

**Minutes of the Third Quarterly Assembly July 2001
North Florida Area Conference
Alcoholics Anonymous**

2001 Theme " Love and Service"

July 29, 2001

Area Chair – Corliss G. opened with the Serenity Prayer and Anonymity Statement. Don H. read the Short Form of the Concepts.

Registrar – Rick B. took Roll (included in minutes). All group changes go to the Registrar.

Secretary – Alva M. asked for any changes to the April minutes. Chair asked for motion to accept April minutes. So moved, seconded. PASSED.

Treasurer – Tom H. gave the Treasurer's Report for Second Quarter of 2001

There were changes on the front page of the Quarterly Cash Summary as follows:

These changes are included in the attached information.

1. Income from contributions for the quarter was up over the first quarter. We are currently at 51.7% of annual budget. This helps to offset the increased costs authorized for the Delegate for the GSO Conference.
2. When viewing the budget please remember that the budget figures shown are for the full year while costs are shown for year to date, so current cost should be at about 50% of budget.
3. Secretary's duplication costs are running lower than budget, but are on the rise.
4. Delegates cost overruns are due to authorized increases in the contributions to defray costs at GSO Conference.
5. Postage costs under the Registrar's budget are running slightly over budget due to postal price increases.
6. Hotel and mileage costs are very slightly over budget.
7. Thanks to the generosity of the groups we are currently meeting expenses for the year.
If you have any questions or corrections to the contribution records please feel free to let me know. If you wish to have a receipt for your contributions please let me know.

The requested budget from the officers and committee Chairs was distributed to all members of the Finance Committee, and was discussed at this assembly. It will be updated with any modifications and printed in the next quarterly minutes so it can be discussed and voted on at the next assembly.

Approved a fourth edition of the Big Book with no changes in the first 164 pages. The 12 Concepts will be added in all future printings. There will be 24 new stories and 16 stories kept from the 3rd edition.

New pamphlet approved called "Can AA Help Me Too?" - Black/African Americans Share Their Stories".

Pamphlet "AA For the Older Alcoholic – Never Too Late" will replace "Time To Start Living".

Agenda

Theme for 2002 Conference is "Sharing the Steps, Traditions, and Concepts".

Report and Charter

Change the wording to clarify the 5th ballot procedure on page S21 of the Service Manual.

Telephone AA meetings to be added to the directory

International Conventions and Regional Forums

The 3 cities in final contention for 2010 International Convention are Detroit, Indianapolis, and San Antonio.

Bid process for future International Conventions to begin 12 years out instead of 10.

Trustees

All of the slates for the General Service Board, the AA World Service Board and the Grapevine Board were approved as submitted.

Policy and Admissions

Dates for the 2004 Conference will be April 18-24.

Grapevine

La Vina will continue to be published and supported by the General Service Board as a service to the fellowship.

Public Information

We approved and are now in the process of conducting a 2001 Membership Survey.

A new television PSA will be produced and presented to 2002 Conference.

Finance

Approved a floating cap plan for the General Service Office's Prudent Reserve Fund.

The Florida State Advisory Committee met at this convention for their regular business meeting and I attended this as their Secretary/Treasurer. The accountant who prepares the tax returns for our State Conventions gave a report on what is required to report, how to obtain tax exempt status and what records should be held and for how long.

Dick G., our Southeastern Regional Trustee, reported that the 48th Florida State Convention in 2004 could be held in conjunction with the Southeastern Regional Conference. This committee made a motion, which was seconded, and passed that we ask the North and South Florida sitting Delegates to submit a bid at the Southeastern Conference for Florida to host the Southeastern in 2004. This motion will be made under New Business.

I have bid packets available if anyone is interested in making a bid for the 2004 convention.

Bids were received for the 2003 convention from The Registry in Naples, Doral Resort and Spa in Miami, and Wyndam Resort in Bonaventure. At the bid selection meeting which was open to all who attended the convention, bids were heard, questions and answers were permitted to each bidder and vote was taken, with The Registry in Naples winning by simple majority.

Again, thank you for allowing me to be the Chair for the North Florida Area. This experience is certainly growth-oriented and is truly gratifying. I am enjoying every minute of it.

Standing Committees

Accessibilities – Max H. Chair – 11 in attendance

Steve R., Alternate Chair

Theme: Workshops.

What a great workshop! We welcomed Nancy D., the new Accessibilities Chair for District 15, and Chuck D., new Accessibilities Chair for District 12. Chuck is deaf and we had Trish for an ASL interpreter. Nancy D. from District 15 wanted information on taking meetings to alcoholics confined to home. We gave her our pamphlet and a lot of good ideas. Gev W. from District 7 was concerned about how we could get the message to those in Nursing Homes. We decided to contact the Nursing Homes about the problem. I have a lot of good notes on what we need for a workshop. I will work with Steve R., my Alternate Chair and other Chairs on constructing one. Chuck D. helped close the meeting with the Lord's Prayer. He spoke it and used sign language at the same time.

Archives – Ellie B. Chair – 38 in attendance

Joan C., Alternate Chair

We opened with the Serenity Prayer. I recently attended the Florida State Convention in Miami. I displayed the Archives for two days. I was very disappointed that the Archives were displayed on the lower level, down a winding steep staircase, with no elevator to that level and no sign saying or pointing the way to our display. People did not know where we were and many people could not have come to visit our display because of not being able to navigate the stairway. The Archives Committee has met and decided to send a letter to the Florida State Convention Committee in Tampa asking that the Archives be placed in a location so that all may visit and enjoy learning more of our AA history. We need the Archives to be handicapped accessible. We believe by communicating this message to the next Florida State Convention Committee, hopefully, the Archives will be available to all at the next State Convention. Out of 2,800 registrants we had approximately 100 visitors. We don't want to criticize, we just want the committee to be aware of the importance to the opportunity of all AA's to learn more and experience more of our history. I spoke at the Archives Workshop Saturday morning. I would like to thank the Alternate Archivist, Joan C. for her help at the State Convention and Pat C., District 12 and Chuck H., District 7.

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Bruce C., an Archives Specialist, was our special guest, at our Workshop yesterday. He spoke to us about preservation, the importance of keeping documents and records acid free so as to keep our past factual with these items intact, and the safe handling of Archival material with gloves. He also spoke of humidity - the Florida Curse - climate control is very important to preserving archival material. Bruce noted that Alcoholics Anonymous is the most important movement of this past century and as such we need to keep factual records. We thanked Bruce for his presentation.

Cooperation with Professional Community - Cheree M., Alternate Chair - 24 in attendance

Theme: Success Stories in CPC Service Work.

Opened with the Serenity Prayer. CPC Chairs for Districts 3, 5, 7, 14, 15, and 31 shared their success in carrying the message to doctors, lawyers, clergy, and universities through letters and workshops. We shared ideas about how CPC District Chairs within the same city area can organize and work together. District 3 has a new CPC Chair and has requested the Area CPC Chair to come and hold a service workshop. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Corrections - Lee Y., Chair - 48 in attendance

Ronnie M., Alternate Chair, gave the report.

We opened our meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. We discussed our budget needs for 2002. Papa Joe shared his experience.

Our Workshop with South Florida has to be rescheduled due to a fire in the facility where it was to be held. We discussed our Corrections Conference with South Florida in Melbourne for 2002. We got about 50% approval.

We also shared our experience at our workshop at the Florida State Convention. The Convention Committee invited Lee and me. Adrienne B. from GSO Staff was present.

We discussed the new Contractors in Corrections and how we might better facilitate our meetings inside. Elmer C. shared his experience along with Dan E., Past Delegate.

Many shared about literature for Corrections with County and State Facilities being somewhat different in the literature they need.

Karen, District 12, Melbourne, brought information on the Pink Cans.

The need for more volunteers was discussed. Our meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Grapevine - Ginny S., Chair - 28 in attendance

North Florida and South Florida Grapevine Chairs and Alternates participated in a panel in Miami. There were door prizes and quiz prizes. Great time had by all.

From my budget for workshops I paid for a Grapevine subscription.

A variety of ways to encourage sales of Grapevines were present. The most interesting was when the group offered to pay \$5.00 toward the \$15.00 subscription.

A mini meeting was held to demonstrate an AA meeting discussing a Grapevine article. This meeting was chaired by Ruth M., Alternate Chair.

The goal of the chair is to have every District identify their Grapevine Chair and to encourage more subscriptions to Grapevine and La Vina.

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The budget for 2002 accepted by the Finance Committee.

Many thanks to the Host Committee for service at the Grapevine table. Sales equaled \$157.75.

Intergroup – Susan C., Alternate Chair - 32 in attendance.

Opened with the Serenity Prayer. Phone directories – GSO will help with any use of AA name infringed on trademark. Passed out AA Intergroup guidelines and "12 Traditions Illustrated". Discussed Traditions up to Tradition 7 – had group conscience meeting at 15 minutes before end of meeting to table Tradition discussion. Had 10 minutes open and 5 minutes for next topic - "better awareness and outreach to groups/boosting attendance". Discussed – should meeting formats used be solely from AA Approved Literature – GSO has advised groups can decide for themselves, however experience shows it's more consistent to use AA approved Literature. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Literature – Mike R., Chair – 18 in attendance.

Pamela D., Alternate Chair

Theme: Conference Agenda Items on Literature.

Opened with the Serenity Prayer. Talked about the Agenda Items from last Assembly for New York and their outcome. I received back one Concepts Checklist that was passed out at the last Assembly. Literature Chair is available to go to workshops to do presentation. Question; to print "Daily Reflections" in Hard Cover and possibly enlarge the print. Also new idea for Service Pamphlet: Possible Title "Service at a Glance", simple single page description of Service Committees. Possibility of CD's of Tapes listed on literature order form. GSR's please carry these ideas to your home group for consensus.

Public Information – Charlotte B, Chair – 40 in attendance.

Susan C., Alternate Chair

The July P.I. Committee opened with the Serenity Prayer. I tried to encourage Districts to have committee chairs and for people to get active. I told of some of the work that can be done: Health Fairs, County Fairs, etc., is one of many areas.

The floor was opened for questions and shared experiences. A couple funny stories were told about ads or obituaries that made people want to donate money. Educating people on our anonymity policies is very important. Any paper that does service ads will do AA.

Debra H., District 15 P.I. Chair shared some of the many things they have done and are doing.

I see more and more that some of the basic work done by former P.I. Chairs such as Fred H. and Mike M. are responsible for much P.I. work still going on. We need more Districts involved and more people to carry on.

Our Saturday night speaker, Steve, from South Florida, was also P.I. Chair for South Florida, District 15, and shared some of his experiences with us. Enthusiasm will motivate people to get involved. He spoke of several areas for involvement and the big thing is to just do something. If each person would give one hour a month a lot can be done. He mentioned "Red Ribbon" week, a national awareness against addictions usually held in October. Steve was lively and motivational.

Treatment Facilities – Marty K., Chair – 56 in attendance.

Barbara S., Alternate Chair

Theme: Bridge the Gap/Temporary Contact program.

Showed GSO's "Hope" video – overview of AA and how it works and TCP recommended to be shown in BTG/TCP AA presentations to Treatment staff and clients (members enjoy it as well).

Barbara S., Alternate Area Chair – gave presentation on Treatment panel at State Convention – she Bridged the Gap with South Florida – made contacts.

Levi S. – BTG/TCP Area Committee Chair working with Treatment Staff, Clients, and AA

Members requires consistent follow-up – the rewards/results are great.

Announced and distributed newsletter and sign up sheet for upcoming BTG Workshop, October 19-21, Denver. It is mentioned in the newsletter that a representative from Florida will be in attendance. Levi S. and myself opened the floor to discussion – Great participation.

Talked "about" dealing with problems other than alcohol – i.e. prescription and other drugs, mental illness (dual diagnosis).

Cooperating with other 12 Step programs: AI-Anon, etc., through referring/suggesting – GSO's

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"Gold Sheet" – a listing of all other 12 Step programs.

Making contacts with TCP and members in other districts, cities, and states for "clients" coming and going to and from different cities. Growing numbers of older folks coming through Treatment Centers and the need to find chronologically older AA members to be contacts. Importance of getting Treatment clients to a meeting immediately (1st 24 hours) upon discharge

The importance and necessity to be flexible when working with and taking meetings into Treatment Centers.

We passed around a sign up sheet for contact points around the North Florida Area in our continuing effort to have a contact in each District.

Thanks to gentleman from District 9 that took notes.

Administrative Committees

Finance Committee – LeRoy L., Chair – 10 of 11 DCM's present

The meeting opened with Serenity Prayer.

The Treasurer report was given and accepted.

The committee accepted a request from the Intergroup Chairperson for an increase in his budget for \$200 to cover the actual cost to attend the Intergroup Seminar in Alberta, Canada. This was passed and will be presented under New Business.

Our Delegate asked for up to \$1500 to be spent for translation equipment for Spanish Speaking Attendees. This was also passed and will be brought to the floor later.

The 2002 proposed budget was reviewed and accepted with a change. The proposed budget will be mailed out with your minutes and voted on at the October Assembly.

There was a request for funding on Archives rent. This was withdrawn after input from the Archives Committee.

The request for funding the Web Site Committee was discussed but no action was taken. A motion was made for \$100 to fund the Web Master to attend the next Assembly. This will be brought up as a motion.

Finally the Prudent Reserve was brought to the table. This will come to the floor as a motion that the Prudent Reserve be set at 75% of the budget. This is not the expenses or money spent, but the Area budget. This will be made under New Business but then it will be tabled. This is so it can be mailed in the minutes and voted on in October.

Growth - Michael S, Chair – 11 of 12 DCM's present

Area Archive Office

Motion that the NFACAA establish an Area Archive Office at the Eastside Club in Orlando through the end of the current term (December 2002).

Linguistic Districts

Motion to modify the NFACAA Structure and Guidelines to allow the formation of linguistic districts with the NFACAA.

Pending the approval of the above motion: Motion to establish a Spanish linguistic District at large within the NFACAA.

Internet Web Site

It is the opinion of the Area Officers and the Growth Committee that the original Advisory Action (April 2000) to create the Web Site would put too much information into the public domain. Therefore, the Growth Committee recommends a motion to repeal the original Advisory Action as stated below:

"The NFACAA shall create an Internet Web Site to include: A) Officer and committee reports for the past year, B) Agenda for the next Assembly, C) Advisory Actions, D) Structure and Guidelines, E) History of the NFACAA, and F) Area activities."

Motion to modify the NFACAA Structure and Guidelines to include the proposed Internet Web Site Guidelines as follows:

- 1) The NFACAA shall create an Internet Web Site to include:
 - A) The Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions, and Twelve Concepts.
 - B) The Preamble, Serenity Prayer, and the "I Am Responsible".

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- C) Area map with links/references to GSO and Area Intergroups.
 - D) Calendar with Area, state, regional, and GSO pertinent activities.
 - E) Upcoming Assembly agenda and registration information.
 - F) Email for Area Officers and Committee Chairs, if available.
- 2) The Web Site shall be administered by a Subcommittee of the Growth Committee, in conjunction with the Public Information Committee, consisting of a web master (appointed by the Area Chair), an Alternate web master, the Growth Committee Chair, the Public Information Committee Chair, and a Past Delegate. (Advisory Action passed April 2001). The role of the Past Delegate shall be advisory only, non-voting, and may be rotated as convenient for the Subcommittee. The Subcommittee shall have the responsibility of maintaining and updating the Web Site.
 - 3) The Web Site, its name (aanorthflorida.org) and content, and all related computer hardware and software, with the exception of the web hosting service, shall be owned and supported by the NFACAA.
 - 4) The Web Site shall conform to the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of Alcoholics Anonymous and to the Structure and Guidelines of the NFACAA.
 - 5) In keeping with AA Traditions, the Web Site should cooperate with other AA entities and should not provide any references of links to non-AA material. Any use of material not owned by the NFACAA shall be properly acknowledged.
 - 6) In keeping with AA Traditions there shall be no reference to individuals, including Email addresses.
 - 7) These Internet Web Site Guidelines shall be posted on the Web Site and shall be an addendum to the NFACAA Structure and Guidelines.

Site and Agenda - Mary D., Chair – 8 of 11 DCMs present

Chet P., Alternate Chair

Discussed bids from Daytona Beach Conference Center, Sheraton Inn Gainesville, and Holiday Inn West, Gainesville for 2003-2004. These were the 3 bid packages that had acceptable rates. After discussion, the motion was made to recommend to the body of the Assembly that we stay at the Sheraton Inn Gainesville contingent on confirmation of our current meeting room needs. Motion passed unanimously. Later that day confirmation was received.

Motion from Growth Committee:

The Growth Chair makes a motion that the NFACAA establish an Area Archive Office at the Eastside Club in Orlando through the end of the current term (December 2002).

Seconded. Discussion was held. The Archives Committee has reconvened and would rather not go to this location. Some issues were security, valuable items, need bars on windows, remoteness of this location. There is a need to be able to work on and to take an inventory of what we have.

Call the question. Seconded. PASSED.

Motion FAILED, no 2/3 majority. 79 for, 72 opposed. Minority opinion given.

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Motion from Growth Committee:

The Growth Chair makes a motion to modify the NFACAA Structure and Guidelines to allow the formation of linguistic districts within the NFACAA.

Seconded. As this will change to Structures and Guidelines, this will be printed in the minutes and voted on at the October 2001 Assembly.

Pending the approval of the above motion: the Growth Chair makes a motion to establish a Spanish linguistic District at large within the NFACAA. This will be printed in the minutes and voted on at the October 2001 Assembly

Motion from Growth Committee:

It is the opinion of the Area Officers and the Growth Committee that the original Advisory Action (April 2000) to create the Web Site would put too much information into the public domain.

Therefore, the Growth Chair makes a motion to repeal the original Advisory Action as stated below:

"The NFACAA shall create an Internet Web Site to include: A) Officer and Committee reports for the past year, B) Agenda for the next Assembly, C) Advisory Actions, D) Structure and Guidelines, E) History of the NFACAA, and F) Area activities."

Seconded. These are printed in the minutes and will be voted on at the October 2001 Assembly.

Motion from Finance Committee:

The Finance Chair makes a motion that the NFA fund the acting Web master \$100 for the next quarter.

Seconded. Discussion was held.

Motion PASSED. No minority opinion given.

Motion from Finance Committee:

The Finance Chair makes a motion that the NFA increase the Intergroup Committee budget \$200 to cover the actual cost of the Intergroup Chair attending the Intergroup Seminar.

Seconded. Motion PASSED. No minority opinion given.

Motion from Finance Committee:

The Finance Chair makes a motion that NFA spend up to \$1500 for translation equipment.

Seconded. Discussion was held. The Spanish have agreed to provide an interpreter.

Motion PASSED unanimously.

Motion from Finance Committee:

The Finance Chair makes a motion that will change Structure and Guidelines that the Prudent Reserve be set at 75% of the annual budget.

Seconded.

Motion to amend as follows:

- 1) An overage evaluation shall be made by the Treasurer at the end of each calendar year after all bills are paid.
- 2) Any overage shall be reported to the Assembly at its first quarterly meeting.
- 3) Any such overage shall be reported in the minutes from the first quarterly meeting, and distribution of the overage shall be decided on at the second quarterly Assembly by the Assembly body.

Seconded. This will be printed in the minutes to be voted on at the October 2001 Assembly.

Motion from Site and Agenda:

The Site and Agenda Chair makes a motion that the Sheraton Gainesville be the site of the

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Assembly for 2003 and 2004 at rate of \$61 per night.
Seconded. Motion PASSED. No minority opinion given.

Motion from Area Chairperson:

Motion was made for Sense of the Assembly: Our Delegate go to the Southeast Regional Conference in Columbia, South Carolina and bid on the 2004 Southeast Regional Conference to be held in Florida at a site to be selected at the 2002 Florida State Convention.

Seconded. Motion PASSED unanimously.

Fred H. from Jacksonville asked for Sense of Assembly and support to make a bid for 2004 Florida State Convention and Southeast Regional Conference. He will be supported by NFA.

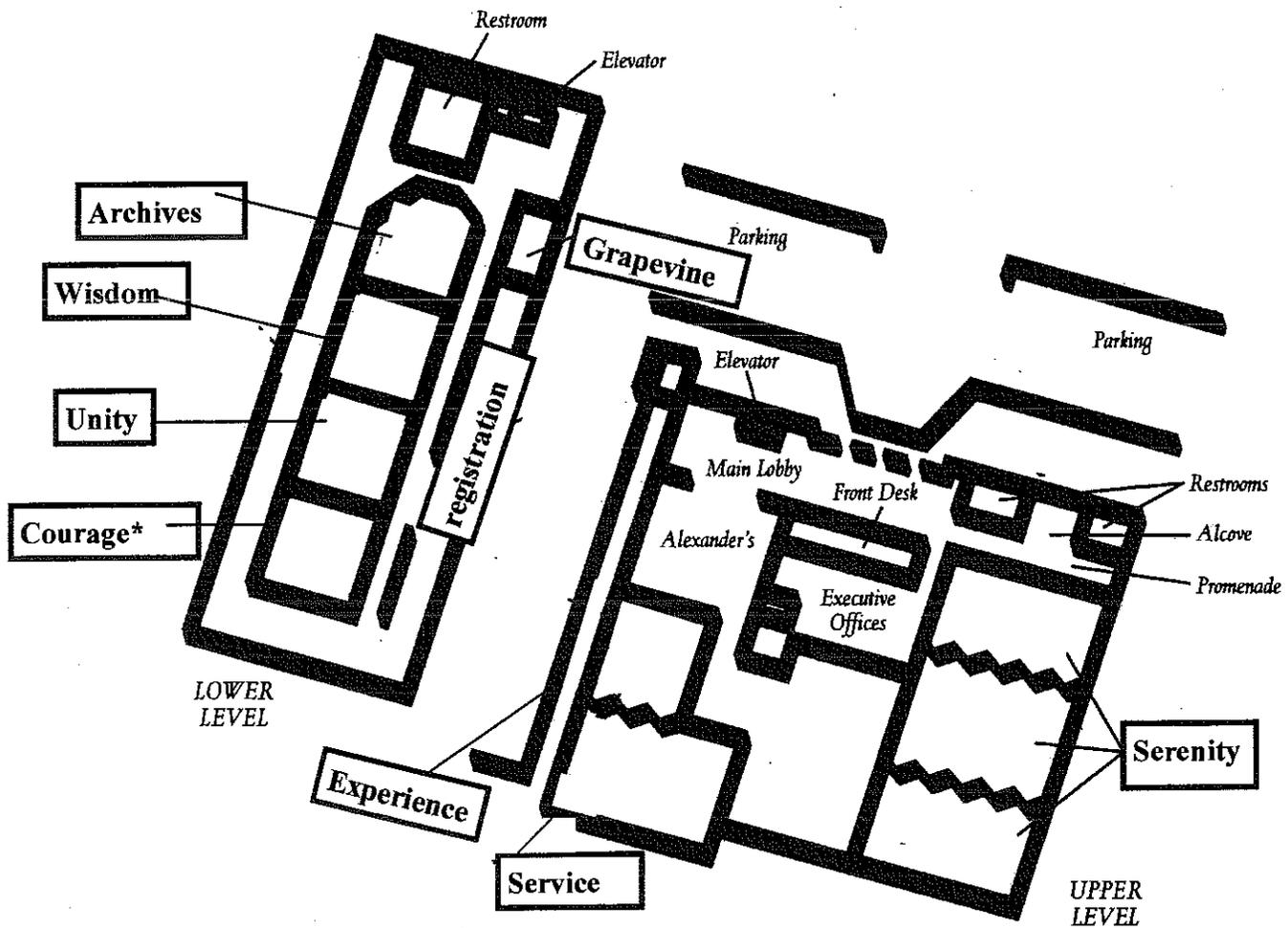

1. Q. How do we start to set up a local A.A. web site?

A. Decisions in the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous are usually made through an informed group conscience and the decision to post a web page is no different. Whether area or district, central office or intergroup - A.A. experience suggests forming a committee to discuss all aspects of setting up a home page, including all possible concerns about the Traditions.

Early on, it is important to agree upon a method for gathering the group conscience of the local A.A. community, and to inform local groups, districts, areas and central offices/intergroups (if affected) about the committee's progress. When the committee has reached a consensus, its findings are shared with the whole group (district, area, etc.) and a decision is made through an informed group conscience vote. It is then that the actual work on the web site can begin. It is helpful to remember that there is no need to let the speed of this technology dictate the speed of our actions and technical questions regarding this communication method will need to be answered by experts in that field.

2. Q. Who is responsible for a web site?

A. A thoughtful and informed group conscience is encouraged to be responsible for deciding the contents, policy and procedures involved in setting up and maintaining a web site. It has been suggested that a "web master" (chairperson) be appointed or elected to serve as a trusted servant, responsible to the committee/groups they serve. This can be an arduous task, if the "web master" is responsible for updating local meeting information.

3. Q. What A.A. information is suitable for a web site?

A. Again, the group conscience will determine the contents. Copyright restrictions apply to material displayed on the web site - just as copyrights protect A.A. literature. Permission must be obtained from G.S.O. prior to including A.A.W.S. material on your web site. Local A.A. sites are permitted to quote a phrase, sentence or brief paragraph excerpted from A.A. literature such as the Big Book, the "Twelve and Twelve," *"The A.A. Service Manual,"* and Conference-approved pamphlets without a prior, written request to do so. When this occurs, please include the proper credit line, in order to insure that the copyrights of A.A. literature are protected. After a quotation from a book or pamphlet, the credit line should read: *Reprinted from (name of publication, page number), with permission of A.A. World Services,*

Inc. The A.A. Preamble is copyrighted by the A.A. Grapevine. Beneath it, and beneath any article or cartoon reprinted from the Grapevine, these words should appear: From the (date) Grapevine. Reprinted with permission of The A.A. Grapevine, Inc.

If you wish to include items on your web site that now appear on G.S.O.'s site, we suggest that you link to the appropriate page of our site.

4. Q. Who pays for a web site?

A. In keeping with our Seventh Tradition, A.A. pays for its own expenses and this applies in cyberspace A.A. as well.

5. Q. What about linking to other sites?

A. Linking to other bona fide A.A. web sites will often have the positive effect of significantly broadening the scope of your site. Information contained on these sites becomes instantly available to those visiting your site. However, since each A.A. entity is autonomous and has its own group conscience, a site to which you have linked may start to display information which your group conscience finds objectionable; and there is no way to know when this might occur, or to prevent it from happening. Linking to non-A.A. sites is even more problematic. Not only are they much more likely to display non-A.A. and/or controversial material, but linking might imply endorsement, if not affiliation, regardless of the contents. In the final analysis, experience strongly suggests that, when considering linking to another site, one must proceed with caution.

6. Q. What about anonymity?

A. We observe all A.A.'s principles and Traditions on our web sites. As anonymity is the "spiritual foundation of all our Traditions," we practice anonymity on A.A. web sites at all times. An A.A. web site is a public medium which has the potential for reaching the broadest possible audience, and, therefore, requires the same safeguards that we use at the level of press, radio and film.

7. Q. Will the General Service Office of A.A. act as a "clearinghouse" for local web sites?

A. There is no central authority in Alcoholics Anonymous, hence, the General Service Office of A.A. is not a "clearinghouse" for local web sites. Questions regarding the Traditions, contents, linking, etc. are determined by a local group conscience. G.S.O. is available to share collected experience on any subject, including web sites. At this point, though, G.S.O. has only limited sharing from local web site committees regarding their experience with matters which are unique to web site creation.

8. Q. What can be found on G.S.O.'s A.A. Web Site? <www.aa.org>

A. In keeping with our Twelve Traditions and viewing the Internet as a form of public and electronic media, G.S.O.'s A.A. Web Site is currently set up as a Public Information tool. Available in English, French and Spanish, it provides accurate and consistent information about Alcoholics Anonymous to the general public, media and professionals and includes:

- The General Service Conference-approved "A.A. Fact File"
- General Service Conference-approved pamphlets "Is A.A. for You?," "A Message to Teenagers," and "A Newcomer Asks "
- List of Central Offices/Intergroups/Answering Services in U.S./Canada
- List of International General Service Offices and links to those offices which have Web Sites..
- Information for professionals, including an e-mail response form for the professional to request additional information about A.A.
- Anonymity Letter to Media
- Information on the International Convention 2000
- *About A.A.* newsletter for professionals
- *Information on Alcoholics Anonymous* (service piece): For anyone referring people to A.A. and for anyone new coming to A.A.

9. Q. How many people visit G.S.O.'s A.A. Web Site?

A. In 1999, the Web Site was visited 729,149 times which is an average of approximately 2,000 visits daily.

10. Q. Is this promotion rather than attraction?

A. As our co-founder, Bill W., wrote:

"Public Information takes many forms - the simple sign outside a meeting place that says 'A.A. meeting tonight'; listing in local phone directories; distribution of A.A. literature; and radio and television shows using sophisticated media techniques. Whatever the form, it comes down to 'one drunk carrying the message to another drunk,' whether through personal contact or through the use of third parties and the

media."
