North Florida Area Conference
Alcoholics Anonymous

2003 Theme "Sponsorship: Ever a Vital Need"

March 30, 2003

Area Chair – Michael S. opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. After reading the Declaration of Unity, he had Greg S., DCM District 11 read the Anonymity Statement and Donna M., DCM District 12 read the short form of the Concepts. Next Michael welcomed everyone, especially all new GSRs saying "I hope you enjoyed it (the assembly) and will come back for many years of service".

Registrar – Cecilia R. took roll call (attached after minutes) and explained the handouts that were left on each District table, which included District lists (Groups listed for the District) and a sheet with questions from the GSO database. She requested that DCM's please clarify any questionable information and make changes to the District list as needed, reminding everyone that the GSO directory will go out with the information provided to her. She also stressed that area codes and zip codes may need particular attention as many have changed recently.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Secretary – Rebecca B. made available extra copies of the previous assembly's minutes and announced that there were two items overlooked when preparing that assembly's reports:

1. A motion was passed in January which read: *At the first Assembly of each year the Treasurer shall present to the Finance committee a report of "large differences" between actual costs for the prior year and the approved budget for that year, for review and consideration by the committee.* This motion was documented in the January Minutes, but the change to Structures and Guidelines which resulted from the motion was not documented.
2. The Area Map and Summary of Conference Procedures pages were not included in the copies of Structures and Guidelines.

Rebecca gave her assurance that both of these omissions will be included in this quarter's reports, then asked for any other changes to the minutes. None were forthcoming. She closed with a reminder to all Committee Chairs to please turn in a copy of their report before leaving the stage.

A motion was called for by the Chair to accept the minutes with the above changes. Moved, seconded and passed.

Treasurer – Connie D. related the highlights of the past quarter's activities as follows:

- Donations to March 15th = \$7,979.
- Expenses to March 15th = \$9,377. (includes Conference payment for Delegate of \$1,800.)
- Donations less expenses resulted in a loss of \$1,398.45.
- Cash in the bank as of March 28th = \$2,833.56.

I will need budget requests from all officers and chairpersons that have not already submitted theirs. The budget will be approved by the Finance Committee at the next assembly and printed in the 3rd quarter minutes to be voted on during the October assembly.

Receipts are provided to all groups donating to the Area and these were handed out during the DCM meeting on Saturday for the period through March 15th 2003.

I plan to revise the 2003 budget taking into account that we should not be spending more than we collect in contributions. I will also build in changes resulting from this assembly coming through the Finance Committee.

Delegate – Corliss G.

First I have some sad news to report. Our Past Delegate from Panel 35, Bob S. passed away last year. Let's have a moment of silence in Bob's honor and remember his wife Ruth as well.

I'd like to recognize to the Past Delegates in attendance: Tom D, Panel 43; Kathy P., Panel 49; Tom G., Panel 51 and from New Jersey, Bonnie F., Panel 38.

The Delegate's Get Together in Atlanta was one of the most fantastic experiences I've ever had. Our Alternate Delegate, Tom H. will be giving a detailed report of this function.

FYI: GSO welcomed a total of 1,700 visitors during 2002. Any time you are in New York, stop by GSO and you will have a great treat in store.

Strong sales of 4th Edition Big Book in 2002, as well as increased unit distribution of pamphlets, was positive in 2002 so that total sales for the year were 11% more than budgeted. This, as well as many contributions received from US and Canada, has made possible increased services to AA members and groups around the world.

For the 12 months ended 12/31/02, 51.2% of the Groups in Area 14 contributed, as compared with 55.3% in 2001. Let's go home and share with our group treasurers the need to contribute to GSO – as well as Area and local service entities.

Currently 138 men and 14 women are waiting to be linked to outside members through the Corrections Correspondence service. A call for help was mailed to Corrections, H&I and Bridging the Gap chairpersons. Response has been encouraging. See Bob P. (Area Corrections Chair) for more information.

I have the latest information regarding entry into Canada for those with criminal convictions. Please let me know if you would like a copy of this. There will be a mailing to all groups with the service piece "Frequently Most Asked Questions about the 2005 International Convention and Travel to Canada". This will also be included on a new link on GSO's website (www.aa.org).

There are back issues of the Grapevine (50 for \$30 plus \$6 handling/postage). These are good for beginners, corrections or treatment.

May 2, 2003 is the deadline date for inclusion in the directory – all DCMs check with Cecilia to make sure that your District information is included and correct.

The new big book anthology, entitled "Experience, Strength and Hope: Stories from the first three editions of Alcoholics Anonymous" will be available in April. Other new products are:

- 12 Concepts Shade (available this month)
- Spanish Shades: Steps, Traditions and Concepts (available this month)
- De las tinieblas hacia la luz – Fourth Edition Big Book Stories in Spanish (available in April).

Also available is the Fourth Edition Big Book in French as well as *Living Sober* in Greek, Chinese wallet card, Urdu Big Book, Setswana and Thai pamphlets.

For 2002, book distribution was down 7.3% from 2001. This can be directly attributed to high sales of the Fourth Edition Big Book in 2001.

I'd like to pass this quote along to you from an AA member who gave a Big Book to a still suffering alcoholic: "She has the best tool I could have ever given to her – an undistorted adequate record of what AA is, what it believes and how it works. It is there rain or shine, day or night, drunk or sober. It places no judgments, never gets tired or weary. It just reaches out to the alcoholic in need."

I have put flyers for the Southeaster Conference in Memphis in August on your tables as well as birthday contribution envelopes. Encourage your group members to donate \$1 per year of sobriety or \$.01 per day of sobriety on their anniversary!! My group gives medallions in these envelopes.

I want to thank all of you for the participation last night in helping me prepare for the General Service Conference – which is coming up in less than a month. I will take the thoughts and concerns of Area 14 with me.

I am very grateful to my higher power for showing me the way into service, to all who have been examples through the years, and to the AA members in Area 14 for choosing me as their delegate; one of the most rewarding experiences I will ever have in Alcoholics Anonymous – second only to finding sobriety through this beautiful fellowship.

Alternate Delegate – Tom H.

First let me thank all of you for the opportunity you have given me by electing me Alternate Delegate.

Corliss and I were privileged to attend the "Delegates Get Together" in Atlanta. It was one of the highlights of my time in AA. The camaraderie of the Delegates and the helpfulness of the Past Delegates was genuine and sincere.

We had the chance to meet all of the current Delegates from the region as well as most of the Alternate Delegates, a large number of Past Delegates, the current Southeastern Regional Trustee, Past Trustees and our US Trustee at Large.

Our Trustee presented the trustees' Committee's recommended list of items for the 53rd General Service Conference, as well as a report on the Trustee's January Board Weekend meeting. The list of items were those that were discussed at this weekend's Assembly.

A Delegate's sharing session followed this. During this session the Delegates from panel 52 shared their experiences and gave recommendations to the Delegates for when they attend the upcoming session in New York. Both practical and whimsical recommendations were given. After this the panel 53 Delegates gave a short report of the activities occurring in their area (Area Highlights), just as they will be expected to do at the General Session. This was enlightening to all present, especially those whose talk ran over the allotted time (they were beeped at the end of their allotted time). I am happy to report that our Delegate's report was exactly in the allotted time.

Next was a session called "What's on your mind?". In this session any Area with a concern could bring it forward and discuss it with the Trustee and the Delegates to see if a problem could be resolved, or an alternative had been used in any other Area. As an example it was felt by the region that GSO was too quick to issue recognition (i.e. a group number) to groups without giving the local Delegate time to investigate whether it is a true AA group or not. This will be reported back to GSO for their consideration.

The next meeting was between the Trustee and the Delegates and Alternate Delegates, to discuss what to expect and how to prepare for attendance at the actual Conference in New York. It covered everything from dress code to what your guest will be able to do during the time the Delegate is in meetings (nearly full time each day).

On Sunday morning, before departing, a memorial service was held for the Past Delegates from the region who had died during the preceding year, followed by a short business meeting.

Attendance at the get together was 62 people with 1,278 years of sobriety. They ranged from 10 years to 34 years with an average of 20 years.

In conclusion let me say that with the quality of sobriety of the people who are our Delegates, the dedication of the Past Delegates and that of our Trustee from this region, we can all be assured that the present and future of AA is in very capable hands.

In the spirit of giving credit where it is due, I'd like to express my thanks to Fran for taking 6 pages of notes during this meeting. Thank you again for allowing me to serve as Alternate Delegate and, if you have any questions, please feel free to see me after the meeting.

Alternate Chairperson – Rick B. began his report with some housekeeping issues and reminders:

- Check out is 12:00 noon.
- Register for next Assembly (July 25th – 27th). There is a 21-day cutoff (our discount rate may not be available to those registering later than 21 days prior to the event).

- No food or beverages are allowed in the meetings other than what is provided by the hotel.

Rick thanked Districts 5, 11, 31 and 33 for hosting this quarter's Assembly and Districts 9-A&B, 18-A&B, 25 and 1 for agreeing to host the next Assembly. He reminded the next hosting committee to pick up the badges and other materials from the registration table before leaving and to be here prior to 5:00 p.m. on July 25th to set up.

Everyone was reminded to leave their badges on the registration table on their way out. In closing, Rick stated that any suggestions on how to improve the Assembly administration would be welcome.

Rick then called for Committee Reports.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

(Note: The following reports contain information discussed at the Sunday morning business meeting only. The Agenda Items which were discussed in the committee meetings, workshops and at the Saturday evening business meeting will be documented at the end of the Sunday minutes.)

Accessibilities – Mary T., Chair – 19 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Marilyn B.

Mary reported on the highlights of her Accessibilities workshop, which ran from 10:30 a.m. until 11:40 a.m. on Saturday. Points of interest included:

- New NFA Accessibilities survey was presented to the workshop participants. The goal of obtaining a wide cross section of persons completing the survey was discussed as well as answering any questions about the survey.
- Kathy P., Past Delegate provided information on Special Needs services currently being provided by GSO and, in particular, Conference approved literature in Braille such as the Big Book and Daily Reflections, which were on display at the workshop.
- Workshop concluded with a lively sharing discussion on current District Special Needs/Accessibilities projects, such as the "On Call" group in District 15 and the publishing of an "Ad" offering services to persons with special needs in their District Newsletter.

Archives – Joan C., Chair – 28 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Rick H. from District 1.

This workshop was held from 10:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m., Saturday and the main theme (after GSO Agenda) was the new edition of the video "Markings on the Journey". Joan's highlights are as follows:

- Welcomed new GSRs and DCMs attending their first Archives workshop. Reviewed purpose and distributed group history forms. Encouraged Districts to fill their archive chair positions to keep local histories in tact. Lots of enthusiasm, questions and interest.
- Presented 2002 edition of video "Markings on the Journey", reviewing historical beginnings of AA. "Shows the right people in the right place at the right time."
- New donation to NFA Archives from Maria H. of District 33: Doce Pasos (12 Steps), 1952 Grapevine publication and AA World Services.
- Archives room open 10:30-12:45 and 2:00-4:00 on Saturday of the Assembly.
- Upcoming Archive presentations:
 - 05/03/03 – District 32, Ormond Beach Annual Dinner.
 - 05/17/03 – District 15, Titusville "Film Festival"
 - 09/25/03 – 09/28/03 – 8th Annual National Workshop, Fort Lauderdale.

Cooperation with Professional Community – Louie M., Chair – 56+ in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Melanie E. from District 18.

The CPC workshop, which was held Saturday between 10:30 and 11:30 a.m., was so well attended that people were standing and sitting on the floor.

"The Biology of Alcoholism" presentation was given by Stephen M. This included the Genetics, Brain Chemistry, Occurrence and some statistics.

Questions raised included:

1. Put this on video? We thought it would be better person to person.
2. Maybe showing it at Area Assembly in the future, either during lunch or instead of a Speaker Meeting, etc.

Corrections – Bob P., Chair - 35 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Elmer C.

The Corrections workshop took place on Saturday at 3:15p.m. and lasted until 4:20p.m. Highlights as reported by Bob were as follows:

- Ronnie M. Shared the fact that BTG (Bridging the Gap) is strong and doing well in North Florida. He just finished a large mailing to all our Correctional Facilities and asked me to put BTG material on each table today.
- Orlando, the Corrections Chair in District 13 shared that he is having problems with Intergroup Corrections. Money being spent from pink cans in ways it shouldn't be. Plus they're not trying to work together. I said that I would try to help by speaking to them and maybe we could smooth this out.
- With the time that was left, I showed a video, "Carrying the Message Behind These Walls". Meeting ended by giving out literature for Correctional Facilities.

Grapevine – Don H., Chair, - 32 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Pamela D.

The main topic of the Grapevine workshop was future Grapevine publications. This meeting took place from 2:00p.m. until 3:00 p.m. on Saturday and Don's highlights are as follows:

1. Opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.
2. I shared about the General Service Conference and Advisory Actions from the past concerning the Grapevine. In 1955 it was decided that it was important to have a Grapevine representative at the group level. In 1997 the decision to create a Grapevine pamphlet was made: *The Grapevine, Our Meeting in Print*.
3. Agenda items were discussed and voted upon.
4. I shared a list of items scheduled for production this year for the Grapevine. Books include *Dear Grapevine* in soft cover, anthology of letters to the Grapevine and *Along Spiritual Lines*, a book of AA members' spiritual experiences. There is also a CD of LaVina and a sign "Declaration of Responsibility". Plus the following are items approved, but not yet scheduled: Books include *Emotional Sobriety*, *The Next Frontier* and *Beginners Grapevine*, which will include articles useful to newcomers, sponsors and anyone else doing 12th Step work. CD's and tapes will include a set of tapes on the topics Carrying the Message, Emotional Sobriety and a "Best of the Grapevine" CD.
5. I will contact the Grapevine Conference coordinator concerning the possibility of printing the Grapevine in large print and if Grapevine subscription certificates are available...yes, 1, 2 & 3 year are available.
6. A consensus was taken of those present and 100% were in favor of having a Grapevine subscription raffle after the Speaker's meeting on Saturday night at the North Florida Area Conferences. This will be brought to the floor for a vote under New Business.
7. The Grapevine Store took in \$329.00 and \$1.00 donation. Thank you to all who gave of their time at the Grapevine Store.

Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

Intergroup – Chet P., Chair – 35 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Ron R.

The main topic of this workshop, which ran from 11:45 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. on Saturday, was "Service Participation: Getting It and Keeping It".

The discussion reminded us that people tend to get active and stay involved if:

1. They know what their duties are.
2. They are asked for their ideas and input.
3. They feel that they are actually doing something that makes a difference.

Almost humorously, providing food has traditionally increased participation.

Sponsorship has been, and is, an ongoing source of involvement. One Intergroup reported a "Bring a Friend" program that produced good results. Finally, giving recognition within the spirit of anonymity was discussed as a way to keep participation going.

Next Assembly: The Seventh Tradition and Self-Support.

Literature – Michael J., Chair – 45 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Andrew S.

The Agenda Items took up the whole hour (plus) in this workshop which ran from 3:15 p.m. until 4:20 p.m. Saturday. No further topics were discussed.

Public Information – Deborah H., Chair – 26 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Al B. from District 19.

Discussion was brought up about the "Declaration of Unity" having been voted in to be on the Area Web site: Corliss clarified this and stated this was voted in January of 2002. This will be added to the Web site.

The North Florida Area Web site will also be available in Spanish as well as English.

Question was asked whether each District was being notified when PSAs are being distributed in their area. The answer is no. It is suggested that all PI chairs follow up with their local television stations to see if they have been contacted. It was also shared that in the past it has been very beneficial if the Public Affairs department at the television stations are contacted whether face-to-face or by phone.

Discussion was brought up regarding a television station, which aired a narrated show about alcoholism, and at the end of the show identified a member of Alcoholics Anonymous as a member of Alcoholics Anonymous. Question was asked how this is handled. Corliss stated that she handles situations regarding those matters and requested information to be given to her after the meeting.

Louie M., PI Chair for District 14, got up and shared about having some billboards put up about Alcoholics Anonymous. Three were spotted around Gainesville.

PI has some extra PSAs available. We are suggesting that if you take them, please ask the TV station to dub them and give the original back to you so that you can bring it back to the Area and they can be given to other Districts for their use. In other words, let's try to recycle.

Treatment Facilities – Dilene S., Chair – 37 in attendance.

Alternate Chair: Mike R. (absent)

The Treatment Facilities workshop was held on Saturday between 2:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m.

After discussion of the Conference Agenda Items, I asked the visiting Treatment Chair from Western Michigan, Rich P., to share with us about treatment work in his area. It was interesting to hear that his committee has monthly meetings which are well attended.

We discussed a letter I received from GSO asking us to give any assistance we can to a state-run youth treatment facility in Winter Springs. I contacted the facility and they have a real need for 32 Big Books for a Big Book Meeting being brought into the facility. After discussion, it was decided that 16 books for the facility would be purchased out of the Area Treatment Facilities budget and I have asked the DCM of District 10 to address the matter for the rest of the books.

I reported to those present that the problem with the Jacksonville treatment facility has been satisfactorily solved by the Legal Services desk at GSO, so we do not need to take further action.

I again asked the workshop participants to send me a list of the treatment facilities in their districts so that I can begin compiling a list for our area.

We had some good sharing about treatment work and some good input from two local gentlemen who are currently in a long-term facility here in Gainesville.

It was requested that we review the Treatment Facilities Workbook and view the "Hope" video at our next meeting.

Chairperson – Michael S. made a couple of announcements before break as follows:

1. I'd like to recognize and welcome our visitor from Michigan, Rich P., who is the Treatment Facilities chair in his area.
2. There have been a number of questions regarding the new no-smoking laws and how it may affect group meetings. This issue is one that needs to be taken up by each individual group with their landlord and will not be discussed at an area level, nor should it be discussed at a district level.
3. Any group or district wanting to announce an event in the upcoming Area Newsletter, needs to get the information to me by the end of May.
4. Anyone who has a bid they'd like to present for the 2005 State Convention should see me.

Treasurer – Connie D. addressed the issue of one Committee Chairperson having requested that no reimbursement of expenses be paid him due to the area's cash crunch. She stated that this cannot be done as it sets a precedent for those who follow and we don't want anyone to feel they need to spend their own money in order to do service. Anyone who wishes to, however, can always donate his or her expense money back to Area after having received his or her reimbursement.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE REPORTS (always held on Saturday, 10:00 – 11:30 a.m.)

Finance Committee – Ann P., Chair – 9 of 13 assigned DCMs present.

Alternate Chair: Steve M. from District 21

Opened meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Welcomed all. NFAA Treasurer, Connie D., went over the treasurer's report and answered questions.

1. Due to program changes in New York, a motion was made and seconded to approve funds for the purchase of a new laptop computer with the appropriate programs to be used by the Registrar, not to exceed \$1200.00
2. Because of the current cash flow problems as reported by the Treasurer, a motion was made and seconded to reinstate the 7th Tradition "basket" in all workshops and committee meetings at assembly. We are also asking that when it is time to pass the basket, that it should be announced.
3. In consideration of the current lack of funds, a motion was made and seconded to fund our Delegate to New York only what is requested by GSO.

We also talked about asking the GSRs to go to the groups and talk to them about making sure they are making their contributions to NFAA.

Thank you, Pam, for taking notes. We closed in the usual way.

Growth – Tom H., Chair – 10 of 13 assigned DCMs present.

Alternate Chair: Tina C.

The entire hour and a half was taken up with Agenda Items discussion. No other business was conducted.

Site and Agenda – Rick B., Chair – 11 of 12 assigned DCMs present.

Alternate Chair: Marcus B.

Hotel selection process was the main topic discussed in this Committee Meeting. Highlights are as follows:

Handout letter of introduction and list of criteria (note: letter is anonymity protected). Letter is open invitation to bid. Two group members volunteered to assist Rick as "front people". Area map showing geographic distribution by number of groups provided. Majority of groups is in central and northern sections of North Florida Area. Package will be sent to all DCMs and anyone requesting one.

We also discussed how the districts and groups use the Conference theme. Suggestions included announcing it to Assembly, use as a workshop topic and meeting topic.

- The Convention will be held in Naples at the Registry Hotel from July 16th through July 20th, 2003.

47th Annual ICYPAA Bid Committee – Ken S.

Ken made a presentation for the Florida Bid Committee as follows:

It is my pleasure and privilege to represent the Florida Bid Committee for the 47th ICYPAA. As many of you know, ICYPAA is the International Conference of Young People in AA.

The aim of the Florida Bid Committee (known as the FBC for short) is to do the pre-planning required in hosting a convention of 2000+ people, and to present the results of this work by way of a formal bid. Our hats are off to the Portland, Oregon committee, which was awarded the privilege of hosting the 46th ICYPAA over July 4th weekend this year. We, along with many other prospective host cities, will present our bid at ICYPAA in Portland.

If awarded the conference, Florida will have the honor of hosting the 47th ICYPAA in 2004. This would be only the second time in 47 years that Florida has hosted an ICYPAA, the first being the 29th ICYPAA in Miami in 1986. Our first bid was presented in 1995, and we hope to be thought of as a "pre-season favorite" this year.

For those that may be wondering "Just what is ICYPAA?", this is an excerpt from ICYPAA's *Facts, Aims and Purposes* pamphlet, "...ICYPAA helps to carry AA's message of recovery to alcoholics of all ages. This meeting provides an opportunity for young AAs from all over the world to come together and share their experience, strength and hope as members of Alcoholics Anonymous. AA members who attend an ICYPAA return home better prepared to receive young people who come to AA looking for a better way of life."

The Florida Bid Committee has asked to come before this Assembly to address three items. The first is the relationship, as we see it, between the FBC and both Areas 14 and 15. We would like to cooperate with both areas, regardless of what city is chosen as our host city. We feel that this cooperation will allow us the best opportunity to serve the still-suffering alcoholic in both north and south Florida.

Secondly, should we be awarded the conference for 2004, our dates would be selected in such a way that they would not conflict with the 30-day before and after window surrounding major AA events within our state, such as the Florida State Convention/SE Regional Conference in Jacksonville.

Lastly, we would like to ask the chair, at the conclusion of our remarks, to please ask for a sense of the meeting that Area 14 supports the FBC's efforts to bring the 47th International conference of Young People in AA back to Florida in 2004.

2005 Florida State Convention – Ann P. asked for the support of North Florida Area Assembly for a bid for the 2005 Florida State convention to be held in Orlando. The bid will be for the Windham Palace Resort and Spa.

Chairman – Michael S. asked for a sense of the Assembly for support of the above bid. Again, the show of hands was unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS

Motion from Finance Committee:

Motion to change *Structures and Guidelines* to read "balanced and reasonable budget" in the Treasurer's responsibilities on page 9. There was some discussion with one member suggesting that this should be stated as a goal rather than a restriction so that we need never fear that essential services might be denied during a shortfall. Motion FAILED.

NEW BUSINESS

Motions from Finance Committee:

Motion to approve funds for the purchase of a new laptop computer with the appropriate programs to be used by the Registrar, not to exceed \$1,200.00.

Discussion included the fact that the current laptop being used is 5 years old and has no CD read/write. GSO data will be supplied to the Registrar in the form of CD starting this year, making a CD read/write necessary. There were also some budget concerns.

Motion to table until next Assembly was seconded, voted and **FAILED**.

After further discussion a motion to Call the Question was seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

The original motion was voted on and **PASSED**.

Motion to reinstate the Seventh Tradition basket at all NFA Committee Meetings and Workshops. After a short discussion, a motion to Call the Question was seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

The motion was voted on and **FAILED**.

Motion to fund Delegate to New York only what is requested by GSO. Clarification was asked for and given as to what the amount was that was requested by GSO (\$800.00), how much has already been sent (\$1,800.00) and what it would cost to pay full expenses (approximately \$3,700.00). Discussion ensued both for and against. Points made revolved around our primary responsibility as an area to support our Delegate versus our current cash flow situation.

A motion to Call the Question was seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

A Point of Order was presented: Since we have already sent GSO \$1,800.00, we can't possibly vote on only sending \$800.00.

An Amendment was made to send the extra \$2,000.00.

A second Amendment was made to let the \$1,800.00 already sent stand and revisit the issue at the end of this fiscal year for next year.

A motion was made to Call the Question on the second Amendment, seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

Some confusion followed as to the order in which the amendments should be voted on, and the Parliamentarian was called to the microphone.

Parliamentarian – Frank G. ruled that we need to vote on the first amendment first before a second amendment can be considered.

Floor action resumed. The second amendment was withdrawn and the first amendment was put back on the floor for discussion. A question was raised as to the total dollar amount involved in this amendment (\$2,000.00 on top of the \$1,800.00 already sent versus \$2,000.00 on top of the \$800.00 GSO is requesting). Chairman, Michael S. determined that the wording of the amendment indicated that we would send an additional \$2,000.00 over the \$800.00 that GSO has requested.

Amendment was voted and **FAILED**.

A motion to Call the Question on the original motion was seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

The motion was then voted on and **FAILED**.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Motion from Don H., Grapevine Chair:

Motion to have a Grapevine subscription raffle on Saturday evenings after the meeting. The number of subscriptions given away will be determined by the number of tickets sold.

Motion was seconded and there was no discussion.

Motion was voted on and **PASSED**.

Motion from Bob P., Corrections Chair:

Motion to approve money to send a representative from NFA Corrections Committee to the Bridging the Gap Conference in Chicago in September, not to exceed \$650.00. Motion was seconded. Much discussion followed revolving mainly around whom specifically would be sent and whether or not Corrections actually has committee members.

A motion was made to Call the Question, seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

Motion was voted on and **FAILED**.

Minority Opinion was heard. The tone of which was that we should be supporting the work that

Bridging the Gap does and get past the issue of who is or is not on the committee.

Motion to reconsider was made, seconded, voted and **PASSED**.

Motion was voted and **PASSED**.

Minority Opinion was heard, again. It was felt that it set a bad precedent to approve funds to an unnamed representative and that the Chair or Alternate Chair should be the only ones considered to go to the Conference. Again the question was raised as to sending a "representative" of a "committee" that doesn't exist. There was no call for reconsideration.

Motion stayed **PASSED**.

GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE AGENDA ITEMS Business Meeting - Saturday, March 29, 2003

Delegate – Corliss G. presided over Saturday night's business meeting regarding the General Service Conference Agenda Items, requesting all of the Committee Chairs to report on the items discussed in their committees or workshops and then, in some cases, asked for a sense of the assembly as to how we would have her vote. Thanking us all for our input, she assured us that our preferences would carry great weight when she votes on the Conference Agenda Items, although she may need to exercise her Right of Decision on some items, particularly when new information is presented. A recap of the meeting follows.

Agenda - Rick B., Items were discussed in the **Site and Agenda** committee meeting.

Per Corliss' request, this committee reviewed the suggested themes for the 2004 General Service Conference and narrowed it down to five choices as follows:

1. The Hand of AA – Outstretched for Those Yet to Come.
2. Unity – Together We Can.
3. Principles Before Personalities.
4. World Service Through Living Our Three Legacies.
5. Self Support – Where Money and Spirituality Meet.

Cooperation with the Professional Community - Louie M.

1. Review report from trustees' CPC Community/Treatment Facilities Committee regarding new CPC displays.
No decision was required on this issue as the displays have already been purchased.
2. Consider proposed changes to the "singleness of purpose" statement in six CPC pamphlets.
 - Request to add "by professionals" to the "singleness of purpose" statement.
The consensus was in favor of this change.
 - Request to replace "drinking problem" with "desire to stop drinking".
The consensus was in favor of this change.
3. Consider request that Workbook (service material) be reviewed annually by the Conference Committee; that changes to the workbook be approved by the trustees' committee; that any changes to the workbook be reported annually to the Conference Committee and distributed as background material. The workshop participants agreed to all of these issues.
4. Discuss ways of reaching a wider variety of professionals.
No suggestions were forthcoming – suggested individuals write down ideas and give them to Corliss.

Correctional Facilities - Bob P.

1. Discussed and accepted the Trustees Committee Report.
2. Correctional Facilities Kit and Workbook.
 - Review progress report of the Trustees' Committee on Correctional Facilities on request to combine the Correctional Facilities Kit and Workbook in a single three-ring binder.
Discussed and passed by all.
 - Consider request that changes in the Workbook be reported annually to the Conference Committee, and be distributed as background material. Discussed and passed by all.
 - Review contents of Kit and Workbook. Discussed and passed by all.
3. Review draft statement of purpose for inclusion in the Correctional Facilities Workbook/Kit. Discussed and passed by all.
4. Review draft statement on AA's singleness of purpose for inclusion in the Correctional Facilities Workbook/Kit. Only 2 workshop participants were for this, all others were against.
5. Review request to revise the booklet *AA in Prison: Inmate to Inmate* to add/replace stories to better reflect current experience. Discussed and passed by all.
6. Consider request that a pamphlet about "bridging the gap between prisons and AA" be published to encourage AA contact for newly released members. Discussed and passed by all.

Finance - Ann P.

Discuss Self-support. The general consensus of the North Florida Area Finance Committee was that self-support has been talked about too much. All voting members of this committee agreed that making changes would take too long and be too hard to do. Therefore, we feel things should be left status quo.

Grapevine - Don H.

1. Consider the suggestion to add the phrase "and encouraging subscriptions" to the description of the Grapevine representative on page 9 of the pamphlet "The AA Grapevine: Our Meeting in Print". Consensus was in favor.
2. Discuss suggestions for new AA Grapevine items for production in the year 2004 or later.
 - *Rule #62*, a soft-cover collection of jokes and cartoons previously published in the *AA Grapevine*. Consensus was in favor.
 - Victor E. poster celebrating the AA Grapevine's 60th anniversary in 2004. Consensus agreed.
 - Soft-cover anthology of Grapevine stories about the Promises: tentative title of "A New Freedom". Consensus agreed.
 - *I Am Responsible*, a pocket-sized soft-cover collection of Grapevine stories addressing AA's declaration of responsibility. Consensus agreed.
 - *Best of Bill* in a Spanish language edition. Consensus agreed.
 - New Spanish language CD of stories about the Promises, published in LaVina. Consensus agreed.

Literature- Michael J.

1. Review the updated draft manuscript of the "AA and the Armed Services" pamphlet. The group decided to allow the Delegate to use her Right of Decision on this item.
2. Consider updated text revision suggested for "The AA Grapevine" section of "Your AA General Service Office" pamphlet. The consensus was in favor of this item.
3. Consider deleting the phrase, "not even your parents," from the second sentence in the sixth panel of the story "Vinnie" in the pamphlet "Too Young". Final majority after discussion was to allow Corliss her Right of Decision with four minority opinions.
4. "The AA Group" pamphlet.
 - Consider suggested change on page 23, in the section "*What trusted servants (officers) do we need?*", replace the word "jobs" in the first and third paragraphs with the words "service" and "service positions" respectively. Consensus agreed.
 - Consider suggested change on page 24: replace the sentence "See the chart of *suggested* group officers" with "The chart below offers possibilities for service at the group level". Consensus agreed.
5. Consider requests for a new edition of the Spanish language Big Book. Per Michael's notes, what they really want is to have stories that are "translated" by identifications rather than literally as content is being lost in the translation; and/or stories sent in by Spanish-speaking recovering individuals. The group agreed in majority, with five minority opinions.
6. Consider the AA World Services Board's request "that its intent to place the Fourth Edition of the Big Book on the GSO Web site be placed on the Agenda of the 53rd General Service Conference for discussion by the conference and/or action as appropriate."

The group discussed pros and cons from the background material and voted 20 for and 5 opposed.

Delegate - Corliss G., requested a general sense of the assembly on this last item. Discussion ensued and resulted in a slight majority being opposed to putting the Big Book on the Web site. Additional discussion revolved around such issues as:

- Against - Couldn't this affect our copyrights?
- For - The search capabilities would be far more convenient when needing to look something up.
- Against - It would take away from the one-on-one interaction between sponsors and sponsees and between seasoned AA members and newcomers.

A second sense of the assembly resulted in a strong majority against the Big Book being put on the Web site.

Corliss also asked for a sense of the assembly on two items not discussed in the Literature Workshop that will be brought to Conference as follows:

1. Consider revisions suggested by the trustees' Literature Committee to the comic book pamphlet "What Happened to Joe..." which include updated text and illustrations to reflect contemporary language, clothing, hair styles and add ethnic and age diversity. The sense of the assembly was pretty much split for and against.
2. Consider the trustees' Literature Committee's suggestion that the pamphlet "It Happened to Alice!" be replaced by a new women's comic book pamphlet which would have current language, updated illustrations and a new/contemporary storyline based on a single working mother who is involved in a DUI incident followed by introduction to AA. The sense of the assembly was in favor of this item.

Policy/Admissions – Mary T., Item discussed at the **Accessibility** workshop.

Discuss request to form a Conference committee on Special Needs.

The workshop participants discussed background materials and history presented by Tom D., Past Delegate; and voted 7 in favor, 4 opposed and 5 abstained resulting in a 44% majority for.

Delegate – Corliss G. asked for a general sense of the assembly on this item. Over two-thirds majority was in favor of forming the committee.

Public Information – Deborah H.

1. Public Service Announcements (PSA).
 - Consider approving the proposed television PSA developed by the trustees' PI Committee. Passed.
 - Review information on centralized distribution, tracking and evaluation of current PSA "Reach Out". See below.
 - Consider centralized distribution, tracking and evaluation of the proposed PSA, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000, in addition to the work of local PI committee. Passed.
2. Consider request that the responsibility for GSO's AA Web site be shifted from the AAWS, Inc. Board of Directors to the trustees' and Conference Public Information Committees. Passed – 11 for, 1 opposed.
3. Consider and approve 2004 Alcoholics Anonymous Membership Survey Questionnaire.
 - Question #3 in survey for marital status add "domestic partnership". Passed.
 - Question #12 employment status where it says "skilled trade selections" replace "craft worker" with "skilled craftsman" to include electricians, plumbers, etc. Passed
4. Consider request that the Public Information Workbook (service material) be reviewed annually by the Conference Committee; that changes to the Workbook be approved by the trustees committee; that any changes to the Workbook be reported annually to the Conference Committee and distributed as background material. Failed – 14 opposed, 5 in favor.

Report and Charter – Tom H., Items were discussed in the **Growth** Committee.

1. Review *The AA Service Manual*, 2002-2003 Edition.
 - Consider suggested change to "Delegates Duties" on page S44 to read: "Be prepared to attend all area service meetings and assemblies plus all regional service meetings and assemblies respective to his/her area".
Against – It was determined that in some areas this would not be possible.
 - Consider suggestion to add two new bullet points under the section titled "Duties" in Chapter Two: The Group and Its GSR on page S24.
 1. GSRs attend district meetings. Agreed.
 2. They also attend area assemblies.
Disagreed – Some Groups/GSRs cannot afford the expense of assembly. This may discourage some members from becoming GSRs.
 - Consider suggestion to add the words "and a sponsor" in the section "Qualifications" in Chapter Two on page S24 to read: "Usually, prospective GSRs have at least two years of continuous sobriety and a sponsor."
Against – Having a sponsor is valuable, but only suggested, and shouldn't be required for service.
 - Consider that Chapter Two: The Group and Its GSR on page S23 be returned to the text on pages S45-49 in the 1991-1992 Edition of *The AA Service Manual* (see Agenda Items for complete wording). Against – newer edition has adequate description.

- Consider the suggestion to add the words "to reprint the Steps, Traditions, and/or the Concepts, and" to the page S37 to read: "Local AA publications are permitted to reprint the Steps, Traditions, and/or the Concepts, and to quote a phrase, sentence or brief paragraph excerpted from AA literature such as the big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, the *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions*, *The AA Service Manual* and Conference-approved pamphlets without a prior, written request to do so." No majority consensus was reached.
 - Review updated chart of the AA Grapevine, Inc. to replace the chart on page S80 and other editorial updates to include language on the Grapevine Representative (GvR), La Vina Representative (LvR) and La Vina. Reviewed and passed.
 - Consider the request that the trustees conduct an audit of all reported Conference Advisory Actions to ensure that they have been and will be reported accurately. Agreed.
2. Discuss AA Directories. The committee felt there is definitely a strong need for the directories, but that better means of keeping them updated are in order.
 3. Discuss *General Service Conference Final Report*. Not discussed due to time constraints.

Treatment Facilities – Dilene S.

1. Review progress report to Conference Committee on Treatment Facilities on combining Kit and Workbook in a single binder. Reviewed – see below.
2. If the Treatment Facilities Workbook (soft-cover) and Kit are combined, consider continuing to publish the workbook as a separate item.
Agreed – separate workbook is portable, easy to use and less cost-prohibitive.
3. Consider request that the Workbook (service material) be reviewed annually by the Conference Committee; that changes to the workbook be approved by the trustees' Committee; that any changes to the workbook be reported annually to the Conference Committee and distributed as background material.
Agreed in majority, though some felt care should be taken regarding giving over our responsibility as a fellowship to the Conference Committee on this issue.

Archives – Joan C.

Review contents of Archives Workbook.

No recommendations for further changes/additions. Approved changes by Archives Committee, 2/2/03.

International Conventions/Regional Forums – Chet P., Items addressed in the Intergroup workshop.

1. Discuss inviting non-AA speakers to participate in the 2005 International Convention at AA's expense with the number not to exceed twenty-one (21) speakers. Approved by a 24 to 8 majority.
2. Discuss selection of three (3) cities to be considered as a site for the International Convention in 2015.
Top three cities recommended were:
 - Atlanta (26 votes)
 - Cleveland (14 votes)
 - Indianapolis (14 votes)

Secretary – Rebecca B. asked for anyone who brought a motion to the floor other than Finance to please see her after the meeting to clarify the exact wording of the motion for the minutes.

Chairperson – Michael S. asked for a motion to adjourn, so moved, seconded and passed.

We still have work to do but AA is definitely alive and well and carrying the message of recovery to the still suffering alcoholic.

Thank you so much for allowing me the opportunity to serve Area 14 as your Delegate. When I looked around and realized that I was one of 93 elected Delegates to the General Service Conference, I felt a profound sense of gratitude. Thank you for this privilege.

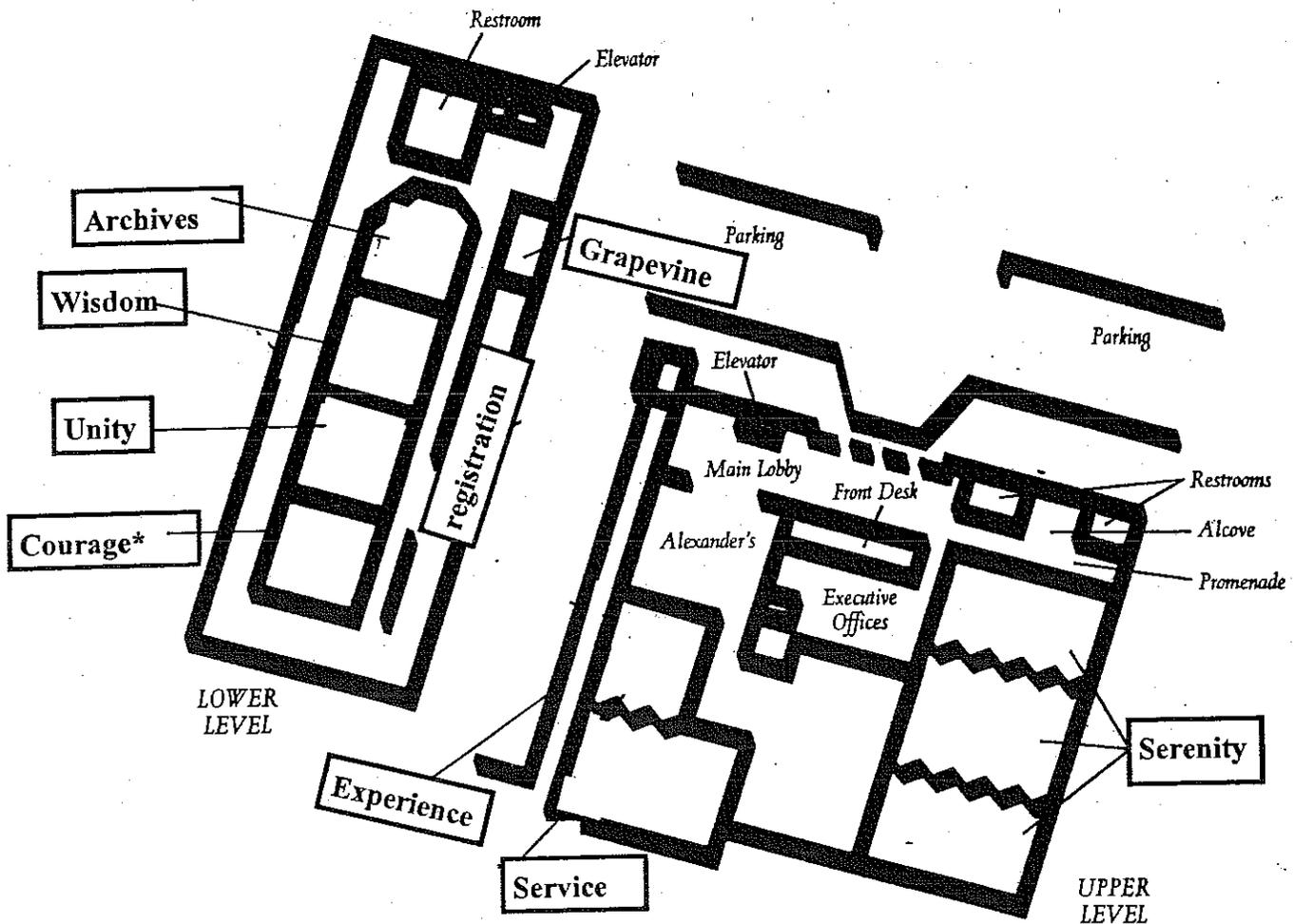
