the Third Quarterly Assembly July 1998**  
**North Florida Area Conference**  
**Alcoholics Anonymous**

**1998 Theme "OUR TWELVE STEP WORK"**

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**JULY 19, 1998**

**Area Chair** - Kathy P opened with the Serenity Prayer. Art Currie read the Short Form of the Concepts.

**Registrar** - Joe C took Roll (included in minutes). All group changes go to Registrar. All address changes due in by August 10, 1998 to be included in the July mailing. Address corrections go out this mailing.

**Secretary** - Cecilia R asked for any changes to the April minutes. Motion made to accept April minutes as presented and seconded. PASSED.

**Treasurers Report** - Michael S : gave the treasurer's report for April-June 1998. The proposed 1999 budget was passed out and it and will be included in the minutes.

I would like again to thank all the groups for their support of service by donating to the NFAC. Any corrections to the group contribution report, give them to me at the break or after the assembly is adjourned.

Motion was made to approve report as presented and seconded. PASSED.

**Delegates Report** - Dick G - Past Delegates Dan E., Jimmy G. & Tom D. were recognized.

Last assembly we went over the agenda items and the members gave me an sense of the assembly. You also gave me the right of decision. I am going to go over the highlights of the GSO April 1998 Conference. I will also go to your districts and give a report upon request.

Conference Advisory Actions of the 48th General Service Conference that PASSED.

Floor action on changes to the Living Sober from the pamphlet "The AA member - Medications and Other Drugs". These originally did not pass however minority opinion brought back for vote and changes passed.

Agenda theme for 1999 was selected.

Cooperation With the Professional Community draft revision of pamphlet to replace "AA and Employee Assistance Program" with "Is There an Alcoholic in the Workplace?".

Corrections Facilities video entitled "Carrying the Message Behind These Walls", was approved and I strongly encourage all districts to purchase one for their library.

Literature video entitled "Your AA General Service Office, the Grapevine and the General Service Structure" was approved. Again I strongly encourage all districts to purchase one for their library.

## NFACAA 3RD quarter/July Minutes

A draft form of the 4th edition of the Big Book is continuing to be developed. A 6 member committee is reviewing all stories submitted. Must pass through all six members to go on. Don't expect to see this for awhile.

Policy/Admission Conference Archives committee composed of nine delegates passed after reconsideration on a 93 to 31 vote.

Public Information four PSA's were approved.

Membership Survey passed. This was never discussed on the floor. There was not an option to vote on the race question. I have given out to the districts the survey and they need to be back by August 14, 1998.

Conference Advisory Actions of the 48th General Service Conference that DID NOT PASS.

CPC committee reviewed the CPC kit regarding working with students of professional schools at open meetings only.

Finance Committee Birthday Plan envelopes be sent to Delegates annually. I have brought back more envelopes. Some groups are putting their group # and medallions in them for birthday members.

Discount or subsidy which would be offered to any other organization when offered to AA must be declined.

Grapevine Committee considered a soft cover anthology tentatively called AA Around the World comprised of Grapevine articles.

Trustee Committee wanted diversity statement removed from the vacancy announcement letters mentioning women and people of color to serve.

### Other items discussed:

Report & Charter reviewed para by para of service manual revisions to send to floor as was. Background material not yet available so that was not sent to the floor. Draft form in work for presentation to next year's conference.

Directory was addressed, recommended that it be published as in the past. It was discussed rather than have GSR name and phone #, that the Intergroup be listed instead. Little support for this and did not go to the floor.

Gary Gl has said he will be appointing a committee prior to the next bid process to set up guidelines for Conferences/Conventions.

I brought the issue of cash incentives vs rebates re the San Diego Convention as a floor action. It was not taken up and when I was given my 2 minutes to speak from the floor I read the following:

This issue is not about cash or non-cash incentives. It is about the solicitation of \$300,000.00 from the City of San Diego by a Ad Hoc member of the San Diego Bid Committee. He went to the Mayor and requested financial assistance from the City. The Mayor went to the City Council whom had never offered an incentive to an convention before. The City Council offered a \$250,000.00 incentive from public funds to bring the AA convention to San Diego. During the same period, they denied funds to at least one other convention.

A resulting article in the San Diego Tribune was sent to the General Service Board, who forwarded it to the International Convention/Regional Forum Committee. They discussed it at their July 1988 meeting. The committee reported it would express its concerns to the San Diego/Imperial County Area Assembly about the inappropriate mechanisms used by their bid committee, which involved AA in the public sector. In October of 1988 San Diego was awarded the bid. In March of 1989 a "letter of commitment was signed with the City of San Diego for a \$150,000.00 inducement" to offset transportation costs.

There was also a letter with the Convention & Visitors Bureau providing \$3.00 per occupied room night up to \$150,000.00. This is additional the \$100,000.00 received, that was available to anyone and not a part of this issue. The \$150,000.00 clearly was not offered to any other organization of similar size requiring a purchased service or product of similar character and magnitude. These funds were offered only to AA and we need to return the money to the City of San Diego.

In all honestly I must tell you that San Diego has subsidized other conventions since that time.

**Alternate Delegate** - Corrinne F - No report.

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### **Standing Committees**

**Accessibilities** - Joe K ; chaired in Azubah's absence. - 20 in attendance. Meeting began with the Serenity Prayer. Discussion topic was "How do you handle accessibility problems at your personal group and district levels". We had a very lively interchange of information ranging from how to make hearing and sight impaired people more comfortable at meetings to setting up special transportation for wheelchair bound people. Information was shared concerning some of the problems individuals have had with access to buildings and vehicles. One solution was to make certain services are available on a request basis ie signers/interpreters or wheelchair lifts vans - "Be prepared". Fix it before it breaks. Plan before need. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

**Archives** - Scott L - The meeting was opened in the usual manner and past archivist Kevin B. shared with the group on the importance of the NFAA having a permanent location for the Secretary & Treasurer and the benefit it would have to be able to house and display the archives. We talked about what would be going on in Akron in Sept and I also mentioned that work Dick G. and his fellow Delegates did by giving the archives a forum to meet with the GSO archives. I would also like to thank the members of District 31 Joe C. and his wife donating Kenny V's 12 & 12 to the NFAA archives and explained to them how most of the Kenny V's books and papers should be put into their archives. The archives will be at Leesburg's workshop in Sept. and I would like to see everyone in October.

I would like to thank all of Holly Hill for inviting the archives to their workshop last May. It was a pleasure bringing the archives to your workshop and receiving the donation of the 1st edition 4th printing with Bills full signature donated by Jim & Trish in Ormond Beach. I will be taking it to Akron to be authenticated and have the archivist from Arkansas restore it to its original condition.

It was also my pleasure to be invited to the longtimers meeting by Alt Del. Corrinne Fail and the history I was able to provide her for her presentation.

**Cooperation with Professional Community** - Janet L 23 people present.  
We opened with the serenity prayer. Thanks go to Bill Hunter who organized AA exhibit at American Physical Therapy Association in Orlando. Thanks to Norm D. for inviting me to speak at the Service Seminar in Holly Hill. I appreciate Jim W invitation to the Service Seminar in Leesburg 9-12-98. Thanks to Don L Alternate CPC Chairperson for sharing his service progression.

GSO CPC action taken includes:

- a) Addition to CPC kit of working with students of professional schools to be implemented at the next printing.
- b) The committee encourages AA members to bring students of professional schools to open AA meetings and
- c) Draft revision of "AA and Employee Assistance Programs" be approved with title "Is There an Alcoholic in the Workplace"? (In the section to the co-worker, recommendation is to delete the line "Al-Anon is not affiliated with AA, but its contribution to increased understanding of the AA recovery program has been substantial" to "Though it is entirely separate from Alcoholics Anonymous, it uses the general principles of the AA program as a guide for husbands, wives, relatives, friends, and others close to alcoholics". A pilot study for physicians was discussed.

Thanks to Susan K , CPC in Jacksonville, for her report and including a study of the traditions as part of their CPC meeting. Good luck to Fred Ramirez, CPC in Gainesville, for starting planning for a full-day panel for professionals. We closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

**Corrections:** JR B chaired. 34 in attendance. Open meeting with the Serenity Prayer then Jack T. read the Traditions. Then Elmer C. read about the first AA meetings in prison in 1942 and the first group was in 1944 from prison thank god. JR asked how many people were taking meetings in prison and more than half raised their hands.

We had a talk about getting people to read in meetings in prison. Like how it works and we told him something's to do that work for us.

Then we went to watch the tape, it is called "Carrying the Message behind the Walls". Very good tape showing how much the person gets inside his heart by doing this. Then JR talked about the tape. JR closed meeting the Lord's Prayer.

**Grapevine** - Sharon K chaired. 9 people present. Opened with the Lord's Prayer. The printout from New York on subscriptions in the North Florida Area have less than 1,100 subscriptions. South Florida has over 4,000.

October is going to be Grapevine month. DCM's will get a copy of what New York has for Grapevine Rep. We have \$547.00 in sales.

**Intergroup** - Corliss G 23 in attendance. Discussed web sites. Three Intergroups shared information on their web sites. GSO has suggested that Intergroups with web sites contact them in order for GSO to have more group experience to share.

We discussed the 10 frequently asked questions about AA Websites.. There was a bit of discussion on how to set up AA web sites, what information is suitable. What about anonymity and the GSO AA web site. We had questions on what GSO was planning to do to give guidelines for the Internet.

**Literature** - Debbie W Workshop was attended by 23 persons. Literature Committee Conference approved the video "Your AA General Service Office, the Grapevine and the General Service Structure" for distribution. Our committee viewed the video with enthusiasm. After discussion ensued about the video and service. After meeting a hearing impaired member approached Chair to ask about closed caption for this population. We will write GSO about this matter. I want to thank Michael PI Chair for the video.

**Public Information** - Michael M - Theme - what materials are available at General Service Offices for Public Information. 20 in attendance. The following was discussed, the catalog from General Service Office which lists all AA conference-approved literature and other AA Service Material, Special Public Information Discount Packages. Also discussed the new PSA's emphasizing membership of young people, minorities and generic AA information. We also discussed the frequently asked questions about AA web sites, some information that can be found on GSO's AA web site in English, French and Spanish General Service Conference approved "AA fact file", List of Central Offices/Intergroups in US/Canada, a letter directed to Professionals, including an e-mail response form for the professional to request additional information about AA, Conference approved AA pamphlets "Is AA For You" and "A Newcomer-Asks" in 1997 the web site was visited 214,603 times and currently there is an average 750 hits daily. The web site address is [www.alcoholics-anonymous.org](http://www.alcoholics-anonymous.org). We also discussed putting AA meeting notices in church bulletins under Parish Calendar.

Also for your information here are the 1998 General Service Advisory Actions on Public Information:  
Advisory action #18- the four proposed television PSA's emphasizing membership of young people, minorities and generic information was approved.  
Advisory action #19 - PSA's TV-25 & TV-34 be removed from inventory and made into one PSA.  
Advisory action #20 - The 1998 AA Membership Survey will be conducted by area on a random basis as was done in the 1996 AA Membership Survey.  
Estimates of AA groups and members worldwide as of 1/1/98 Groups-97,568 Members - 1,967,433.

A reminder in Public Information service work personal appearance is important, and we are not experts on the topic of alcoholism and speak only as members of AA and not AA as a whole. Meeting closed with the Lords Prayer.

**Treatment Facilities** - Jeff H - Went over the GSO report on suggested goals for Treatment Centers. Explained the need for more District Treatment Chairpeople and how the Treatment Facilities Handbook is a great source of Information for new and people currently involved in Treatment Facility Committees. Discussed ways of getting new committees started. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

### Administrative Committees

**Finance Committee** - Bock F Called to order with 9 committee members and 15 visitors. Meeting opened with the Serenity Prayer. Cecilia R. Secretary and J.R. Corrections Chair made presentations regarding their budgets. Treasurer made regular report. Committee discussed and approved a software and memory upgrade for the Secretary (\$120.00). Committee discussed and approved a request from the Area Chair to allow a one-time expense for hotel room for dual coverage of the Grapevine Rep (does not increase the budget). Committee discussed and approved a mileage request by Secretary for logistics requirement to acquire new envelopes for the minutes (\$21.80).

The committee discussed and approved a motion to change the Structures and Guidelines to add to description of duties for the Finance Committee. "5) maintain a current inventory of capital equipment (ie computers, printers, recording equipment)".

The committee met in separate session to review the proposed budget. After discussion and amendments the committee approved the proposed budget which will be brought before the Assembly in October for approval (\$37, 975).

**Growth** - Jim B 9 of 12 committee members present. 26 people in attendance. Old business: Motion to change the term of the Archives Committee from 2 years to 4 years was withdrawn. There was alot of opposition to 4 year terms for any service position. Consideration should be given to having a permanent Archivist sometime in the future. Refer to Tradition 8.

New Business: A motion was presented to the Growth Committee to have the Alternate Delegate chair the Growth Committee or make the Site Committee a separate chair. After much discussion the Growth Committee is recommending by a vote of 8 in favor, 0 opposed and 1 abstained, to have the North Florida Area Chairperson appoint the Site Chair in the same manner that the other committee chairs are appointed.

**Site** - Tom G - Meeting opened with Chairman, 9 members and 23 others in attendance. We began with discussion about table in lobby which contains flyers complaints that have come in about non AA literature that is being put on it. Motion was made to leave as it but put a disclaimer on table that the NFA does not endorse or approve any of the events advertised there. Discussion followed, vote was taken and motion was defeated 5-4. Another motion was made that anything put on table would have to be hosted by NFA, a district, a group or an intergroup and proceeds would benefit AA. All items in the future will have to first be cleared by Site Committee Chair. Passed. Minority opinion was heard.

We had much discussion about a site for a NFA office and are bringing forth the following motion which will be published in the minutes and voted on at the October Assembly. Move to create the NFA office in the Ocala area to be used for:

- 1) Permanent mailing address for NFA.
- 2) Permanent mailing address for groups to send donations.
- 3) House copier to print, collate, and staple NFA minutes.
- 4) Temp controlled place to store and display archives.
- 5) Hold quarterly officers meetings.
- 6) Store Grapevine materials.
- 7) Store equipment and supplies for the NFA.

The approximate cost will be \$15,000, which will include rent, insurance, all utilities, including phone, part time help @\$7.00 per hr for 12 hr per weekly, opening expenses (ie deposits, paying deposits and cost of office equipment).

Need hosts for the January 1999 assembly.

December 4-6 Southeast Regional Forum, Daytona Beach, this hotel.

We need help with the voting assembly. Anyone who is not voting members of the assembly please volunteer. Will need 40-50 people. Volunteer list will be at the registration table.

Question was asked about the San Diego rebates vs cash incentives. Motion was made to ADD TO THE 1999 AGENDA TO CHANGE BOARD POLICY TO ELIMINATE ACCEPTANCE OF CASH INCENTIVES FOR CONVENTION LOCATION. Discussion was held. Motion Failed. Minority opinion was heard.

Motion to send letter to the board to send back the \$150,000 received by San Diego for convention.

Amendment to motion: Send any interest if any was earned as well.

Motion PASSED 80 yes 27 no. Minority opinion was heard.

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**New Business**

Motion from Site: MOVE THAT NOTHING BE PUT ON THE INFORMATION TABLE THAT IS NOT HOSTED OR SUPPORTED BY NORTH FLORIDA AREA. A DISTRICT, A GROUP, OR AN INTERGROUP AND PROCEEDS WOULD BENEFIT AA. Motion Passed. Minority opinion was heard. All items will have to be cleared through the Site Committee Chair.

Patrick O spoke as Chair of the 1999 State Convention in Daytona Beach Adams Mark Hotel. Volunteer sheets and pre registration forms were put on each of the District tables.

Chet P Chair of the 2000 State Convention in Orlando August 9-13. Theme is We Stood at the Turning Point.
