

**North Florida Area Assembly Minutes
Second Quarter, March 24-25, 2007**

2007 Theme: Our 12th Step Responsibility – Are We Going to Any Length?

Area Chair: The meeting was called to order by Chair, Tina C-L. There was moment of silence and everyone said Serenity Prayer. Our Anonymity statement was read by Jonette. The short form of the twelve concepts was also read.

Registrar: The roll was called by Area Registrar Glenn W. As the District number was called, the DCM was asked to answer with those present as follows: DCM, Alternate DCM and the number of GSRs present from their District (see attached)

OFFICER’S REPORTS:

Secretary: Ann P. reported that the printer had inadvertently left out the last page (page 10) of the January minutes, and they were mailed with out this page. In order to rectify their mistake, they printer printed 400 hundred copies free of charge. The copies are on the table, as well extra copies of the minutes.

The minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer: Marilyn B. Good morning, Once again I have opted to have a balance sheet as part of the financials.

I call your attention to the reserve account. In January I said I would be looking to move monies from checking, a non-interest account, to a CD. I also said I was going to attempt to place part of the funds in a 3 & 6 month CD so we would have the funds available should a need arise.

When I looked into 3 & 6 month CD’s the interest rate was not satisfactory. I was able to find a C.D. at Bank of America that I felt met the Area’s need to earn interest & have funds available.

This CD pays 4.35% APY, based on 11 months but the nice feature of this CD is Area funds are available every 6 days without penalties or fees. It’s like having a checking account that pays interest.

I looked into the CD we had at SunTrust and it was paying 1% less than the BOA. Also the SunTrust CD tied our money up for 13 months, so I moved that CD to the Bank of America.

You will also notice I opened a checking account at the BOA. That’s for the purpose of fund transfers. I didn’t need to have checks printed the bank provided 10 free checks.

The other reports are the usual reports you are use to seeing except for one account on the Profit/Loss Statement. The new account is called Prior Year Tax Adjustments and is listed in the other income section. That account is primarily for tax purposes. Expenses and income recorded and reported on the 2006, 990 tax return changed in late January. Example: An expense check was voided and 2 group contribution checks were returned.

I have been mailing contribution receipts to the groups that are using the wrong mailing address, enclosing a card that gives the group treasurer contact information. So far that has proven to be very effective. I would ask the GSR's to remind your group treasures to include your District Number.

A final note: The GSO has started to mail the quarterly contribution reports to the Area Treasurer. I would like to give you a short report, but when I opened my letter it start “Cher Tresoir”.

Although flattering, I have requested to be returned to the English mailing and by July I should be able to give you that report.

Delegate: Fred H. Recognized the Past Delegates seated in the audience: Tom D., Panel 43; Dan E. Panel 45, Tom G. Panel 51, Corliss G. Panel 54 & Michael S. Panel 55.

I attended the Southeast Region Delegates-Get-Together in Atlanta from February 2nd thru February 4th, 2007. The event was hosted by Howard L. our current Southeast Regional Trustee. Chet P. your Alternate Delegate will report on the weekend events in his report later this morning.

I will also be attending the 57th General Service Conference in New York City from April 21st thru April 28th. The theme for the 2007 Conference is "Our 12th Step Responsibility – Are We Going to Any Length?" I am also pleased to tell you that I have been assigned to the Panel 57 Conference Grapevine Committee for the next 2 years.

During the past several months I have been preparing for the April 2007 General Service Conference. I have been reviewing the conference agenda items along with the background material. During the next several weeks I will be compiling the conference agenda information that I received from you during our meeting on March 24th.

Two motions for items to be included on the 2007 General Service Conference Agenda were brought forth & passed at our January 14, 2007 business meeting. I forwarded both motions to our General Service Office on January 15, 2007, the cutoff date for conference agenda items.

The first motion requested that the Daily Reflections Perpetual Calendar be reprinted and made available for sale thru AAWS Publications. The motion stated that this item was originally printed in 1990 and reprinted in 2000. The Daily Reflections book was originally published in 1990 and the perpetual calendar was originally printed in 2000 as a souvenir item for the 2000 International Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota and then offered for sale until the stock was depleted. This motion will not be considered on the 2007 Conference Agenda & has been forwarded to AAWS Publications for further review.

The second motion requested three changes to the "A.A. Service Manual Combined with Twelve Concepts for World Service"

Since January I spoke with the GSO Staff members several times concerning this motion & was originally told in early February that the motion would be included on the 2007 Report & Charter Conference Agenda. Unfortunately the motion and background material were overlooked & were not included in the information sent to the delegates & therefore will not be on the 2007 Conference Agenda. It will however be included on the 2008 Conference Agenda.

However, I would like to thank Scott B. GSR from District 31 for his effort and research in bringing forth this motion at our January Assembly. Part of the duties of a GSR is to learn everything they can and become familiar with the A.A. Service Manual. I want to thank Scott for his service to his district & our area.

The following is a brief summary of items from the January & March 2007 A.A.W.S. Board Meetings.

Finance Committee: Group contributions remain strong for the beginning of 2007. For January 2007 groups contributed 3% over budget and 5% more than the same period last year.

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General Service Office Manager: The start-up and roll out of the Fellowship New Vision project has been delayed from April to mid-May, however it now appears that GSO will open the system to all areas at one time rather than on a staggered basis. The FNV project will allow area registrars to perform group changes on-line rather than having to mail change information to GSO.

Publishing: Sales for all books are up 13% thru February 2007 and of that total 14% are being sold to non-A.A. purchasers. Gross sales thru February were \$2,260,592.00 vs. \$2,045,255.00 in 2006. This represents a 10% increase in sales.

A new policy has been adopted by the Publishing Committee and approved by the A.A.W.S. Board. It reads as follows: "Any recognized central or intergroup office; any district or area or committee thereof; and any other entity that has spent \$25,000 or more on A.A. literature in any one of the past three years. Customers must be from either the United States or Canada."

General Information: The winter edition of the corrections newsletter "Sharing From behind the Walls" has been mailed to all Corrections chairs in the U.S. and Canada and also to all listed corrections groups. The newsletter also included with each response from GSO to an inmate.

The Final Forum Reports for the nine previous Regional or Special Forums are now available on the GSO Web Site. The December 2006 Southeast Regional Forum held in Atlanta is included with these reports.

Shortly after the conference in April I will be available to come to your districts and to give my delegate report. I am currently scheduled to visit District # 13 In Hudson on May 13th & District # 1 & # 4 in Jacksonville on May 19th. Please see me personally or contact me via telephone or e-mail to schedule your visit. Thank you for the privilege to serve and I look forward to coming to your districts.

Alternate Delegate: Chet P., Howard L., Southeast Regional Trustee reported on January Board weekend:

Financial

Literature Sales were 11.5 million in 2006

All book sales down 150,000 units less than last year

Contributions were \$ 6,068,200.

This is the first time in history contributions have been over 6 million.

47% of revenue came from group contributions (12% more than last year).

There was a \$ 682,000 surplus at the end of the year.

Grapevine

Grapevine 103,900 paid circulation, which is down from last year.

There was a \$ 60,000 loss primarily from funding retirement plans.

La Vina had over 10,000 subscriptions for the first time.

There was a \$ 72,000 loss.

(Note: All print magazine subscriptions are decreasing in numbers).

Grapevine is directing attention to electronic versions and getting the word to younger members (average grapevine subscriber is over 60 years old and 73% are over 50 years old).

Grapevine goals:

1. Let younger members know of grapevine;
2. Increase awareness of audio grapevine;
3. Work toward awareness of on-line version of Grapevine.

Committee Reports

Finance/Budget

Reserve was \$10,000,000 (8.5 months reserve)

A concise statement of self-support was passed by Committee:

"The A.A. spiritual principle of self-support enables us to pursue our primary purpose of carrying the message to the still suffering alcoholic with a shared sense of responsibility for our lifesaving work and without interference or financial dependence on outsiders. From our fellowship's earliest days, the expenses of the General Service Office, and the world services provided by it, have exceeded the amount derived from contributions of AA groups and members. As a result, providing these needed services has necessarily been supported in part by income from the sale of AA literature. It is the policy of the General Service Board that income from literature sales should only be in amounts required to allow continued provision of vitally needed service and maintenance of a prudent reserve fund. We hope that the day will come when AA groups and members, through their contributions, will be able to fund fully the services provided by the General Service Office. If that is achieved, revenues from literature sales will only be needed in amounts necessary to cover the actual costs associated with literature production and to maintain a prudent reserve fund."

Conference Committee: approved a service piece "Trust the Committee Process"

International Convention/Forum Committee: 2010 International Convention in San Antonio theme is "A Vision For You".

Panel 56 Delegates shared what it was like being at their first Conference. They gave some very nuts and bolts advice and also some emotional impressions.

There was a lot of good fellowship and sharing of experience, strength and hope. I came away with enough background so that if it were necessary to attend the General Service Conference as an alternate I would not be completely lost. It was a valuable meeting for that reason alone.

Chairperson: Tina C-L Welcomed all visitors and first timers at North Florida Area Assembly. I feel all has gone well at this assembly. I received a thank you note from Howard L thanking us for inviting him to our January Assembly and showing him wonderful and warm hospitality. I am sad to report to you that a past Regional Trustee, Betty G. from North Carolina, passed away and her funeral is this weekend. Dick G. a Past Regional Trustee from Area 14 is there to represent GSO.

Alternate Chair: Connie K. Thanks to host Districts 3, 12, 18b, and 28 and the DCMs Paul, Laura, Clint and Jim and all their volunteers for a job well done. What a great job all of you did this weekend!

Thank you Corliss our past Delegate for this assembly, for your help and we are very sorry for the loss of your mother during this time. Thank you for your continued service to AA and the fellowship.

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The dates for our next assembly are July 13, 14 and 15; Thank you to the host districts volunteering for July, Districts 1, 4, 6, 25 and Paul again for District 3. Cindy will be the go to contact for the host districts in July. Please meet me at the registration table outside immediately following this meeting to go over the duties and inventory.

The dates for October are the 12th, 13th and 14th and the host Districts volunteering are 5, 11, 21 and 8.

Make your reservations as soon as possible and at least 30 days in advance of the assembly. Our room block for Friday night is 75 and 150 for Saturday night. Be sure to ask for the North Florida Area block when making reservations.

Special Reports:

51st Florida State Convention: Kelly J, chairperson for the 51st Florida State Convention, reported that they have met the 1300 room block and need your help to be being self supporting. We have 2000 guests registered, however only 650 have pre registered for the convention. We need every one who possibly can to register early. We have a great line up of speakers. We hope to see you all there.

NFAA Florida State Convention Advisory Committee: - Chet P., chair.

North Florida Convention Oversight Committee Report:

The Committee unanimously passed six requirements for a proposed convention from North Florida to obtain North Florida Area Convention Oversight Committee approval and be eligible to present a bid at the Convention Site Selection Meeting.

The Chair and Treasurer of the prospective convention personally meet with the Area Convention Oversight Committee and commit to the following:

1. That the Chair and Treasurer agree to stay on past the Convention and serve on the Area Oversight Committee.
2. That the Chair and Treasurer agree to put an area officer on the convention bank account so records can be obtained in case of an emergency.
3. That the Chair and Treasurer agree to strongly consider any recommendations from the Area Oversight Committee or the Joint State Advisory Committee.
4. That the Chair and Treasurer agree to budget an addition to the prudent reserve of the Joint State Advisory Committee.
5. That the Chair agree to give a mailing list of convention attendees and the Final Financial Report to the next convention and to the Area and Joint committees.
6. That the Chair and Treasurer submit a preliminary budget based on a suggested number of attendees.

A discussion of funding for the convention Chair and Treasurer to serve on the Area Oversight Committee was tabled.

A report from the 2007 Orlando convention committee was received.

It was agreed to permit the Jacksonville 2009 committee to ask for a sense of the Area for support of their proposed bid conditioned upon meeting the 6 requirements prior to final approval to submit a bid.

The Assembly gave support to Jacksonville at the Sunday business meeting.

FYCYPAA: Art, Pine Hills Grace Group, announced that The Florida Conference of Young People in AA will be held in Miami. The date is June 15 thru 17. The purpose is let young people know they are not alone. We have great speakers and a lot of fun and fellowship. Please take some of our flyers back to your home groups. Thank you

Service Coordinators Reports:

Accessibilities: Kathy S. Coordinator, First, I'd like to thank Rachel in District 15 for taking the notes for the workshop. There were 25 people in attendance.

The first thing we did was review what we did at our last workshop. Pat, from District 19, was able to share that he became an Accessibilities chairperson since the last Assembly. He shared about the work being initiated in Volusia County.

I provided contact cards for the Accessibilities contact at the General Service Office. Her name is Gayle R., and she is very happy to send the Accessibilities chairpersons in the districts a packet. We don't have a workbook, but we do have a packet. It's very informational and helpful.

I'd like to thank Maria from District 33 for offering to make copies of some DVDs of the signers at the speaker meetings of the 50th State Convention.

We hope to have the Accessibilities North Florida Area pamphlet printed by the next assembly. I do have some hard copies. If you were at the workshop and did not get the pamphlet, they are now available. In the meantime, we will get the word document converted to an electronic version that can be sent to a printer.

Our Archivist, Cecilia R., came to the workshop and provided some history of the March 1979 minutes of the Area 14 Handicapped Committee. That is what our committee was first called. The gentleman that served as the chair, his name was Bob K., and he had an 85% loss of sight due to alcohol abuse.

Many districts have been proactive in sending our surveys to find out the needs in their districts and building lists for roving meetings. We also talked about babysitting issues—things to be cautious of when getting babysitters for meetings where women/parents can come to meetings if they do not have a sitter. All these things were helpful. We had a lot of participation and I appreciate everyone for showing up.

Theme or Main Topic Conference Agenda items and local archives workshop activities.

Discussion centered around two conference agenda items:

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1. Review of Archives Workbook
2. Final Report of Subcommittee on Archive recordings

Changes recommended to the Archives Workbook were supported by the Archives workshop attendees. Among the many changes in the workbook are a revised Mission and Purpose statement, a revised Researcher Application form, a revised Research Record and the addition of new content. Other bullets under this agenda item were and updated Oral Histories kit, Guidelines for Collection Oral Histories, the Archives Collection Policy, revisions to the access given to directors, trustees and staff and a revised Gift Deed Form. The Archives subcommittee report comprised approximately 97 pages of text so only highlights were brought due to time restrictions. The sense of the workshop body supported the findings of the subcommittee's report. Among the relevant bullets of the report were: legal implications of audio recording distribution, a review of a legal opinion about copying and distributing materials in the GSO Archives and the realization that most of the materials held in the Archives are not copyrighted by AAWS. Legal definitions and suggestions from the Archives subcommittee were found to be in line with reducing risks of copyright infringement (and resulting legal actions) the subcommittee recommended approval of all suggestions made by the Trustee's Committee on Archives. Much of what was recommended has been incorporated a GSO "Sound and Video Access Policies" for Archival Materials Area archivist, Cecilia Reid has been steadily combing the area's archives turning up many gems of information and history. Much of the information she is "rediscovering" can be used to help local district archivists date some of their groups' origins. She found the brochure/agenda flyer for the First Annual North Florida conference in June, 1966. She is in the process of a transcribing early budget ledger (handwritten until 1988) which reveals contributions from groups in existence at that time (handy for districts to date group beginnings) in addition to continuing to collect district histories. She has also completed a "History of Corrections in North Florida Area".

Among some of the new finds she presented were a French version of "AA Comes of Age", a Copy of "John Barleycorn" by Jack London, Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignacius, "The First 35 years of Al-Anon" and "Addresses of Harry Drummond" (1892). Additionally she covered the references to Florida in "Diary of Motorcycle Hobos". A reference to early sober Floridians was highlighted in an outside endeavor with a copy of "Florida State University Study of Alcohol Rehabilitation Newsletter" which Tom Sharpe, our first delegate and the first drunk 12 stepped in Florida, was named as a member of that program. District 14 (Gainesville) brought an impressive display of a portion of their archives for our viewing pleasure. Daytona has agreed to bring some of their archives to the next Area Assembly for display.

The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer and had 22 in attendance.

Our web site, aanorthflorida.org, had 1383 unique visitors, and 1940 total visitors in January, and 1238 unique visitors and 1645 total visitors in February.

Because of an April 2000 Advisory Action to place the Advisory Actions on the NFA web site, a discussion was started about whether it would really be a good idea to do this. The question, “What is an Advisory Action?” was asked. The answer given was that an Advisory Action is any motion made and passed by the Conference.

Many ideas were brought up for why Advisory Actions should not be placed on aanorthflorida.org. Chief among these ideas was that they, like the business meeting minutes, are confidential information and would best be for AA members only. It was also noted that A.A.W.S. considers the printed General Service Conference Advisory Actions “Confidential: for A.A. members only.”

After some discussion, the workshop unanimously recommended that the following motion be made to the NFAC:

Rescind part C of previous motion from April 2000 – “to include... [NFA] Advisory Actions [on the NFA web site]”.

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The result of this motion would be that Advisory Actions would not be included on the NFA web site.

Next, Jeff stated that though section 19 of Structures and Guidelines (section 19 was the list of web site guidelines for the NFA) is no longer there, those guidelines were all results of Advisory Actions, and the Advisory Actions are still in effect.

Ideas for oversight of the web site were then discussed. The major idea brought up at this time was for the possibility of forming an Administrative Web Site Committee responsible for the web site. Some discussion followed on how best to set up such a committee, members, etc., and the following motion was unanimously recommended to be made to the NFAC:

That an ad hoc committee be formed to develop guidelines for the web site.

It is planned that at the July Assembly, the web site workshop will discuss the possibility of making confidential information available on the web site, requiring a password for access.

The workshop was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS:

Finance: Chair, Melanie E. Discussed agenda items; however we have some motions coming to the floor during new business.

Growth: Chet P, Chair. Doniece S, Alt Chair
9 of 12 assigned DCMs were in attendance. We only covered the Agenda items assigned to the Growth Committee.

Site and Agenda: Chair, Connie K, Alternate chair, Jim K. Attendance: voting DCMs out of 10 assigned to the Committee. Attendance 10 voting out of 12 assigned to the committee
Main Topic/Theme Conference Agenda Items and Hotel Bid Assignment

Thanks, Don G. District 28 for taking notes.

Conference Agenda - The committee split up into 2 groups and discussed the choices for Conference themes from the background material, selecting five: #14, Unity, Recovery & Service: Living our 3 Legacies Together, #20, Back to Basics Our Primary Purpose, #23, Securing Our Future – One Day at a Time, #36, Keeping the Door Open – our past, our future and #9, Participation, a desire to belong.

Next, the committee, in their discussion groups, selected from the background material, five Presentation/Discussions: #3 are we losing newcomers? #7 How to make teens and young people feel welcome, are we doing our part, #44 Principles before personalities, #50, The three legacies: Recovery, unity & Service, #58 Pass it on don't make it up as we go along.

The groups selected five Workshop Topics from the background material: #11, Corrections and Rehab, #18, The Home group importance, #28, How are we using the essentials honesty open mindedness & willingness #46, Recovery, Unity & Service and #53, So we take responsibility for the future of AA or what is best for now.

Fred H. helped us discuss the Policy/Admissions item B, Review the Final Report of the General Service Board Regional Composition Committee and Structure Inventory Committee, and we reviewed the dates for the 2010 General Service.

We also discussed Item C on International Conventions/Regional Forums, Discuss ways to increase interest in Forums. It was agreed:

1. It should be stressed that anyone can go, not just officers, DCMs, Trustees, etc.
2. Mailing sets of flyers for the Forum to AA Members, GSRs, and Intergroups was instrumental to getting more people to attend and show interest
3. Talking about the Forum and encouraging people to go using the Area Assembly meeting
4. Offering transportation options, for example, car pooling
5. Sponsor people to the Forum

Finally, it was noted to remind the committee of the need to get the 2009 - 2010 hotel bids in for compilation in committee by July to present to the Assembly in October for a vote. The Assembly dates are somewhat flexible on weeks in July and October and we try to hold the 2nd Quarter meeting in late March to accommodate the Delegate for the April Conference. January is the second week and October has been flexible depending on Football Dates. Please get bids in if interested in changing venues – we will look at everything and will not exclude anyone bringing in bids. It is open to the assembly to present a bid.

North Florida Area Archivist: Cecilia R

Doing a lot of research and history in the last quarter and we will continue and the reason for this is you have minutes that now look faded because they were printed on thermal paper and we have to high intensity light and magnify to be able to read and get them transcribed into a computer disc so that we don't lose these documents. I am also going to start high lighting a group in Archives so you can see what your group's contributions were. We have some hand outs of a list of Districts from 1976, for you to be able to see changes in the area. We have treasurers reports from 57 to 80 are copied and can be gone through. You are invited to come to Archive in Cocoa.




