

North Florida Area 14 Assembly Minutes
4th Quarter, October 9-10, 2009
2009 Theme “Enthusiasm and Gratitude in Action”

Area Chair: Glenn W. called meeting to order at 9:10 AM. Serenity Prayer was said. Since the last time we met here, sadly, we have lost two trusted servants; GSR, District 15, and DCM District 23 to the N Florida area conference and our fellowship as a whole. I respectfully wish to ask for a moment of silence in their memory of their service here.

The AA Anonymity Statement was read and the Short Form of the Twelve Concepts was read.

Registrar: Roll call was taken by Andy D. As each district was called for attendance of D.C.M., Alternate D.C.M., and number of G.S.R.’s and alternate G.S.R.’s present. All officers and service coordinators were present. 197 total voting members for assembly.

Officer Reports:

Secretary: Kelly J. The minutes were sent out in a timely fashion. The cost of 670 copies of the July Minutes was \$518.58. Saving of \$957.42 from last July Minutes. On page 1 of the proposed budget sheet, under Alternate Delegate line item 6291 International Convention came after Alternate Delegate Total, correct placement was before total. Tom H. name should appear next to C.P.C. on page 12. All were in favor.

Treasurer: Laura M. Thank you for the privilege of serving. Let’s start on the top of the Balance Sheet; combined cash on hand is \$61,696.35. If you go to the next page, Income & Expense report shows our budgeted amount for contributions for 2009 is \$48,000. That’s estimating \$12,000 in contributions per quarter. Note that we had total contributions of \$30,925.45. This is approximately \$5,074.55 below our estimated contributions. Our 2009 Budgeted Total Expenses are \$64,600.00 and our actual expenses as of September 30, 2009 are \$31,237.55 which is \$33,362.45 below budget at this time. Thank you Panel 59 for being prudent in your spending. The proposed 2010 Budget is on your table and will be discussed under old business.

Delegate Panel 59: Chet P. recognized the Past Area 14 Delegates seated in the audience: Tom D., Panel 43; Dan E., Panel 45; Corliss G., Panel 53; Michael S., Panel 55; and Fred H., Panel 57. Also recognized were Ken C., our weekend guest and Delegate from Area 15; Annie C., Ken’s wife and Area 15 Registrar; Kathy G., Area 15 Chairperson; and Tom K., Past Delegate Area 43, Panel 52. At your direction, I sent a copy of the Motion regarding establishing a full face policy to the Conference Coordinator. In response the Conference Coordinator said that the topic was discussed at the August sharing session of the General Service Board and it was carried forward for further discussion at the November Board meeting. She asked if she could include our motion and forwarding letter for background material at those meetings. I gave permission for that use.

I attended the **65th Southeastern Conference** in Mobile in August. I was asked to present a workshop topic on sponsorship. We received a report from our Southeast Regional Trustee about the July General Service Board meeting. 1) Financial summary: book sales and Grapevine subscriptions are up, due to purchases made before the price increase went into effect, and contributions are down. Figures: Total book distribution for the first 6 months was 1,495,764 which was a 37% increase over last year; net literature sales was \$ 8,410,300 for a gross profit of \$ 5,099,410. Contributions for that period were \$2,883,440 or 7% less than budgeted and 7% less than last year. However, total revenue was \$ 210,131 more than budgeted and \$ 1,209,507 more than last year. 2) The Board will put together a more specific request for fellowship input on a specific limit to the use of literature profits and what to do in case of a shortfall; this will come out earlier than last year’s request for input on contributions vis-à-vis literature sales. 3) The Conference Inventory has been postponed until the November Board meeting in order to look at ways of getting more useful feedback. The Conference Evaluation has been getting poor feedback and ways to get better feedback will be explored. 4) There will be no more “executive sessions” except those related to legal or personnel issues. Now these sessions will be known as

“sharing sessions” which should aid in transparency. 5) Corrections announced a strong need for Spanish speaking males to correspond with inmates. 6) At the International Convention the long-timers panel will be open to anyone with over 40 years of sobriety and they are looking at a way of selection so that there will be a good cross-section of the fellowship represented.

At the Southeast Region business meeting I took your sense of the Assembly regarding the SERAASA to the business meeting. There was substantial unanimity that the project would go forward although, afterwards, there has been some talk of reconsideration. The Regional Trustee appointed an ad hoc committee to report on a format for consideration so the actual event is still a work in progress. The Regional Trustee also appointed an ad hoc committee to consider changes to the procedure for the Southeast Region to conduct business. I expect both of these to be discussed at great length at the Delegate’s Get Together in February.

Additional News: The Kindle Reader project has been terminated pursuant to the 30-day withdrawal period that was in the contract. Primarily, 6th Tradition affiliation issues could not be resolved to the Board’s satisfaction. Construction at GSO for Archives expansion and an employee break room is underway will be completed by mid-November. This was approved as a capital project to be funded from the Reserve Fund in 2006 and the decision was made to complete it this year because the bid price is only good through the end of this year and, if delayed, the needed work will cost much more. There will be limited large group visits to GSO during construction and Archives will be closed to visitors and researchers for approximately 30 days. Two new AAWS staff members have been hired to fill vacant positions: Jim M., corrections desk, and Mary C., CPC desk. In August Chris C. resigned as Publications Director and Valerie O. was appointed to fill that position. At our January 2010 Assembly, Mary D. will be our AAWS guest: before accepting her AAWS position, Mary was DCM, District 31, and later our Alternate Chairperson, Panel 53. The Hope video and the young people’s videos have been delayed in production and distribution. I will advise you further as more is known.

International Convention- More than 20,000 people have registered. This is not taken as a sign of larger attendance, but earlier registration due to the ability to register for hotel rooms upon registration. In Toronto only 3,000 rooms had been requested when they began assigning rooms in November, 2004. However, the initial block of rooms sold out in less than two weeks. Most of the core hotels downtown was sold out within one week. New rooms were added, but those too sold out. Having over 8,000 rooms booked this early is unprecedented. In response they are continuing to expand the selection of rooms in the outlying areas, but they do not expect any new rooms in the downtown area. There will be shuttle service at no charge to all hotels booked through the Convention Housing Bureau.

Since the last Assembly I have been asked to give Delegate’s reports in District 22, District 28, the Central Group in Orlando, Districts 9, 10, 11, 33 and 18, Districts 12, 15 and 23... and District 20 along with a Traditions workshop. I was also asked to participate in a workshop at the State Convention entitled “Who Runs AA?” along with the Delegate from South Florida. Thank you for allowing me to be of service.

Alternate Delegate: Cecilia R. I attended the Southeastern Regional Forum in Mobile where I sat on two panels, Corrections and Service. I also attended the Archives workshop and I was informed that North Florida is known as the Group History Form area. North Florida is known around other areas for our work on getting the groups history documented and sent to New York. Keep up the great work on your group history forms. I also attended the Orlando Service Fair where I was dunked 12 times in the dunk tank.

Chairperson: Glenn W. First I want to recognize all new G.S.R.’s and D.C.M.’s with orange badges. Also, I wanted to recognize all our visitors with green badges. Since the last time we met, I have continued to participate in some workshops for various Districts as well as the Florida State Convention. I also want to thank the G.S.R.’s and D.C.M.’s that participated in our Area Inventory. We, all of the officers as well as the service coordinators are available to you for workshops. It has been brought to my attention that a G.S.R. and D.C.M. were not happy with my decision of taking a sense of the meeting at our last Assembly. First, I want to let you all know that my decisions – any

decisions that happen during this business meeting come after careful consideration and prayer a lot of times with this book as my guide. In this particular case, it is to allow the International Women's Conf give a short report and have a table for the next 3 Assemblies until April of next year. To not take up the time of the 200 voting members with a formal motion, discussion, debate, I asked for a sense of the meeting – which can be found in our Service Manual. As I stated then, if I get the sense that it is not a clear majority, then we will need to have discussion. In July, that was not the case it was very obviously a majority. However, our spiritual principals speak of the importance just 1 G.S.R.'s voice – and our Concept of Participation. So here is my challenge as your Chairperson, within the framework of our Business Meeting, we don't have a G.S.R. sharing, so any issues need to be addressed as Motions to be discussed and voted on. I have re-considered my actions and based on the overall sense of the Assembly last time, I remain in favor. I never want to censure a G.S.R.'s voice or vote. If you wish, you may absolutely make a motion and, provided it is seconded, we will discuss this issue to the vote.

With regards to our Accessibilities Service Coordinator's resignation, we are in need of an Accessibilities Service Coordinator. Please submit to me your service resume – a template is available on our website. For those that do not know, a service resume is simply a listing of your service positions and experience with a brief statement on why you wish to serve in the role you are submitting for.

Alternate Chair: Marilyn B.

This weekend we had 297 member registered. The breakdown is as follows; 35 D.C.M.'s/Alt. D.C.M.'s, 58 Visitors, 163 G.S.R.'s/Alt.G.S.R.'s, and 31 Officers, Service Coordinators and Administrative Chairs. I want to thank Districts 4, 6, 13, and 14 for hosting, with special thanks to Sheryl R. for taking on the job to host DCM. Great Job! I want to thank Corliss G. for serving as the Past Delegate of the Assembly. Our next Assembly will be Jan 15, 16 & 17 and Districts 1, 7, 15 & 32 will be hosting and our Past Delegate for the Assembly will be Dick G. & our special guest from our GSO will be Mary D. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

At the Accessibilities workshop we discussed the conference actions that directly affected Special Needs. Foremost was the Conference Action that Special needs be linked to the Treatment desk. All in attendance were queried to see if anyone was interested in stepping forward to be considered as an interim Accessibility Coordinator to replace me. Jerry Faber from the Patrick Group in Dist. 23 stepped forward. In Love and Service, Jim E.

Archives: Dave W. Coordinator, Judy C. Alternate Coordinator Attendance: 20 Report read by Steven R. Dave W. attended **the National Archives Workshop**. Learned valuable information on restoration and organization of archival material. Visited archives display brought there by southern California archives both in Spanish and in English. Re-learned all the steps in conservation. Did hands on encapsulation of a document, also took the staples out of a Grapevine and replaced staples with wax covered string. We talked about spiritual readings that Bill had read to help bring him to his Spiritual experience. Placed a bid for National Archives Workshop in 2012 to be held in Florida. We discussed different archives in our area. Cecelia gave handouts on how our archives are important. We had handouts on a recent Carl Jung newspaper article along with notes given to me at the national archives workshop. While attending this workshop, Stephan took our display to the big extravaganza on Orlando. Thank you Steve! Thank you for letting me be your trusted servant.

Area Archivist: Steven R. I had the privilege of filling in for our Archives coordinator at the Orlando service fair in September. I was able to participate by setting up the road show. Archives have also uncovered a large number of Cassette and reel to reel tapes of AA speakers. We are going to go through them and look into the cost associated with transferring these tapes onto CD or a computer hard drive. Once this is accomplished we will be able to possibly establish an Archives speaker library. We are planning on putting a bid in to host the 2012 National Archives workshop to be held in the North Florida area. The 2010 will be held in Macon GA. & the 2011 is scheduled to be held in Helena Montana. North Florida will be bidding against Northern California for the workshop site. Dennis K. donated to the North Florida Archives a first addition Big Book and a number of other old books related to Alcoholics Anonymous and alcohol. He came across them during demolition of a building. Group History forums were passed out to a number of DCM'S who requested them. It was reported by our alternate Delegate that at the southeastern conference we were being known as the group history area. Markings, the archives news letter put out by GSO is available on line at Alcoholics Anonymous .org. Another Member Charlotte G. made it known to us that she has some old Oxford Group books that she would like to donate. Thanks, for allowing me to serve.

Cooperation with the Professional Community: Tom H. Coordinator, Alt. Kathy P. Attendance: 40 Tom Introduced Ken C. South Florida Area 15 Delegate and Chair of the GSO committee on CPC for the 2010 GSO Conference. Tom told us he had been to Hernando County District 13, The Orlando Service Fair, and Ormond Beach in the past quarter for CPC displays. The January CPC workshop will be the power point presentation "Lets be friendly with our friends" available from GSO for the Professional Community. It will be lead by Alternate service coordinator Kathy P. Tom gave a brief history of CPC and a review of the efforts of Dr. Nicholas Pace in New York City to provide training for interns in Alcohol abuse. Reference Grapevine May 2006, Vol. 62 No. 12. Linda G. had provided a copy of a billboard showing a baby drinking from a beer bottle with the heading "Fight Underage Drinking."

Corrections: Bob C. Coordinator, Jordan C. Alt. Coordinator, Attendance: 20 Bob C. attended the Pre-Release (Bridging the Gap) conference in Kansas City. A discussion took place about the conference. Jordan C. the Alternate Service Coordinator will be taking the Pre-Release job over. She will be organizing and distributing letters to various districts as they come in from GSO. Bob C. has been successful at starting a meeting at the Florida State Prison Main Unit in Raiford. It meets every Wednesday night at 6:30 PM. The name of the group is "Clean Start Behind the Walls" and is in the process of registering. The Reception Medical Center at Lake Butler and Baker County Sheriff Office has contacted Bob C. about starting meetings in their institutions. The new application process needs to get organized in order to get more people access. If Districts are interested in getting access to meetings, in particular District 16, please email requests to Bob C. or Jordan C. to get the process started. Bob C. was invited to speak at a Re-entry Seminar at Baker CI, District 5, and District 15. The Grapevine Project was discussed. Jordan created a list of all jails and prisons within Area 14 which will be used to ask about sending Grapevines to their institutions.


