

North Florida Area 14 Assembly Minutes
1st Quarter, January 10-11, 2009
2009 Theme “Enthusiasm and Gratitude in Action”

Area Chair: Glenn W. called meeting to order. Serenity Prayer was said. The AA Anonymity Statement was read and the Short Form of the Twelve Concepts was read.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Andy D. As each district was called for attendance of D.C.M., Alternate D.C.M., and number of G.S.R.’s and alternate G.S.R.’s present. 8 of the 8 officers were present. Service Coordinators absent CPC and website. 200 total voting members for assembly.

Officer Reports:

Secretary: Kelly J. The minutes were sent out in a timely fashion. Are there any changes to the minutes as presented that I do not already know about? None were reported. In the Growth report, it should have read, table to the January 2009 Assembly. Motion was made by Chairperson to accept the minutes. All were in favor.

Treasurer: Laura M. We will start with the top form, the Balance Sheet. As you can see we have combined cash on hand and Prudent Reserve total of **\$ 57,137.87**. Based on our 2009 approved budget, we are still within the Prudent Reserve Guidelines stated in our Structures & Guidelines.

Our Income/Expense report shows contributions were down this year, but fortunately so were our expenses. We had higher than expected 7th Tradition and Literature Sales Income and we received over 60% more interest on our Prudent Reserve than originally projected. Overall, we had a year where income exceeded expenses by **\$ 1,273.06**. I thank you for your continued support of the North Florida Area. There were no questions for the Treasurer. Motion was made by Chairperson to accept report. All were in favor.

Delegate Panel 59: Chet P. Chet recognized the Past Area 14 Delegates seated in the audience: Tom D., Panel 43; Dan E., Panel 45; Kathy P., Panel 49; Michael S., Panel 55; and Fred H., Panel 57. Chet also recognized Tom K., Panel 52, Area 43, New Hampshire and Howard L. Panel 42, Area 37, Mississippi, our current Southeast Regional Trustee. It was my privilege, as your Delegate, to attend my first **Southeast Regional Forum in Knoxville, November 21 through 23rd**. It was a valuable experience. Here are the highlights from the weekend: Leonard Blumenthal, outgoing Chairman of the General Service Board, opened the Forum and stressed the 2008 Conference theme of “Communication and Participation – The Key to Unity and Self Support”. He stressed a firm belief that together we can insure that this Fellowship will not only stay together, but will continue to be that beacon of hope for alcoholics yet to come. But, quoting Bill W., “we cannot sit comfortably in our groups and hope that others will hear about us and come around.” “Let us, at any cost or sacrifice, so improve our communication with all these that they may find what you have found – a new life of freedom under God.”

Our past Delegate, Fred H., gave a very clear and informative presentation on “**How a Suggestion Becomes a Conference Action.**”

Grapevine Report: It was reported that the price of the Grapevine subscription is increasing. The Grapevine is the only magazine that is funded solely by subscriptions. There is no advertising or outside support. Five people, 4 in addition to the subscriber, read each Grapevine magazine so it effectively spreads our message. Also, in this digital age it is a way that our message can be carried in facilities where electronic delivery is not possible: the correctional facilities. The Grapevine staff is currently assessing the actual numbers of correctional facilities that will not allow metal staples to be brought in because the extra cost of non-metal binding is about \$ 28,000 per year or \$ 2,000 per issue. The Grapevine themes for rest of this year were distributed.

March: **Double-Digit Sobriety, Staying Sober for the Long Haul**; April: **Along Spiritual**

Lines, AAs Talk about their Higher Powers; May: Open issue; June: **Finding Balance, Leading a Full Life in Recovery;** July: **Prison issue;** Augusts: **The Joy of Living;** September: **All about Me, Letting Go of Ego;** October: **Dealing with Feeling Different;** November: **Classic GV;** December: **What Gives you Hope?** The La Vina themes are: March/April, Issue on general topics/ Numero acerca de topicos generales; May/June: Newcomers/**Problemas de los recién llegados;** July/August: Prison issue/**AA en la carcel;** September/October: Women in AA/**La mujer en AA;** November/December: Remaining sober during the holidays/**Como mantenernos sobrios durante las festividades de fin de año.** Not only are articles being sought on these topics, but also articles on Traditions are always encouraged.

AAWS Director, John K., reported that our web site receives about 13,000 visits per day; that all pamphlets and the 4th Edition of the Big Book in English, Spanish and French can be read on-line. The Big Book is currently published in 57 languages and pamphlets in 87 languages.

Greg M., the outgoing General Manager of the General Service Office, gave a presentation of "Self-Support – A Spiritual Journey". 45% of listed groups contribute to GSO. To be fully self-supporting from group and individual contributions would require \$ 6.69 per year per person or \$ 338 per year from the groups that now contribute. Literature sales are up, but so are warehousing and direct shipping costs. In order to keep our reserve fund at 9 months operating costs there will need to be a \$ 1.00 per book price increase in July.

At the October General Service Board weekend, Ward Ewing, Class A Trustee, was elected as the new Board Chair and Phyllis H., past Delegate and past Pacific Region Trustee, was selected as the new General Manager of the General Service Office.

The purpose of the Regional Forums was to improve the communication within the fellowship. The first Forum held in 1975 in Atlanta was a very contentious affair at the beginning with a good bit of mistrust about what was being done in New York. However, it ended with a renewed sense of trust, love and gratitude. It impressed me that we belong to a Fellowship that brings the non-alcoholic chairman of the General Service Board and another Class A Trustee, the General Manager of the General Service Office, four publication or AAWS directors and a Trustee-at-Large to meet with members of AA and answer any question that was asked. There were a lot of questions concerning the procedure used in the selection of the new General Manager of the General Service Office and, after the Forum ended, it was my sense that much distrust of the process had been cleared from the air.

The 59th General Service Conference will be held April 25 to May 2, 2009 at the Crowne Plaza Times Square Hotel. The theme of the Conference is "**Our Commitment To Carry A.A.'s Message – Enthusiasm and Gratitude In Action**". I have been assigned to the Finance Committee. The background materials for the agenda items should arrive in February and I will distribute them as soon as possible so that your districts will have as much time as possible to discuss the agenda before the April Assembly.

Cecilia and I will be attending the Delegate's Get Together in Atlanta next month. My past experience with this meeting is that it provides preparation for the Conference, especially for new Delegates and Alternates. I would like to take with me a sense of the Assembly as to whether North Florida wants to participate in a Southeast Regional Hospitality Suite at the 2010 International Convention in San Antonio, TX.

Alternate Delegate: Cecilia R. As I have been serving for only 249 hours, I have a short report. I will be attending the Southeast Regional Delegates Get Together in Atlanta in February. Chet is providing me with the Conference background material as he receives it so I can have a head start on the Conference agenda items when they are received.

Chairperson: Glenn W.

I want to welcome all to your Area Assembly – especially those here for the first time. I have appointed our Service Coordinators, Committee Chairs and have started doing the work of serving you all working with these committees. It was suggested to me I set a goal of what we are here to accomplish during the next two years of this Panel. My first thought was the obvious; we are here to inform our Delegate on conference items, and to make decisions concerning the North Florida Area committee, and of course, to carry the message. My second thought was how well are we doing this? As trusted service workers are we able to be of maximum service to carry the message? What can we do to be better service workers? So my goal will be to provide an atmosphere to help empower our trusted servants, our G.S.R.'s, D.C.M.'s, and service workers to better be able to serve Alcoholics Anonymous as guardians of our Traditions and Concepts. One of our first tasks as new service workers will be the passing on of information about General Service Conference agenda items to be voted on in April by our Delegate. I will work with our Delegate and Alt Delegate to get this background information to the Groups as quickly as possible to give adequate time for consideration. To accomplish this goal, we will need the help of the D.C.M.'s to distribute this information. You will be notified later in February. I will strive to make available the resources of the N Florida Area through our communications, workshops, and other means to enlarge our knowledge and experience so that we may ultimately better serve our Groups, Districts, and our fellow Alcoholics as we carry the message to those who still suffer from Alcoholism. Thank you for giving me this opportunity to serve Alcoholics Anonymous.

Alternate Chair: Marilyn B.

This weekend we have 323 members registered. The breakdown is as follows: 54 D.C.M./Alt D.C.M.'s, 66 Visitors, 165 G.S.R./Alt G.S.R.'s and 38 Officers, Service Coordinators & Administrative Chairs. I want to thank Districts 1, 10, 23, 25 & 28 for hosting & Bud B. for taking on the job of Host DCM. You folks did a great job. Let's all remember these Districts were volunteered by Panel 57 outgoing D.C.M.'s. Thanks goes to our past Delegate, Fred H., for serving this weekend as the Delegate of the Assembly, past Delegate Dan E. who facilitated the D.C.M. Orientation Workshop and past Delegate Kathy P. for facilitating the Traditions Workshop. A special thank you to our S.E. Regional Trustee, Howard L., for his participation in the G.S.R. Orientation Workshop. Our next Assembly will be April 3, 4, & 5th and Districts 3, 17A/B, 14 and 18A/B will be hosting.

Special Reports:

Ad Hoc Committee Report – International Convention Hospitality Room: Fred H. Chair
At the October 2008 Area Assembly, myself along with Chet P., Marilyn B., and Melanie E. were requested by the Area 14 Chairperson to research Area 14 involvement and participation in previous hospitality rooms at the International Conventions. After some discussion between the committee members, we determined that Area 14 has previously participated along with Area 15, South Florida in the following International Conventions: 1995 in San Diego, 2000 in Minnesota, 2005 in Toronto, Canada.

The purpose of the State of Florida Hospitality Room is to provide a meeting place where convention attendees could stop by and be greeted by volunteer members from the various districts throughout Florida. Other states and regions from various parts of the USA and Canada have also hosted Hospitality Suites at International Conventions. In keeping with previous tradition, the Area 14 Alternate Delegate co-hosted the Hospitality Suite along with the Alternate Delegate from Area 15, South Florida. Each time the Area 14 Alternate Delegate attended the International Convention and co-hosted the suite they did so at their own expense. The Alternate Delegate spends the most of their time confined to being in the suite to order and verify delivery of coffee for the suite. Our past Delegate Fred H. spent at least 8 hours a day in the suite over the three days. Their duties prior to the convention would be to gather names and schedule volunteers for a three day period to serve as greeters.

The coffee for the hospitality suite is already paid for by the coffee fund which is held in escrow by the Area 15, Treasurer. The coffee fund was established some years ago to cover the cost of the coffee and other miscellaneous expenses such as printing and guest books. The total expenses at the 2005 Toronto International Convention were \$4,640.

Recently, Area 15 voted to fund their Alternate Delegate to attend the 2010 San Antonio, Texas International Convention and serve as a host during the 3 day event.

While our Ad Hoc Committee had no recommendations we report these same finding yesterday to the Growth Committee for their further consideration. The committee thanks Area 14 for the opportunity to be of service.

53rd Florida State Convention Lon L. Chairperson

Please register early. We need the funds to meet our budget. We have 370 registrations for the convention. We have 700 room nights booked. The earlier you register for the Friday and Saturday night banquet the better your seat will be at the Speaker meeting. We will be seating in zones based on your time of registration. Please take Fliers to your meetings and make an announcement about the banquet and encourage members to register early for the AA State Convention and if they want to stay at the Host Hotel to make room reservation as soon as possible.

NFAA Florida State Convention Oversight Committee: Cecilia R. Chairperson
4 out of 6 voting members were present. Michael S absent, Harold absent

We received a report from Lon L. Chairperson of the 53rd State Convention in Jacksonville, FL. July 29-August 1, 2009. There are approx 370 registrants and over 700 room nights. Website address to register is www.flstateconvention.com.

Jack from Daytona expressed interest in putting in a bid for 2011 Florida State Convention. We voted to support that effort and asked that at the April assembly he bring back particulars for review. He was given names and email address of committee members for help in this effort.

We discussed the liability of giving past convention mailing lists to future conventions. The 52nd is not agreeable to giving the 53rd a copy of their mailing lists so that a flyer can be sent to encourage registrations. HIPA rules were used as an example. Cecilia to look into this and also to see if there is another way to get a mailing based on the 52nd registrations.

Service Coordinator Reports:

Accessibilities: Jim E. Coordinator, John L. Alternate Coordinator, Attendance: 17
Opened Meeting with discussion of some accessibility issues: hearing, sight, mobility, learning, age. We then looked into the tools we have to overcome these impediments. I tasked each of us to look around our meeting rooms and see if we are making the rooms accessible. My first meeting following this workshop was our business meeting where I noticed that those with mobility issues might be precluded from accessing our stage. In response, I will ask the Assembly to consider a motion that a ramp be built on at least one side of our stage.

Archives: Dave W. Coordinator, Attendance: 34, Note Taker: Cecilia R.,
Theme or main Topic: Position Description, Workbook discussion, Show & Tell, Q&A Qualified myself to the North Florida area 14. Discussion was about pictures and anonymity. Will order archives workbook for next assembly. Two more are interested in helping. There are requests to take archives road show to 2 locations. Cecilia R. gave handouts and discussed the very first gratitude dinner.

Area Archivist: Cecilia R. Archivist

We passed out 20 copies of the Oral History kits furnished by G.S.O. and discussed how to conduct and what permissions you need when taking oral histories. Also there is a deed of gift form for all books and items given by members and/or families to archives. In November, I presented the history of Gratitude Dinners and the write up is on the back table for those interested. Our collection of Group History forms is growing and we are adding to the book. Our goal is to have one for every group. We will then send a book to New York for the G.S.O. Archives. Questions were raised about non conference history books vs. conference approved as far as accuracy and using in presentations.

At this time I am submitting my resignation as Area Archivist. I will continue to participate in Archives as they are a love of mine. I thank the Area for allowing me to serve as Area Archivist.

Cooperation with the Professional Community: Tom H. Lead workshop for Chairperson.
Attendance: 38

Suggestions brought up by attendees: Send out packets to professionals in district. Leave old Grapevine copies in Doctor's Offices. Stamp literature with local information. Take advantage of the free pamphlets from G.S.O.. At hotels and at professional conferences set up a large poster and man table. Educate physicians on Alcoholism in their offices. Offer to take medical and nursing students to Open AA Meetings. List local contact numbers on Public Service TV. What do we say when we take brochures to places? Just say you have information about alcoholism.

Send reluctant physicians a copy of the Doctors Opinion. Discussed advantages of personal visits to professional offices and not just sending them information. Go to office managers to get permission to display racks of literature in offices and hospitals. Educate Judges about singleness of purpose. Question rose about the difference of the CPC and PI. What exactly we are supposed to do. Most districts have CPC and PI joined due to lack of volunteers. We need a new CPC Area Service Coordinator. See Glenn W. Chairperson for service resume form to fill out.

Corrections: Bob C. Coordinator, Seeking Alternate Coordinator, Attendance: 30

The incoming Corrections Service Coordinator introduced himself and gave a brief background of him. Bob C. expressed the need to obtain an Alt. Service Coordinator and requested a service resume be submitted as several people expressed an interest to serve. Bob C. explained the desire to continue the work that the previous service coordinator has done with the State Correction Officials. Bob also said that it is very important that the relationship between Area 14 and these officials remain on good footing. Bob C. explained that due to a new influx of D.C.M.'s/G.S.R.'s that a new list of contacts for the Corrections Prerelease is needed and passed around a list in order that interested people can put down their contact information. Bob C. asked the group what their needs and expectations are and what can the Corrections Service Coordinator can do to facilitate these needs and expectations. A discussion took place on the problems and situations on getting access to the various facilities in the districts. Some of the problems appear to be a lack of communication between individual AAs and corrections officials in as far as the policy of a particular facility. A question was asked about how districts worked the prerelease program. Bob C. explained how the program is working in the Duval/Jacksonville corrections facilities. Other suggestions were made. Bob C. explained that the Area Delegate has requested that a survey be conducted to find out what the policies of the correctional facilities within Area 14 in regard with bring Grapevines into their facilities. The intent of the survey is to find out how many facilities will not allow Grapevines with staples.

Grapevine: Rob L. Coordinator, Attendance of 38. Eight of those were new G.V.R.'s. Questions from the new G.V.R.'s were taken and addressed. The discussion centered on the duties and responsibilities of a G.V.R.. We discussed how to do a Grapevine meeting at your home group. There was discussion on what to do with your older editions of the Grapevine. How to "lose" them in various places (i.e. doctor's office, bus, taxi, etc). We talked about the Grapevine Digital Archives. We also discussed the 2009 budget that was approved. It was decided to bring a motion to the floor today to increase our budget to be able to meet the anticipated actual need. Through the sale of the raffle tickets throughout the weekend, we were able to raffle 24 subscriptions to the Grapevine. We discussed what our goals were for next quarter and the rest of the year. The April Assembly will focus on how to write an article for the Grapevine. Our goal is to have several articles written by members of the Area and be able to submit them by the July Assembly. Thanks to all who participated and allowing me to serve as your Grapevine Coordinator.

Intergroup: Don H, Service Coordinator, Melanie E, Alternate Coordinator, Attendance: 43 Don has made initial contact with the 13 of the Area 14 Intergroup Offices and intends numerous contacts/visits during the next 2 years. The meeting topics: The History of the Intergroup Coordinator at NFAA; Are Intergroup/Central Offices a part of AA? Are Intergroup/Central Offices a part of the General Service Structure?

Numerous references were noted and read concerning all three topics leading to a lively discussion/question and answer session. Note: Reference items were: AA Service Manual; Pamphlet Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix; Box 459 Aug-Sept 2007. Future Assembly topics mentioned were: Possible NFAA inputs to Area 14 Intergroup newsletters; AA Guidelines; Prudent Reserves; Accuracy of Where & When's listed on the internet; Open/Closed

Meetings; Compiling a list of all Intergroup activities available in Area 14; Sharing of Area 14 Intergroup original documents/pamphlets. Attendees were encouraged to enlarge/enhance this topic list.

Literature: Wendy M., Coordinator, Richard C., Alternate Coordinator, Attendance 27
We talked about the Box 459 and the book "Experience, Strength, and Hope" stories that were removed from the first three editions of the big book. A display was set up of the 2007 Membership Survey results. Update was given about the progress of "Along the way." Feed back was given on how the area and district levels can use literature to inform our members and carry the message. We discussed Conference - approved literature vs. non approved literature. The process and importance of conference approved literature and if the grapevine was conference approved.

Public Information: Staci S., Coordinator, Heidi L., Alternate Coordinator. Attendance: 60
First I would like to thank Heidi for agreeing to be my alternate. I would also like to thank Joshua for taking notes. I read the "Purpose" from the A.A. guidelines on P.I. We had a very informative meeting with the topic being different means of doing Public Information work. I asked what the districts are doing now & what they have done in the past. We discussed Billboards- the different types, the costs, length of time and that we get a better rate when we let them know that we are non-profit. Internet- Craig list (update often). How to approach: Schools, Doctors, Police, and Judges by using Guide Letters in the P.I. Workbook. Leaving AA literature in hotels, motels, hospital waiting rooms and places of worship. Bringing Public Service Announcements to TV and Radio Stations. The anonymity behind doing interviews. We also discussed how to encourage more involvement from members in our Districts. Suggestions were Service Fairs, making a poster board with P.I. information to bring to groups, and of course what works best, "feed them and they will come." There were some questions about getting a P.I. Kit. All P.I. District Chairs receive theirs free from G.S.O. when they register. For others the cost is \$12.00 for the full kit (catalog item M-27) or just the workbook at a cost of \$2.50 (item M-27I). I forgot to pass around an attendance sheet, so please e-mail me at P.I. coordinator at the area 14 website. I would like to get everyone information as soon as possible so when I receive the background info I can pass it along to you and you can have time to pass it along to your groups and get feedback before the next assembly.

Treatment: Vivian F. Coordinator, Attendance 70
We handed out Treatment Workbooks and "AA In Treatment Facilities" Pamphlet at the beginning of the meeting. We then had an interactive discussion on what the message is that is taken into these meetings. After much discussion, we read from the section in the Treatment Workbook, on page 15, about Singleness of Purpose. We moved on to Bridging the Gap and how it works. We finished with sharing from the attendees on the different formats used in treatment meetings and the other types of facilities that are available also for meetings, such as nursing homes, assisted living facilities and retirement communities. We agreed to have a quarterly newsletter to share our experience with others. I am available for workshops. You can contact me by email at treatment@aanorthflorida.org. Corrections and Treatment will also have a combined workshop and we are willing to travel! Thank you for the privilege to serve.

Website: Jim S. Alternate Coordinator Attendance 14, 3 assigned DCMs, past delegate Michael
I would like to thank Amanda for taking notes. ***The Password Protected Section of the website will expire as of this assembly and I will be presenting a motion to extend this.*** Ron. B. was selected to be our new Webmaster based on his experience with our software and his experience with other A.A. related websites and his willingness to serve. Our past Webmaster, Jeff P. has set

up all the e-mail boxes so the right people will receive your e-mails if you click on the links of the website. Registrar Andy D. tested this for me and all is well. I would like to thank Jeff for all his hard work in making this transitional period a little easier.

We discussed the future of this committee and Michel had suggested we review the past as to not repeat it. We also discussed helping some of the Districts to build and maintain websites within the guidelines from GSO on the Internet.

Administrative Reports:

Finance: Chairperson: ANDY J.

Alternate Chair: Sandi B.

Attendance: 11 DCM's out of 11 assigned to the committee

Laura (Area 14 Treasurer) went over Finance Committee Member folders. Lengthy discussion about HOSPITALITY ROOMS at the 2010 International AA Convention. Howard L. (SE Delegate) has brought up possibly joining in on a "SE Area Hospitality Room." The SE area includes states as far north as Virginia / Kentucky and states south and as far west as the Mississippi River. There was also discussion about the North Florida area joining in with the South Florida area to host a "Florida Hospitality Room". It was agreed that more information is needed about each possible choice. GRAPEVINE Chairperson Rob presented a request to increase the Grapevine budget from \$900 to \$2500. This is actually only a housekeeping issue and does not involve any real financial changes. ***MOTION MADE to increase the Grapevine's budget by \$1600 – from \$900 to \$2500. Passed***

Growth: Cecilia R. Chairperson, Rita C. Alternate Chairperson, Attendance: 8 of 10 members present. Introduction of Rita C. alternate chair and sitting DCM's with service background. Guests also introduced themselves. Past Growth chairs from Panel 53, 55 & 57 discussed the challenges, which faced their committee's, and the outcomes.

It was suggested that all DCM's bring their service manuals, advisory actions, structures and guidelines and minutes to this meeting in order to be prepared and informed in service to the area. We discussed the 2 past items from the October assembly regarding adding additional duties to the Alt Delegates position and forming a secondary administrative committee for International Conventions/Forums.

Motion was made to: Change Structures and Guidelines to add to Section 10 Alternate Delegate To add to Alternate Delegate job responsibilities to co-chair the Florida Hospitality Suite at the International Convention.

SE Trustee Howard L. shared on the proposal to have at the International Conventions a SE Regional Hospitality suite, financed and manned by the areas in the SE Region. This will be discussed at the Business meeting tomorrow so the delegate can take our voice to the Delegates Get Together in Atlanta in February, where this will be discussed with the other SE Region Delegates and Trustee.

We have two housekeeping motions from motions, which were passed in October.

1. Change Structures and Guidelines Section 5 Scheduling and Notice of Area Assemblies. Remove website from Service Coordinators and add to Administrative Committee Reports. Add Archivist after Archives.

2. Change Structures and Guidelines Section 4 Area Service Coordinators/Administrative Committees. Remove website from Service Coordinators and add to Administrative Committees

We discussed the area map and updating of district boundaries as a committee and we will start work on that at our next assembly. This is to help the DCM's see what groups are geographically in their area and to make official district lines which can be recorded for future DCM's to use.
