September 16, 2000

Area Chair - Cecilia R. opened with the Serenity Prayer and Anonymity Statement. John P. read the Short Form of the Concepts.

Registrar - Jeff H. took Roll (see page 12). All group changes go to Registrar.

Secretary - Corliss G. made the following changes to the July minutes:

- Kathy recognized all Past Delegates in the room: Jimmy G., Tom D., Dan E., Dick G. and Dick P.
- Conference Reports and Survey on International Conventions were passed out earlier. Please mail surveys back to Kathy by December 1st so she can compile results and send to GSO. If anyone in your District has questions on Conference Report, don't hesitate to call Kathy.
 - Kathy will be traveling to Southeastern Conference in Louisiana in October and Southeast Regional Forum in November.
 - Southeast Regional Forum will be held November 17-19 in Huntington, WV. Registration forms should be available locally through your Intergroups, or call Kathy.
 - Box 459 highlights events of International Convention, introduced our new Class A Trustee and two new Class B Trustees. New anthology from Grapevine, AA Around the World, appears in 459 with a short preview of what to expect in the book.
 - Grapevine is going ahead with its plan to outsource for product fulfillment; this will help reduce costs. We still need all of you to subscribe to the Grapevine.
 - Starting January 2001, a package will be sent to all Area Chairs and Area Registrars/Group record keepers (copying all Delegates) advising that it is time for annual updates to directories. A letter advising about these updates, a sample group information sheet, a set of explanations and procedures and questions on how you would like to receive the updates - you can choose group

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procedures and questions on how you would like to receive the updates – you can choose group information sheets or diskettes. Look for this mailing and keep dates posted that will be sent with this information.

- Literature – The Fourth Edition Big Book Committee will be reviewing edited new stories in early October prior to regularly scheduled meeting late October. Pamphlet for Black/African American Alcoholics has reviewed 14 edited stories and is still working on further editing. Subcommittees also met on pamphlet for older alcoholics and AA is Spiritual Rather than Religious. Draft of a Special Needs pamphlet prepared by AAWS Services Committee is being returned to Committee for final review prior to distribution as service material in pamphlet format.
- Concepts Checklist – There was a subcommittee appointed to revise the Concepts Checklist since at least one error was found. It was suggested that the question "What are the Conference Bylaw?" under Concept VII in the Current Concepts Checklist be deleted and the word "notion" be replaced by "Principle". After the corrections, it was suggested that Concepts Checklist be made available to the Fellowship.
- At the Conference there were discussions on the 12 Concepts of World Service being added to the 4th Edition of the Big Book. Christopher (DCM, District 17) will be coming to the mike with a motion in regard to this topic.
- Daily Reflections desktop flip book will be available for \$10.75 with 20% quantity discount. English and Spanish versions are available through the office as items B53 and B54. The new jacket covers will be available (item # B9C).
- Request from Susan, Conference Coordinator, that as soon as elections are over, I send a list of newly elected officers to GSO. I will be going out and giving my Conference report to a few more Districts during the next 2 months and tomorrow we will have a new Delegate for the North Florida Area Assembly.
- "I wish at this time to thank my husband for the countless hours he has helped me during the last two years. I would also like to thank Dick and Carolyn G. for all the help and support they have been in the last four years. Our past delegates Dan E., Tom D., Jimmy G., Dick P. and Tom T. At the October 28th Interim Officers meeting, we will be meeting at the Sheraton in Gainesville. Both Panel 49 and 51 will be invited to attend. Chairperson and Officer Orientation are to be held at this time.

Standing Committees

Accessibilities - Joe K., Chair – 15 in attendance.

Workshop opened with the "Serenity Prayer". We talked about all of the topics we have discussed during the past two years. Discussion included suggestions for the new Chairperson, i.e., creating a District Accessibility Chair list early on in the term. It was suggested that anyone standing for the position of Chair of Accessibilities be willing to do so with a responsible determination. The Chair thanked everyone for supporting Accessibilities and reminded them that they are the front line in carrying the message to their home groups. Meeting closed with the "Lord's Prayer".

Archives – Chip R., Chair – 26 in attendance.

Opened the meeting and started by showing our new display cases. Both are made of beech wood. Both cases are beautiful. In going through our archives, I found a 1950 directory and a 1955 Alanon World Directory – and the ledger for the area from 1957. There will be an Archives get together on December 9 in Cocoa in District 15 hosted by the Central Brevard group. Flyers will be sent out.

I talked about where I felt I fell short as the Archives Chair. I then offered the incoming Archives Chair any and all help possible. Thanks to the people of Panel 49 for allowing me to serve A.A. in this level. I will never forget these last two years. God bless you all.

Cooperation with Professional Community – Dale T., Chair – 18 in attendance.

After reading the CPC purpose, thanks was given to those who assisted in manning the two CPC exhibits during the last quarter. Passed around a sign-up sheet of names, phone numbers. A discussion of what we have done in the last quarter and what we plan to do in the next quarter. This discussion included contacting nursing students, physicians and clergy.

Plans are to develop a newsletter for CPC area people to communicate between assemblies. A mention of using email was suggested for this communication. One district had hopes of giving Grapevine subscriptions to doctors, but instead give the Grapevine to doctors directly.

Corrections - Walter M., Chair - 35 in attendance.

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Meeting opened with moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Mailouts' addresses were checked by those attending for accuracy and the volunteer list increased from 60 to 70. The North/South workshop was held last week in Orlando with none of the DOC staff in attendance.

Consistency and flexibility are sought after goals of Corrections Committee. Consistency among the prisons of the qualifications of volunteers and flexibility in individual cases, because no one knows a prisoner better than an ex-con.

Cecilia R. reported about upcoming South Florida Area General Service Corrections Workshop and encouraged people to attend. She also pitched districts to make available GSO "Corrections Facilities Kit" to members doing correction meetings. Recent changes at the State level of DOC will affect state facilities.

Elmer passed around a new confidential pre release mailing list for additions.

Meeting closed with the Lords Prayer.

Grapevine - Jackie C., Chair - 4 in attendance.

The meeting opened at 3:15pm with the Serenity Prayer. Circulation is down 811 worldwide, 40 in the North Florida area. Grapevine is promoting another half price subscription, 20 per area. The attendants at the Grapevine Committee meeting took full advantage of this offer to help spread the Grapevine to their districts. We discussed the fact that the skit "Ebby" which was introduced last year at the Assembly is being performed in 2 districts very soon, one in Longwood on Oct 28 and one in Melbourne on Oct 7. I read p. 53 from the August issue of the Grapevine - it was a very good explanation of what the Grapevine is all about. We discussed the "Chain of Command" as presented in the service manual, pg S80. We then broke up into 4 small groups and each wrote a couple of paragraphs about what it is like here at the NFAA. Marcus will take these home and put all together to present to the Grapevine. Dan discussed his personal experience with the Grapevine. He encouraged us all to participate in service - there are no excuses. Dan also has let us borrow his Grapevine display board for this Assembly. Thank you, Dan!!! Thank you for a great 2 years.

Intergroup - Fred H., Chair - 37 in attendance.

The Area Chair has requested a statement and outline reflecting the duties for the Area Intergroup Chair. Mike J., Alt. Intergroup Chair, presented and discussed a proposed outline as follows:

The statement of purpose contained in the Area Structures and Guidelines was reviewed.

It reads: "This committee serves as a liaison between Area intergroups and the members of the North Florida Area, facilitating 'mutual cooperation and harmony, to their benefit of the entire Fellowship'. (pg S98)

A list of some of the possible goals of this Committee was developed and included:

- Offering Intergroups/Central Offices serving Groups in the North Florida Assembly Area a forum for sharing their strength, hope and experience with each other to maximize efficiency and effectiveness in supporting groups.
- Establishing a communications link to foster greater unity and opportunities for educating the AA general membership about the benefits of service through alternative methods of carrying the message other than face-to-face 12th Step work.
- Cooperative efforts to promote our singleness of purpose through fellowship activities leading to greater and closer networking amongst AA members throughout - and at all levels within - the North Florida Area.

A recommended, clearer, statement of purpose might be:

The purpose of the North Florida Area intergroup Committee is to foster and develop, to the greatest extent possible, cooperation between the Intergroups/Central Offices, the Districts and Groups they serve, and the North Florida Area Committee. The intended goals of this spirit of cooperation will be to increase the ability of these entities to minimize duplication of efforts and expenses in furtherance of AA's singleness of purpose in carrying the messages of Recovery, Unity and Service to the still suffering alcoholic and to the general membership in local Groups and meetings.

Literature - LeRoy L., Chair - 25 in attendance.

Workshop opened with a moment of silence for Pat P., may her memory be eternal.

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The AA guideline on the Literature Committee were read on the scope of the Committee. This states Literature Committee is to inform the groups on what AA World Service publish and encourage them to purchase AA approved literature.

The AA guidelines were presented by Past Delegate, Tom D., and these were discussed by everyone. It was pointed out there is a lot of important information that is free from GSO. We should share this with the public, Doctors, Correction and treatment centers. But we must follow the rules of the facility about what is allowed.

Next was a lively discussion on should the 12 Concepts be included in the 4th Edition of the Big Book that is still underway. The group was divided between yes and unsure, with the majority being for it. During this discussion it was brought up on how to make a motion at the Assembly and that an individual could send an opinion directly to GSO.

The meeting closed with a moment of silence for those who have passed and the Lords Prayer.

Public Information – Charlie T., Chair – 22 in attendance.

- Meeting opened with the Serenity Prayer. Asked if anyone had videos checked out to return before my term was up. Announced that results of PI Committee's survey was printed and mailed (Attachment 2).
- Committee wishes to recommend incoming NFAA Chair that Alternate, Charlotte B., be successor.
- Question and discussion on a newspaper with anonymity breaks – gave copy of letter from New York to pass on. Discussion how NFAA helps local PI and Districts and then discussed how to get message into schools. Passed on paper of a "pilot program" for schools.
- Discussed topic of AA booth at a craft fair and appropriate ways to handle this.
- Ad hoc committee wanted any feedback on possible web site for NFAA and we discussed this.
- Then discussed whether we wanted to go to Assembly to recommend New York produce a new PSA to be geared to the holiday season and we will bring this up under new business.
- Thanks and closed with Lords Prayer.

Treatment Facilities - Fred W., Chair – 51 in attendance.

Dale T. spoke for a short time on "Cooperation with the Professional Community" Committee activities. Thereafter, Marty K. chaired the meeting. A workshop continued with discussions on singleness of purpose, dual-diagnosis and GSO guidelines related to those topics. Discussion also addressed working within facility guidelines and temporary contact within Districts and Intergroups. Please allow me to thank all participants in our workshops and Cecilia for letting me serve the fellowship. Meeting closed in the usual manner.

Administrative Committees

Finance Committee – Tom H., Chair

Opened with the Serenity Prayer.

- Treasurer gave out report for last 2 months, a review of the proposed budget showed no changes.
- NFAA web site Ad Hoc Committee – an interim report was presented on the progress to date. The Committee will continue developing guidelines and other suggestions.
- Taping of meetings – the two proposals which were received by the Finance Chair were reviewed and discussed. The Committee felt that we should use our own (NFAA) equipment to tape the business meetings and not contract with any business for the speaker meeting. The motion carried – minority report was heard but the vote stood. As a consequence there will be no taping of the speaker meetings.
- The Committee then took up the concept of what a prudent reserve should be for NFAA. The sense of the Committee was to recommend to the incoming Finance Committee to set a 9 month time frame as a prudent reserve.
- Meeting closed with the Lords Prayer.

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Report from Web Site Ad Hoc Committee – Tom D. Chair

Committee was selected from volunteers after the last quarterly assembly (only 3 members volunteered). The members are: Tom D. (Chair, Orlando), James T. (Cape Canaveral), Jeff H. (Edgewater), Pete C. (Orlando). A meeting was scheduled for Sept 10th. Prior to the meeting all members did much research on website design and maintenance. We also observed the principles of the 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts of Alcoholics Anonymous in our discussions. We found we have much work to do and will have a full report in January.

Growth – Rick B., Chair – 10 Committee members in attendance.

A moment of silence in memory of Tony S. and then the Serenity Prayer.
Agenda item: Non-rotating archivist report.

Report from Non-Rotating Ad Hoc Committee – Jimmy G., Chair

Joe C. and Jim B. are on the Committee. After having talked with people from all over the Southeast and compiling all information, it is our opinion that it is a good idea. There should be a 5 member Committee. NFAA should create the position and further detail worked out through the Archives Committee.

Jimmy G. was given the floor to answer question from the last Assembly. Jimmy had prepared a packet of information to give the Committee members the information in detail of how other areas had set up their non-rotating archivist. Jimmy's Committee had developed a recommendation that the North Florida Area should approve the position of non-rotating archivist and that further details; i.e., guidelines, budget, location, who should fill the position, etc. be worked out by the Archives Committee. Proposal passed 9 for and 0 against (Chair not voting).

Agenda Item: Should NFAA redistrict the area for DCM Districts?

Much discussion was held on why this was needed; i.e., DCMs not able to travel to their District group meetings because of distance; lack of funding due to small amounts of groups in a District, etc. It was generally felt that the answer to the problems was not in changing boundaries but in getting enough DCMs in a District to serve the groups. A proposal was made to change the Structures and Guidelines wording to change the amount of groups needed to go from single DCM to multiple DCMs from "thirty" to "twenty", page 12 – 12. Redistricting the area.

Motion passed – for 9, against 0 (Chair not voting).

Agenda item regarding web page was withdrawn.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Site and Agenda – Michael S., Chair – 7 of 11 DCMs present

Thanked 13, 26 and 28 for hosting.

Revised guidelines for Host Committee and Hotel selection were finalized – to be included in minutes (Attachment 3).

Motion made that the North Florida Area Assembly create the position of non-rotating archivist and it is suggested that the details, budget, who will fill the position, where the archives will be displayed/stored, etc. be worked out by the Archives Committee.

Discussion: Question: Does this change Structures and Guidelines? Answer: No

Motion PASSED, no minority opinion given.

Motion from Growth Committee:

Motion made to change Structures and Guidelines as follows:

Page 12, paragraph 17. "Redistricting the Area", be changed to read:

"When a District has grown such that the DCM can no longer effectively serve all groups (*twenty* or more), the District may petition the Area Assembly (pg S52) to elect multiple DCMs (one for each *ten* groups). The multiple DCMs will perform all the duties of a DCM and will have a vote at the Area Assembly."

As this will be a change to Structures and Guidelines, this will be printed in the minutes and voted on at the January 2001 Assembly.

Motion from Finance Committee:

Motion made that the recommended 2001 budget as presented in the minutes be accepted.

Motion PASSED, no minority opinion given.

Motion from Floor (Christopher, DCM 17):

Motion that our area send a letter to The Trustee's Literature Committee supporting the inclusion of the Concepts in the Appendix section of the Fourth Edition of the Big Book.

Seconded. Discussion ensued.

Motion PASSED, minority opinion given – newcomers have enough trouble understanding the Big Book as is, no need to confuse them further.

Motion from Floor (Christopher, DCM 17):

Motion that our area recommend to the 2001 General Service conference that an Ad Hoc Ways and Means Committee be appointed to discuss and present to the 2002 Conference their ideas and suggestions on how our General Services may become fully self-supporting through AA member and group contributions. Seconded. Discussion ensued with Christopher giving some figures on how literature makes up for shortfall

Motion to Table. Seconded. Discussion ensued with explanation that if motion is to go to 2001 General Conference, it must go to New York prior to January 15, 2001.

Motion to Table FAILED, no 2/3 majority

Original Motion: Discussion ensued

Motion FAILED. Minority opinion given – members have gotten used to having literature pay our way – how do we change this? Statement: We have a Finance Committee in New York. Write them letters and ask that we become self-supporting.

From the Floor

Michael S. referred to page 6 in July 2000 minutes; i.e., "**Motion** that North Florida Area formalize

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a bid process for taping the business and speakers meetings starting in January 2001. Seconded. **Motion PASSED**, no minority. He stated that the Finance Committee was charged to make a selection from the bids which have been received. Finance Committee did not do this – they voted not to have the Assemblies taped by an outside individual. Chair asked Finance Committee to meet and readdress the issue.

Motion from Floor (PI Committee Chair, Charlie T.):

Motion to have the Delegate of the NFAA write a letter to New York General Service Office PI Committee asking them to consider for an Advisory Action the production of a new public service announcement that would be specific to the holidays.

Seconded. Discussion ensued

Motion to amend as follows: Change "holidays" to "holiday season". Seconded. Discussion ensued

Motion to amend amendment as follows: Change "holidays" to "year-end holiday". Seconded. Discussion ensued. **Motion to amend amendment FAILED**.

Motion to amend PASSED. Minority opinions given

Motion from majority voter to reconsider motion – had heard enough minority opinion to change mind. Seconded. Discussion

Motion to reconsider FAILED. We will not reconsider motion. Minority opinion given.

Chair – Cecilia R.

Announced that if you do not have a blue dot on your name tag, you will not receive a ballot for voting at tomorrow's voting assembly. She read from service manual the qualifications for each service position and asked candidates to stand.

Chair asked for motion to adjourn, so moved and seconded.

Site Advisory Board of State Convention, Cecilia R. – a check for \$3,000 from the 44th State Convention is turned over to Treasurer – same amount was sent to South Florida

Treasurer, Ginny S., wants all expenses for current chairs/officers no later than December 15 so the

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books can be closed.

Growth, Rick B., motion from growth is on agenda for January to change Structures and Guidelines. The funding is closed for the Ad Hoc Committee to research the non-rotating archivist. The Growth Committee will continue to oversee this process.

Site/Agenda Committee, Michael S., handed out updated host committee duties and hotel site selection guidelines (enclosed). Betty Stevens, Southeastern Regional Trustee, will be at the Assembly in January.

There was an orientation for all new officers and committee chairs.

There is a new process to submit bids for the International Convention and an individual from Ft. Lauderdale asked the North Florida area if we could elicit support from all of our groups so they may make their bid and have it in by the deadline of mid-November. Consensus was that this was not possible.

Chair's Comments:

I attended the Florida State Convention Advisory Committee meeting in October. Reports from the 44th State Convention stated that over 2,200 people attended and a check for \$3,000.00 was given to the North Florida Area. The 45th Convention is running well. The 46th have set their dates for the 2002 convention being July 24-29 in Tampa. The bid package has been updated and sent out. If you are interested in bidding on a State Convention contact the Chair for a package.

We started out the year with an Area Inventory held in January. The results which have been implemented during the course of the year to include, DCM district reports at the Officer's/DCM meeting held on Saturday afternoons. Ending of 7th Tradition collections during the workshops on Saturday and selling of Structures and Guidelines. A standardized GSR orientation and assembly site change.

We were fortunate to have as speakers the South Florida Delegate Brenda S., Area Secretary Corliss G. and Warren S. our Southeast Regional Correspondent from the GSO office in July.

Ad Hoc committees were created for a Non-rotating Archivist, guidelines for the creation of a web site for the NFA; the Computer Use Policy was adopted.

The Area voted; the Districts requested and the Chair dispensed all the literature that was held by the area.

In summary the Area saw a year of growth in service, changing the way we do business, "listening to our Customers" the GSR's and DCM's. Your participation this past year in your group, district and area show the commitment necessary to achieve success in service.

Delegate's Corner:

Bill called from GSO, Public Information desk, and reported that they received our motion and it will go to the Trustee's Committee. It was a Conference action that an Advisory Action would need a price tag attached. Bill said an estimate would be \$30,000, since each PSA is done in English, Spanish, and French. Since our motion was for a seasonal video, the play time would be much shorter than a regular PSA. PI has a video in process currently so the PI Committee may not have \$60,000. These figures are estimates. Bill will keep us informed during the process.

Valerie O., Trustees' Literature Committee, received our request "to add the short form of the Concepts of World Service to the Appendix to the 4th Edition of the book Alcoholics Anonymous." This request was on the agenda for the Trustees' Literature Committee, because they had received a prior request from a member in North Carolina. They will meet October 28th and then we will know more.

The November issue of the Grapevine is putting out a call for articles from the Southeast. That is us, so write an article for the Grapevine. And, buy a subscription for a Sponsee, friend, or group member.

I enjoyed the Southeastern in Louisiana and am looking forward to the Forum in West Virginia, November 17-19. I hope to see many of you there. Thank you once again for allowing me to serve as your Panel 49 Delegate. It has been a wonderful two years and a blessing in my life.

General

 - B) Traditions workshop
 - C) Speaker meeting
(usually Sat night or Sun morning)

- 6) Smile and greet people.

Setup

- 1) The hotel will provide the registration and Grapevine/Literature tables. Set out the name tags on the registration table (Orange for new GSR's, white for returning GSR's, green for guests.) Set out three sign in pads with pens (Officers/Cmte Chairs, DCM's, GSR's). Hang the meeting room signs.

Friday

- 1) Registration should begin at 5:00pm and remain staffed until 9:00pm. The Chair or Secretary shall provide the NFAC Structures & Guidelines and Service Manuals. These are to be sold and the money given to the Treasurer. The Site & Agenda Committee Chair should provide 300 copies of the agenda, ask the hotel to make more copies if necessary. At least two people should staff this table throughout the assembly. Many host districts rotate staff in two-hour intervals.
- 2) It is the NFACAA group conscience that there be no smoking in the registration lobby; smoking should be limited to the smoking room or outside.
- 3) Coffee for Friday is entirely the responsibility of the host districts. A coffee order form provided by the Treasurer should be signed by the host person responsible for ordering coffee and by the hotel when coffee is delivered. The coffee order form should be used for the entire assembly and returned to the treasurer at the end of the assembly. The host districts keep the seventh tradition from the discussion meeting and the coffee can donations to defray cost of coffee. The cost of coffee is usually approx \$120, but can range from \$85 to \$200. The hosts districts should pay the hotel front desk for Friday night coffee. The host districts may keep any money collected in excess of the cost of coffee and the host districts should pay any money short.
- 4) The Grapevine booth should be staffed by at least one person during the same hours the registration table is open.
- 5) The host districts are responsible for selecting chair and readers for the open discussion meeting. The topic should be service related.

Saturday

- 1) Continue to staff the registration table and Grapevine booth from 8:00am – 9:00pm.
- 2) Continue to order coffee as necessary.
- 3) Pass the seventh tradition buckets at the speaker meeting only.. (Don't forget to pass the bucket to the front tables). All money should be counted; the amount should be written on the seventh tradition form/envelope provided by the treasurer and returned to the treasurer as soon as counted. Do not hold on to any monies.
- 4) Someone should take notes/minutes of each Committee (Finance, Growth, Site & Agenda, Accessibilities, Archives, Corrections, CPC, Grapevine, Intergroup, Literature, PI, and Treatment) meeting and turn them in to the Committee Chair at the end of the meeting.

- 5) Select someone to chair the Traditions Workshop. The chair should be someone who is very familiar with the NFAC as well as the Traditions. (Current and past trustees, delegates, area officers, and DCMs are good choices to chair.) The format for these meetings is up to the chair. The Traditions Workshop should focus on three (Jan: 1-3, Apr: 4-6, Jul: 7-9, Oct: 10-12). Allow ample time for questions and answers.
- 6) The host districts are responsible for selecting the chair, readers, and speaker for the open speaker meeting.

Sunday

- 1) Continue to staff the registration table from 8:00am – 9:00am and Grapevine booth from 8:00am – 12:00pm.
- 2) Continue to order coffee as necessary.
- 3) Pass the seventh tradition buckets at the speaker meeting only.. (Don't forget to pass the bucket to the front tables). All money should be counted; the amount should be written on the seventh tradition form/envelope provided by the treasurer and returned to the treasurer as soon as counted. Do not hold on to any monies.
- 4) Assist the officers or committee chairs in passing out any information.
- 5) Return the coffee order form, seventh tradition form, and any envelopes to the treasurer.
- 6) Clean up registration table and pass on all supplies (the name badges, legal pads, room banners, seventh tradition buckets, etc) to host districts for the next assembly.

Exceptions

- 1) January odd-year the Saturday night speaker is the SE Regional Trustee.
- 2) January even-year the Saturday night speaker is the South Florida Area Delegate.
- 3) October even-year there will be no speaker meeting. Business meeting held Saturday night and Elections held Sunday morning.

From Jacksonville:

Take I-10 west from I-295 junction to US 301 interchange. Take US 301 south 49 miles arriving at SR 24 exit. Take SR 24 southwest 12 miles arriving at city limits of Gainesville. Proceed on SR 24 (Waldo road in city limits) south-southwest 8 miles until it merges with Williston road, SR 331. Proceed west on Williston road ¼ mile to intersection of US 441 (also called 13th st.). Turn right and proceed north ¼ mile and hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Lake City (or Metro Atlanta):

Take I-75 south 53 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Tallahassee or Pensacola:

Take I-10 east 103 miles to (303 from Pensacola) to I-75 interchange. Take I-75 south 53 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Tampa/ St Petersburg/ Clearwater:

Take I-275 northeast to I-75 junction. (Depending on point of departure 10 to 45 miles.) Proceed north on I-75 117 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Sarasota:

Take I-75 north 195 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Orlando:

Take the Florida Turnpike north 50 miles until it merges with I-75 after Leesburg-Wildwood toll plaza. Proceed north on I-75 55 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Southeast Florida (West Palm Beach/ Ft Lauderdale/ Miami):

Take The Florida Turnpike north (Depending on point of departure - 120 to 275 miles) until it merges with I-75 after Leesburg-Wildwood toll plaza. Proceed north on I-75 55 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Daytona Beach:

Take I-95 north 7 miles to SR 40. Proceed 70 miles to I-75 interchange. Travel north 32 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th st.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From St Augustine:

Take SR 207 south 27 miles to SR 20. Proceed west 70 miles to the I-75 interchange. Travel north 32 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th St.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Gainesville Regional Airport:

Take Access road to 39th Ave. Turn right onto 39th Ave and travel ½ mile to first intersection (Waldo road). Turn left onto Waldo road and proceed south-southwest for 8 miles until it merges with Williston road, SR 331. Proceed west on Williston road ¼ mile to intersection of US 441 (also called 13th St.). Turn right and proceed north ¼ mile and hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Orlando International Airport:

Take Access road north to Martin Anderson Beeline Expressway (SR 528). Proceed west 10 miles to Florida Turnpike interchange. Take the Florida Turnpike north 50 miles until it merges with I-75 after Leesburg-Wildwood toll plaza. Proceed north on I-75 55 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th St.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Jacksonville International Airport:

Take Access road (SR 102) to I-95 interchange. Proceed south on I-95 3 miles to I-295. Travel west on I-295 then south for 14 miles to I-10 interchange. Take I-10 west 13 miles to US 301 interchange. Take US 301 south 49 miles (arriving at SR 24 exit). Take SR 24 southwest 12 miles arriving at city limits of Gainesville. Proceed on SR 24 (Waldo road) south - southwest 8 miles until it merges with Williston road, SR 331. Proceed west on Williston road ¼ mile to intersection of US 441 (also called 13th St.). Turn right and proceed north ¼ mile and hotel will be on the left side of the road.

From Tampa International Airport:

Take Access road south to SR 60 (Campbell Causeway-Westshore Blvd.). Proceed south on SR 60 4 miles until it merges with I-275 junction. Take I-275 north by northeast to I-75 junction. Proceed north on I-75 117 miles to Williston road (exit #74). Turn left onto Williston road, go 2 miles to intersection with US 441 (13th St.) turn left onto US 441 and proceed north ¼ mile - hotel will be on the left side of the road.


From Ft Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport:

Take Access road to I-595 interchange. Travel west 3 miles to the Florida Turnpike interchange. Take the Florida Turnpike north until it merges with I-75 after Leesburg-Wildwood toll plaza. Proceed north on I-75 55 miles to Williston road (exit #74).
