

**Minutes of the Second Quarterly Assembly July 2006  
North Florida Area Conference of Alcoholics Anonymous**

**2006 Theme: "Sponsorship, Service and Self-Support in a Changing World"**

**Area Chair,** Tom H. opened the meeting with the Serenity Prayer. Jim T, read the Anonymity Statement and Tom read the short form of the Concepts. Every one was asked to recite the Responsibility Statement

Tom reminded us that we would be electing an Archivist for North Florida Area Assembly. He then asked the Registrar to call the roll so that we would have an accurate count of votes. It takes a 2/3 majority to elect officers.

**Registrar:** – Connie D. – Asked Districts to please answer the roll call by saying DMC, Alt DCM, Number of GSRs and Total number of votes as she call the roll. (See roll call attachment).

While waiting for a total from Connie, Area Registrar, Tom recognized and welcomed the first Timers to NFAA.

**SPECIAL ELECTION:** Chair Tom H asked that all who care to stand for the position of Area Archivist to please go to the microphone. Cecilia R., current DCM District 15 and Archives Service Coordinator stated that she has put in her service resume for consideration to be Archivist for the North Florida Area. Chair Tom H, announced that Cecilia had previously resigned as the Archives Service Coordinator and that the Alternate, Rob, is now the Archives Service Coordinator

There being no other candidates Tom asked for a show of hands for a unanimous vote. Cecilia R is the Archivist for North Florida Area.

**OFFICERS REPORTS:**

**Delegate** – Michael S. Recognized all Past Delegates in the room: Tom D, panel 43; Dan E, panel 45, Dick G, panel 47, also past S E Region Trustee; Kathy P, panel 49; Also I would like to announce past delegate Gene L, panel 49 (Area71, Virginia) now a Floridian, who is often with us recently got married and is a honey moon this week and could not be here.

We have with us this weekend some guests from South FL. Steve P South Florida Area Delegate, panel 55, and Beth D. panel 53, past Delegate.

As of current printings of pamphlets, the pamphlets will begin to have a new look; before they had stair steps and dots denoting whether they were service or recovery or professional and now they will say right on there which category. I have set up a table with my notebooks and things from conference and these will be there so you can have a look at them. The contents remain the same it's only the covers that have changed.

Also at Conference they have a display of Big Books and currently there are 53 translations of the Big Book. Not all of them are of the complete Big Book, some of them are just the first 164 pages, but what I did during break is copy all the covers so you can see the languages that the Big Book has been written in.

After the Conference ended we had a chance to go to Stepping Stones and I brought back a flyer from that it is a wonderful experience. You can also visit Steppingstones.Org online and there you will see a lot of pictures of Bill W's home.

The General Service Conference was held April 23 – 26. The theme of the conference was "Sponsorship, Service and Self-Support in a Changing World". My second year conference experience is like watching a favorite movie for the second time. I know the plot and can pay more attention to detail and dialogue, but it is also a bitter sweet experience because it is sweet seeing friends that I made last year but bitter knowing this is the last General Service Conference I will ever attend as delegate.

The General Service Conference is currently held each year in April in New York City, it is composed of 93 Area Delegates – 78 from the U. S., 14 from Canada and 1 from Porto Rico, there are 21 Trustees – 7 class A non-alcoholic, 14 class B Alcoholic – 8 of which are Regional Trustees, 2 are At large Trustees 1 each from the U S and Canada, and 4 are General Service Trustees. Also, there are 6 Non Trustee Directors – 3 from the AAWS Board and 3 from the Grapevine Board. The Conference also has 16 Staff members -13 from GSO and 3 from the Grapevine. Bringing the total to 136 voting conference members.

This morning I give my report in two parts. The first part I will be telling you about the experience of that week and the second part will be the advisory actions.

I arrived on Saturday in New York around noon and went to the hotel however the trip from the airport to the hotel took longer than the trip from Florida to New York, due to weather and traffic. It rained all day Saturday and Sunday and off and on Monday and Tuesday. This prevented any short walks around the hotel. The temperature was in the 40s and slowly warmed up throughout the week. Saturday afternoon was a hospitality suite sponsored by the New York Intergroup. I have meeting schedule from the New York Intergroup on the display table and there in access of 100 pages. I missed the hospitality suite this year due to the shuttle service. The only personal time the Delegates have is before the conference begins or after it ends. During Conference we are busy morning, noon and night. Saturday night was the Southeastern Regional Delegates Diner and this is followed by a delegate's only meeting. As this year conference Chair, I chaired that meeting. For the next six days lunch and diner are a part of the conference. The entire conference is held in two large adjoining ball rooms – one for meetings – one for meals. Several small rooms are used for committee meetings. Saturday afternoon is also a meeting of the 1728 Group. This name comes from multiplying 12 x12 x 12. It is an AA meeting for Trustees so the Alcoholic Trustees can share their experience of working the steps with our Non Alcoholic Trustees. The Non Alcoholic Trustees are strongly encouraged to work the steps and to even have a sponsor.

Sunday morning is orientation; Sunday afternoon is opening greetings and Keynote address. Also Sunday afternoon is a joint Trustees and conference committee meeting, this is so the Delegates can ask questions regarding the agenda items and background material. Sunday night is the conference banquet which is affectionately called "say good by to your spouse" and a speaker meeting, because once this happens the spouses are taken out site seeing and shopping in New York, while the Delegates are working.

There were two observers attending the conference Valerie M. from GSO Australia and Noritake N from GSO Japan.

Monday 9 AM – 12 Noon is the first of two scheduled conference committee meetings. This year for the first time is recent memory the Literature Committee finished all their work in the two allotted meetings. However, the Report and Charter Committee ran into excessive overtime meeting a total of six times for more than eleven hours. Monday Afternoon there was reports by

AAWS and Grapevine and Financial Reports. The incoming Delegates are also to give a two minute presentation about their area. These reports are spaced over three days. During the week there are also presentations about the Conference theme and time allotted for sharing sessions between the Delegates, the GSO staff and the Trustees. Tuesday morning was the second of two scheduled conference committee meetings. Tuesday afternoon was more presentations and a trip to the General Service Office. Tuesday night was a Delegates only dinner and the election of the Delegate Chair and alternate Chair for next years Conference. Darrel M., from Kentucky will serve a Delegate Chair and Pat L from Alberto, Canada will serve as Alternate Delegate Chair. Wednesday morning was more workshops and more reports. Wednesday afternoon was Trustees election. This year's election was held for Eastern Canada and the Pacific Regions. Wednesday night starts the actual business meeting with committee reports, motions, and discussions and voting. It is similar to any other AA business meeting since we are all just a bunch of drunks. However this business meeting starts on Wednesday evening and goes until we get finished Friday evening. The Conference is finally over when all business is conducted. Last year the Conference ended at approximately 7:00 PM. Sometimes it runs later, sometimes it runs later. This year it ended at about 4: PM. Friday night several of us went out for diner and then I had a few hours to walk around the hotel and buy some souvenirs. Saturday morning is a farewell brunch, with the rotating Trustees saying "goodbye". Then is when we went to "Stepping Stones". This is the home of Bill and Lois in Bedford Hills about an hour north of the city and is a beautiful, hilly and wooded area. It is sparsely populated; however, many new homes have been built there in the last 20 years. "Stepping Stones" consist of the main house, a garage building and up a little is Bill's study affectionately called wits end. This is where Bill did much of his writing. His original desk is there where he sat and wrote the Big Book. There are lovely gardens throughout the entire property. The home was originally built as a summer cottage. Any one is allowed to visit and take the tour. I was overwhelmed with the serenity I felt while there. I returned later that evening.

On the advisory actions, on the Agenda Committee, the theme for the 2007 General Service Conference is "Our 12 Step Responsibility, Are We Going to Any Length?" There are also several workshop and presentations topics chosen.

Policy and Admissions they met a total of six times and most of the time was used to update a policy from 1977, regarding observers at the conference. The 1977 policy states we can have one observer and this had to be changed because we had two observers at this Conference, and because one of the observers required a translator.

The Trustees Committee approved the slate of the Trustees for the coming year and revised some corporate by-laws. They have also referred to the Trustees Committee the possibility of a Class B Alcoholic Chair of the board and that is to be reported back to the Conference Trustees next year.

The Grapevine Committee, there were no recommendations, only consideration for developing a Spanish workbook and anthology in the near future.

The Finance Committee, the word "donation" will be replaced with the word "contribution" throughout AA literature. The small order freight charge will not be changed at this time. The large order discounts will not be removed. Basically these were implemented in July and there were not sufficient time to have an accurate picture of the affect on finances and will be looked at again next year.

The Archives Committee, will compile a list of recordings that need to be properly archived and the cost and will review this on a yearly basis, also several ongoing projects were reviewed. There is a vast treasure trove of tapes, some reel to reel, and some cassettes that due to age are decaying and deteriorating that need to be digitized before they are completely lost. We have a new Archivist, Amy Filiatro. She is not AA, she is a friend of AA, and her father has 30 years of sobriety. She will identify these tapes and prioritize them so they can begin to be digitized and the message will be saved.

The Report and Charter Committee, met 4 times for total of 10 hours discussing a disclaimer statement in the front of directories.

The International Convention and Regional Forums Committee, The International Convention in Toronto lost \$39,000. Considering this is less than 1% of their budget, basically they broke even and did a wonderful job.

The CPC Committee, they recommended that three short video segments be produced and accessible on the Internet aimed at professionals.

The PI Committee accepted a new PSA. Recommended that on the survey that "other" be listed under "marital status". The original request was that domestic partner be added and that was changed to "other" with a blank so that people could file it in as they see fit.

The Literature Committee accepted the comic pamphlet "Too Young". Last year we reviewed and sent it back to publications for rewrite. They did a wonderful job listening to our suggestions and we accepted what they gave us without any corrections. We also accepted the pamphlet "It Happened To Alice" another comic pamphlet. Sent the pamphlet "AA and the Native North American", to the Trustees Literature Committee and the publications department to be revised where it will be reviewed and put out word to solicit more stories and rewrite. That project will probably be several years in the making. Recommended that the word "largely" be restored to the preface of the Big Book. In context it says that "this book has been unchanged" and the word "largely" was added in the second edition and it should say "this book has remained largely unchanged". That word will also be replaced in other appropriate places like "Experience, Strength and Hope" and other referrals to the preface. Reviewed and accepted the Trustees progress report on the Spanish third edition of the Big Book. Originally there was a deadline of September of last year for stories. They felt they did not have sufficient quantity of stories and extended that deadline until June of this year. There will either be a draft or a progress report presented to next years General Service Conference. We accepted the draft manuscript "Young People in AA", this has been expanded and stories have been added with stories of people as young as twelve. We recommended that the pamphlet "Letter To The Woman Alcoholic" be discontinued. It was original produced in the 1950s, and written by a non-alcoholic and published in "Good Housekeeping" magazine when we did not have literature for women and it is our feeling that we are now writing our own literature, by us for us, and we retired that to archives. It can be retrieve from the Archives department. We discussed the request to develop a history book from 1955 through 2000, and took no action, because this project had been attempted at least three times in the past and over \$300,000 spent and we could not decide which direction to go and felt it would be worse to try put it out there and spending money without a result, which would not be in the best interest of AA.

One of the items of interest is discuss the request to develop an "Intergroup/Central Office" pamphlet. Reading the exact recommendation that came out of committee, "The committee discussed the request to develop an "Intergroup/Central Office" pamphlet, and took no action. The committee acknowledged that in many areas that Intergroup/Central office has a vital role in

carrying the AA message. However they felt there appears to be sufficient information available about Intergroup/Central Office in AA conference approved literature and service material as the structure and function of Intergroup/Central Office is varied throughout the U.S. and Canada, it was the consensus of the Committee that where a need may exist for an Intergroup/Central Office pamphlet, it can best be addressed locally". I was asked at the April Assembly to request an agenda item for a Spanish audio CD of the Big Book. It was too late to get it on this year's agenda, but I did speak to Chris C, the Publications Director, and was told it would be considered after the third edition of the Spanish Big Book is finished.

The Corrections Committee, develop a media presentation aimed at corrections personnel They are also going to revise the pamphlet "Inmate to Inmate"

The Treatment Committee revised and redefined the scope of the Treatment Committee.

There were five floor actions this year. The first, added text to the PI advisory action that the airing of the video be reported back to the 2007 General Service Conference. There is a company the GSO contracts with that monitors the airing the PSA, and reports how often and what time aired, and we wanted that report.

Two, when the Literature Committee finished and there the explanation about the Intergroup/Central Office pamphlet, someone went to the microphone and moved that we have an Intergroup/Central Office pamphlet. They were not happy with the answer and they have the right to do that. We voted on that motion and the motion failed since the Committee had explained the reasoning behind their decision.

Three, there was a motion to change the name of the pamphlet "Inmate to Inmate" and that failed.

Four, Amy Filiatro had an excellent Archives presentation and there was a motion that that presentation be available on CD. That motion failed because we did not want to set a president of distributing archives material until sufficient thought had gone into what we are going distribute, how we are going to distribute and how we are going to price it.

Five, after the PI Committee information on the membership survey there was a floor action to add domestic partner to the membership survey and we voted not to consider this since it had already been considered.

A couple of other items from the Conference. On the financial side, the 2007 budget is up 11% or \$1,250,000 from 2005. Contributions for 2005 were \$5,282,000; up 2%. Total budget is \$12,758,000. Total expenses are \$12,102,000; projecting a \$600,000 access in cash. This will be used to build the prudent reserve, and to fund retire plan and the health insurance plan as required by Federal and New York law.

Grapevine circulation has dropped to 105,500; down about 2,000 from 2005, Income is \$1, 9 million expenses expected to be \$1, 6 million; with approximate \$22,000 profit this. La Vina circulation is expected to increase from 9,400 to 9,700, with an expected loss of about \$100,000. it has been about that same amount for the about the past ten years, since it began, but the General Service Conference is in unanimous agreement that we continue, because it meets a need within the fellowship.

An estimate of groups and members in the fellowship as on January 1, 2006; in the US there are 52,000 groups and over 1 million members. In Canada there are 6,000 groups and 110,000

members. There 45,000 groups outside of North America for 700,000 members. With numbers that include groups in correctional institutions and loaners; Worldwide there are approximately 106,000 groups and 1,950,000 members and that is just an estimate.

There are fewer groups giving more money, but contributions are essentially flat. Since the fourth edition of the Big Book, has come sells are declining. If this trend continues they will have to raise the price of literature, so that they have the fund so operate. Please take this message back to your groups, that GSO needs money. This does not mean they're hurting or in dire financial shape or shut the door or cut any of the services. They just keep a keen eye on the figures and the future, so that they can do the work that we have charged them to do through the Conference.

If you have questions, please see me during the break or after the assembly this morning. My schedule is filling quickly, but I would love to be at every district, please contact me as soon as possible.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your delegate. It is an honor and a privilege.

Chair Tom H, called on Steve P. Delegate for the South Florida Area. The hospitality has been overwhelming the spirit of enthusiasm has been encouraging and I wish you all the best. Please keep carrying the message and doing the vital work that you do and thank you for the hospitality.

**Alternate Delegate:** Fred H. - Michael & I will be attending the Southeastern Regional Conference in Louisville, Kentucky from August 11 – 13, 2006. There is service workshops scheduled and Michael & I will be attending and participating in the workshops. A luncheon & business meeting is scheduled for Saturday. It will be hosted by Howard L. our current Southeast Region Trustee.

A Regional Forum is scheduled to be held in Atlanta, Georgia from December 1 – 3, 2006. The forum will be hosted by the 13 areas of the Southeast Region. There will be members of the General Service Office staff at the forum during the sharing sessions and they will be available to answer questions. The current delegates from the Southeast Region will be giving presentations and there will be representatives from the Grapevine present. The Sunday morning session will include talks by the past trustees.

Registration forms are being mailed from the General Service Office. Registration is free and you do not have to register to attend. You may register at the G.S.O. A.A. Web Site @ [www.aa.org](http://www.aa.org) Anyone who does register will receive a final report of all of the discussions at the forum.

District 28 – Marylyn B. We have 300 to 350 members in our district and our district is very active with approximately 25 people attending the district business meeting.

Discussion was held about smoking in front of the meeting room doors. Alternate Chair will make an announcement throughout the assemblies, suggesting smokers not stand in front of the meeting room doors. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

The committee made a decision to change the Friday registration time (which is not officially part of the Assembly) to from 6: PM to 8: PM.

**Finance Report:** Beth J, chair, 9 voting DCMs of 12 assigned to this committee were Present. Thank you to Alternate Finance Chair, Melanie E, and the Finance Committee.

Discussed the upcoming motion regarding the reprinting of the Accessibilities pamphlet in and will move that we reprint the pamphlet at a cost up to \$1000.00.

The Treatment had asked for additional funds to attend the Bridging the Gap Conference in September. However the Treatment Service Committee chair could not attend this committee and the committee elected not to discuss.

### **SERVICE COORDINATORS REPORTS**

**Website:** Glenn W,

Hi all, you've been keeping me busy and I am happy to report the following number of unique visitors to your website: Apr: 1,451 May: 1,551 June: 1,459

We opened the meeting with the serenity prayer and had 26 in attendance.

A brief explanation of how the Webmaster position has changed into a Web Service Coordinator. Members have taken increased interest in the website and since the meetings for the website were started, the attendance has steadily increased. A number of motions have been presented, each of which must go through a lengthy process as follows:

First the motion is discussed amongst the website meeting, then presented on the floor at the business meeting, then referred to the Growth committee (because any change to the website will change the Structures and Guidelines). Then at the next Assembly (3 months later), the Website Service Coordinator will attend the Growth Committee meeting to speak towards the motion and answer questions. If the Growth committee passes it, then it will be presented to the floor for final vote by the Groups / GSRs.

After some brief discussion, a motion was made to remove the section from the Structures & Guidelines on the website (Section 19), and add the description of the Website Service Coordinator to section 4 (where the other service positions are described). Motion was seconded and discussion ensued. Questions and comments started, mainly along one issue: *Is the Webmaster and the Web Service Coordinator the same position?* Glenn believes and has operated as “one of the same”. When the website was first voted in and started, the Webmaster was the technical contact and person responsible for the maintenance of the website. The committee at that time was defined as a subcommittee of the Public Information committee and was made up of Officers of the N. Florida Area Committee and rarely met.

Currently, through the passing of motions during the past year, the website is “directed” by regularly scheduled meeting headed by a Web Service Coordinator. As motions pass, the Web Service Coordinator also does the website updates.

More discussion and comments included: We may be limiting the Web Service Coordinator candidates because of the “added” technical expertise required. Maybe the positions should be separate.

Motion to call the vote - passed. Motion of “Remove Section 19 from Structures and Guidelines” was called and passed unanimously.

A motion was made to define the Webmaster and the Web Site Service Coordinator as the same position. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. After discussion, motion was withdrawn. More discussion ensued about the role of a Webmaster and the role of a Web Service Coordinator.

Points made included:

The original intent was one position, and used the generally accepted term which was “Webmaster” for the person responsible.

Maybe the position should be split now there is a Service Coordinator. What if don’t have the technical expertise? Maybe we should look into a separate position? If it is a separate position, who is responsible?

Glenn stated that these are all great points and this topic should be explored further at the next Web Site meeting in October. Glenn also stressed that he believes the position does require a level of special technical expertise and that a few active members do currently possess the knowledge necessary to fulfill the role. Glenn also said that he thinks the experience with the Traditions and Concepts is equally as important in this position. However, that experience can be gained in this position with the guidance of the “committee”.

I want to encourage and invite anyone interested in serving in this position to please come and ask any questions you like.


